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ABSTRACT

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

PARENT INFORMATION AND TRAINING CENTER DIRECTORY

In the summer of 1984 the Department of Special Education and Rehabilitative Services, Office of Education, funded a number of projects as a result of P.L. 98-199. Included in this effort was funding for parent training and information centers nationwide. The work outlined in this document is information supplied by the grant recipients to the National Information Center for Handicapped Children and Youth (NICHCY). The first objective in the NICHCY contract with OSERS is "to establish a national system to distribute comprehensive and current information regarding educational and related services and rights affecting handicapped children and youth to a broadly based audience."

As part of the effort, NICHCY staff members participated in telephone interviews with directors and/or staff persons working on these grants. As a staff we wanted to establish personal contacts with these grant recipients. After the phone interview, each grantee was provided a NICHCY information packet and a staff roster.
