ABSTRACT

The result of a comprehensive search for documents about the Educational Resources Information Center (ERIC) published between 1979 and 1984, this bibliography lists 131 entries which approach ERIC in several different ways: documents of historical interest in the development of ERIC; "how to" items whose object is to initiate the user into the system; cross-database comparisons involving ERIC; user surveys; evaluations of ERIC performance; reports describing particular computer search programs or efforts; ERIC in the context of educational research and development dissemination; reviews of ERIC practices or results; how to teach ERIC; thesaurus development; how ERIC relates to some subset of the educational community; ERIC and microforms; and ERIC's current attributes including size and products. This supplement to a 1978 bibliography includes subject, personal author, and institution indexes. The 131 entries are arranged by their ERIC accession numbers (ED for documents in Resources in Education; EJ for journal articles in Current Index to Journals in Education), with the ED accessions appearing first, followed by the EJ accessions. Full records have been printed, including the abstract, in order to make the relevance of each item to ERIC abundantly clear. (THC)

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

Introduction

The Educational Resources Information Center (ERIC) began operations in the early 1960's. Since that time, there has been a steady production of literature about ERIC. These materials approach ERIC in several different ways, e.g. documents of historical interest in the development of ERIC; "How to" items whose object is to initiate the user into the system; cross-database comparisons involving ERIC; user surveys; evaluations of ERIC performance; reports describing particular computer search programs or efforts; ERIC in the context of educational R&D dissemination; reviews of ERIC practices or results; how to teach ERIC; thesaurus development; how ERIC relates to some subset of the educational community; ERIC and microforms; ERIC's current attributes, size, products, etc. As one of the most economical and frequently searched databases, ERIC has played a major role in the dramatic growth of online searching. There have been many recent documents dealing with the online searching of ERIC.

These materials are of interest from several points of view. They will often answer a user's question about ERIC; they are essential to any studies of ERIC; some are appropriate to classroom use in the teaching of ERIC; they are indicative of what is considered worth writing about in ERIC.

Given these uses, ERIC has attempted to maintain some degree of bibliographic control over the more substantive materials. This bibliography represents the results of a comprehensive search for documents about ERIC published during the period 1979-1984 that can be found in the ERIC database. (It also lists, in an addendum, 35 items about ERIC that are either not in the ERIC database or that were discovered too late to be included in the main body of the bibliography).

Each item has been screened for suitability. Items that were simply news announcements have been eliminated, as have items of poor quality, bibliographies based on ERIC accessions (but without other ERIC relevance), repetitive brochures explaining the well-known basic facts about ERIC, and general material on the dissemination of educational R & D, but without sufficient ERIC connection.

This bibliography was first issued in December 1978 in an edition containing 269 entries (ED-169 955). This first bibliography was comprehensive in that it did not limit itself to items found in the ERIC database. Subsequent updates to the 1978 edition were similarly comprehensive, but were not formally published and were simply circulated internally within the ERIC system for the use of the ERIC Clearinghouses.

The present edition supplements the 1978 publication. It contains entries for documents and journal articles collected during the six year period 1979-1984. In the interests of improving the access to and utility of this material, we are, for the first time, including indexes (Subject, Personal Author, and Institution) with this bibliography. The 131 entries are arranged by their ERIC accession numbers (ED for documents in *Resources in Education*; EJ for journal articles in *Current Index to Journals in Education*), with the ED accessions appearing first, followed by the EJ accessions. Full records have been printed, including the abstract, in order to make the relevance of each item to ERIC abundantly clear.

The Santa Ana College (SAC) Research Office cataloging system based on ERIC subject descriptors and on an internally developed document

source and author index is described. Each document entering the office is assigned a classification number which includes a subject index code, a source index code, the publication date, and a unique sequence number from which computerized document listings by subject index number, source, and alphabetic titles are generated. SAC's subject classification derives from the Descriptor Group Display in "The Thesaurus of ERIC Descriptors". The system advantages include ease of locating items within the system and of conducting searches, the ability to generate periodic current document listings to keep the administration and staff updated, and improvement of the Institutional Research Office image and reputation due to the retrieval efficiency of the taxonomic classification. System disadvantages are identified: subjectivity in subject index coding and a problem with no margin for coding errors. Future system plans involve developing an on-line file maintenance and search operation to facilitate document processing and eliminate some processing errors. (TR)

The ERIC network conversion to an OCR (Optical Character Recognition) mode of data entry was studied to analyze the potential effectiveness of OCR data entry for future EPC/s (Editorial Processing Centers). To obtain user evaluations of the information analysis products (IAPs) produced by the Educational Resources Information Center Clearinghouse on Tests, Measurement, and Evaluation (ERIC/TM), subjects were randomly drawn from a 1976 list of the clearinghouse's IAP orders. The sample was stratified by the title requested and the following institutional affiliations: (1) commercial organizations; (2) state departments of education; (3) elementary through high schools, including vocational schools; (4) school districts; (5) universities and four-year colleges; and (6) other. A questionnaire was administered to determine the type of professional activity engaged in by the requestor; how the requestor became aware of the document; whether the requestor belonged to ERIC/TM's target population; receipt of the document; reading vs. scanning; and document quality and utility. Indicators of quality were document length, organization, writing, and format. Utility was judged according to the purpose for ordering the document, whether the document was passed on (if so, to whom and what for), and the document's impact on the requestor's subsequent work activities. User evaluations of ERIC/TM's products tend to be high and indicate that the publications are used as reference tools by educators to keep abreast of the literature. This self-improvement manual developed for experienced online searchers presents and discusses several alternative search strategies and their appropriate use to achieve the desired outcome. The manual is divided into two parts: (1) an eight step model of the total search process emphasizing how the decision of the information professional affects retrieval results and search objectives at each step of the search process; and (2) introduction to DIALOG's ONTAP file and self-improvement exercises with search formulations and explanations selected from the questions stored in the ONTAP file. Each exercise falls within the scope of interest of one of the 16 ERIC Clearinghouses. The ONTAP file is a subset of the ERIC data base consisting of RIE and CIJE citations for the 1975 ERIC file and 29 simple, moderate, or difficult search questions with answer sets. It was developed to allow searchers to evaluate their output by computing recall and precision scores of their results with the results of a "perfect search" or answer set. The appendices include 13 search save formulations of common search facets for "population level" and "tools" which can be accessed and exchanged between DIALOG workspaces by using the procedures that are outlined, and a comprehensive guide to DIALOG's ERIC data bases. The Educational Resources Information Center (ERIC) system was used to identify 1,734 documents on program evaluation methodology. Attempts to further characterize these documents by subject were only partially successful because of the lack of sufficient depth of indexing and design constraints of the computer system. Attempts to characterize these documents by type of publication were also unsuccessful because so many of the documents had not been assigned publication type codes. When compared with a 1976 evaluation bibliography prepared by the Evaluation Center at Western Michigan University and edited by M.A. Bunda, only 27 percent of the bibliography's references were also listed in ERIC. Further investigation revealed that 28 percent of the bibliography was published or written before ERIC was incorporating such documents into its system, 22 percent were books or chapters of books (not usually made available through ERIC), nine percent were journal articles, and 14 percent were fugitive documents, which should generally be included in ERIC. Additional problems associated with non-hierarchical searching, system constraints on assignments of descriptors, and indexer limitations resulted in very little overlap between the ERIC search results and the Western Michigan bibliography. Researchers should be aware of the limitations of a search of the ERIC system. (BW)

The Educational Resources Information Center (ERIC) system provides information to education writers for newspapers, magazines, radio, and television. ERIC can be used to find the names of reliable sources in a given field, as well as background information for an in-depth article or broadcast. The ERIC collection of documents on microfiche is housed at 650 public institutions, some of which also provide computer searches of the data base for a fee of approximately 15 to 25 dollars. The Thesaurus of ERIC Descriptors suggests the appropriate subject terms for an ERIC search. The computer search results in a printout of abstracts and bibliographic citations; these are scanned in order to decide which microfiche, photocopies, or journals to request. Two printed indexes also provide bibliographic citations and abstracts, and are indexed by ERIC descriptors: (1) Resources in Education (RIE)—listing research reports, project summaries, and conference papers that are available as part of the ERIC microfiche collection; and (2) Current Index to Journals in Education (CIJE)—which indexes articles from education journals. A wide variety of educational materials regarding American Indians has been collected by the Educational Resources Information Center (ERIC) system; this guide was prepared to help anyone who is seeking that information to find it. It lists the addresses and telephone numbers of the 16 ERIC clearinghouses and the educational areas for which each is responsible. It describes ERIC's functions, what kinds of documents it uses, where the documents come from and who uses the system. Procedure is given for conducting both computer and manual searches of the data base with detailed descriptions devoted to the use of descriptor and identifier retrieval terms under which all documents are indexed. A listing of the commonly used American Indian descriptors and identifiers is given. Use of the ERIC reference books, including the "Thesaurus", the monthly "Resources in Education" abstract journal, and the monthly "Current Index to Journals in Education" is also explored. Because documents may be viewed at any of the ERIC microfiche collectings, a directory of microfiche collectings in all states with a significant Indian population is appended. Also included is information on how to order documents from the ERIC Document Reproduction Service.
