ABSTRACT

This bibliography of materials on domestic violence and child abuse available in the Robert E. Kennedy Library at California Polytechnic State University is divided into sections by type of abuse, with sections on family violence, child abuse, emotional child abuse, incest and sexual abuse of children, the child-abusing mother, infant abuse, wife beating, and elder abuse. Other sections contain materials on Parents Anonymous, foster homes, counseling and treatment, shelters, the school's role in child abuse, measurement tools, services, literature reviews, and materials for children. The bibliography includes both print and non-print materials with emphasis on books and journal articles. The information covers the period 1976-1985, and is organized alphabetically by author or title within each section. A listing of local, state, and national organizations concerned with family violence is included. Journals and printed abstracts covering child abuse and family violence are also listed. (ABL)

INTRODUCTION

This bibliography contains information that may be obtained in the Robert E. Kennedy Library on domestic violence in the home with a special emphasis on child abuse. The bibliography is divided into the different forms of abuse, with sections on counseling and treatment, shelters, and materials for children. It includes both print and non-print materials, with emphasis on books and journal articles. The information dates from 1976-1985, and is organized alphabetically by author or title within each section.

SCREAM QUIETLY OR THE NEIGHBORS WILL HEAR is only one of the titles listed within the bibliography, but it aptly sums up a problem that involves the educator, the counselor, the social worker, and the concerned citizen in seeking a solution to a growing problem in America that effects all levels of society.

The first edition of this bibliography appeared in 1982. In the intervening three years, the problem of family violence has grown. We hope that should there be a need to revise the bibliography again, that we can report the opposite - that family violence has lessened.
