ABSTRACT

The amounts, types, and sources of financial aid received by Illinois college students are reported, based on the 1985 Illinois Student Financial Aid Survey. Data are provided for 332,868 Illincis s. idents attending 168 public and private colleges and universities. Included are a narrative discussion of the findings, including the growth and distribution of financial aid for the past 5 years, and detailed statistical tables for 1985, as well as comparative sector data for the past 10 fiscal years. The number and value of awards, loans, and campus jobs provided to students are reported by source, type, program, sector, institution, and level. Data are provided for public universities, community colleges, and private institutions. The sources of aid include federal and state funding, institutionally-sponsored programs and a variety of other sources, including student loan programs. Financial ai is classified into four types: grants, tuition waivers, loans, and employment. Employment data include only on-campus student employment. Appended are a list of the participating institutions, the fiscal year 1985 survey, and instructions and definitions for the survey. (SW)

INTRODUCTION

The annual Illinois Student Financial Aid Survey provides a record of the amounts, types, and sources of financial assistance received by students in Illinois higher education. All 168 public and private not-for-profit institutions that participate in state administered financial assistance programs completed the fiscal year 1935 survey. The survey reports data on the financial assistance received by 332,868 Illinois students during the past fiscal year.

The major component of the Financial Aid Survey was initiated in fiscal year 1973 by the Illinois Board of Higher Education.

The report is composed of two principal sections: Section I, a discussion of findings from the survey data; and Section II, detailed data tables drawn from survey data. The narrative report, Section I, includes summary tables showing the growth and distribution of financial assistance for the past five years. The more detailed tables in Section II concentrate on data from FY1985 and comparative sector data for the past ten fiscal years.

The survey is now a cooperative project of the Board staff and the staff of the Illinois State Scholarship Commission. The data have been provided by institutional financial aid officers throughout Illinois. The usefulness of the survey owes much to their efforts and cooperation.

REPORT ON THE FISCAL YEAR 1985 STUDENT FINANCIAL AID SURVEY

OVERVIEW

Highlights

Total student financial aid in fiscal year 1985 was \$970.0 million, an increase of 6.7 percent over fiscal year 1984's total aid. Overall financial aid grew in all sectors: by 4.9 percent at public universities, 8.2 percent at private institutions, and 5.0 percent at community colleges

The 332,868 students receiving some form of financial assistance represent a 3.3 percent increase in fiscal year 1985 over fiscal year 1984. The number of recipients increased by 1.3 percent at public universities, 5.5 percent at community colleges, and 3.4 percent at private institutions.

Undergraduate grants, scholarships, and tuition waivers in fiscal year 1985 totaled \$370.4 million, up 7.5 percent from the fiscal year 1984 undergraduate gift assistance of \$344.4 million. In fiscal year 1985, \$109.7 million in undergraduate gift assistance was provided through the Illinois State Scholarship Commission Monetary Award Program; \$116.4 million was provided under the federal government Pell Grant program.

Graduate financial assistance of all types in both the public and private sectors was \$284.0 million in fiscal year 1985, up 5.6 percent from \$269.0 million in fiscal year 1984. The value of scholarships and tuition waivers increased by 22.4 percent, loans dropped by 1.0 percent, and on-campus employment grew by 1.1 percent.

Tables 1 through 58 on the following pages provide details on the fiscal year 1985 Student Financial Aid Survey results. Appendix A lists the institutions that participated in the survey, Appendix B is a copy of the questionnaire used for the fiscal year 1985 survey, and Appendix C is a copy of the instructions and definitions for the fiscal year 1985 survey.

Survey Scope

The fiscal year 1985 Student Financial Aid Survey describes the financial aid received by undergraduate and graduate students at 168 Illinois public and private, not-for-profit higher educational institutions during the 1984-85 academic year. The number and value of awards, loans, and campus jobs provided to students are reported by source, type, program, sector, institution, and level.

The sources of student financial assistance include federal and state funding, institutionally sponsored programs, and a variety of other sources. Student loans made by private financial institutions under the Illinois Guaranteed Loan Program are included in the category of other sources. This program is administered by the Illinois State Scholarship Commission using capital from private lending institutions, loan guarantees and interest subsidies provided by the federal government. In cases of mixed funding for individual assistance programs (e.g., the shared federal and institutional funding for College Work-Study), the source of funds is appropriately apportioned.

Financial aid is classified into four types: grants, tuition waivers, loans, and employment. In the summary tables, gr ts and tuition waivers are combined into a category of nonrepayable gift assistance. Loans are normally repayable following student departure from school, although some types of loans have limited forgiveness features. Employment data reported here include only on-campus student employment. In some cases, such as work-study programs, earnings from campus employment are part of a financial aid package. In other cases, students gain campus employment independently from financial aid considerations.

More detailed definitions and a copy of the actual survey instrument are provided in Appendices B and C.

Trends in Overall Student Financial Assistance

In fiscal year 1985, a total of \$970.0 million (See Table A) in financial assistance was received by undergraduate and graduate students in the 168 Illinois institutions taking part in state-funded assistance programs. Financial aid to students in proprietary institutions is not included in the survey, although these students receive assistance under federal programs.

Overall student financial assistance increased 6.7 percent in fiscal year 1985 over fiscal year 1984's total of \$909.4 million. As presented on Table A, this overall increase was greatest at private institutions, up 8.2 percent from fiscal year 1984. Total assistance to students at both prolic universities and community colleges increased by 4.9 percent at public universities and 5.0 percent at community colleges during fiscal year 1985.

Assistance received from federal sources in fiscal year 1985 increased by 9.9 percent at public universities and 5.1 percent at community colleges over fiscal year 1984. At private institutions, federal aid increased 9.1 percent in fiscal year 1985. These totals for federal assistance do not include the costs of interest subsidies and other payments under the federal guaranteed loan program.

The capital for loans under these programs is secured from private financial institutions under loan guarantees and interest subsidies provided by the federal government. Borrowers pay insurance and origination feas that offset auministrative costs of the IGLP and a small portion of federal government costs.

State sources of student assistance in fiscal year 1985 increased 9.8 percent at public universities and decreased 4.2 percent at community colleges in fiscal year 1985. The decrease at community colleges followed a 7.9 percent increase of state funding in fiscal year 1984. At private institutions, state sources rose by 9.9 percent.

Institutional sources of student financial assistance decreased by 12.0 percent at public universities after a two-year growth period. Institutional sources of student financial assistance increased by 1.9 percent at community colleges and by 4.0 percent at private institutions during fiscal year 1985. Historically, institutional sources have been among the most variable, in part a reflection of the availability of support from other sources of student aid.

Borrowing under the Illinois Guaranteed Student Loan Program increased moderately in all sectors. Borrowing increased 1.8 percent at public universities (down from a 15.2 percent increase last year), 13.3 percent at community colleges (down from 54.7 percent last year), and 9.0 percent at private institutions (down from an 11.7 percent increase last year).

"Other" sources of funds were up by 15.7 percent in fiscal year 1985, and constitute one of the fastest growing aid sources. Other sources of funds include programs where aid is provided from an outside (e.g., corporate or service club) donor but institutional coordination is needed. At public universities, other sources rose by 19.9 percent, at community colleges, they dropped 20.4 percent, and at private institutions, they rose by 16.7 percent.

As indicated on Table 3, many individual students are provided assistance of several types and from several sources. The Financial Aid Survey includes data on the unduplicated headcount of recipients of the major types of aid and for all programs combined. A total of 332,868 students at Illinois public and private, not-for-profit institutions received some form of financial assistance during fiscal year 1985. This total represents an increase of 10,500 students, or about 47 percent of total headcount enrollment and 59 percent of total on-campus enrollment for these institutions.

Undergraduate Financial Assistance

Financial assistance to undergraduate students in Illinois since fiscal yes: 1981 is shown on Tables C and D. Total assistance (including gift aid, loans and employment) increased to \$686.0 million in fiscal year 1985, up from \$640.5 million in the previous year. This represents an increase of 7.0 percent. The distribution of total assistance to Illinois undergraduate students by source of funds, type, and sector is illustrated in Figure E.






UNDERGRADUATE STUDENT FINANCIAL AID FY1984 AND FY1985 (dollars in millions)

Table C provides a detailed breakdown of grants, scholarships, and tuition waivers to Illinois undergraduate students by sector during fiscal year 1985. The largest grant programs, the federal Pell Grants and the Illinois Monetary Award Program, are need-based assistance programs. Grants under the Illinois Monetary Award Program are limited to the payment of tuition and required fees at public institutions and to a statutory maximum at private institutions. Pell Grants may be used to meet non-tuition educational and living expenses. Monetary Award Program grants provided \$109.7 million in assistance in fiscal year 1985, up 4.9 percent from fiscal year 1984's level as a result of increases in all sectors. Pell Grant assistance was \$116.4 million in fiscal year 1985, up 9.0 percent from the previous year. At private institutions, institutionally funded programs provided approximately 34 percent of grant and scholarship aid, a decrease from 37 percent in the previous year.

Table D shows undergraduate financial assistance by type and sector since fiscal year 1981. For all sectors as a whole, gift assistance increased 7.5 percent, employment increased 2.8 percent, and loans to undergraduates increased by 7.7 percent from fiscal year 1984. Total assistance to undergraduates at public universities increased 5.8 percent in fiscal year 1985. The largest component of this gain was a 9.2 percent increase in gift assistance. Total assistance at community colleges increased 5.0 percent in fiscal year 1985. At public universities the growth in undergraduate gift assistance (grants, scholarships, and tuition waivers) in fiscal year 1985 kept pace with tuition increases and outstripped enrollment decreases. Gift assistance increased .7 percent for community colleges.

At private institutions, total undergraduate assistance increased 8.6 percent, with a 9.0 percent increase in gift assistance, a 9.4 percent increase in loans, and an increase of 5.8 percent in employment.

I \Rightarrow distribution of total assistance to Illinois undergraduate students by source of funds, type, and sector is illustrated in Figure E.

Table F shows the number of undergraduate recipients of financial aid in the form of gift assistance, loans, or campus employment in all sectors combined since fiscal year 1981. The number of undergraduates receiving gift assistance in fiscal year 1985 (230,097) is significantly larger than the number participating in loan programs (106,902) or campus employment (73,101). The number of undergraduates receiving gift assistance has increased in the last two years after decreases in fiscal years 1982 and 1983. Loans were up from last year, still below the all-time high set in fiscal year 1982, but well above fiscal year 1980's figure. Undergraduate participation in campus employment programs has remained relatively stable during the past five years.

The 285,504 recipients of one or more types of financial assistance in fiscal year 1985 represent approximately 40 percent of total headcount enrollment and 59 percent of on-campus enrollment in undergraduate programs. These proportions have increased from approximately 45 percent and 56 percent, respectively.

For fiscal year 1985, the number of undergraduate students receiving nonrepayable assistance represented 47.8 percent of on-campus enrollment compared to 45.1 percent and 42.5 percent in fiscal years 1983 and 1984, respectively. For fiscal year 1985, undergraduate students participating in loan prome represented 22.2 percent of on-campus enrollments, up from 20. Lent in fiscal year 1984. Employment recipients represented 27.2 percent of on-campus undergraduate enrollment, an increase from 14.3 percent in fiscal year 1984.

Graduate Financial Assistance

Financial assistance to graduate students in Illinois since fiscal year 1981 is shown on Table G. Total assistance increased to \$284.0 million in fiscal year 1985, up from \$269.0 million in the previous year. This represents an increase of 5.6 percent. The distribution of total assistance to Illinois graduate students by source of funds, type, and sector is illustrated in Figure H.

Financial aid for graduate students in public universities was \$119.5 million in fiscal year 1985, up 3.2 percent from the \$115.9 million in fiscal year 1984. Of the fiscal year 1985 total, \$37.5 million was in the form of gift assistance, \$\frac{1}{2}\$.1 million was in loans, and \$46.0 million was in on-campus employment earnings.

One substantial change in financial assistance to graduate students at public institutions in fiscal year 1985 was a drop (9.0 percent) in the value of loans used to meet graduate students' expenses and a significant increase (42.2 percent) in the value of scholarships and tuition waivers awarded.

Financial aid for graduate students in private institutions was \$164.4 million in fiscal year 1985, a 7.4 percent increase from the fiscal year 1984 total of \$153.1 million. In fiscal year 1985, \$47.0 million was in the form of gift aid, \$89.7 million was in loans, and \$27.6 million was in on-campus employment earnings.

Total graduate student borrowing in fiscal year 1985 was \$125.8 million, a decrease of \$1.2 million (1.0 percent) from fiscal year 1984. Gift assistance increased 22.4 percent and employment increased 1.1 percent over fiscal year 1984.







Table J shows graduate participation in financial aid programs by sector and type of assistance for fiscal year 1983 to fiscal year 1985. The number of graduate financial aid recipients was approximately 61 percent of on-campus eurollments in fiscal year 1985. Aid recipients represented 78.0 percent of on-campus public university graduate students in fiscal year 1985, an increase over 71.0 percent in fiscal year 1984. Recipients represented 45.7 percent of on-campus private university graduate students in fiscal year 1985, a slight increase from 42.3 percent in fiscal year 1984.

At public universities, for fiscal year 1985 the number of graduate students receiving nonrepayable assistance represented 59.6 percent of on-campus enrollment compared to 24.7 percent at private institutions. For fiscal year 1985, graduate students participating in loan programs represented 23.1 percent of on-campus enrollment at public universities and 29.5 percent at private institutions. Employment recipients represented 36.0 percent of on-campus graduate enrollment at public universities and 10.8 percent at private institutions.

Financial Assistance to Minorities and Women

Last year, the Illinois Student Financial Aid Survey Report began to include data regarding the composition by race and sex of Monetary Award Program recipients, and of recipients of all types of financial aid. Tables K, L and M provide these data for fiscal years 1984 and 1985, and also indicate the percent hange from one year to the next.

As Table K illustrates, minorities comprised 42.9 percent of all Monetary Award Program grant recipients reporting race and sex data in fiscal year 1985; women comprised 58.2 percent.

Table L breaks out recipients of all types of financial aid, showing that 29.6 percent of all undergraduate aid recipients were minorities and that 53.6 percent were women. For graduate students, Table M indicates that minorities composed 19.2 percent of all aid recipients, and women composed 46.0 percent.



## General Instructions

The FY1985 Financial Aid Questionnairs contains six sections to be completed by each institution. Sections I-IV require detailed information by program and by student level. The following definitions should be used in completing Sections I-IV:

Number of Recipients:

The number of students that were granted awards in each program from July 1, 1984 to June 30, 1985. If enrollment periods do not correspond to the fiscal year, count the number of awards during the academic year 1984-85 and summer term, 1985. Each student receiving an award for any program should be counted once in the column "Number of Recipients" per program, regardless of the number of terms to which the award applies. For example, if a student receives a talent waiver fc. all three quarters of the academic year, he/she would still only be counted once in the column, "Number of Recipients" under the talent waiver program.

Total Value of Awards:

The value of awards from July 1, 1984, to June 30, 1985. If enrollment periods do n t correspond to the fiscal year, use the value of awards for the academic year 1984-85 and for summer, 1985. If necessary, use estimated summer, 1985 data.

The amount reported should include only awards made to students. It should not include administrative expenses or funds which are available but which will not be expended before June 30, 1985.

fill amounts reported should be rounded to the nearest dollar.

Undergraduate:

The number of individuals en 'led in certificate and degree credit instructional ... ograms who have not earned their first baccalaureate degree choice equivalent. All students enrolled in community colleges, private two-year colleges and hospital schools of nursing should be classified as undergraduate students in the survey, even though selected students may have



already obtained a baccalaureate degree. For the purposes of this survey, students enrolled in precollegiate curricula should NOT be considered undergraduates, and any financial aid they receive should not be reported on this questionnaire.

Graduate:

The number of individuals holding bona fide bachelor's degrees who have been admitted to the graduate division or to a professional school either as a candidate for a master's degree, an advanced degree or certificate, a second bachelor's degree, or as an unclassified graduate student.

Tuition and Fee Waivers:

Gift (nonrepayable) assistance to students which is limited to payment of tuition and fees. Such aid is given by an institution in the form of "foregone income", with the institution not collecting tuition from a student, thereby awarding him/her a grant although no money changes hands.

Tuition waivers may be granted for a variety of reasons: financial need, athletic talent, academic promise, musical skill, etc. If possible, please categorize institutional tuition waivers by type of award.

Scholarships, irants, Fellowships, and Trainee-ships:

All forms of (nonrepayable) gift assistance other than tuition and fee waivers. Such gift assistance is used for payment of living costs, tuition, or other expenses. This category does not include earnings from employment.

Loans:

Financial assistance which must be repaid by the student. Include only the amount loaned from July 1, 1984 to June 30, 1985. Do not include costs of cancelled loans, funds which were available but not spent during the fiscal year, or loans guaranteed but not executed by the borrower.

Employment:

All student employment at the college or university or through college or university programs. Graduate teaching and research assistants should be included as well as student cafetaria employees and students working for an outside agency as part of the College Work-Study program. Do not include students who obtained employment through a college employment agency but are not paid by the college.

Within the questionnaire certain lines have been marked out with a series of X's to indicate that no response is required. There are two primary reasons why these lines do not need to be completed:

- 1. the program is limited to either the undergraduate or graduate levels, i.e., the Pell.
- 2. the number of recipients for programs requiring matching funds need only be reported once; i.e., CWS and NDSL programs.

Respondents should report the institution's FICE or USOE Vendor Code in the upper right hand corner of the first page of the questionnaire. The FICE Code refers to the Federal Interagency Committee on Education Code which is a six tight number that is unique for each institution and remains as the institutional number for the life of the institution. The USOE Vendor Code number is the United State Office of Education Code; the FICE and USOE numbers are the same for most institutions. With the exception of some hospital schools of nursing, most institutions have been issued either a FICE or USOE Vendor Code by the Federal Government. This code number should be available in your institution's business office. If the FICE or USOE Vendor Code cannot be located, please leave this space blank. The IBHE staff will locate your code number and complete these blanks for you.

More specific instructions for completing each section of the questionnaire follow.

### Section I. Federal Programs

Federal Programs include student aid programs authorized by federal statute for which funds are provided by the federal government. In several programs institutional matching funds are a necessary requirement for receiving federal funds. For these programs, the institutional matching funds should be included in Section I under the appropriate line code. For other programs, the federal government requires that institutions provide students with an additional type and source of assistance. In these cases, the additional assistance should be reported in the section related to the appropriate source of funding. For example, if a tuition waiver is required in order to receive a graduate fellowship, the value of the tuition waiver should be reported in Section III, Institutional Programs.

The federal share of matching funds required under the various federal loan programs should only include that portion of funds which the institution receives directly from the federal government each year through standard application procedures. All funds collected from students through repayment of loans should be placed in the line, Funds Available from Collections and Other Revenue, regardless of the original source of those funds. If institutional reporting systems do not provide data on whether funds available through collections are loaned to either undergraduate or graduate students, institutions should use an allocation procedure for the distribution of these funds by student level based on the best information available.

The number of recipients and value of awards on Line Code 24, Subtotal - Federal Programs, should equal the sum of the numbers reported for each program in Section I. Numbers enclosed in parentheses within this Section are subtotals and should not be added into the final Federal Program Subtotal; all lines not enclosed in parentheses should be added to obtain the Federal Subtotal.



# Section II. State of Illinois Programs Not Funded Through ISSC

This section includes student aid programs for which funding is provided by a State agency or department other than ISSC, and lending institutions that are separate and distinct from the educational institution. If the Department of Public Aid provides these students with stipends for school-related living expenses, the value of the stipends should be reported in Line Code 43, Scholarships. The stipends associated with the awards program need only be reported if the financial aid office is notified of the value of the stipends by the Department.

The number of recipients and value of awards on Line Code 44, Subtotal - State Programs, should equal the sum of the numbers reported for each program in Section II. The subtotal will provide a duplicated number of recipients. Numbers enclosed in parentheses in this section are subtotals and should not be included in the final subtotal for State Programs; all lines not enclosed in parentheses should be added to obtain the State of Illinois subtotal.

# Section III. Institutional Programs

Institutional programs include student aid programs which are funded by institutional or institutionally-related monies. Public universities should include funds in this section which were received as a part of the universities' regular state appropriation. In the public university questionnaire, appropriated funds refer to those funds for current operations received from, or made available by, state governmental sources through General Assembly action. Nonappropriated funds would include funds available to the institution through federal grants and contracts, auxiliary enterprises, private grants and donations, and other revenue which has not been appropriated to the institution by the General Assembly.

tine Code 81 of the public university questionnaire, Cooperating Teachers, refers to local school district teachers who are granted tuition waivers by the institution as a form of payment for supervising student teachers.

Line Code 88 of the private institution questionnaire, FISL Loans, refers to loans provided through institutional resources which are guaranteed under the Federally Insured Student L. in Program. FISL loans granted through institutional resources should be sorted in this line code regardless of whether the initial capital for the loans was provided through existing fund balances or funds borrowed by the institution for this purpose.



The number of recipients and value of awards on Line Code 68, Subtotal - Institutional Programs, should equal the sum of the numbers reported for each program in Section III. Numbers enclosed in parentheses within this section are subtotals and should not be added into the Institutional Subtotal; all lines not enclosed in parentheses should be added to obtain the Institutional Program Subtotal.

### Section IV. Other Sources of Funds

Other Sources of Funds include programs whose recipients are selected by he institution using funds supplied by sources unrelated to the institution or programs whose recipients are selected by the donor but institutional coordination is required.

Line Code 74, Subtotal - Other Sources of Funds, should include the sum of the numbers reported for each program in Section IV. All lines <u>not</u> enclosed in parentheses should be added to obtain the subtotal for other sources of funds.

### Section V. Total

The number of recipients and value of awards in Line Code 75 should equal the sum of Line Codes 24, 44, 68, and 74. Line Code 75 will, in effect, provide a duplicated number of recipients from all programs.

# Section VI. <u>Unduplicated</u> Headcount and Demographic Data

An unduplicated headcount is the number of students, NOT the number of awards, served by each type of program.

For the purpose of completing the information on unduplicated headcounts in Section VI.1, all programs listed in Sections I - IV of the questionnaire must be classified under the following three major categories of financial aid:

- 1. Gift Assistance
- 2. Loans
- 3. Employment

Individual students must then be assigned to the three categories on the basis of the type(s) of aid received. It is recognized that an individual student may receive two or more awards (such as a MAP and Pell award) which can be classified in the same category (in this case, gift assistance). This student would only be counted once in Line Code 592, Students Receiving 3ift Assistance, since an unduplicated headcount of <u>students</u>, not awards, is being requested. Another student may receive assistance from all three categories of financial aid. In this example, the student would be counted once in Line Code 592, Students Receiving Gift Assistance, once in Line Code 593, Students Receiving Loans, and once in Line Code 594, Students Employed by Your Institution, regardless of how many awards the student received in each category.



Line Code 591 requires an unduplicated headcount of <u>students</u> served by all financial aid programs. This headcount will include MAP, PLUS, ALAS, IGLP, and National Guard Fund recipients. Each student receiving financial aid, regardless of the type or number of awards received, should only be counted once in Line Code 591.

The only instance where the line codes would be additive would be if every student on financial aid received awards in only one category, either gift assistance, loans, or employment. Generally, the sum of Line Code 592, 593, and 594 will exceed the number of students reported in Line Code 591 since many students receive more than one category of financial aid.

The instructions for completing unduplicated headcounts are applicable for both undergraduate and graduate students.

For definitions of the racial or ethnic background categories used in Sections VI.2 and VI.3, see Illinois Board of Higher Education Fall Enrollment Survey, Glossary of Data Elements. Definitions are consistent with HEGIS categories. Totals of the columns and categories for Section VI.2 should be consistent with the Monetary Award Program payment roster accompanying this questionnaire. Column and category totals for Section VI.3 should be consistent with total unduplicated headcount in Section VI.1.

# Common Errors in Past Questionnaires

Two common problems respondents encountered in past questionnaires should be pointed out. First, many of the questionnaires have had tabulation errors. Columns and/or rows of data did not add up correctly. Subtotals are in parentheses, so in adding columns, add only those lines without parentheses. Please make a final check of your report for any errors in row or column addition.

The second problem concerns unduplicated counts of undergraduate and graduate aid recipients. Read this section carefully, and if you have questions, please call Sandra Slotnick at 217/782-3632 for clarification.

It is important that every institution return the report by the due date to enable us to preedit, keypunch, edit, compile, write, print and distribute the survey by the October 1, deadline. Your cooperation is essential to meeting this publication deadline.
