ABSTRACT

This report summarizes and compares data, extracted from U.S. Census Bureau reports, relating to the numbers and relative earnings of artists from different racial and ethnic backgrounds and for male and female artists. Results indicate that Black and Hispanic workers are underrepresented in artist occupations in relation to their numbers in the civilian labor force. They also earn less than other artists; however, their earnings as artists are greater than their earnings in the general labor force. Those in the residual ethnic class of "others," principally Asian Americans, do relatively well in arts occupations, both in their numbers and in their earnings. The proportion of women workers in artist occupations rose from 25 to 38 percent during the 1970s. At the same time the proportion of women in the overall work force increased to 43 percent. The results indicate that artist occupations still lag behind the general labor force in women's participation but that the gap has been reduced. The relative earnings of women artists changed little between 1970 and 1980. The median earnings of women artists in 1980 was 59 percent of the earnings obtained by men. Data are displayed in 10 tables. Additional and more extensive tables are contained in the appendices. They include: (1) artists' median earnings and ethnic distribution in the civilian labor force by occupation, sex, ethnicity, and weeks worked; (2) artists' age distribution by occupation, sex, and ethnicity; and (3) ethnic distribution of earnings by artist occupation and major industry. MINORITIES AND WOMEN IN THE ARTS: 1980

INTRODUCTION

This is the fifth of a series of reports on artists, based on data from the 1980 U.S. census for a set of 11 arts-related occupations. The first report in the series, Trends in the Artist Occupations, 1970-1980, provides general information on changes during the decade in the sex and ethnic composition, age structure, labor force participation rates, levels of education, and earnings of artists. The second report, The Distribution of Artists Among Industrial Sectors, is a more detailed analysis of the allocation of these workers among different types of workplaces. The third report, Earnings of Artists: 1980, provides data on the earned income of artists, considering variations among occupations, differences of sex or ethnic background, and other factors. The fourth report Artists by Place of Residence: 1980, examines variations in geographic distribution of artists among the states and major Standard Metropolitan Statistical Areas (SMSA's). The present report summarizes data on the numbers and relative earnings of minority and women artists.

The 11 artist occupational titles examined in these reports, along with their three-digit Bureau of the Census OCS (Occupational Classification System) codes, are:

- actors and directors (OCS Code 187);
- announcers (OCS Code 198);
- architects (OCS Code 043);
- postsecondary art, drama, and music teachers (OCS Code 137);
- authors (OCS Code 183);
- dancers (OCS Code 193);
- designers (OCS Code 185);
- musicians and composers (OCS Code 186);
- painters, sculptors, craft artists, and artist printmakers (OCS Code 188);
- photographers (OCS Code 189); and
- artists, performers, and related workers, N.E.C. ("Not Elsewhere Classified"--OCS Code 194).

The OCS series 183-199 makes up the larger general census class of "Writers, Artists, Entertainers, and Athletes," and the final "N.E.C." group listed above is the residual category for this broad occupational sector. All of the occupational categories in this broad artists-and-entertainers sector are included in the set of 11 fields used in the National Endowment for the Arts' series of demographic studies, except for technical writers, editors and reporters, public relations specialists, and athletes. In ad-

dition, two occupations outside the broad artists' cluster used by the census are included in the NEA's analyses: postsecondary art, drama, and music teachers (grouped by the census with other kinds of educators), and architects (grouped with the engineers). By 1980 the experienced civilian labor force (ECLF) included over a million persons in these 11 occupations.

Section I of this report summarizes data on the numbers and relative earnings of artists with different racial and ethnic backgrounds. Trends over time are also considered. Section II provides similar information for men and women artists. Each section draws on other reports in this series. The tables in this report are newly prepared, and do not duplicate those in the earlier studies.

In considering trends in the artist occupations with respect to racial or ethnic groups or between the sexes, it is useful to take note of several related developments during the 1970's for these fields. The numbers of artists increased over the ten-year period by 51 percent, compared to a 30 percent increase in the size of the overall experienced civilian labor force. This estimate of growth in the size of the artist work force is adjusted to correct for changes that took place during the decade in the definitions used by the Bureau of the Census to categorize the artist occupations.

During the same period, median earnings of artists failed to keep pace with earnings for the general ECLF. In 1969, median earnings for all artists were \$7,880, 29 percent greater than the median of \$6,100 reported for the entire experienced civilian labor force. By 1979, the absolute value of median earnings for artists had risen to \$9,803, but this was still 15 percent less than the 1979 figure for all workers of \$11,420. If the comparison is limited only to full-time workers, the artists' relative median earnings for 1979 look much better; at \$15,777, they are about seven percent more than the median of \$14,769 for all full-time persons in the ECLF. However, a decade earlier the full-time artists enjoyed the much greater advantage of earnings about a third better than those of the median full-time worker in the overall labor force.¹ In short, at the beginning of the decade, artists' earnings were generally better than those of most workers; at the end of the period, they were generally no better or worse. I. MINORITIES IN THE ARTS: 1980

Black and Hispanic workers are underrepresented in the 11 artist occupations, relative to their numbers in the experienced civilian labor force as a whole. Black and Hispanic artists also earn less than others, although not quite as much less as do Black and Hispanic workers in general. Those in the residual ethnic class of "others," principally Asian Americans, do relatively well in the arts occupations, both in their numbers and in their earnings. These are the main findings; more detailed comments are below.

Number of Minorities

Between 1970 and 1980, the total portion of all minority workers in the 11 artist occupations rose slightly, from 8.8 percent to 10.7 percent. During the same period, the share of minority workers in the overall ECLF rose from 14.9 to 18.0 percent. In both years, the relative difference between the arts occupations and the experienced civilian labor force as a whole is the same: the share of minority workers in the art fields is only about 59 percent of the share they have in the general work force. As noted above, the shortfall is due to a lack of Blacks and Hispanics; the art fields have more than the usual share of "other" minorities. Over the decade, the Hispanics made the greatest relative gains in numbers, from 3.7 to 5.7 percent of the artists. The relative increase in the number of "other" workers in the artist occupations was also high, going from 1.6 percent of the total in 1970 to 2.2 percent in 1980. The relative share of Black workers increased only slightly; that of white workers dropped.

Among the 11 artist occupations, dancers have the largest share of minority workers (19.9 percent), while authors have the smallest share (6.2 percent). The total percentage of minorities in all the other artist occupations ranges between 8.7 and 13.8 percent. Over the decade, the proportion of minority workers rose more for announcers and postsecondary art, drama and music teachers than in the other artists' occupations. It increased the least among designers and painters, sculptors, craft artists and printmakers. In the case of the residual category of "Artists N.E.C.," the proportion of minority workers dropped. Like some of the other time trends summarized here, this outcome may have been influenced by changes in procedures used by the Census Bureau to classify artists.

Table 1 on the next page provides general data on the numbers and earnings of four major ethnic and/or racial groups for the artist occupations, plus comparative statistics for the experienced civilian labor force. Artists comprise 1.04 percent of the ECLF, and 1.00 percent of the full-time workers. There are 18 percent more persons with "other" ethnic origins--principally Asian Americans--in the artist work force than would be expected if the share of these persons in the general work force applied. The portion of whites in the artist work force is nine percent higher than the share of whites in the labor force as a whole. Hispanics are underrepresented, with only about two-thirds the numbers of artists that would be expected, given their share of the general labor force; Blacks are severely underrepresented, with less than half the share of workers that Blacks represent in the total ECLF.

Earnings

The same pattern applies to earnings: in both the artist work force and the total experienced civilian labor force, Blacks and Hispanics who work full-time earn less than non-minority full-time workers. However, the relative position of Black and Hispanic artists is better than that of Blacks and Hispanics in general. Median earnings for full-time Black artists are 85 percent of those for all artists. This is about 10 percent better than the comparable figure of 77 percent for Black workers in general. Hispanic results are similar (90 and 79 percent). Those in the "other" ethnic group earn almost as much as "other" workers in the total labor force, and "other" artists' median earnings are higher than those of whites.

Table 2, which follows on the next two pages, includes similar statistics for all 11 artist occupations, for each of the four principal racial/ethnic categories. Looking first at the whites, all but two of the 11 artist occupations were between 86 and 91 percent white in 1980. The exceptional fields are the authors (94 percent white) and the dancers (80 percent white). The white dancers are also an exceptional group in their median earnings, making 15 percent more during calendar 1979, the period measured for these 1980 census data, than did other kinds of full-time dancers (most earnings comparisons are limited to full-time workers, to allow for varying propensities to work at least 35 hours a week, 50 or more weeks a year). White workers in all the other artist occupations have median earnings that are within one percent of the figures for all persons in those fields.

Sharper differences from overall results appear in the data for the three minority categories. None of the artist occupations has as many as ten percent Black workers, their share in the overall experienced civilian labor force. The dancers and announcers come closest, with 8.6 and 8.1 percent, respectively, of their workers being Black. Black announcers are relatively well paid, with median earnings at 107 percent of those for all announcers; Black dancers are relatively poorly paid, with median earnings that are only 80 percent of those paid to all dancers. Four of the 11 fields have substantially less than half the share of Black workers found in the general labor force. Only about three percent of the designers and the painters, sculptors, craft artists and printmakers are Black; even fewer architects and authors are Black. Black designers have median earnings that are only 80 percent of those for all designers, similar to the Black dancers; Black architects' median earnings are at the 86 percent level for that occupation, Black authors are at the 93 percent level, and Black painters and sculptors' earnings are at par.

Black artists in the remaining fields (musicians and composers; actors and directors; postsecondary art, drama, and music teachers; photographers; and "Artists N.E.C.,") account for between 5.0 and 6.5 percent of the total numbers of workers in these occupations. Black postsecondary art, music and drama teachers have relatively good median earnings, almost ten percent better than those of these workers in general; Black musicians and composers have earnings that are close to par (that is, the same as the figure for all workers). Black workers in the other fields have relatively poorer earnings: those for the full-time actors and directors are 89 percent of the general median; for the photographers, 85 percent; and for the "Artists N.E.C.," 81 percent.

"Full-Time" means 35 or more hours a week, 50 or more weeks a year. The Hispanic group is defined by national origin, and overrides racial categories. The "other" racial/ethnic group consists mainly of Asian-Americans; it also includes American Indians. Only postsecondary personnel are included in the group of art, drama and music teachers. The group of painters and sculptors also includes craft artists and printmakers.

Turning to the Hispanics, a similar general picture of lower numbers and earnings is presented, but the details are different. Only the dancers have shares of Hispanics that are comparable to those for the general labor force (six percent, compared to 5.7 percent for all workers). Hispanic dancers are relatively poorly paid, with earnings at only 80 percent of those for all workers in the field. A group of eight occupations--the "Artists N.E.C."; musicians and composers; announcers; architects; photographers; designers; painters, sculptors, craft artists and printmakers; and actors and directors--are all between 3.7 and 4.5 percent Hispanic. There are some sharp variations within these fields in relative earnings. Hispanics in the painters and sculptors' occupational group have median earnings above those for all workers in this field. Hispanic announcers, architects and photographers have median earnings that are between 93 and 96 percent of the figures for all workers in these occupations. Hispanics classed as "Artists N.E.C." have earnings at the 89 percent level; Hispanic actors and directors have earnings at the 86 percent level; Hispanic designers have earnings at the 82 percent level; Hispanic musicians and composers have earnings at the 76 percent level.

Two occupations--authors, and postsecondary art, drama and music teachers--have less than half the shares of Hispanics found in the overall experienced civilian labor force. Hispanic authors, however, have median earnings that are extraordinarily high in comparison to other authors, at 171 percent of those for all persons in this field, while the Hispanic postsecondary teachers have the lowest relative earnings of any of these combinations of occupation and ethnicity, at 74 percent of those for all full-time workers in the field.

The data for those classed in the "other" racial/ethnic category are very different. This group includes Asians and Pacific Islanders, and American Indians, Eskimos and Aleuts. There are approximately three Asian-Americans for every Native American, so the "other" group is predominantly one of ethnic Polynesians, Chinese, Japanese, Filipinos, Koreans and Vietnamese. These persons are more common in the 11 artist occupations than in the experienced civilian labor force in general, and their full-time median earnings are seven percent higher than those of all artists.

Within the 11 fields, more than double the usual share of dancers have Asian or Native American backgrounds--5.4 percent, compared to 2.6 percent for the artist occupations generally and 2.2 percent for all workers. However, the "other" dancers, like the Black and Hispanic dancers, earn only 80 percent of the full-time median earnings for dancers generally. "Other" kinds of architects are also present in proportions exceeding those found elsewhere (4.2 percent of all architects in 1980 had Asian or Native American backgrounds); these workers have median earnings that are 94 percent of the median for full-time architects.

Three of the artist occupations--the painters, sculptors, craft artists and printmakers, the designers, and the "Artists N.E.C."--have shares of "other" workers that are similar to or slightly higher than those for the artist fields in general (from 2.6 to 3.0 percent Asian or Native American). The "other" painters and "Artists N.E.C." have median earnings just over par, while the "other" designers are relatively well off, with medians at 112 percent of those for all full-time designers.

Another set of three occupations--the photographers, the musicians and composers, and the postsecondary art, drama and music teachers--have shares of persons with "other" backgrounds that are lower than those for the arts field in general, but similar to or just slightly less than those for the entire experienced civilian labor force. The median earnings of full-time "other" photographers are about par for that occupation, while those of the "other" musicians and composers and postsecondary teachers are relatively low (88 and 89 percent, respectively, of medians for full-time practitioners in the two fields).

A final set of three occupations has somewhat lower relative shares of persons with Asian or Native American backgrounds: the actors and directors, the authors, and the announcers. Authors with "other" backgrounds had relatively good median earnings (11 percent larger than those of all full-time authors); Asian and Native American actors and directors have earnings that are six percent greater than those of all actors and directors; the "other" announcers are just under par.

Weeks Worked

Up to this point, this report has compared earnings among full-time minority and non-minority artists. Full-time has been defined as working 35 or more hours a week and 50 or more weeks a year. Another factor to consider in evaluating artists' earnings is the total number of weeks the artists work during the year. Table 3 shows that minority artists do not work as many weeks in total as non-minority artists. This has the effect of further reducing their total annual earnings. It also widens the gap between white and minority artists' earnings.

The data in Table 3 show that while 75 percent of white artists work 40 or more weeks per year, only 69 percent of all minority artists are in situations where they maintain this work level. Among Black artists only 65 percent work 40 or more weeks per year, while for Hispanic artists the figure is close to 70 percent. The "other" types of minority artists--primarily Asians and American Indians--have work levels closer to the white group.

Another interesting item in Table 3 is what happens to earnings at the lower weeks worked levels--the discrepancies between minority and white earnings disappear. Among artists working 14 - 49 weeks per year, Blacks show median earnings that are slightly higher than median earnings of whites.

Appendix Table A-1 provides the detailed data on which Table 3 is based, with additional detail for specific artist occupations.

Age

Minority artists tend to be younger than white artists. Sixty percent of minority artists are under age 35, compared to 53 percent of white artists. Black artists are the youngest of all the ethnic groups, with 63 percent under age 35 and nearly one-quarter of Black artists under age 25. Over 4 percent of white artists are age 55 and over, while less than 2 percent of minority artists are age 65 and over.

These age statistics help to account for the lower earnings among minority artists. There is a relationship between artists' age and earnings (see Earnings of Artists: 1980, pages 13-14). Earnings rise with age and are at their highest in the 45-54 age group.

The age statistics are also an indication of future trends. As the artist population ages, minorities are likely to have a greater share of artist occupations, if those in the younger age groups continue as artists.

Appendix Table A-2 provides detailed age and ethnicity data for each artist occupation. Appendix Table A-3 gives detailed earnings data by ethnicity for each artist occupation in the 12 major industrial sectors.

II. WOMEN IN THE ARTS: 1980

Number of Women

Table 5 on the next page provides information on the relative distribution and earnings of men and women artists, plus comparative data for the entire experienced civilian labor force (ECLF). The proportion of women workers in the 11 artist occupations rose considerably during the 1970's. In 1970, just over a quarter of all artists were women, compared to 38 percent of the ECLF. By 1980, the 11 artist occupations also averaged 38 percent women. In the meantime, the share of females in the overall work force also increased, to about 43 percent, so the artist occupations still lag behind the general labor force in participation by women--but the gap has been greatly reduced.

Some of the increase in the presence of women workers in the artist occupations can be attributed to changes in the definitions of these fields used by the census; in particular, substantial numbers of workers were added to the group of designers, already the largest of the 11 occupations, and the added workers were more likely than other kinds of designers to be female (for more information, see the Trends report, op. cit., page 25). The only predominantly female artist occupation, the dancers, increased its share of male participants during the decade. The proportion of women workers rose in all of the other occupations except for the actors and directors (which were affected by changes in the Bureau of the Census' occupational classification procedures, leading to the addition of a group of predominately male directors and production workers to the group), and for the musicians and composers. Unlike the other arts occupations, both the "Artists N.E.C." and the postsecondary art, music and drama teachers diminished in numbers over the decade, so the increases in the proportion of women in those groups could be due as much to males leaving these arts occupations as to females entering them.

Earnings

Although substantial changes can be observed in the Census data on the numbers of women in the arts occupations between 1970 and 1980, the same cannot be said of their median earnings. Exact comparisons between 1970 and 1980 are impossible due to numerous changes in the definitions and terms used by the Census, but available data indicate that the relative earnings of women artists have changed very little during the past decade. The printed 1970 Census special report on occupational characteristics, op. cit., provides earnings data on male and female artists, writers, and entertainers who worked at least 30 hours a week for 50 weeks or more in 1969; the same table also provides separate data for earnings of male architects (but not female architects, as there were insufficient numbers of those workers in 1970 for the Census to report their earnings in this tabulation). The median 1969 income of these female artists, writers and entertainers was about 61.5 percent of that of the men (using a weighted average to add in the data for male architects). Compared to the data for 1980 in Table 5, the differences are that the 1980 figures are based on those working at least 35 hours a week; the 1980 data do include women architects, and also include both male and female postsecondary art, music, and drama teachers; and the 1980 data exclude those workers--the editors,

technical writers, and athletes--that are included in the Bureau of the Census' broad summary group of artists, writers and entertainers, as noted in the introduction to this report. The median earnings of women artists reported in these 1980 data are 59.6% percent of those obtained for men. If one assumes that both the inclusion in the 1980 census data of female architects, and the exclusion of the editors, technical writers, and athletes, would tend to boost the relative earnings of women, then it may be that their relative earnings have decreased even more.

A different test of changes over time in relative earnings of women artists is provided by the data in Table 6 on the following page. The comparison is still not a "pure" one because of changes between 1970 and 1980 in the way the Bureau of the Census counted and classified artists. In particular, large numbers of workers were added to both the actors and directors and to the designer groups in 1980. Also, the numbers in Table 6 overstate the difference between men and women, at least in terms of earnings for similar levels of invested effort, because they are based on all workers and not just on those that worked full-time--and women are much more likely than men to be part-time earners. With allowance for these discrepancies,

however, the general conclusion is reinforced that the relative level of women's earnings in the arts, compared to that of men, has not improved a great deal over the ten-year period. Within the 11 occupations, there does seem to be evidence of improvement for the announcers, musicians and composers, and painters, sculptors, craft artists, and printmakers, but these gains are offset by losses elsewhere. Note that the statistics in Table 6 are not comparable to those in the other tables in this report. Table 6 treats women's earnings as a percentage of male earnings; in other tables, both women's and men's earnings are reported as a percentage of the overall overall medians for both sexes combined.

Table 7 on the next page provides statistics on the numbers of men and women, and their earnings relative to overall median earnings, for each of the 11 artist occupations. Architecture is the artist occupation with the lowest share of women; because women are relatively rare, male earnings are not much larger than the overall median for full-time architects. Median earnings for the full-time women architects are about 70 percent of those for full-time architects in general, a result close to that for all of the artist occupations.

Eighty-two percent of the announcers are men. Female median earnings for full-time announcers are 78 percent the size of those for full-time announcers generally. Other predominantly male artist occupations (76 to 66 percent men) are the photographers, with female full-time earnings at the 69 percent level; the musicians and composers, with full-time female earnings at the 72 percent level; and the actors and directors, with full-time females earnings at the 80 percent level.

Two of the fields--the "Artists N.E.C." and the authors--are 59 and 56 percent male, respectively. Full-time female "Artists N.E.C." median earnings are 73 percent of those for all full-time workers in this residual group of artists. Full-time female authors' median earnings are at the 80 percent level.

In three of the occupations--the painters/sculptors/craft artists/print-makers, the postsecondary art/drama/music teachers, and the designers--the sexes are balanced more or less equally. Full-time women designers' median earnings are about two-thirds (67 percent) of those for full-time designers in general. The similar proportion for the other two fields is four-fifths, or 80 percent.

The dancers are the only artist occupation where females predominate (only 25 percent of the dancers are men). The premium for full-time work in this profession is such that it ranks first for both sexes in terms of the relative advantage in earnings enjoyed by the full-time workers--but sharp differences among the two sexes persist, with median earnings for full-time women at 89 percent of those for all workers, while those for full-time men are at the 137 percent level!

Table 7 shows that there is a general inverse relationship between the proportion of males in these occupations and the size of the relative earnings advantage enjoyed by the men. This outcome is a result of the fact that in fields like architecture there are simply too few women for the males' advantage to amount to much in terms of differences between them and all workers in the occupation. As the share of men becomes lower, their general ability to obtain higher median earnings begins to make more and more difference, until it reaches an extreme point for artists in the group of dancers. There is no comparable tendency among women for their relative earnings to be related to their share of the work force.

Table 8 on the next page provides a somewhat different perspective on relative earnings differences between the sexes. Like Table 6, it includes part-time as well as full-time workers, so it exaggerates the differences between men and women. It is useful, however, as a guide to variations in these relative earnings differences among different kinds of workplaces.

This table illustrates the same relationship between the proportion of men in a field and their relative "edge" in median earnings that was noted above in the comments on Table 7. There is a strong relationship between the proportion of females in each industrial sector and the size of the relative advantage in median earnings enjoyed by the men. No such relationship seems apparent in the data for females. There are two kinds of workplaces in the rankings where the males do not appear to obtain as much "edge" as men elsewhere: the general merchandise stores, which include

department stores, and the printing industries. On the other hand, the men seem to get more than the expected degree of extra earnings in the agricultural/mining/forestry sector.

Weeks Worked

Most of the earnings data reported above compares full-time males with full-time females. Full-time has been defined as working 35 or more hours a week and 50 or more weeks a year. When looking at the total number of weeks artists work during the year there are some important differences between men and women artists. Table 9 shows that women do not work as many weeks during the year as male artists work. About half (49 percent) of women artists work 50 or more weeks per year, while 65 percent of men artists work this much. Work levels affect total earnings; because women tend to work fewer weeks during the year, this factor widens the gap between male and female earnings.

Table 9 also clearly shows that no matter how many weeks per year women work, when compared with men who work the same amount of time, women still earn considerably less. Among artists who worked 14-39 weeks per year, women's earnings averaged \$3,839 per year while men's averaged \$5,465 per year. Among artists who worked 40-49 weeks per year, women's earnings averaged \$6,002 per year while men's averaged \$10,422 per year. This earnings gap increases as the number of weeks worked increases.

Appendix Table A-1 provides the detailed data on which Table 9 is based, with additional detail for specific artist occupations.

Age

Over half of all artists are under the age of 35, making the arts a youthful field. Women artists tend to be younger than their male counterparts--57 percent of the women are under age 35, while 52 percent of male artists are under age 35. One out of every five female artists is under the age of 25. Among older artists, 14 percent of the males and 12% of the females are 55 and over.

These age statistics help to account for the lower earnings among female artists. There is a relationship between artists' age and earnings (see Earnings of Artists: 1980, pages 13-14). Earnings rise with age and are at their highest in the 45-54 age group.

The age statistics are also an indication of future trends. As the artist population ages, women are likely to have a greater share of artist occupations, if those in the younger age groups continue to work as artists.

Appendix Table A-2 provides detailed age, sex and ethnicity data for each artist occupation.
