ABSTRACT

An informal handbook for both the undergraduate and graduate student in education, this guide begins by briefly describing and explaining the card catalog, Library of Congress Subject Headings, Library of Congress Classification System, and the Dewey Decimal System. It then lists some of the more useful materials and reference works basic to general research and gives their location in Fogler Library at the University of Maine. The 14 categories of information described in the guide include: (1) abstracts and indexes; (2) audiovisual sources; (3) computerized searching; (4) directories; (5) dissertations; (6) encyclopedias and dictionaries; (7) free materials; (8) guides; (9) handbooks; (10) journals; (11) statistical sources; (12) style manuals; (13) tests; and (14) yearbooks. Brief annotations accompany the majority of examples cited, and the various collections of print and nonprint materials available in the learning materials center are briefly described. (CGD)

CARD CATALOG

The card catalog is the key to books and other library materials. It functions as an index to a major portion of the resources found in Fogler Library.

**CALL  
NUMBERS  
AND  
CLASSIFICATION**

Most of the books in Fogler Library are classified in the Library of Congress Classification System (LC) which is based upon letter and number combinations. The call number of a book classified in this system is shown below.

Ref	Location symbol - Indicates the book is in Reference
LB	Classification - Theory and practice of education
1051	Subclass - Educational psychology
D56	Derived from author's name

There are still volumes in the Library classified in the Dewey Decimal System (DDC) which was used prior to 1967. These books, though older, may still be useful. Example:

374.8	Classification - Adult education - Continuation schools
EV16	Derived for author's name

All call numbers, LC or Dewey, are found in the upper left hand corner of the catalog card. Copy the entire number.

**ABSTRACTS  
AND  
INDEXES**

Topics of current interest, preliminary reports of field work and other research are found in journals and other serial publications. Such publications are generally inaccessible through the card catalog. Periodical indexes and abstracts are the keys to this type of literature.

An Index is usually arranged alphabetically by subject and supplies bibliographic citations to articles in magazines, books, pamphlets, etc. The citation for a periodical article contains the following elements:

- Name of author(s)
- Title of article
- Name of Journal
- Volume number and date
- Inclusive page numbers

An abstract supplies all of the above, plus a summary or description of the article.

All of the Abstracts and Indexes described below are located in the Reference Area.

**COMPUTERIZED  
SEARCHING**

Computerized searching (often called database searching) is an automated method of scanning indexes of journal articles and other literature in order to compile a list of references on a particular subject. Those abstracts and indexes which may be accessed by computer are described in the previous section. Check at the Information Desk for information on procedures and costs.

**JOURNALS**

Fogler Library holds approximately 250 journals in education. For complete information on Fogler's holdings in education and its related fields consult the Master Periodicals List and Periodicals Listed by Subject. These computer print-outs contain all titles, current and retrospective, of journals, newspapers and indexes held by Fogler. They may be found at the Information Desk and the Periodicals Desk.

The Learning Materials Center, located on the 2nd floor of the Fogler Library, houses several representative collections of educational materials, print and non-print. Designed primarily to aid the student teacher corps and faculty of the UM, the Center maintains the following collections: Juvenile and teen literature, current textbooks for grades K-12, curriculum guides, a resource (information) file, publisher's catalog file and non-print media: slides, phonodiscs, audiotape cassettes, film strips and pictures. Supplemental audio-visual materials for use in college courses are also shelved in the LMC. A limited number of filmstrip viewers, cassette players, record players and additional A-V equipment is maintained for previewing of materials.
