ABSTRACT

This directory lists over 250 non-profit and for-profit arts organizations in 90 Alaskan communities. Compiled as a resource guide for artists, arts administrators, and teachers, this document offers information that assist them in sharing resources, communicating, and coordinating arts activities. It contains information from and about arts organizations, schools, school districts, libraries, museums, city governments, arts businesses, and commercial galleries. It is organized by city and contains information about each city's population size and the name, address, telephone number, and director of the included arts organizations. Budget data for non-profit organizations and a short description of each organization's purpose and major activities are provided. Information about seven national or regional organizations and a map indicating Alaska's communities that are represented in the directory are included. (JHP)

INTRODUCTION

Alaska Arts Resource Directory, a listing of over 250 nonprofit and for-profit arts organizations in 90 communities, is published by Arts Alaska as a reference for artists, arts administrators, teachers and others involved in the arts to assist them in communicating, cooperating in the sharing of resources, and coordinating arts activities.

Information for *Alaska Arts Resource Directory* was solicited from arts organizations, schools, school districts, libraries, museums, city governments, arts businesses, and commercial galleries throughout the state. Alaska Arts Southeast permitted us to purchase the information compiled for their *1985 Alaska Arts Directory* to facilitate this effort. Nonprofits were offered free listings; commercial businesses were listed for a small fee. We are grateful to those businesses as well as our advertisers for participating with us in this venture. Their support has made possible the free distribution of this publication.

Inclusion or omission of a nonprofit organization or commercial business in this directory in no way implies an endorsement or rejection of any organization or business.

We have attempted to provide accurate and comprehensive information. While this directory was in production several organizations were in the process of moving; some were searching for new staff or board members. New organizations were being formed; others were experiencing a period of inactivity which made it difficult to obtain current information. Arts Alaska welcomes suggestions, corrections and additional information in order to update and improve future editions of this directory.
