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ABSTRACT

The annual performance report of the Austin Independent School District (AISD) for the 1986-87 school year contains the information required by the State Board of Education reconfigured into district-level and campus-level (individual school) information. Data include: the Superintendent's Report for 1986-87, dropout rates, class size above selected reporting levels, information gathered by the Texas Education Agency, student achievement, discipline, instructional expenditures per average daily attendance, personnel turnover rates, and student/teacher ratios by program. Priorities for the year were improvement in: (1) curriculum and instruction; (2) human resources services; (3) communication and pride; and (4) management efficiency. Achievements for each priority are detailed. Across all grades and test areas, AISD students generally scored above national averages on standardized tests, including the Scholastic Aptitude Test. Dropout rates declined for high school although they rose for junior high. Campus-level statistics are presented in data tables. (SLD)

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FOREWORD

An annual performance report, conceptualized as a "report to the stockholders," is an outgrowth of Texas' education reforms as passed in both HB 246 and HB 72. The 1986-87 school year report is the third to be prepared. Everchanging formats and definitions coming from the State Board of Education and the Texas Education Agency have made preparation of an annual performance report a challenging task for local school systems. AISD's third annual performance report has only a few similarities to the first and second, and the fourth is likely to differ substantially, also. Eventually, we expect that these reports will assume a standard format that will greatly facilitate comparisons across school years and across school districts.

Copies of this report will be available in every school library for inspection. Individual copies may be purchased for \$12.00 from the Department of Management Information.

Format Descriptions

The annual performance report must contain three sections as specified by SBOE rule. AISD's report contains these three sections, but they are reconfigured into two parts. This enables readers to locate district-level or campus-level information easily. The following chart shows where the information from each of the three sections appears in the two parts of AISD's report.


Dear Madam President and Members of the Board:






TEAMS Mathematics



- ✎ AISD had 51 National Merit Scholarship semifinalists (47 finalists) — 7.3 times the expected number for a district the size of AISD.

B. To reduce the failure rate of students, particularly grades 7-9

Retainees

- The number of students retained in a grade in 1986-87 was lower than in 1985-86. The differences were especially marked in grade 1 and grades 7 through 11.

TAP and AIP

- The Transitional Academic Program at F.R. Rice and W.R. Robbins enrolled 275 students in 1986-87 in a program to earn high school course credits while completing remedial junior high courses. Of these, 229 were still enrolled in school at the end of the school year. Two of these students were on campus honor rolls, and one received a Trustee Award. Three of the TAP students had transferred out of the District, and the whereabouts of two were unknown.
- The Academic Incentive Program to provide intensive remediation in language arts, reading, and mathematics was available at Martin Junior High in the fall of 1986. The program expanded to Dobie and Burnet Junior High Schools in the spring of 1987. The program served 143 students through the year at the three schools.

Failing Grades


- The percentage of AISD students who lost eligibility for extracurricular activities by failing one or more course in grades 9 through 12 declined noticeably from the fall semester 1985 to fall, 1986. Ninth and tenth graders posted smaller declines in the spring semester, while more students in grades 11 and 12 had failing grades in the spring semester of 1986-87 than in the spring semester of 1985-86.

- Students in grades 7 and 8 have no end-of-first-semester grades, but at the end of the year the percent of students failing a course decreased compared to 1985-86.

TEAMS Exit-Level Mastery

- Of AISD seniors who were eligible to graduate in May, 1987, and were required to pass the Exit-Level TEAMS, 99.4% passed both areas of the test. Only 17 students were denied diplomas in the first year of this new graduation requirement.



Curriculum/Instruction

C. To reduce the number of students dropping out of school

- ☆ A Dropout Prevention Policy, WINGS, was approved by the Board of Trustees on November 24, 1986. The WINGS Program includes these components: communications, program development, community involvement, evaluation, recognition, and articulation.
- ☆ Each individual school developed a dropout prevention plan. Specific activities/strategies and programs were used to encourage students to stay in school. These plans and their implementation were monitored on a regular basis.
- ☆ Through Adopt-A-School and call-in volunteers, tutoring and mentoring activities were conducted in many secondary schools.
- ☆ The WINGS program received \$1,228 from a charity basketball game with Kool and the Gang, and \$12,250 from the Greater Southwest Optimists Fajita Cook-Off.
- ☆ The Office of Research and Evaluation sent lists of high risk students to all schools in the fall.
- ☆ The TAP and AIP programs served 418 students at the junior high level who were at risk of dropping out as a result of being retained.
- ☆ Evening School enrolled 106 students and returning dropouts during 1986-87 to take courses toward diplomas.
- ☆ The Zenith Diploma Program, an adult basic education program at the Evening High School, enrolled 52 dropouts during 1986-87, who returned to seek diplomas.

☆ In 1986-87 the annual dropout rate for high school students dropped for the second year, from 10.7% to 10.2% of high school membership. At the same time, however, the percent of junior high students who dropped out rose from 5.1% to 6.3%.

Curriculum/Instruction

D. To emphasize the prevention of drug abuse

- ✓ A kindergarten-through-twelfth-grade policy on Drug and Alcohol Abuse was approved by the Board of Trustees on October 10, 1986.
- ✓ Workshops and training by Region XIII, Charter Lane Hospital, and Faulkner Center staffs have been provided to key staff at each district campus.
- ✓ The number of alcohol-related discipline incidents decreased in the secondary schools in 1986-87, from 69 to 55. The number of drug-related incidents increased from 214 in 1985-86 to 252 in 1986-87.

E. To begin a study of the elementary social studies and science curriculum with the goal to identify ways to make units more interesting, teachable

- ✓ A three-year plan for strengthening the elementary social studies curriculum was developed, beginning with the analysis and evaluation of the existing social studies curriculum. As a result, two new social studies units were developed and other curricula were updated or enhanced.
- ✓ Acting on the recommendations of a social studies teacher-advisory committee and feedback from teachers at the February, 1987, districtwide staff development, a group of teachers this summer produced curriculum materials.
 - Grades 1 and 2, activities on the Constitution
 - Grades 1, 2, and 3, mini-lessons on "Influences of Austin's Geographic Setting"
 - Grades 1 and 3, units on "Colonial Leaders" and "A Study of People Through Shelter," incorporating the mural method and other mnemonic devices
 - Grade 2, supplementary lessons on the "Texas" unit of Our World
 - Grade 3, supplementary lessons for additional activities in economics
 - Grade 4, mini-lessons on "A Study of Austin Through Culture"
 - Grade 5, supplementary lessons on the Constitution
- ✓ Social Studies resource lists were updated on several topics, including Texas, economics and government—the Constitution and law.
- ✓ The District is working with Capital Metro to obtain new units on public transportation which will be used in grades 1, 3, and 5.
- ✓ More than 500 elementary teachers (grades 1 through 6) attended social studies in-service training in August, 1987.
- ✓ In the area of science education, progress continued to be made in strengthening the curriculum.
 - ✓ A Science Resource Manual was compiled for the District, documenting efforts over the past three years to improve the delivery of science instruction to students. It describes the science curriculum to the essential elements, identifies AISD competencies in science, provides information on special science staff development. Information on the Science Materials Center is also included.
 - ✓ Special efforts were made to improve teacher training in the presentation of science material through summer in-service workshops in the sciences. The workshops provided content knowledge, hands-on experience in presenting information to students, and experience in developing teaching materials. Ninety teachers attended a three-day "Hands on Science" workshop for teachers of grades K through 5; about 120 teachers attended a two-day session focusing on the content areas of life science, earth science, and physical science.
 - ✓ Science fairs were held on 54 campuses, the largest number ever.

Human Resources

A. To improve staff recruitment , staff support activities, and staff development activities

Progress toward our faculty/staff recruitment goals has been made; however, the reality of the scarcity of certified minority teachers is evident in statewide statistics.

- ✦ The Personnel Office was reorganized during 1986-87 to increase efficiency and improve efforts to recruit well qualified teachers and administrators and to meet hiring goals for minorities.
- ✦ To improve minority recruitment efforts, five schools have been targeted for intensive public relations efforts, including contact with students by AISD personnel officers. The targeted schools were:
 - Lincoln University,*
 - Cheyney State University,*
 - University of Maryland Eastern Shore,*
 - Delaware State University, and*
 - Bowie State College.*
- ✦ Colleges in the Rio Grande Valley were also visited, with intensive recruiting efforts concentrated there.
- ✦ The Office of Staff Development was transferred into the Personnel Office in March, 1987 in order to improve coordination among personnel-related activities. Changes in training requirements from the Texas Education Agency were incorporated into plans for 1987-88 staff development.


B. To develop staff recognition activities

- + In November, 1986, faculties that encouraged high student attendance during the October Attendance Emphasis were rewarded with faculty receptions, t-shirts, and certificates of recognition.
- + A program to recognize AISD employees for extended terms of service will be initiated in September. The District will recognize approximately 4,100 employees by presenting them pins for 5, 10, or 25 years of service.
- + Each issue of the Messenger since March, 1987, has given recognition to outstanding teachers for their contributions to quality in the classroom. This feature will continue.


C. To implement the new Teacher Appraisal System effectively

- + The State trained and certified 286 AISD appraisers to use the Texas Teacher Appraisal System.
- + During the 1986-87 school year, four observations were conducted of each of about 3700 teachers. Administrators were assisted with the TTAS paperwork by an on-line computer program that allowed appraisers to receive immediate calculations and summaries from ratings entered at each campus.
- + Teachers have mixed feelings about the new teacher appraisal system.
 - ⇒ Most elementary teachers thought their principals gave clear explanation of how the system would work, and that principals followed the process as outlined. Over half of all teachers reported that the system was implemented fairly at their campuses.
 - ⇒ However, most teachers report that they do not understand the system fully. Nine out of ten teachers reported having questions, and fewer than half claimed to be well prepared for it.
 - ⇒ Few teachers considered the new system an improvement over the old, and almost all reported anxiety over the appraisal system at their campuses.

Communication and Pride

A. To provide information to parents and the community about the variety and quality of AISD programs and services

- ⇒ One hundred news releases and press summaries were distributed to the news media, an 80% increase over 1985-86, and a broader range of media outlets was included in the distribution of releases. Much of the information was published in the new AISD Notes in the Austin American-Statesman, and some items were developed further by the electronic media.
- ⇒ Agendas for the Board of Trustees' meetings are aired on Cable 8 during the weekend before each meeting to improve community access to the information.
- ⇒ Local television stations discussed the District's Dropout Prevention Program, and featured Adopt-A-School in a half-hour program.
- ⇒ Brochures have been produced and distributed to highlight District programs such as:
 - Dropout prevention,*
 - Peer Assistance and Leadership (PAL) program, and*
 - The District honors program.*
- ⇒ A Discipline Management handbook in both English and Spanish was prepared for parents and staff.
- ⇒ Adopt-A-School window decals were distributed to 300 adopters, to promote the program and the District.
- ⇒ When boundary changes were being considered, 350,000 copies of maps and handouts were distributed to all parents and the community. The changes under consideration were shown, and public information meetings were publicized. Community leaders (103) were sent schedules of meetings and background information.
- ⇒ When boundary changes were adopted, summaries of the changes were sent to 60 Austin area realtors, and changes were published.
- ⇒ The 1987-88 budget was discussed in a 25-page Budget Summary for distribution to staff and the public.

B. To emphasize and improve parent/ community involvement

- ✓ Volunteer Advisory Committee meetings were held regularly through 1986-87. New members were added and officers selected. The Executive Committee met in December and January to develop goals and functions, which were adopted by the Committee.
- ✓ Public service announcements have been produced and shown on Cable Channel 8, KVUE, and KBVO to recruit volunteers as tutors, speakers, library aides, foster grandparents, etc. As a result of recruiting efforts 130 tutors, 400 resource speakers, and 100 other volunteers were trained and placed by the Volunteer Office. Speakers were available in areas including substance abuse, dropout prevention, career awareness, and for It's Your Future, a career awareness TV show.
- ✓ Phi Delta Kappa, Kiwanas—Golden K—Austin, and Teen Pregnancy Forum members attended orientation sessions for service groups.
- ✓ Parent Involvement workshops have been held:
 - October 12 at Allan, where 150 parents attended;*
 - January 23 at Blackshear, where 50 parents attended;*
 - Weekly sessions for parents of students in bilingual education, where 6 to 12 parents have attended each of 10 sessions;*
 - January and February at Brooke, where 200 parents attended each of two sessions on new immigration laws; and*
 - Five weekly sessions in May and June for parents of students in the secondary bilingual program.*
- ✓ Austin hosted the Texas Parent Coordinating Council Conference in February. Twenty AISD parents represented the District as participants.
- ✓ National Volunteer Day was observed with a reception on November 12, and the Volunteer of the Month, Mr. Mique Davis, was honored, along with Ms. Dana Mattingly, 1986 AISD Volunteer of the Year.
- ✓ The Austin American-Statesman/Neighbor has reinstated a Volunteers in AISD feature. Letters and press releases have been sent to staff and organizations for nominations.
- ✓ Ms. Cathy Christian was recognized by the Board of Trustees on April 13, 1987, as the 1987 AISD Volunteer of the Year, and the annual AISD Salute to Volunteers was held April 14.

Communication and Pride

C. To promote and expand Adopt-A-School

- ✓ AISD Adopt-A-School in 1986-87:

Doubled the number of adopters—from 178 in September, 1986 to 368 in May, 1987;

Increased the number of volunteer hours by adopters from 6,587 to 31,672;

Had six times as many volunteers as in 1985-86, from 676 to 4,068; and

Doubled both the cash donations and the donations of furniture, carpet, books, equipment, etc.

- ✓ Adopters have been recognized and staff and the community informed of Adopt-A-School activities and accomplishments by:

Regular articles in newspapers and newsletters,

Public service announcements and TV news releases,


Framed certificates of recognition presented by the schools to adopters,

An AAS Salute reception in May, where 37 A+ Adopters of the Year were honored, and


At the AAS Salute reception, The 1987 Report to Partners was presented, which listed all 368 adopters and the contributions made by adopters to AISD in 1986-87.

- ✓ Members of the AAS Chairman's Council are beginning to disseminate information to the community, including various civic groups. The AAS Booster Club has been formed to attract individuals who are not associated with adopters to support the program.


Adopt-A-School Volunteers




Adopt-A-School Volunteer Hours Worked

Management Efficiency

A. To develop a sound budget plan, recognizing current economic realities

Despite gloomy predictions, a reasonable budget, salary increases, and tax rate were adopted by the Board of Trustees for 1987-88.

Major features of this budget include:

- ✓ Limiting the increase in the effective tax rate to 7.1%, compared to previous tax increases of...

14.3% in 1986-87

9.2% in 1985-86

7.9% in 1984-85

7.9% in 1983-84

- ✓ After a year with no salary increases, raising employee salaries by:


5.40% for professionals

4.85% for administrators

- ✓ Absorbing a reduction in the percentage of the budget provided by the State.

Management Efficiency

B. To complete a plan for effective use of instructional space, including school boundaries and school bonds

- ✓ After extended staff work, 13 public information meetings, and two Board public hearings, the Board on April 13, 1987, adopted a new student assignment plan, to impact elementary and junior high/middle schools in 1987-88 and high schools in 1988-89.
- ✓ During the summer, 37 portable buildings were moved and 32 new portables were built to accommodate new arrangements of students. Teacher materials, textbooks, and other materials were moved to new locations and repairs and renovations were completed. Elementary and junior high/middle school students and staff were notified of their new school assignments for 1987-88, and schools opened on September 1 with students and staff in place.
- ✓ Notices of boundary meetings, student assignments, and school opening information were broadcast on Cable Channel 8, and Hotlines on student assignments and school information were open in February, April, August, and September, 1987.
- ✓ Planning for a new bond issue calls for thorough review and detailed analysis of attendance patterns and space use in existing buildings after school starts in September. Future bond needs can be determined only after new forecasts are available based on the new assignment plan implemented this fall, which includes a new middle school configuration and smaller class size at 16 priority elementary schools.
- ✓ A bond issue timeline has been drafted to focus attention on processes preliminary to the bond election. It suggests that analysis of bond needs be completed by November 1, 1987, so a bond proposal can be presented in a timely, effective manner.

C. To improve the effectiveness of the internal audit system

- ✓ In order to conduct management efficiency audits of District departments and to make more frequent audits of activity funds, the District added two internal auditors, for a total audit staff of five.

Management Efficiency

D. To reduce paperwork for teachers and administrators

Paperwork issues were assessed throughout the year by the districtwide Information Services Committee (ISC) as well as the four major divisions and various departments and units.

Three major reports were completed during 1986-87. Follow-up on these reports forms the basis for identifying and implementing future paperwork reduction:

1. The School Office Review conducted by Internal Audit,
2. A Study of the Referral Process for Special Education and Communication/Interaction Between Regular and Special Education Teachers, conducted by a committee appointed by the Superintendent as a result of AAT Consultation,
3. The Principals' In-Basket Study conducted by ORE at the request of the ISC.

The Board of Trustees approved a revised and expanded paperwork reduction policy in December, 1986. The policy includes definition of the role of the Information Services Committee (ISC) in controlling paperwork and information gathering in the District.

Major paperwork reduction activities which occurred during the 1986-87 school year include:

- ✓ Registration forms for returning students are computer printed before registration, to save staff and parent time in the registration process.
- ✓ Texas Teacher Appraisal System (TTAS) observation records were entered directly into the computer by the appraisers, saving hand writing and calculating 3,700 appraisal records. Forms to be signed by the teachers were computer generated. The system increased speed and accuracy, and eliminated the need for appraisers to add, convert, average, and interpret scores on the TTAS.
- ✓ Student attendance cards used by teachers to report student absences to the school office are printed by computer, so they need not be hand written by the teacher or clerk.
- ✓ ORE developed a system for scoring TEAMS practice tests and producing classroom summaries, so that teachers receive immediate feedback without hand scoring the tests.
- ✓ ORE and Elementary Education are working on a system for machine scoring end-of-book tests for basal readers for grades three through six. The system will save teachers the time previously required for hand scoring and recording results.
- ✓ The central process for data collection for the Faculty Advisory Committee Question/Answer document was computerized to shorten the process and provide greater access for a more thorough review.
- ✓ Vision and Hearing staff have reduced a four-page form to two pages, and have combined 11 other forms into one unit on NCR paper. This consolidates the forms, eliminates repetition, and saves time for classroom teachers, testing technicians, and clerks.
- ✓ The Texas Education Agency produced Documenting Mastery, a guideline for campus use, and distributed copies to campuses.

Management Efficiency

E. To maintain a strong legislative liaison effort

- ✓ AISD played a leadership role in working with the Urban 8 Texas districts and with the Educational Consortium in proposing and opposing numerous pieces of legislation in the regular and special sessions.
- ✓ AISD worked closely with the Travis County delegation to maximize efforts to ensure that AISD would receive reasonable treatment. The Travis County delegation remained remarkably united, despite some strong political and philosophical differences.
- ✓ AISD's efforts were highly successful in minimizing loss of State funds. Early estimates of possible losses ranged from \$8 million to \$35 million, but the final loss to the District was only \$5 million.
- ✓ There was an effort made by some groups to change the Price Differential Index (PDI) to a Cost Differential (CDI), which would have cost AISD a minimum of \$30 per student. AISD assisted in efforts which prevented legislators from filing a CDI bill.
- ✓ The State Board of Education voted on the third reading to maintain the current Price Differential Index (PDI) which places AISD at the highest index.
- ✓ In January, 1987, the State Board of Education voted to include exemptions from the 8% rollback provisions for school districts that lose funds in its legislative package.

F. To improve the system of management information

Long-Range System Plan

- ✦ The Long-Range Plan for Data Services is complete. Hardware has been purchased and installation was completed in April, 1987. Major hardware upgrades were made in the central processing unit, on-line memory, a laser printer, tape drives, remote terminals, and control units. System software has been upgraded from DOS to MVS to provide for more efficient management of computer programs. In addition, data-base management and inquiry software will tie all data together and allow for answering "what if" questions for decision makers. Work that was slowing down as the old computer system neared capacity will run about 3 to 6 times faster in the future.

Financial Management

- ✦ A contract for application software through the Region XIII Service Center was approved by the Board of Trustees on July 13, 1987. Within a year, applications should be in place for budget control, general ledger, accounts payable, fixed assets, purchasing, payroll, and personnel.

Boundaries

- ✦ Software and hardware improvements made possible the complex job of creating new boundaries for schools. On-line student addresses, street maps, and bus-route data can now be analyzed and used instantly.

TOSS

- ✦ Many central and school staff are now proficient and regular users of Total Office Support System (TOSS). From virtually no use in 1985-86, TOSS use has grown to 5,400 entries per week in May, 1987. This message system reduces paperwork and ensures prompt communication among its users in the administration building and on the campuses, as each entry eliminates the need for a memo or telephone call.

Warehouse Requisitions

- ✦ Warehouse purchase requisitions and textbook inventory software systems have been written and are in use. With these systems, orders are sent on-line, reducing paperwork and streamlining processing.

Training

- ✦ District audits of school procedures for accounting for student membership, attendance, and staffing led to intensive training of school clerical staff in August, 1987. Uniform practice and use of on-line systems were emphasized.

The Office of Research and Evaluation annually summarizes AISD's dropout situation at grades 7-12. In this report the school year dropout counts for 1983-84 through 1986-87 are reported, as well as the current status of the entering ninth graders of 1983-84 through 1986-87, and entering seventh graders of 1985-86 and 1986-87.

MAJOR FINDINGS:

- The group who entered ninth grade for the first time in 1983-84 has now been followed for four complete years. As of October, 1987, 26.7% of this group has dropped out. The dropout rate for Hispanics from this group is 37.7%, for Blacks 30.0%, and for Anglo/Others 21.2%.
- The annual high school dropout rate for the school year 1986-87, as of July 1, 1987, was 10.3%. This is 0.5 percentage points lower than the school year rate for 1985-86 and 0.8 percentage points lower than 1984-85.
- The school-year rates for Hispanics and Anglo/Others were lower than in 1985-86, while the rate for Blacks was higher.
- The school-year dropout rate for 1986-87 seventh and eighth graders as of July 1 was 6.3%. This is 1.2 percentage points higher than 1985-86 and 2.4 percentage points higher than 1984-85. The concurrent increase in junior high retentions may be responsible.

1986-87 Dropout Report

Introduction

AISD's dropout rate is:

- a) 27%
- b) 12%
- c) 10%
- d) It depends.

The correct answer is "it depends." It depends on the grade span of interest. It depends on whether you include summer or just the school year. It depends on whether you're interested in an annual or long-term rate. The simple truth is that there are many legitimate ways to calculate a dropout rate, and that however much one might wish it were otherwise, there is no single number that can adequately express the District's dropout situation.

The Office of Research and Evaluation (ORE) has been monitoring AISD's dropout situation and publishing an annual report since 1983-84. During that time our methods, time frames, cohort definitions, or some combination have changed annually as we have learned more about the complexities of counting dropouts. Although our numbers have steadily gained accuracy and meaning as a result, we have paid a price in year-to-year comparability, a fact which has been frustrating to us as to the community at large. We think it has been worth it, and that we now have a counting and reporting system that will serve us well for the foreseeable future, although state requirements resulting from House Bill 1010 may cause further changes. (For a full discussion of the issues which must be considered in counting dropouts and the evolution of AISD's approach see "Counting Dropouts, It's Enough to Make You Want to Quit Too!," ORE Pub. No. 86.39.)

This year the major change is in the timing of the report and the time span used in calculating the numbers. In the past we have published dropout numbers in the summer, so they could be used in planning for the coming school year. This meant that we could not include summer dropouts, summer transfers, or summer graduates in the results until the following year's report, nor did we give students who transferred late in the school year much time for their new schools to request records (our definition of a nondropout). We ended up with a timely but incomplete report.

We have tried to resolve this issue by adjusting our time frame. This past summer we did a calculation of the school-year dropout rate as of July 1, for the sole purpose of giving the principals and other administrators something, even if incomplete, to use in planning. But for the current, official report we extended the timeline to the fall so that the summer could be included as part

of the preceding school year.

The second important change involves the definition of cohorts for the purpose of longitudinal tracking. In the past we have reported longitudinal dropout rates for the entire group of high school students from a given base year. Unfortunately, such a rate has little if any intrinsic meaning. A better longitudinal rate is for the ninth graders from a particular base year, which we also reported in past years. Finally we realized that this meant that retainees--a group particularly likely to drop out--were counted in more than one cohort of ninth graders. Now we think we have the single best number for expressing the longitudinal high school dropout rate: the rate for each year's group of entering ninth graders. We believe this is the best way to define a cohort for three reasons. First, it is the base group of which people intuitively think when they want to know the long-term, or ultimate, dropout rate. Second, no student is counted in more than one group. Finally, it gives us a number which is somewhat comparable to the longitudinal rate published in our original dropout study, Mother Got Tired of Taking Care of My Baby, which found a 24% dropout rate among the group of all AISD 14-year-olds from September, 1978, after four and one half years.

Definition and Method

One aspect of our dropout system that has not changed is the definition of a dropout. A dropout is a student who has withdrawn from AISD and whose records have not been requested by another school or district. Students who earn GED's are counted as dropouts in our system.

In July, 1986, a longitudinal computerized database (the Secondary Student Longitudinal File, or SSLF) was constructed that enables us to answer questions about the enrollment status of any group of students at any point in time, beginning with the 1983-84 school year for high school students and the 1985-86 school year for seventh and eighth graders.

Our method for assigning dropout status code is as follows:

- Each year's cohort includes all students enrolled in an AISD high school at any time during the school year.
- Any student who withdraws from AISD is first considered a dropout.
- If the student's records are requested by a district, school, or other institution offering a high school diploma, the student is judged to be pursuing an education and his/her classification is changed from "dropout" to "transfer."
- In the fall following each school year, dropout statuses

are assigned to each student on the file. Possible statuses are:

- Currently enrolled as of September 15.
- School-year dropout (withdrew during a school year, with no records request by the end of the first six weeks).
- School-year transfer (withdrew, records request).
- Graduated.
- Died.
- Summer dropout (completed a school year, but did not enroll in the fall by September 15, and no records request by the end of the first six weeks).
- Summer transfer (completed school year, did not enroll in fall, records requested.)

- The dropout rate is calculated by dividing the total number of dropouts (school year plus summer) by the total enrollment. This can be done for any subgroup of interest.

The Annual Rate As It Looked in July (for Comparison Only)

Although (as explained above) the numbers available in July are necessarily incomplete and inadequate, to give a sense of the trend across time, Figure 1 shows the dropout rate for the 1986-87 school year using the old July 1 cutoff date for transcript requests, compared to the three years previous. By this measure the annual rate declined for the second consecutive year for high school students. A lower rate among Hispanics and Anglo/Others accounted for the drop; the rate for Blacks increased.

What Is the Dropout Rate for 1986-87 High School Students as of October?

Figure 2 shows the dropout rates for 1986-87 high school students, broken down by sex, ethnicity, grade, and by time of dropping out. Note that from the October perspective, the number of school-year dropouts drops from 1,809 to 1,426 (reflecting returners and late records requests), but that another 731 left during the summer.

What Percentage of Students Who Enter Ninth Grade in AISD Fail to Graduate?

This is probably the most significant single question about dropouts in our District, and we are now approaching an answer. The group who entered ninth grade during the 1983-84 school year

has been followed for four complete years. Of the 4,641 students in this cohort, 2,377 (51.2%) have graduated from AISD. Six hundred eighty-five (14.8%) have transferred to other districts and not returned. Three hundred thirty-four (7.2%) are still enrolled as of the fall of 1987. Six students have died, and 1,239 (26.7%) have dropped out.

Figure 3 shows the dropout pattern for this group in some detail, as well as that of the first-time ninth graders from 1984-85, 1985-86, and 1986-87. The patterns for each ethnic group are also shown separately.

As the figure shows, about 37.7% of the Hispanic first-time ninth graders from 1983-84 have dropped out so far, compared to 30.0% of Blacks and 21.2% of Anglo/Others.

Counting Junior High Dropouts: Problems and Possible Solutions

We have reported annual junior high dropout rates for several years, but we have always urged that they be interpreted very cautiously because we doubted their accuracy. The problem is that junior high schools do not always request transcripts for their incoming students, probably because graduation credits are not an issue at that level.

During 1986-87 we took steps to assess the extent of this problem and to increase the accuracy of the junior high numbers. First, we conducted a mail survey. We sent each junior high a list of their former students who had (according to our information) dropped out in 1985-86 or 1986-87. In addition to asking them to indicate which students had had their records requested, we asked them to list the suspected whereabouts (city, state, and school if known) of each student whose records had not been requested. Then we wrote to the public school district in that location and asked if the student had enrolled there.

We found that schools thought they knew the whereabouts of about a third of the "dropouts." We mailed surveys to the districts and received a response from 95% of them. The result: about 20% of all "dropouts" (and about 58% of those whose whereabouts were thought to be known by their junior highs) had enrolled in other districts.

This means the rate of "false dropouts" is apparently between 20% and 58%. If all the students whose whereabouts were not known by their former schools are really dropouts, it's 20%. If the rate of false dropouts is the same among those whose whereabouts are not known as among those found by the survey, it's 58%. The truth is most likely somewhere in between. In any case it is a substantial number, and our junior high dropout rates are inflated.

What is the impact of false dropouts on the reported dropout rate? To illustrate, the junior high dropout rate for 1986-87 as of July 1 was 6.3%. If the rate of false dropouts is 20% the true dropout rate would be 5.1%. If the rate of false dropouts is 58% the true rate would be 2.7%.

We have taken steps to reduce the rate of false dropouts and thus to improve our reporting accuracy. First, we emphasized to the schools that a written request for any records, not just a transcript, constitutes valid evidence that the student is enrolled and should be reported to ORE. We had thought this was implicit in the logic of the reporting system, but we had never told the schools this explicitly.

Second, in the fall of 1987 we sent a supply of postcards to middle schools and junior highs for them to give to students who withdraw. The students will be told to give a card to an official at the school in which he or she enrolls. The official is to

indicate that the student has enrolled, sign and date the card and mail it to the student's former school. We hope this will reduce the "false dropout" rate, but in any case the emphasis should be on changes from year to year rather than on the absolute number.

Junior High Dropout Results, 1986-87

Figures 4 and 5 show junior high dropout results for 1986-87. Figure 4 compares previous years' annual rates with the 1986-87 rate as it appeared in July. As with the high school rates shown above, the July rate is given only for the purpose of comparison with previous years.

As the figure shows, there was an increase compared to the previous two years. This may be the result of a large increase in the junior high retention rate, which in turn resulted from new state requirements for junior high promotion.

Figure 5 shows the junior high dropout rate for 1986-87 students with summer included, broken down by sex, ethnicity, and grade. As was also true at high school, the school year dropout rate is lower than it appeared in July, as students returned in the fall or had their records requested after July 1. But again, this is more than offset by the number of summer dropouts.

* The Transitional Academic Program (TAP) served eighth grade retainees. Served students took some ninth grade courses while completing eighth grade requirements for promotion, rather than repeating an entire year of eighth grade. Most TAP students went to regular high schools at midyear. See Launching Toward Success (ORE Pub. No. 86.44) for details about this program.

In the present report, all TAP students are included in junior high totals.

Longitudinal Junior High Dropout Rates

In 1985-86 we added junior high schools to the longitudinal data collection system. Consequently for the first time we have longitudinal data to report for junior high students. As Figure 6 shows, for first-time seventh graders of 1985-86, the dropout rate is about 9.6% as of October, 1987; it is 7.5% for Blacks, 11.2% for Hispanics, and 9.6% for Anglo/Others. From now on we will report longitudinal dropout rates of cohorts of first-time seventh graders annually.

C. Class Sizes above Selected Reporting Levels

HB 72 mandates that districts are to report the number of classes above specified levels; however those levels do not correspond to HB 72 class size limits or to SBOE rules. The class size information reported here merely meets the mandated reporting requirement. There were no class size limits in place in 1986-87 above grade 2. Those effective for grades K-2 limited class sizes to a maximum of 22 students. Each school was allowed to have one class per grade in K-2 with up to 24 students.

DESCRIPTION OF SECTION II DATA

Information Compiled by the Texas Education Agency

Section II of the APR contains district and campus reports. The district report provides information on: students, student standardized test performance, professional personnel, and finance. The district report compares each district to a comparable group of districts and to the state. Districts were assigned to a group based on their enrollment size, wealth, and percentage of low-income students. These classifications created 16 different groups by dividing districts into four size categories; two wealth categories (above or below state average); and two low income categories (above or below 40 percent participation in the Free and Reduced Price Lunch Program). The number of districts and students covered by each group is presented at the end of this document.

The campus report provides information on: students, student standardized test performance, and professional personnel. Currently, financial data at the campus level are not reported to TEA. The campus report, in most cases, compares the campus information to the district averages. Groups were not created at the campus level.

The data sources and formulas used to derive the values in Section II are described below. The order of the descriptions generally follows the sequence of the district report.

Group and state calculations are the same as district calculations, except that aggregate values are used. Campus calculations are the same as district calculations unless otherwise noted. Detail may not add to 100 percent due to rounding.

STUDENT INFORMATION

Student enrollment, including grade and ethnicity, is from the Fall Survey of Pupils in Membership (Fall Survey) taken on October 5, 1986.

Total Enrollment indicates the total number of students in the district, grades pre-kindergarten through 12, on the day the Fall Survey was taken.

Percentage Enrollment by Grade shows the percentage of students in grades pre-kindergarten through six, grades seven through nine, and grades 10 through 12. On the campus report, rather than grade distribution, only the span of grades taught is indicated.

Ethnic Distribution shows each major ethnic group as a percentage of total enrollment.

The following items are found only on the district report.

Enrollment by Special Program provides comparative information concerning the percentage of total Fall Survey enrollment in four special programs: special education, vocational education, gifted/talented education, and bilingual education. The sources for special program enrollments are: special education enrollment as found on the Fall Survey; vocational education participants as defined on the 1986-87 Vocational Education Data Report; gifted and talented participants as found on the October, 1986, Superintendent's Report of Pupil Attendance and Contact Hours (PACH), Table V (students identified and served in operational programs); and, bilingual education participants found on the October, 1986 Bilingual Education Fall more than one of the programs. *Bilingual includes both bilingual and English as a Second Language (ESL) programs.

Program Enrollment X 100
Total Enrollment

Enrollment by High School Subject Area provides comparative information concerning students enrolled in selected subject areas as a percent of total students enrolled. TEST SCORE INFORMATION

The Texas Educational Assessment of Minimum Skills (TEAMS) is a criterion-referenced, standardized test administered annually to all Texas students in Grades 1, 3, 5, 7, 9, and 11. The test is composed of sections measuring objectives in reading, mathematics, and writing. Passing the eleventh grade test is a requirement for graduation. Test results for grades 3, 5, 7, and 9 are from the February, 1987, administration of the test. Grade 3 test results are reported for the test administered in English only. Grade 11 test results are reported for first time takers only, and are from the October, 1986, administration. Grade 1 test results are not included.

Test results are provided to the school districts and to TEA. Scores and diagnostic information are provided for each student tested. State law requires that students not mastering these tests be given remediation. Summary results are developed for each campus and each district as well as the state. This provides a basis for comparison of student performance.

Number of Students Tested is the number of students in each grade who took the test during the 1986-87 school year.

Test results are reported as **National Percentiles** in reading, writing, and mathematics. Raw scores for each subject and grade were normalized, summed, and averaged. These averages were normed against the Metropolitan Achievement Test, Sixth Edition, a nationally norm-referenced achievement test published by the Psychological Corporation. The percentile given for the district, group, or state is TEA's prediction of how the students would perform with respect to all students in the nation had they all taken the norm-referenced achievement test. For example, a percentile score of 55 can be interpreted as a score that is higher than the scores attained by 55% of the students in the nation. The percentiles allow comparisons between campuses, districts, and the state, as well as a comparison with the nation.

Special Populations Tested reports the percent of special education students, bilingual education students, and students from low-income families taking the test in each grade. The special education category summarizes all handicapping conditions and the bilingual education category includes students who participate in bilingual education or English as a Second Language programs.

PROFESSIONAL PERSONNEL INFORMATION

Data for this section are from the 1986-87 Roster of Personnel (Roster). Only certified professional personnel (teachers, administrators, and professional staff) were used in the calculations. Unless otherwise noted, personnel are reported by their major duty only. All counts of personnel are expressed as full-time equivalents (FTE), with the exception of degree held and returning teacher information, which reports head counts instead.

Librarians, nurses, supervisors, and counselors comprise the majority of this category. **Campus Administration** and **Central Administration** are persons who are involved in the management of finances, personnel and/or students in a school. Examples include principals, administrative officers, and superintendents. Administration is identified as either campus or central. Personnel with no campus affiliation, i.e. campus numbers of '000', were categorized as central administration and will appear on the district report only. Personnel types are shown as a percentage of total professional personnel.

Personnel by program are shown as a percentage of total professional staff. On the campus reports, only regular, special, and vocational education programs are reported.

Percent Expenditure by Object aggregates expenditures for all functions within the appropriate object categories. These are expressed as a percent of total expenditures.

Object codes 6300, 6400, and 6600 represent supplies and materials, other operating expenditures, and capital outlay expenditures not made from capital projects funds, respectively.

Tax rate and property value information are from the State Property Tax Board Study of Property (SPTB Study) for tax year 1986, and the State Property Tax Board Self Report (SPTB Self Report) for tax year 1986.

The **Standardized District Tax Rate** is a rate calculated with all property values standardized to 100 percent of market value as found on the SPTB Study. The components of the total standardized rate are based on the maintenance and operations levies (M & O) and interest and sinking fund levies (I & S) found on the SPTB Self Report. Rates are expressed per \$100 of market value.

C. Discipline

Information on disciplinary actions are reported by campus, and for each of the six categories reported, the list includes:

The total number of students who were disciplined, and
The total number of actions taken (any student may have had more than one action.)

The categories of disciplinary actions reported are:

1. EMERGENCY REMOVAL FOR ONE TO THREE DAYS

When the Board or its designee determines that a compelling reason (e.g., being under the influence of drugs or alcohol) exists for removing the student, and temporarily removes the student from the campus prior to disciplinary action, for one to three days.

2. OUT OF SCHOOL SUSPENSION (0 - 6 DAYS)

When the Board or its designee determines that the student's presence in the regular classroom program or at the home campus presents a danger of physical harm to the student or to other individuals, or that the student has engaged in serious or persistent misbehavior that violates the district's previously communicated standards of conduct, and the student is removed from the campus for six days or less.

3. EXPELLED

When by Board action the student is totally deprived of educational services for disciplinary reasons.

4. REMOVED TO A SUPERVISED ALTERNATIVE EDUCATION PROGRAM FOR FOUR TO TEN DAYS

When a student is assigned to a supervised alternative education program (e.g., in-school suspension) as the result of a hearing, for 4 to 10 days.

5. REMOVED TO A SUPERVISED ALTERNATIVE EDUCATION PROGRAM FOR 11 DAYS TO SIX WEEKS

Same as (4) above, except for 11 days to six weeks.

6. REMOVED TO A SUPERVISED ALTERNATIVE EDUCATION PROGRAM FOR MORE THAN SIX WEEKS

Same as (4) above, except for more than six weeks.

E. Personnel Turnover Rates

SPECIFICATIONS: TURNOVER BY CAMPUS

A count of professional staff was compiled by pay location, from the April, 1987 tape. This represents a count for the 1986-87 school year.

Of the professionals who were shown to be at each location in 1986-87, a second count was compiled showing the professionals who remained at the same pay location for the 1987-88 school year. The live file on November 5, 1987 was used for this second count.

The following formula was then used to determine the campus turnover rate:

$$1 - (1987-88 \text{ count} / 1986-87 \text{ count}) = \text{turnover rate}$$

A professional staff member would be counted as "turnover" if they moved to another AISD campus, or terminated employment with AISD, or became a non-professional staff member at the same campus.

The turnover rate for 1986-87 will probably be higher than future years due to the implementation of a new boundary plan which caused an unusual number of reassignments among the professional ranks.

SCE in 1986-87

The State Compensatory Education (SCE) program provides compensatory education to low-achieving elementary students. There are 10 SCE schools. In the districtwide ranking of schools based on the percentages of low-income students, these 10 schools follow (in ranking order) after the 32 Chapter 1 schools. Decisions on which students to serve are based on achievement scores (ITBS) and teacher recommendations. For consistency with Chapter 1, the principals were asked to select students who scored at or below the 30th percentile for SCE services. Teaching mode and subjects covered (reading, language arts, and/or math) are at the discretion of each principal.

LEP Students and Teachers in 1986-87

A LEP student has limited language proficiency in English. The number of LEP students includes only those being served with either bilingual or English as a second language (ESL) instruction. Teachers who provide bilingual instruction must be bilingually endorsed (see definitions below). ESL must be provided by ESL or bilingually endorsed teachers. The number of bilingual, ESL, and ESL-Austin endorsed teachers represents the number of teachers available at each school with such endorsement; however, some may not have taught bilingual or ESL in 1986-87.

Bilingually endorsed -- Teachers have completed a series of college courses preparing them to provide dual language instruction and passed oral and written Spanish proficiency tests.

Regular ESL -- Teachers have completed four college courses focusing on ESL techniques.

Austin ESL -- Teachers had one or more LEP students in their classes prior to 1980-81. TEA granted ESL endorsement to such teachers statewide as long as the teachers stayed in the same district.
