ABSTRACT

This directory contains a listing of federal offices that address women's issues. Among the departments and agencies included are: the executive branch and the executive agencies departments of agriculture, commerce, defense (Air Force, Army, Coast Guard, Marine Corps, National Guard and Navy), education, health and human services, housing and urban development, interior, justice, labor, state, transportation, and treasury; the legislative branch; and the independent establishments and government corporations such as the Environmental Protection Agency, Federal Election Commission, National Aeronautics and Space Administration, and Office of Personnel Management. The document defines issues as policies or employment opportunities. Each office is listed with complete address and phone number. Some offices are given short annotations that explain their purpose or function. (DJC)




## Introduction

In 1986, the Federal Policies, Practices, and Programs Committee of the National Advisory Council on Women's Educational Programs (NACWEP) wanted to access the efforts being made by the Federal government to address women's issues. The Committee asked the staff of the Council to begin a directory listing the Federal agencies and offices that address women's issues, issues being policies or employment opportunities. This project was begun by Deputy Director Patricia A. Weber, now Executive Director of the Council. When Weber was given the post of Executive Director, the project became the responsibility of Assistant to the Executive Director Antoinette Grueninger. In 1988, Grueninger left the Council staff, to be replaced by Mary Anne Murray, who updated the directory and completed the project.

This year, by not reauthorizing the National Advisory Council on Women's Educational Programs, Congress did, in effect, abolish the Council. As the Council prepares to close down, it leaves a final copy of this directory. The Council recognizes that this directory may not be complete, and that it will periodically require updating. It is the hope of the Council that the Department of Education or the White House will deem this directory suitable for continuation, and that this directory will become the responsibility of another federal office.

The Council believes that the role of women in society has changed dramatically since the inception of the National Advisory Council on Women's Educational Programs, and that this listing provides proof that the Federal government has worked to insure that Federal policies keep up with these changing roles.

## Note

The Federal Women's Interagency Board (FWIB) is a non-profit private sector organization, although it bears mentioning in this directory because it is comprised of all the Federal Women's Program Managers of the federal government. [Members of this board are indicated in the directory by an asterick by their name.]

The group began in the early 1970's when an informal group of Federal Women's Program Managers met to explore the possibility of implementing a Federal Women's Program within the federal government. By 1973, the group was holding formal meetings.

The focus of FWIB has changed little since its inception; the group still works to increase the effectiveness of the Federal Women's Program Managers, and to enhance their professionalism through training, mentoring, and networking.
