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ABSTRACT

This document demonstrates the relationships among four Florida nursing education programs (home health aide, nursing assistant, patient care assistant, and practical nursing) by listing student performance standards and indicating which ones are required in each program. The 268 student performance standards are arranged in 23 areas of competence, such as "Use verbal and written communication," and "Perform physical and comfort and safety functions." A Nursing Curriculum Framework specifies which of 23 intended outcomes apply to each program. (CML)

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## INTRODUCTION

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### Relationships among Four Nursing Programs

Since the passage of the Nursing Assistant Certification Law, the nursing home industry has asserted that many of the school districts and community colleges were offering the Nursing Assistant program for too many hours. The industry wanted the program to be offered as much as possible in the nursing homes in order to make up for the shortage of nursing assistants. In an effort to meet the industry's work-force needs, the program was shortened to 120 hours for the postsecondary adult program and to one credit for the secondary program.


Originally, Geriatric Aide was considered for the program title. However, the program advisory committee recommended the use of terminology contained in the law that is specifically directed towards the nursing assistants employed in nursing homes. Thus, the program was titled Nursing Assisting and then was changed to Nursing Assistant at the request of the industry.

In order to prepare individuals to be versatile and employable in hospitals, clinics, home health agencies, private homes, and nursing homes, the Patient Care Assistant program was established. Patient Care Assistant is, therefore, a combination of Nursing Assistant (certification required for nursing homes), Home Health Aide (documentation required for home health agencies), and Hospital Nursing Assistant (no certification or documentation required by law). The recommended length of the Patient Care Assistant program is 300 hours for the postsecondary program and two credits for the secondary program.

Students who have completed an approved Nursing Assistant program should receive advance standing in the Patient Care Assistant program. Both Nursing Assistant and Patient Care Assistant programs will be eligible to submit for Nursing Assistant certification.

Those students who have completed an approved Nursing Assistant program can take an additional 40 hours of instruction in the Home Health Aide (HHA) program to be employable not only in nursing homes but also in private homes and home health agencies. The Home Health Aide program is designed to train students in skills and attitudes necessary for providing services to the patients as stated in **Rules of the Florida Department of Health and Rehabilitative Services, Division of Health, Chapter 10D-68**. This 40-hour Home Health Aide program is offered by home health agencies as well as by public schools.

The following diagram shows the relationship among the four nursing programs (Practical Nursing, Patient Care Assistant, Nursing Assistant, and Home Health Aide) and the recommended hours for each program.



### **Matrix of Nursing Programs and Intended Outcomes/Student Performance Standards**

A matrix of these four nursing programs and their Intended Outcomes and Student Performance Standards (SPSs) is provided below to indicate their relationships in terms of the coverage of student performance standards. It should be noted that the depth and scope of the coverage of each Intended Outcome and SPS are different in each of these four programs; Home Health Aide (HHA) is least comprehensive and the Practical Nursing (PN, formerly LPN) most comprehensive. For example, the SPS, "Describe the basic structure and function of body systems," in the PN program should be covered in more depth and in wider scope than that SPS in the HHA, Nursing Assistant (NA), or Patient Care Assistant (PCA) program.

It is also recommended that NA, PCA, and HHA programs be articulated so that the students who have completed the NA program do not repeat the same instruction in another of the programs, or vice versa.
