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ABSTRACT

The estimates in this publication are key statistics reported early in the school year and include the number of students in membership, teachers, and high school graduates and the total revenues and expenditures for the operation of public elementary and secondary schools. These estimates are either preliminary actual counts for individual states, estimates derived by the states for the National Center for Education Statistics (NCES), or imputed values developed by NCES using a combination of state-specific and national data. Early estimates for private schools are included in this report. The highlights of the report include the following estimates for the 1989-90 school year: (1) total student membership in all the Nation's Schools (public and private) is estimated to be 46 million students; (2) 2.7 million students will graduate from high school (3) there are 2.4 public school teachers and (4) the cost of public education is \$4,448 per student. The estimates in this publication are key statistics reported early in the school year and include the number of students in membership, teachers, and high school graduates, and total revenues and expenditures for the operation of public elementary and secondary schools. These estimates include three kinds of data: preliminary actual counts for individual States, estimates derived by the States for the National Center for Education Statistics (NCES), or imputed values developed by NCES using a combination of State-specific and national data. Early estimates for private schools are included in this report.

Highlights

- Total student membership in all the Nation's schools (both public and private) is estimated to be 46.0 million students for the 1989-90 school year, and an estimated 2.7 million students will graduate from high school. It is estimated that there are 2.7 million teachers in the public and private schools in this school year (1989-90).
- There are approximately 40.6 million students enrolled in the Nation's public elementary and secondary schools this fall (October 1989) compared with 40.2 million a year ago. Student membership has increased by over half a million since fall 1987.
- Public school students are being taught by an estimated 2.4 million school teachers in this school year (1989-90.)
- High school graduates of the Nation's public schools totaled an estimated 2.5 million for the 1988-89 school year, and it is estimated that approximately 2.4 million students will graduate in school year 1989-90. From spring 1988 to spring 1990, high school graduates are anticipated to increase in 10 States, and to decrease in 41 States.
- Revenues for public elementary and secondary education in fiscal year 1989 are estimated to be \$181.8 billion, and they are expected to rise to approximately \$195.2 billion in fiscal year 1990. This would represent an increase of 15.0 percent over the 2-year period from fiscal year 1988 to fiscal year 1990.
- Total current expenditures for public elementary and secondary education in fiscal year 1989 are estimated to be \$168.6 billion, and they are expected to rise to approximately \$180.6 billion in fiscal year 1990.
- The cost of public education is estimated to be \$4,448 per student in membership for the 1989-90 school year.

The Early Estimate System

The primary source of basic statistical information about public elementary and secondary education is the Common Core of Data (CCD), data collected annually by NCES from State education agencies. These data are reported to NCES in March, undergo NCES and State editing, and are available for publication in September--a full year after the beginning of the school year. High school graduate and fiscal data are reported a year later than the student and teacher data.

The Early Estimates System is designed to allow NCES to report selected key statistics early in the school year. NCES is continuing to examine and evaluate various methodologies to obtain better estimates and improve the data collection system for public elementary and secondary education.

Forty-eight States and the District of Columbia participated in the survey. Estimates reported here were provided to NCES by State education agencies and represent the best information available to States at this early stage of the school year. They are, however, subject to revision.

Estimates for private schools are based on a national probability sample of private schools surveyed in the fall of 1989 (see Key Statistics for Private Elementary and Secondary Education: School Year 1989-90," Early Estimates, publication number NCES90-026).

Methodology

Early in November 1989, a survey form was sent to each State education agency requesting its cooperation and specifying when NCES would collect the data by telephone. States were contacted beginning the week of November 7 and State estimates were received through December 19. Data collected by telephone were checked for reasonableness against prior years' data. Followup calls were made to resolve questions about the data.

Missing values for membership were imputed by multiplying membership data from the 1988-89 school year by one plus the rate of growth experienced by membership from 1987-88 to 1988-89.

Missing values for other data elements were imputed by State, using ratios of the missing quantity to the student membership value, and then adjusting this number by the national average percent change from the previous year for this element. For example, the procedure for imputing number of teachers in the 1989-90 school year involved: (1) calculating the teacher-to-student ratio in the given State in 1988-89, (2) calculating the total growth rate in teacher-to-student ratios for reporting States from 1988-89 to 1989-90, and (3) multiplying the State student membership for the 1989-90 school year by the ratio calculated in step 1, and then multiplying this product by the growth rate calculated in step 2. Equivalent procedures were used for imputing numbers of high school graduates, revenues, and

current expenditures. When a national total includes imputed State values, that national total is reported as an imputed number.

Accuracy of Last Year's Estimates

Past year's data provide an indication of the differences between early estimates and final data. The early estimate of membership for fall 1988 was 40,196,263, which represented an increase of 0.43 percent from the fall 1987 value. The actual increase, based on the final count of 40,191,397 was 0.42 percent. Last year's estimate indicated that there were 2,296,181 teachers for 1988-89, implying an increase of 0.76 percent over the previous year. Actual increase of teachers over that year was 1.63 percent. For number of graduates, the estimated increase from 1986-87 to 1987-88 was 2.45 percent, while the actual increase was 2.61 percent. Revenues were estimated to increase 5.86 percent from 1986-87 to 1987-88, while the actual increase was 6.82 percent. The estimated increase in current expenditures, from 1986-87 to 1987-88, was 6.79 percent, as compared with an actual increase of 7.25 percent. The same methodology used for estimating these data last year was used in generating the estimates contained in this report.

Definitions

Membership is the unduplicated count of students on the roll of the school or local education agency on the school day closest to October 1; students who withdrew from school have been removed from the count. Membership includes all students prekindergarten through grade 12.

Teachers are professional staff who provide instruction to students and maintain daily student attendance figures for a group or class at any of the levels from prekindergarten through grade 12. (Numbers of private school teachers include instructors for grades kindergarten through grade 12 only.) Teacher numbers are reported in full-time equivalents (FTE). FTE are computed by dividing the amount of time employed in instruction by the time normally required of a full-time position.

Pupil/teacher ratio is the number of students divided by the number of teachers in a State. The number reported here represents an average across all levels. There is, however, variability across elementary and secondary grade levels and across programs such as special education, and gifted and talented.

Graduates reported in this paper are regular diploma recipients.

Revenues are defined as additions to assets which do not incur an obligation that must be met at some future date, do not represent exchanges of fixed assets, and are available for expenditure by the local education agencies in the State.

Revenues include funds from local, intermediate, State, and Federal sources.

Current expenditures are funds spent for operating local public schools and include such items as salaries for school personnel, fixed charges, student transportation, school books and materials, and energy costs, but exclude capital outlay and interest on school debt.

Per pupil expenditure (or per pupil revenue) is the total current expenditure (or revenue) for public elementary and secondary education in a State divided by the student membership. The numbers reported here, based on membership, can be expected to be smaller than per pupil expenditures (and per pupil revenues) based on average daily attendance, because the membership counts are generally larger than average daily attendance.
