## ABSTRACT

This statistical factbook provides information on student demographics, employees, budget, organization, graduates, programs, enrollments, grants, and the foundation on Catonsville Community College (CCC). An additional section provides parallel information on Carroll Community College where available. The first section focuses on college data, including an operating calendar, an employee profile, and information on the physical plant, library holdings, and budgetary concerns. The second section provides data on the characteristics of fall and winter credit students, graduates, financial aid recipients and awards, and credit-free students. The third section offers data on credit-free enrollment patterns, selected discipline/departmental enrollment by number of sections, headcount enrollment, full-time equivalency, and credit-free enrollment patterns. The fourth section presents information on resource development and external connections, examining the CCC foundation and board of directors, foundation assets, and numbers of scholarships and grants awarded. This section also contains information on external environmental factors, such as estimates of the Maryland population by race, region, political subdivision, age, and sex. The final section describes Carroll Community College, following the same general outline as the CCC information. (JMC)






## Job Classification by Gender Catonsville Community College






# Average Salary by Gender



Percentage of Revenue








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

Enrollment is 10,236 -- a 7.4% increase from last fall's 9533 students. FTE is 2332, which is an 10.1% increase over the fall of 1988.

#### STUDENT DEMOGRAPHICS

Women students comprise 52% of the student body. Minority students increased in percentage to 33.4% from 20.1% of the student body last year with the percent of black students increasing to 16.9%.

Baltimore County residents comprise 68.5% of the students while the percent of students from Carroll and Anne Arundel declined and from Howard and Baltimore City increased.

The average age increased slightly from 29.9 to 30.1. About a third (34.5%) of the students are over 30 -- 38.1% of the women and 30.6% of the men. The number of seniors increased from 512 last year to 528 this fall and comprises 5.5% of the students.

More than half (57.7%) of our new students (new to college) who responded indicate their educational goal is an A.A. degree, 17.4% are pursuing a certificate, and 24.8% plan to take courses without working toward a degree or certificate.

Almost half of the new students indicated their reason for attending CJC was to prepare for transfer (44.2%), and 18.1% were preparing for immediate entry into a career (up from 16.2% last fall).

#### ENROLLMENT CHARACTERISTICS

Numbers of new and transfer students increased slightly -- to 33.7% of the student body.

Average credit hours rose slightly to 6.9 per student. Full-time students average 13.3 and part-time students average 4.8.

The number of full-time enrollments rose from 2146 to 2492 -- a 16.1% increase.

Students taking only day classes outnumber students taking only night classes -- 42% to 41%; 17% of our students take classes both day and evening. The number of day student enrollments increased more than evening student enrollments; in terms of percents, night only enrollment has increased to 40.9%.

#### PROGRAM CHARACTERISTICS

Enrollment in career programs is 44% of the student body; students majoring in General Studies comprise 41% of the total population; and 14% are enrolled in the other five state authorized transfer programs (Arts and Sciences, Engineering, Business Administration, Teacher Education, Computer Science).







## Mean Age – New Students Catonsville Community College Fall








## Overall Average Credit Hours Carried - Fall Catonsville Community College









CCC Share of 1989 High school Graduates  
from Major Feeder Schools

In the spring of 1989, 2219 seniors graduated from the eight schools which are the College's major feeder high schools. Of those 2219 students, 406 attended CCC as new students in the fall of 1989, up from 395 in Fall, 1988. This represents 18.3% of these schools' graduates.

Since 1980, the College's share of the graduates has varied from a high of 18.3% to Fall 85's low of 12.4%. Interestingly, these share rates vary widely from year to year. This year showed a big increase in yield from Milford Mill, Pikesville, and Lansdowne.

The table below summarizes share rate data for years 1985 to 1989. The fairly steady decline in absolute number of high school graduates from our major feeder schools appears to be almost finished.




## Winter Semester 1989 Headcount

## Winter Semester 1989 FTE




Number of Headcount




## Credit Headcount - Spring Catonsville Community College



# Program of Study of Respondents


Percentage








## Where CCC Graduates Transferred



## Credits Lost in Transfer




## Satisfaction With Transfer Preparation








# Total Number of Recipient of All Types of Financial Aid – FY89







Number of Approved FTE's














# Number of Scholarships Awarded Catonsville Community College Foundation, Inc.





# Estimated Baltimore County Population - July 86


## Age Groups



Percentage of Revenue




## FTE History Carroll Community College

CREDIT STUDENT PROFILE  
FALL 1989

Enrollment is 2034, an increase of 45 students (2.2%) from last fall's 1989 students. FTE's are 425, up 46 (12.1%) from last fall.

STUDENT DEMOGRAPHICS

The proportion of women students remained 65% this fall. The average age of students fell to 29.0. There are 25 senior citizens attending the college.

About 92% of the students live in Carroll County; 6.4% live in Baltimore County; and almost 2% come from other counties or out of state. Most (72%) of the new students attended either Westminster, South Carroll, North Carroll, Liberty, or Francis Scott Key High schools; 55% of all students attended one of these schools.

ENROLLMENT CHARACTERISTICS

Full-time enrollment (12 or more credits) increased by 81 students to 20% of the student body.

New and transfer students comprise 31% of the student body.

The proportion of evening students decreased from 47% to 43%, continuing the trend of previous years, while the proportion of day students decreased to 31%; and the proportion of students taking both day and evening classes increased to 26%.

The average credit load increased to 6.3 hours; full-time students take an average of 13.3 credits, and part-time students take 4.6 credits.

PROGRAM CHARACTERISTICS

The career program enrollments increased somewhat from Fall 1988; this fall, 35% of the students are majoring in career programs while 40% are in General Studies, and 19% are in the other five state authorized transfer programs (Arts and Sciences, Engineering, Business Administration, Teacher Education, Computer Science).

Over half (61%) of the new students want to "obtain the AA degree," 13% of them hope to "obtain a certificate," and about one-fourth (26%) plan to "take courses without working toward a degree or certificate."




## **Credit Headcount** **Carroll Community College**




## **Credit FTE** **Carroll Community College**




## Average Credit Hours Carried - Fall Carroll Community College




## Overall Average Credit Hours Carried - Fall Carroll Community College






## Continuing Education/Community Services Approved FTE's - Carroll Community College

Number of FTE's




# Continuing Education/Community Services FTE by Program FY89 - Carroll Community College








# Carroll County Public Schools Enrollment by Race – Fall 86




