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ABSTRACT

This eleventh annual edition contains a concise presentation of statistics about Connecticut's educational system collected from major State and Federal sources arranged according to each town and school district. State totals are given for the following areas: (1) community data; (2) district students; (3) early childhood education programs; (4) mastery test results for fall 1988; (5) staff data; (6) revenue data; (7) selected State grants; (8) education equalization data for 1985-86; (9) aid and expenditure data; (10) selected state and Federal grants; and (11) expenditure data. The same type of information is provided for 149 towns that operate school districts and for the 17 regional school districts. Community data, education equalization data, and aid and expenditure data are given for 20 towns that do not operate school districts and that are part of regional school districts. The following information is provided for three endowed and incorporated academies: school data; district students; and early childhood education programs. Definitions and sources of data are listed. (SLD)



Bilingual Education	A grant paid to those school districts that are required to provide bilingual instruction under Section 10-17f of the Connecticut General Statutes, i.e., when there are 20 or more eligible children in any district school whose dominant language is other than English
Compensatory Education (EERA)	A grant paid to school districts to provide supplementary compensatory education for students who have been identified as needing remedial assistance in basic skills based on the EERA Ninth Grade Proficiency Test
Vocational Agriculture Tuition	A grant to support vocational agriculture centers at high schools in 18 school districts and to support the tuition costs of other school districts sending resident students to vocational agriculture centers

Child Nutrition	A grant supporting school lunch programs in local school districts. Aid amounts are based on the number of meals served
School Building Aid	The sum of various state grants that support land acquisition and school building projects by local school districts

Equalized School Tax Rate	The measure of school tax effort, in mills, used to calculate state Educational Equalization Aid to towns for 1988-89. Towns are ranked from highest tax rate (1) to lowest tax rate (169).
Student Need	The measure of student need used to calculate state Educational Equalization Aid to towns for 1988-89. Towns are ranked from largest (1) to smallest (169).

AID AND EXPENDITURE DATA

Special Education	The state support percentage, based on town wealth, used to calculate special education grants to school districts for 1988-89. These percentages range from 30 percent to 70 percent.
Transportation	The state support percentage, based on town wealth, used to calculate transportation grants to school districts for 1988-89. These percentages range from 20 percent to 60 percent.
School Construction	The state support percentage, based on town wealth, used to calculate school construction aid to school districts for 1988-89. These percentages range from 40 percent to 80 percent.
Equalization Aid Per Pupil	The state Educational Equalization Aid grant per pupil for 1988-89. Per pupil amounts are based on 1985-86 ADM counts of towns. Educational Equalization Aid grants are paid to towns.
Minimum Expenditure Requirement Per Pupil	The amount the town was required to spend per pupil in 1988-89. Each town has a unique Minimum Expenditure Requirement based on (1) the state's 75th percentile per pupil expenditure level in the third previous year, (2) the concentration of economically deprived children between the ages of 5 and 18 in the town, and (3) the town's Minimum Expenditure Requirement in the previous year.

EXPENDITURE DATA

All expenditures shown in this section are based on fiscal reports submitted by local school districts, "End of Year School Report," Form ED-001, September 1989. Expenditures are grouped in terms of function, i.e., the purpose for which an expenditure is made. Unless otherwise noted, expenditures include expenditures from federal, state and local funds.

Total Expenditures	All expenditures for programs and services for public elementary and secondary school students, except expenditures for adult education programs, community services, and services for nonpublic school students. Total expenditures include expenditures for resident students educated outside the district as well as expenditures for students, resident and nonresident, who attend district schools. The per pupil amount is based on the total number of students attending district schools plus the number of resident students educated outside the district.
Net Current Expenditures	Total expenditures, as defined above, less the sum of expenditures for pupil transportation and capital equipment and tuition receipts for nonresident students. This amount represents current operating expenditures for all resident pupils. The per pupil amount is based on the average daily membership of the district.

Regular Instruction	The sum of district expenditures for regular instructional programs and for the improvement of instruction. The per pupil amount is based on the total number of students in district schools.
Special Education Instruction	The sum of district expenditures for special education instructional programs
Compensatory Education Instruction	The sum of district expenditures for supplemental compensatory education programs
Pupil Support Services	The sum of district expenditures for pupil services such as social work, guidance, health, psychological, speech and hearing services. The per pupil amount is based on the total number of students in the district.
Administration	The sum of district expenditures for administrative services. The per pupil amount is based on the total number of students in the district.
Fiscal and Other Support Services	The sum of district expenditures for fiscal, business and central office services. The per pupil amount is based on the total number of students in the district.
Transportation	The sum of district expenditures for all pupil and other transportation. The per pupil amount is based on the number of students reported as receiving transportation to public and nonpublic schools at the expense of the local public school district.
Food Services and Student Activities	The sum of district expenditures for food services and student activities. This sum represents net food services expenditures plus net student activities expenditures (i.e., total expenditures less sales revenues). Where sales revenues meet or exceed expenditures, net food services expenditures may be reported as zero.
Operation and Maintenance of Plant	The sum of district expenditures for the operation and maintenance of school buildings and property. The per pupil amount is based on the total number of pupils in the district.
Tuition Payments to Other Districts	The sum of district expenditures for tuition for resident students educated outside the school district. The per pupil amount is based on the number of resident students for whom tuition is paid.
Land, Buildings and Debt Services	The sum of district expenditures for the acquisition of land and buildings and for paying of the principal and interest on school bonds. The per pupil amount is based on the total number of students in the district.

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
