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ABSTRACT

This directory contains information about schools that are working to improve student performance through the school-based management process "Onward to Excellence." Over 600 schools were sent questionnaires asking for detailed information about activities using "Onward to Excellence" and about results of that work. Data received from 293 schools are featured, including information from 162 elementary schools, 56 middle/junior high schools, 44 high schools, and 31 schools serving multiple levels of students. Each responding school is included once in the alphabetical listing for one of the four school categories given in the directory. Three indices are provided: (1) the list of practice clusters from "Effective Schooling Practices: A Research Synthesis"; (2) a chart noting which schools selected which practice clusters in creating their prescriptions for improvement; and (3) goals selected by schools in the areas of student academic achievement, student attitude, and student behavior. 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Introduction

The *1990 School Improvement Network Directory* continues the work of the Northwest Regional Educational Laboratory School Improvement Program to support networking among schools and districts involved in long-term school improvement efforts. This third edition of the *Directory* includes information about schools that are working to improve student performance through the school-based management process *Onward to Excellence*.

This year, over 600 schools that were using or had used *Onward to Excellence* as of March 31, 1990, were sent questionnaires requesting information for the *Directory*. Only data from completed questionnaires returned before July 1, 1990, were included.

A total of 293 schools are described in this year's *Directory*, including 162 elementary schools (54%), 56 middle/junior high schools (19%), 44 high schools (16%), and 31 schools serving multiple levels of students (11%). Each school is listed in one of four sections in the alphabetical table of contents: elementary schools, those serving grades K or 1 to 5 or 6; middle/junior high schools, grades 6 or 7 to 8 or 9; high schools, grades 8 or 9 to 12; and multi-levels schools, grades K to 8, 7 to 12, and K to 12.

Of the schools included, all but 16 continue to use the *Onward to Excellence* process. Thirty-six schools reported work in more than one cycle of improvement (or more than one goal area): 31 schools listed two cycles, 2 listed three cycles, 2 schools reported four cycles, and 1 school reported five improvement cycles.

Approximately one-third of all schools are located in towns or suburban areas (population 2,500-25,000), one-third are in rural areas (population of 2,500 or less), and the remaining third are divided approximately equally between large cities (over 50,000) and small cities (25-50,000).

Only four schools returning questionnaires serve fewer than 100 students. The largest group, 169 (58%), serve between 100 and 499 students; 94 (32%) serve between 500 and 1,000 students; and 26 (9%) serve more than 1,000 students.

The 293 schools included in the *Directory* report 318 OTE cycles or goals. Of those reported, 170 goals (57%) focus on improving student academic achievement; 66 (22%) focus on student behavior; and 64 (21%) focus on student attitude.

In describing progress toward meeting those goals, 33 (10%) report meeting the goal's long-term standard; 52 (16%) met the short-term target; 84 (27%) made some progress toward the target; 9 (3%) made little or no progress toward the goal; and 125 (39%) report that progress has not yet been formally assessed. Fifteen schools (5%) do not report on progress.

To assist *Directory* users, three indices are provided:

- **Index I: Practice Clusters:** The list of practice clusters from *Effective Schooling Practices: A Research Synthesis*, (NWREL, 1984). The numbers of relevant practice clusters are listed in each entry under "Selected Practice Clusters."
- **Index II: Practice Clusters Selected by Schools:** A chart noting which schools selected which practice clusters in creating their prescriptions for improvement.
- **Index III: Goal and Content Areas Selected by Schools:** An index of schools organized by goal content area ("reading," "math," "self-esteem," etc.).

All schools included in this *Directory* will receive copies, thereby gaining access to this large and growing network of schools actively involved in research-based school improvement. The *Directory* will be updated again next year, incorporating information about new schools joining *Onward to Excellence* and updated data on continued efforts by schools already listed.

Elementary Schools

Elementary schools in this section include those with students in grades K or 1 through 5 or 6. A total of 162 elementary schools returned questionnaires and are listed in this *Directory*. Of these, 17 schools have used *Onward to Excellence* for more than one cycle of improvement: 15 are in their second cycle, and 2 are in their third cycle. Most schools have fewer than 499 students; 1 has fewer than 100 students, 45 have more than 500 students (three with more than 1,000 students). About one-quarter of the reporting schools are located in rural areas and one-quarter in towns or suburban areas.

In improvement goal selection, 107 schools cite goals related to student achievement, 23 cite student behavior goals and 30 cite student attitude goals. Of those identifying goals, 21 met long-term standards in an OTE cycle, 32 met short-term targets, 37 made some progress toward the target, 5 made little or no progress, and 67 had not yet formally assessed programs.

A total of 56 middle/junior high schools returned questionnaires and are listed in this *Directory*. Multi-Level Schools

Multi-level schools in this section include those with students in grades K to 8 (15 schools), grades 7 to 12 (10 schools), and grades K to 12 (6 schools). Of these 31 schools, one school serving grades K-8 has used *Onward to Excellence* for two cycles of improvement and one school serving grades K-12 has used the process for three cycles of improvement. All but one of the schools have more than 100 students: 19 have 100-499 students, 6 have 500-1,000 students, and 5 have more than 1,000 students. Nearly 90 percent of the reporting schools are located in rural areas.

In improvement goal selection, 17 schools cite goals related to student achievement, 2 cite student behavior goals, and 7 cite student attitude goals.
