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**ABSTRACT**

Section I of this 3-part reference circular provides information about national organizations that serve as information clearinghouses and referral agencies, or that act as advocacy organizations for learning-disabled youths and adults, their families, and professionals serving them. It consists of an alphabetical listing of 18 such organizations with name, address, and phone number. A brief annotation for each organization lists its basic activities, services, and publications. Section II is a select bibliography of 54 books, special-subject periodicals, articles in magazines, pamphlets, and other literature on learning disabilities. Items cover such topics as early childhood intervention, higher education, vocational training, employment search, job accommodation, societal attitudes, and psychological issues. Section III lists state level agencies that administer public programs providing special education and rehabilitation for learning-disabled persons. An address and phone number are provided for each agency. Also listed are additional reference circulars available from the National Library Service for the Blind and Physically Handicapped. (DB)

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Introduction

This reference circular includes information about national organizations that serve as information clearinghouses and referral agencies, or that act as advocacy organizations for learning-disabled youths and adults, their families, and the professionals who serve them. Areas covered include early childhood education, transition from high school to work or higher education, employment search and accommodation, enhanced independent living skills, and legal advocacy.

Section I is an alphabetical listing of national information and advocacy organizations. A brief annotation following each organization lists the basic activities, services, and publications.

Section II is a select bibliography of books; special-subject periodicals; and articles in magazines, pamphlets, and other literature for the use of persons with learning disabilities and those interacting with learning disabled people. The cited literature covers a broad range of topics from appropriate early childhood interventions to higher education or vocational training, from employment search and job accommodation to societal attitudes, and from psychological issues to life with learning disabilities.

Section III lists state-level agencies that administer public programs providing special education and rehabilitation for learning disabled persons.
