ABSTRACT

Data on the characteristics of full- and part-time faculty at Illinois public community colleges are presented and analyzed in terms of the faculty members' primary teaching assignments for fall 1990. Tables provide statistics on numbers of faculty at each institution disaggregated by gender; age ranges; ethnic/racial classification; employment status; highest degree earned; tenure status; and years of experience/service in present classification. Highlighted findings include the following: (1) 64.7% of all college employees were full- and part-time faculty; (2) overall, 52.7% of the faculty were male, while in baccalaureate/transfer programs, 60.3% were male, and in Adult Basic (ABE)/Adult Secondary (ASE)/remedial programs, 65.5% were female; (3) the average age was 45.3 years, with baccalaureate faculty having the highest average age and general studies the lowest; (4) 83.2% of all faculty were White, and 11.4% were Black (constituting two-thirds of all minorities); (5) 71% of the faculty were employed on a part-time basis, though virtually all general studies (99.8%) and ABE/ASE/remedial (95.8%) instructors worked part-time; (6) most faculty possessed a master's or a more advanced degree, although variations existed by type of instructional program; (7) faculty averaged 7.3 years as instructors at their institutions; (8) the four programs employing the largest number of faculty were basic skills, office occupations and systems, English, and management; and (9) 95% of the full-time faculty were concentrated in the baccalaureate, transfer and occupational programs. **CHARACTERISTICS OF
ILLINOIS PUBLIC COMMUNITY COLLEGE FACULTY
BASED ON THEIR PRIMARY TEACHING ASSIGNMENTS**

Each fall the colleges provide the Illinois Community College Board (ICCB) with detailed information on full- and part-time faculty and all other full-time college employees. Faculty and staff (PI) data provide information about the characteristics of individual college employees.

Fiscal year 1991 faculty and staff data reveal that nearly two-thirds (64.7 percent) of the college employees reported in the faculty and staff data submission are full- or part-time faculty. While colleges could not function without administrative, professional, and support staffs, faculty provide the crucial link between colleges and their communities. The success and strength of the Illinois community college system owes much to the quality and dedication of its faculty.

A source of pride and strength for Illinois' comprehensive community college system are the colleges' open-door admission policies. The colleges employ faculty in a comprehensive array of instructional areas to meet the educational needs of the diverse student populations that they attract. The following paragraphs contain an examination of fall 1990 faculty characteristics based on their primary teaching assignments: baccalaureate/transfer; occupational; vocational skills; general studies; and adult basic/adult secondary/remedial education. Faculty demographic data, information pertaining to their employment status, and the earned degree status of instructors will be described. In the report, full- and part-time faculty are generally treated as a single group. Percentages cited throughout this report portray the percent of known data for each faculty characteristic described. Results are highlighted in the text with appendix tables containing more complete data.

Training specialists employed by the City Colleges of Chicago who teach in its adult education programs are included in this report. The City Colleges of Chicago do not consider training specialists as faculty members. However, since other colleges in the system do classify their adult education instructors as faculty, the training specialists have been included for comparability.

Baccalaureate/Transfer Faculty

Baccalaureate/transfer programs provide the equivalent of the first two years of study available at four-year colleges and universities. These programs are designed for transfer and, with thoughtful course selection, allow students to meet the lower-division general education requirements of a baccalaureate degree. Community college students also use transfer programs in a variety of other ways to meet their individual needs. Baccalaureate/transfer faculty

constituted the largest faculty group accounting for 41.6 percent of the entire instructional staff. Similarly, statewide fiscal year 1990 unit cost data indicate that 47.3 percent (2,818,314 hours) of the midterm certified student credit hours were in the baccalaureate/transfer area. The ICCB fall 1990 course master file reveals that statewide, 16,474 courses were approved to be offered in baccalaureate/transfer curricula.

Demographic data pertaining to baccalaureate faculty including gender, age, and racial ethnic composition are highlighted below. Sixty percent of the baccalaureate/transfer faculty were male. The average age of baccalaureate faculty was 46.4 years with nearly two-thirds (63.5 percent) of the transfer faculty being between 40 and 59 years of age. The largest contingent of transfer faculty were in their forties (37.8 percent) with another quarter in their fifties. Racial/ethnic data indicate that 8.7 percent of the baccalaureate/transfer faculty were members of minority groups. Blacks were the largest minority group accounting for two-thirds of all minority faculty.

Characteristics of the transfer faculty's employment status and their highest earned degrees are presented below. Baccalaureate/transfer headcount data indicate that 60.4 percent of the faculty were employed part-time. Correspondingly, 60 percent of all baccalaureate/transfer faculty were not in tenure track lines. Eighty-six percent of the baccalaureate faculty in tenure track positions had attained tenure. Advertisements for faculty vacancies in baccalaureate/transfer programs at community colleges typically specify that a master's degree is required. In keeping with this requirement, the master's degree was the highest earned degree for two-thirds of the baccalaureate/transfer faculty. Of the various teaching areas, faculty in transfer programs had the highest earned degree attainment as 80.7 percent attained a master's or more advanced degree.

Baccalaureate faculty averaged 9.8 years of employment as teachers at their colleges. The baccalaureate/transfer faculty tended toward polarization in terms of the number of years employed as teachers at their institutions. Over one-quarter of the baccalaureate faculty were employed as instructors at their colleges for fewer than two years. Nearly one-third were instructors at their institutions for 16 or more years. Part-time faculty accounted for three-quarters of the faculty employed at their colleges for less than two years and full-time faculty accounted for almost all (95.1 percent) of the faculty at their institutions for 16 or more years.

Specific data for the largest programs in the baccalaureate/transfer area are presented in Table 1. Five program areas accounted for 57.1 percent of all baccalaureate/transfer faculty including: English (19.5 percent), social sciences (10.4 percent), math (9.9 percent), management (9.8 percent), and the visual and performing arts (7.5 percent). Nearly two-thirds of the 1,289 English faculty were concentrated in composition and general English. Over half of the 686 social science faculty were centralized in general social sciences, history, and economics. Over 80 percent of the 653 mathematics instructors were in pure, general, or applied math. Three-quarters of the 647 management instructors taught in accounting and general business management. Almost half of the 494 visual and performing arts faculty were in music performance, drawing, or general fine arts.

Occupational and Vocational Skills Faculty

Occupational programs of study provide in-depth training aimed at developing skills for career-oriented employment. A wide variety of occupational education opportunities are available across the state. Cooperative agreements exist among districts for some highly technical occupational programs. Occupational programs are designed to deliver training with greater breadth and depth than vocational skills programs.

Vocational skills programs help students review and upgrade their present work-related skills or learn a specific, short-term occupational skill. These programs provide more limited training, both in terms of their scope and duration, than those offered under the occupational program category. Each approach to training is equally valid but they serve different community

members' needs. In this section, occupational faculty will be described first and then vocational skills instructors will be characterized. Occupational faculty often teach in vocational programs as well and vice versa. These two areas accounted for 33.8 percent of the faculty.

Occupational faculty were the second largest instructional group with 29.1 percent of the faculty statewide. Likewise, fiscal year 1990 unit cost statewide data show that occupational programs generate 22.8 percent (1,358,962 hours) of the midterm certified student credit hours. ICCB fall 1990 data reveal that 20,732 courses were approved to be offered in 4,139 approved occupational programs. Due to the variety of training sought by the diverse populations attracted to educational opportunities in the community college system, the occupational area had the largest number of approved courses and programs.

Characteristics of occupational faculty including their gender, age, and racial ethnic make-up are featured below. Occupational faculty were predominantly male (57.4 percent). The average age of the occupational faculty was 45.1 years. Nearly two-thirds of the occupational faculty were between 30 and 49 years of age. Minorities accounted for 8.1 percent of the instructors in occupational programs. Blacks were the largest minority group representing 81.7 percent of all minority occupational program instructors.

Employment conditions of occupational faculty are examined next. Almost two-thirds of the occupational faculty were employed on a part-time basis. Part-time faculty normally are not given consideration for tenure due to their limited participation at the colleges. Hence, nearly two-thirds of occupational faculty were in non-tenure positions. Of the 1,745 occupational faculty on tenure lines, 81.3 percent had earned tenure. Occupational faculty averaged 7.7 years of employment as teachers at their colleges. The largest group of occupational faculty were employed by their institutions as instructors for less than five years (45.4 percent). Another quarter of the occupational faculty were employed between five and ten years.

Next, the highest earned degree attainment and noneducational-related work experience of occupational faculty are reviewed. Instruction in occupational areas is aimed at preparing students for employment. Hence, a mixture of formal training and on-the-job experience is often required of occupational faculty. The master's degree (42.2 percent) was the most frequently cited highest earned academic degree. Approximately 5 percent of the occupational faculty earned degrees beyond a master's. Slightly less than one-third of occupational instructors had bachelor's degrees as their highest earned degree. About one-half of the colleges provide data pertaining to the noneducational work experience of occupational faculty. Business is the area where the largest number of occupational faculty are employed. One-quarter of business faculty, the largest contingent, had between two and four years of noneducational work-related experience. Over one-third of the business faculty had 11 or more years of business work experience. Health was the second largest employment area for occupational faculty. One-fifth of the health faculty had two to four years of related work experience. Another one-fifth completed between five and seven years of related on-the-job

experience. Thirty-eight percent of health faculty had 11 or more years of work experience in the field of health. Trade and industrial program faculty accounted for the third largest group. Notably, over 50 percent of the trade and industrial program faculty had 11 or more years of related work experience. Overall, occupational faculty through a combination of formal training and job-related experience are well prepared to teach in their respective areas.

Almost two-thirds of the occupational faculty were employed in five areas: office occupations and systems (24.8 percent), engineering-related technologies (10.7 percent), allied health (10.4 percent), nursing (8.4 percent), and management (8.2 percent). Faculty teaching computer skills accounted for one-third of the 1,151 office occupations and systems faculty: business data processing, keyboarding, and other data processing. In the broad program area of management, over one-fifth of the faculty taught real estate and another one-fifth taught management. Most of the management faculty teach in multiple areas within their field.

Information pertaining to the vocational skills faculty is focused on next. Less than 5 percent (4.7 percent) of the faculty were classified as primarily providing instruction in vocational skills programs. Statewide unit cost data for fiscal year 1990 indicate that 2.8 percent (166,933 hours) of the midterm certified student credit hours were in vocational skills courses. The ICCB course master file reveals that statewide, 9,147 vocational skills courses were approved to be offered in community colleges.

The gender of vocational skills faculty was almost evenly split (52 percent female). The age distribution for vocational skills faculty was similar to that of occupational faculty. The average age of vocational skills faculty was 44.7 years. The largest group of vocational skills faculty were in their forties (38.6 percent). Another quarter were in their thirties. One-fifth of the vocational skills faculty were members of minority groups. Three-quarters of the 134 minority vocational skills faculty were black (102).

Approximately nine out of ten vocational skills faculty were employed on a part-time basis. Most vocational skills faculty were employed in non-tenure line positions (87 percent). One-half of the vocational skills faculty in tenure-seeking positions have earned tenure. Vocational skills faculty possess specialized knowledge and skills about distinct areas within occupations. Similar to their counterparts in occupational programs, vocational faculty typically have a combination of academic and on-the-job training. The largest group of vocational skills faculty held master's degrees (32.6 percent). Bachelor's degree holders (30.5 percent) were a close second. Vocational skills faculty averaged 4.1 years of employment as teachers at their colleges. Two-thirds of the vocational skills faculty were employed less than five years. Another 25 percent have between five and ten years of teaching experience at the college.

The largest vocational skills programs are discussed below. Allied health (21.1 percent) was the program where most vocational skills faculty were employed. Office occupations and systems (18.6 percent) was second, basic skills (13.3 percent) third, and home/institutional services (8.5 percent) fourth in terms of the number of vocational skills faculty employed. Table 2 provides information on the number of faculty teaching occupational and vocational skills courses.

General Studies Faculty

General studies programs provide students with an understanding of one of the following areas: personal development; intellectual and cultural studies; health, safety, and the environment; community and civic development; homemaking; and improving family circumstances.

General education faculty were among the smallest faculty contingents accounting for 3.8 percent of all instructors. Statewide, fiscal year 1990 unit cost data indicate that general education produced just 0.9 percent (51,802 hours) of the midterm certified student credit hours. The course master file shows that in fall 1990, there were 5,327 general skills courses.

The majority of general studies instructors were female (59.7 percent). The average age of general studies faculty was 43.7 years. General studies faculty had a higher percentage of their faculty under 30 years of age (12 percent) than any other teaching area. Over one-third (39.2 percent) of general studies faculty were members of minority groups. Blacks were the most prevalent among the minority groups (88 percent). Nearly all general studies faculty (99.8 percent) were employed on a part-time basis. The single individual who is employed full-time has been tenured. Over three-quarters of the general studies faculty either did not report their degree status or indicated that they had no earned degrees. Eight percent of the general studies faculty had master's degrees and above. General studies faculty averaged 3.4 years of employment as teachers at their colleges. The largest group of general studies faculty were employed as instructors at their colleges less than two years (46.1 percent). Three-quarters of the general studies faculty were employed in their current positions for fewer than five years. Just 1.2 percent of the general studies instructional staff have been employed for 16 or more years.

The largest concentration of general studies faculty were in leisure and recreational activities programs (46.9 percent). The remaining general studies faculty were spread across programs with the following areas containing the largest groups: visual and performing arts (7.4 percent), basic skills (7.1 percent), and health-related activities (5 percent). Table 3 contains data from the largest general studies programs.

Adult Basic/Adult Secondary/Remedial Education Faculty

Adult basic education/adult secondary education/remedial education (ABE/ASE/remedial) faculty all provide instruction at precollege levels. The degree of educational preparation exhibited by students in each area varies. Adult basic education (ABE) programs provide reading, writing, and mathematics instruction and English as a second language education to students at the elementary level (below grade 9). ABE programs provide a much-needed community service by helping those enrolled master the fundamental communication and numerical manipulation skills necessary for full participation as citizens. Adult secondary education (ASE) programs are designed to prepare students for General Equivalency Development (GED) exam passage by providing high school equivalency coursework or high school English as a second language courses (grades 9-12). ASE programs empower students by providing the requisite skills for pursuing higher education or entry-level employment. Remedial education programs target specific weaknesses in the educational preparation of students who have completed high school or its equivalent. Remedial education programs help students strengthen their skills in one or more particular academic areas. The ABE/ASE/remedial education faculty are being grouped for this analysis because they often teach in more than one of these programs.

In combination, ABE/ASE/remedial education faculty had the third largest number of instructors and accounted for one-fifth of all faculty. Fifty-five percent of the ABE/ASE/remedial education faculty are employed in the City Colleges of Chicago. Statewide, fiscal year 1990 unit cost data indicate that 27.5 percent (1,641,994 hours) of the midterm certified student credit hours were in ABE/ASE/remedial education programs. ICCB fall 1990 course files show that in combination, 5,847 courses were approved to be offered in ABE/ASE/remedial education curricula.

The ABE/ASE/remedial education area had the largest proportion of female instructors. Two-thirds of the ABE/ASE/remedial education faculty were female. The average age of this group was 43.8 years with the largest group in their forties (37.3 percent). An additional 27 percent were in their thirties. ABE/ASE/remedial education faculty had the highest minority representation among all faculty groups (39.5 percent). The 780 black ABE/ASE/remedial education faculty represented nearly two-thirds of the minority ABE/ASE/remedial faculty. Hispanics (398) accounted for 32 percent of the ABE/ASE/remedial minority faculty.

Nearly all ABE/ASE/remedial education faculty are employed on a part-time basis (95.8 percent). Correspondingly, almost all ABE/ASE/remedial education faculty are in non-tenure-seeking positions (95.1 percent). Just over one-half of the ABE/ASE/remedial education faculty in tenure-seeking positions (86 of 160) have earned tenure. Slightly less than one-half of the ABE/ASE/remedial education faculty's highest earned degree was a bachelor's degree (47.8 percent). Yet, 37.6 percent of the ABE/ASE/remedial education faculty earned a master's degree or above.

ABE/ASE/remedial education instructors averaged 3.8 years of employment as teachers at their colleges. Sixty-two percent of the ABE/ASE/remedial education faculty had fewer than five years teaching experience at their college. The only other large group of ABE/ASE/remedial faculty had between five and seven years (30.9 percent) of experience as instructors at their institutions.

As could be anticipated, nearly all ABE/ASE/remedial education faculty (94.5 percent) were classified as providing instruction in basic skills. As depicted in Table 4, English as a second language was the largest specific basic skills instructional area mentioned.

Summary and Conclusions

This report provides an analysis of fiscal year 1991 faculty and staff (Pl) data. Nearly two-thirds of all college employees included in the faculty and staff submission were full- or part-time faculty. Characteristics of the fall 1990 faculty are provided focusing on their primary teaching area: baccalaureate/transfer; occupational; vocational skills; general studies; and adult basic/adult secondary/remedial education. Faculty demographic data and information relating to their employment and earned degree status are investigated.

Overall, the gender of the faculty was relatively balanced (52.7 percent male). The baccalaureate/transfer faculty contained the highest percentage of males (60.3 percent). ABE/ASE/remedial education had the largest percentage of female faculty (65.5 percent).

Overall, the average age of the faculty was 45.3 years. The average age of the faculty varied little from one area to the next. The overall average age of full-time faculty was 48.7 years compared to 43.7 years for part-time faculty. Baccalaureate faculty had the highest average age and general studies faculty had the lowest average age. Overall, the largest group of faculty were in their thirties and forties. Twenty-six percent of the general studies faculty were in the age extremes. General studies faculty who were virtually all part-time college employees had the highest percentage of faculty under 30 years of age (12 percent) as well as the greatest portion of faculty 60 and above (14.3 percent).

The racial/ethnic composition of fall 1990 community college faculty indicates that they were predominantly white (83.2 percent). Opening fall 1990 student headcount racial/ethnic data (E1) show that 71.4 percent of the students were white. Overall, faculty data reveal that blacks (11.4 percent) constituted the largest minority group accounting for two-thirds of all minority faculty. Opening fall enrollment data also indicate that blacks (14.4 percent) are the largest student minority group and represent 51.2 percent of all minority students. Hispanics were second largest minority group in terms of faculty and students in fall 1990. Hispanics accounted for one-fifth of the minority faculty and one-third of the minority student population. Overall, opening fall 1990 student headcount data showed slightly more diversity than faculty headcount data. Another way to look at minority faculty is to determine where the largest number of faculty in each minority group were employed. The total number of Asian faculty was 254. Nearly one-half of the Asian faculty (N=120 or 47.2 percent) were employed in baccalaureate/transfer curricula. ABE/ASE/remedial education employed about one-half (N=15) and baccalaureate programs employed one-third (N=11) of the American Indian instructors. Forty-six percent of the black faculty and 77.1 percent of the Hispanic instructors were employed in ABE/ASE/remedial education curricula.

Seventy-one percent of the faculty were employed on a part-time basis. Virtually all general studies (99.8 percent) and ABE/ASE/remedial education (95.8 percent) instructors were part-time college employees. Programs with the largest percentage of full-time faculty were baccalaureate/transfer (39.6 percent) and occupational (38.2 percent).

Overall, most faculty are in non-tenure-seeking positions (70.6 percent). The number of part-time faculty in the system have a heavy influence on this figure. Among those in tenure line positions, 81.8 percent have attained tenure. Faculty in the two largest academic areas -- baccalaureate (86.4 percent) and occupational (81.3 percent) -- were heavily tenured.

Overall, most faculty employed at community colleges have earned a master's or more advanced degree. The earned degree attainment varied considerably from one type of instructional program to another. For instance, 80.7 percent of the baccalaureate instructors had a master's degree or above and only 7.9 percent of the general studies faculty earned a master's or more advanced degree. The differentiation in the highest earned degree status of the faculty is reasonable when one considers the type of instruction sought by students in each area. Many students in baccalaureate programs are preparing to transfer to a four-year college or university. Conversely, most general studies students are interested in enhancing their knowledge and skills in a specific area and do not plan to pursue additional education.

Data regarding the length of time faculty members had been employed at their institutions as teachers are highlighted next. Overall, community college faculty averaged 7.3 years as instructors at their institutions. General studies faculty averaged the fewest years as teachers at their colleges with approximately 3.4 years. Three-quarters of the general studies faculty were employed at their institutions for less than five years. ABE/ASE/remedial education faculty (33.8 percent) had the largest percentage of faculty with five to ten years teaching experience at their college. Baccalaureate faculty, who averaged 9.8 years, spent the longest average length of time at their colleges as instructors. Fourteen percent of the occupational faculty had 11 to 15 years of experience and almost one-third of the baccalaureate faculty had 16 or more years of teaching experience at their colleges.

A list of the four largest overall programs where all faculty are employed reiterates the diverse educational offerings available to the citizens of Illinois through their public community colleges. The largest number of faculty were employed in basic skills programs which are offered primarily in ABE/ASE/remedial education programs. Office occupations and systems programs, provided in the occupational and vocational skills areas, were second. English programs taught most frequently in the baccalaureate/transfer area were third. Management was fourth. Management programs are taught primarily in baccalaureate and occupational areas.

Due to the large number of part-time instructors, the top positions among part-time faculty mirror overall results. The only difference is that the relative position of management and English was reversed from the overall results.

Full-time faculty are highly concentrated in baccalaureate/transfer and occupational programs (95 percent). Three of the five programs employing the largest number of full-time faculty were in the baccalaureate/transfer area: English (12.5 percent), social sciences (6.9 percent), and mathematics (6.3 percent). The remaining large employment areas for full-time faculty were either occupational -- office occupations and systems (8.6 percent) or occupational and vocational skills -- allied health (6.5 percent).

Community college faculty bring a rich mixture of skills, abilities and attributes to their positions. As opportunities to hire new and replacement faculty arise, community colleges should continue their efforts to enhance diversity among the instructional staff. Efforts to review staffing patterns and address any inequities that are identified in terms of the faculty's gender, age and racial/ethnic composition should be accentuated. Maintaining and enhancing the faculty's earned degree status and work-related experiences should be pursued.

Community colleges offer Illinois' citizens access to quality education very close to home at a reasonable cost. The diversity of the students and staff who gather on community college campuses is a measure of the success and quality of this uniquely American educational system.
