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ABSTRACT

This guide describes the holdings in the manuscript collections, the university archives, and the American Foreign Policy Center, all of which are located in Louisiana Tech University's Prescott Memorial Library. The guide is divided into three sections. The first section, "Manuscript Collections," presents descriptions of 197 collections of personal and family papers, business and corporate records, photographs, diaries, original manuscripts, and other similar materials. The second section, "Collections in the University Archives," identifies 49 holdings of records, papers, and printed publications generated by the Louisiana Industrial Institute, Louisiana Polytechnic Institute, and Louisiana Tech University. These collections include the records of the office of the president of the university, as well as those of other campus divisions, colleges and departments; catalogs, bulletins, directories, yearbooks, and other publications issued by Tech since 1897; and numerous photographs of the campus, university activities, and faculty members. It is noted that the Special Collections Department also serves as a repository for books and periodicals related to the history, literature, and culture of Louisiana and the South. The final section presents a bibliography of the microform collections of primary materials in the American Foreign Policy Center. (MAB)

The Special Collections Department also serves as a repository for books and periodicals related to the history, literature, and culture of Louisiana and the South.

Business and legal records and correspondence of Treuman Breithaupt, planter in Catahoula Parish, LA; journal of agricultural activities, 1844-1850; Civil War correspondence of his son, Ernest; and records of the Grange movement in Catahoula Parish; ca. 75 items.

Collection of tax receipts, notes, a letter and poetry of various individuals in Union Parish, LA; 15 items.

Two early catalogs and a reunion program of college founded in Mansfield, LA in 1855 and operated under the supervision of the Louisiana Methodist Conference until it closed in 1930; 3 items.

Mementos of a prominent New Orleans businessman and financier during the late nineteenth century and a colonel in the Confederate Army during the Civil War; 5 items.

Paper prepared and read by Thrash, Bistineau Baptist Church historian, for the centennial of the church; 6 p.

Letters written from Baton Rouge, LA by the Claiborne Parish state senator and attorney to his wife during the first two years of the Huey P. Long administration; correspondence deals with political matters including the impeachment proceedings against Governor Long; 9 items.

Margaret Towers Monroe, Papers, 1896-1970.  
History of Anna Calhoun Smith's school in Vernon, LA, 1885-1901, written by her step-granddaughter; wife of Judge N.M. Smith of Jackson Parish, Mrs. Smith operated the private school for members of her family and other pupils, among whom was Senator James P. Pope; includes two Pope letters; 1 ms and 6 items.

Ruston Presbyterian Church, Ruston, LA, Historical Papers, 1963.  
Papers given by members at a historical meeting of the Ruston Presbyterian Church in 1963, honoring Kathleen and Helen Graham (active, long-time members of the church); highlights of the history of the church and tributes to the Graham sisters; 15 items.

James H. Ashe, Calcote Family Genealogy, 1685-1898.  
Genealogy, mainly, of the descendants of John Calcote, Sr., of Franklin and Amite Counties, Mississippi; some of the Calcote family settled in Lincoln Parish, LA; 3 p.

William W. Colbert, Jr., Leary Family History, 1775-1960.  
History of the Calvin Leary family who moved from Georgia and settled in Bienville Parish, LA in 1850; account of plantation and family life written by a descendant who includes genealogical notes on the Leary and related families; 12 p.

Charles S. Cox Collection of Catalogs of the Mount Lebanon University, 1856-1857, 1858-1860, and 1865-1866 and the Mount Lebanon Female College, 1855-1858.

Catalogs of the University and the Female College, both founded in 1853, in Bienville Parish, LA by the Louisiana Baptist State Convention; 7 items.

Corinne Smith Bennett, Family History, 1781-1949.  
Memoirs and historical notes on the family of Benjamin Fitzpatrick Smith, early Lincoln Parish settlers and the family of Thompson Samuel Scott, early residents of North Louisiana and South Arkansas; 2 items, 10 p.

Hoss Family, Papers, 1847-1971.  
Nathaniel Hoss was an early settler, planter, and commission merchant in Caddo Parish, LA; his son, James M. Hoss, was one of the founders and benefactors of Hosston, LA; includes deeds, business records and related correspondence of three generations of the Hoss family; 302 items.

Jaclyn Lucas Keasler (1931-), "The Simontons and Related Families, ca. 1100-1963."

Genealogy of and historical notes on the Simontons and related families from the Middle Ages in Scotland through the twenty-second generation in the southern states; traces the Simonton line in Louisiana including parishes of Lincoln, Bienville, Claiborne, and Jackson; 47 p.

Walnut Creek Baptist Church, Lincoln Parish, LA, Minutes and Church Roll, 1885-1932.

Minutes of church conferences and related records, partial list of church members; two clippings on the history of the church, 1846-1965; 1 vol. (309 p.) and 2 items.

Ruston Presbyterian Church, Ruston, LA, Records, 1884-1957.

Minutes of the Session, 1884-1920; register of pastors, elders, deacons, communicants and baptisms, 1884-1957; 1 vol. (392 p.) and 3 items.

John Riley Malone, Sr. (1924-), Malone, Tatum and Related Family Genealogies, ca. 1700-1969.

Genealogies, notes, correspondence and records of Malone, his wife, Rae Tatum Malone, and related families; Malones are residents of Claiborne Parish, LA; 18 items.

M 59

Ephesus Primitive Baptist Church, Lincoln Parish, LA, Records and Related Papers, 1851-1958.

Minutes of church conferences, constitutions, articles of faith and church roll; includes correspondence of church

leaders, related papers and a few records of the Louisiana Association of Primitive Baptists; 2 vols. and 42 items.

O.A. Newsome Collection of Writings on the "In the Gloaming" Legend and a History of Dubach, LA, 1935-1959.

Three periodical articles on the union Parish legend of "In the Gloaming," a Marion High School operetta of the same title, and a history of Dubach compiled by the Dubach High School faculty; 5 items.

Earl R. Hester (d.1970) Collection, 1850-1965.

Collection of records and papers relating mainly to the history of Arcadia and Bienville Parish, LA; also includes files on Allen Greene, Huey P. Long, and other materials on Louisiana history; ca. 700 items.

Fellowship Baptist Church of Christ, Dubberly, LA, Records, 1848-1896.

Constitution, covenant, rules of decorum, church roll and minutes of church conferences; 2 vols.

Sardis Baptist Church, Winn Parish, LA, Records, 1860-1901.

Covenant, rules of decorum, articles of faith, minutes of church conferences and church roll; includes Bible records of the W.J. Martin family, members of the church; 208 p. and 1 item.

Spring Hill Missionary Baptist Church, Oakland, LA, Church Record and Minute Book, 1878-1907, 1911-1966.

Articles of faith, church covenant, church roll and minutes of church conferences of an early Union Parish church; 2 vols.

M 65

Ina Claire Madden Collection of Selected Bienville Parish, LA Records, 1865-1866.

Charters of the Methodist Episcopal Church, South at Mt. Lebanon, LA and at Arcadia, LA; charter of the Mt. Lebanon Female College; related records of the period; 5 items.

M 66

Loyce Smith Robbins Collection of Stovall and Smith Family Genealogical Papers, 1721-1968.

Wills, land records, genealogies, photographs and related papers mainly on the Stovall family of Jackson and Winn Parish, LA; papers include some records on the Smith and Trevillion families; 105 items.

Marshall Harvey Twitchell (1840-1905), Papers, 1851-1938. Correspondence, legal records, state documents, bonds, autobiography, and other papers of a Vermonter who was a Freedman's Bureau agent in old Sparta, LA, and was later the North Louisiana leader of the radical Republicans and owner of a plantation in Red River Parish; ca. 600 items.

Rita M. Krouse Collection of Official Correspondence on Building a Louisiana Military Road, 1827-1838. Correspondence concerning the building of a military road between Fort Smith on the Arkansas River to Natchitoches, LA; 17 items.

M 69

Kellam Family, Correspondence, 1834-1891. Letters received by members of the Kellam and related families, prominent residents and plantation owners in Ouachita Parish, LA; 37 items.

M 70

Cecil P. Campbell, "Old Castor Methodist Church", 1965. History of the Old Castor Methodist Church in Bienville Parish, LA, from about 1852 to 1926; by a descendant of several of the founding families of the church; 6 p.

M 71

Murrell Family, Correspondence, 1853-1930. Personal letters from John and Isaac Murrell and other descendants of John Murrell, pioneer settler of Claiborne Parish, LA to various family members; 16 items.

M 72

Roland Jones (1813-1869), Family Papers, 1840-1969. Papers of prominent attorney, U.S. Congressman, district judge of Caddo Parish, LA, and a pioneer resident of Shreveport; papers include mainly correspondence of Roland Jones and his wife, Anne Neville Stokes, and that of their descendants in Louisiana; letters cover political, professional, social, and family matters; ca. 850 items.

Catherine J.S. Duhon Collection of Pelican Area Community Histories, 1968.

Material collected and written by students of Duhon, teacher at Pelican High School, Pelican, LA; articles cover the high school, the town of Pelican, villages in the area, and a history of DeSoto Parish, LA; 13 items.

M 74

Ida G. Tooke, "History of New Providence Baptist Church, 1850-1950."

History and a few early records of the Ringgold, LA church; Tooke is a descendant of founders of the church; 7 p.

M 75

Marjorie Leigh, "Out of Our Past," 1966-1968.

Articles researched and written mainly on the history of Lincoln Parish by Leigh, former Louisiana Tech librarian; 110 items.

M 76

Harley B. Bozeman (1891-1971), Papers, 1858-1971.

Papers of longtime resident of Winn Parish, LA state politician and friend of Huey P. Long and family; in later years, became known as the historian and genealogist of Winn Parish; ca. 1080 items.

M 77

Thaddeus Pardue Collection of Cemetery Records of Union, Lincoln, Bienville and Caddo Parishes, Louisiana.

Tombstone records limited to persons born prior to 1860; incomplete records for Lincoln Parish; 3 vols.

M 78

Vienna Presbyterian Church, Vienna, LA, Church Book Number 2, 1874-1897.

Church roll, minutes of church conferences, and related records; 53 p.

M 79

Castor Methodist Church, Castor, LA, Church Register, 1888-1912.

Register of pastors, members, marriages, deaths and disposals of the church; 42 p.

M 80

Adam Riser (1809-1898), Store Ledgers, 1859, 1873.

One of the first settlers in the southern part of Lincoln Parish, LA and owner of a Trading Post Center in Old Bonner, LA; 2 vols. and 1 item.

M 81

Sidney Seth Tatum (1862-1918), Family Papers, 1868-1970.

A large landholder and farmer in Claiborne and Lincoln Parishes, LA during the late nineteenth and early twentieth centuries, taught a private school in Hico, LA; also was a merchant, helped establish the Dubach State Bank, and was active in the Farmers' Union movement in Lincoln Parish; includes legal records, business and financial papers, correspondence, school records and assorted papers of other Tatum family members; ca. 105 items.

Felix Pierre Poche (1836-1895), Diary and Related Papers, 1854-1955.

Diary of a young Confederate Army officer kept 1863-1865, including eyewitness accounts of two 1864 battles in North Louisiana; after the war, Poche an attorney in St. James Parish, LA, was elected a state senator and later an associate judge of the Louisiana Supreme Court; 3 items.

Garnie W. McGinty (1900-1984), Papers and Publications, 1895-1969.

Major events covered include the Dominican Republic coup of 1930 and the rise of Trujillo, unrest in Argentina and the election of Peron in 1946, the controversy over Yugoslav aid to Greek guerrillas in 1947, the Chinese Civil War and the Shanghai situation, the resignation of President Quadros in Brazil in 1961, and the outcome of the secret United States-Communist China talks held in Moscow in 1962.

The U.S. State Department Central Files are perhaps the definitive source of American diplomatic reporting on political, military, social, and economic developments throughout the world in the twentieth century. Each part of the Central Files contains a wide range of materials from U.S. diplomats in foreign countries: special reports on political and military affairs; studies and statistics on socioeconomic matters; interviews and minutes of meetings with foreign government officials; court proceedings and other legal documents; full texts of important letters, instructions, and cables sent and received by U.S. diplomatic personnel; reports and translations from foreign journals and newspapers; and translations of high-level foreign government documents.

The Central Files also illuminate the internal affairs of foreign countries.
