ABSTRACT

This report contains a comprehensive listing of basic student charges for academic year 1990-91 at over 4,700 4-year, 2-year, and public less-than-2-year postsecondary institutions. Typical tuition and required fees are provided for in-state and out-of-state students at the undergraduate and graduate levels, along with the costs for room and board, and the number of meals per week covered by the board charge. Tables give summary national statistics on tuition and required fees for the academic year 1990-91 at postsecondary institutions. Data are also presented on tuition and required fees and room and board charges at individual institutions. These listings are divided into three sections: (1) 4-year institutions (offering a bachelor's degree or higher); (2) 2-year institutions (offering a postsecondary award of at least 2 but less than 4 academic years; and (3) public less-than-2-year institutions (offering a postsecondary award of less than 2 academic years). Schools are listed alphabetically by state within each section. Listings for schools in outlying areas, such as Puerto Rico, follow the state listings. At the beginning of each state listing are state averages for the various charges. A glossary presents definitions for 15 key terms. (JB)

Foreword

This report contains a comprehensive listing of basic student charges for academic year 1990-91 at more than 4,700 4-year, 2-year, and public less-than-2-year postsecondary institutions (collegiate and non-collegiate) in the United States and its outlying areas. Typical tuition and required fees are provided for in-state and out-of-state students at the undergraduate and graduate levels, along with the costs for room and board, and the number of meals per week covered by the board charge.

This information should be especially helpful to students, guidance counselors, and parents in evaluating the *basic costs* of attending specific postsecondary schools. For additional information, such as the availability of student financial aid or the programs of study offered at specific institutions, one may wish to consult other postsecondary guides. A school or local public library is a good starting point and should have reference material on postsecondary institutions readily available.¹ Once a student has narrowed his or her selection to a few schools, each school should be contacted directly for a current catalog and application form. Before making a final decision on which school to attend, it is usually a good idea to tap the knowledge and expertise of a guidance or career counselor.

"Basic Student Charges" was prepared by the National Center for Education Statistics (NCES), U.S. Department of Education. The data were collected through the 1990-91 "Institutional Characteristics" survey conducted annually by NCES as part of its Integrated Postsecondary Education Data System.

Introduction

This report lists tuition and required fees and room and board charges for academic year 1990-91 for over 4,700 schools in the United States and its outlying areas. These are the typical charges for these items that a full-time, full-year student should expect to pay to attend the institution. A Glossary of terms used herein is provided at the end of this report.

"Basic Student Charges" should be used for reference and comparison purposes only, and not as a quote of actual charges at an institution. Tuition and required fees, for example, may vary at an institution by student level or program. In addition, these basic charges are not inclusive of all costs a student may incur in attending an institution. Most students will have to meet additional expenses for books and supplies, laboratory fees, and transportation. Also, the total amount a student ends up paying out-of-pocket to attend a postsecondary institution may be significantly reduced by the receipt of financial aid from federal, state, local, and/or institutional sources.

The student charges in this publication were edited for reasonableness and consistency with charges for the previous year (1989-90). Large variations in charges from the previous year were verified with the institution; otherwise, the data were accepted as reported. For institutions that did not respond the previous year, data were accepted as reported. Zero charges represent actual reported responses.

Organization of this report

"Basic Student Charges" opens with national statistics on tuition and required fees for academic year 1990-91 at postsecondary institutions. These data are followed by tuition and required fees and room and board charges at individual institutions. For the convenience of the user, the institutional listings are divided into three sections: 4-year institutions (i.e., offering a bachelor's degree or higher award); 2-year institutions (offering a postsecondary award of at least 2 but less than 4 academic years); and public less-than-2-year institutions (offering a postsecondary award of less than 2 academic years). Private less-than-2-year institutions are not included in this report because the data requested on student charges from these schools are not comparable to data requested from other postsecondary institutions.

Schools are listed alphabetically by state within each section. Schools in outlying areas, such as Puerto Rico, follow the state listings. At the beginning of each State listing are State averages for the various student charges.² For

²The state averages are based on actual institutional charges (i.e., they have not been weighted by student enrollment at the institution). A state's room average will be somewhat inflated if any institutions combined their room and board charges, since the combined charge is reported under room.

the convenience of the user, footnotes are provided at the bottom of each page of the tables to explain codes found within the body of the tables. These codes are explained in greater detail on page 3.

All 5,500 4-year, 2-year, and public less-than-2-year institutions in the 1990-91 "Institutional Characteristics" survey universe are included in this report, respondents and nonrespondents. Over 4,700 institutions responded to the survey items on student charges--a response rate of 90 percent. Data on student charges were not imputed for the 800 nonresponding institutions, so all columns are blank for these schools.

The institutional names in this report were transferred directly from the survey data tape. Thus, names may be abbreviated to accommodate the maximum number of 50 tape positions for this variable. Branch campuses may be further identified by their city location to aid the user of this report.

Codes Used in Tables 1, 2, and 3

- (H) Institutions identified by an "(H)" to the left of their name are accredited by an agency or association nationally recognized by the Secretary of the U.S. Department of Education, and are known as institutions of higher education.
- * Many institutions reported a combined room and board charge. The combined charge is listed in the Room column and an asterisk (*) is entered in the Board column.
- ** Institutions with a double asterisk (**) to the right of their name did not respond to any of the items on student charges included in this report. Almost two-thirds of these institutions were total nonrespondents to the "Institutional Characteristics" survey which collects these and other data. The remaining third responded to the survey but not to these particular items. Most schools in this latter group simply did not answer the survey items pertaining to student charges. The items were not applicable to other schools in this group because they (1) offer programs at the first-professional level only and do not provide room and board, or (2) they enroll only part-time students, and the items on student charges were requested for full-time, full-year students only.
- *** Institutions with a triple asterisk (***) to the right of their name reported tuition and required fees for in-district students that were at least 10 percent lower than the charge to in-State students. Only tables 2 and 3 carry this code, as lower in-district than in-State charges are generally a phenomenon of public 2-year and less-than-2-year schools.
- (#) Found to the left of a state name or other area, the (#) code indicates that no postsecondary institutions were identified at the 4-year, or 2-year, or public less-than-2-year level through the "Institutional Characteristics" survey. Although there may be such institutions in the State or area, they must respond to the survey at least once before they can be included in the universe of postsecondary institutions maintained by the National Center for Education Statistics. (Institutions listed in this report as nonrespondents completed the survey in a previous year and are still operational.)

Summary Statistics on Tuition and Required Fees Charged by Postsecondary Institutions

In recent years, much attention has focused on the rising costs of attending college, particularly on tuition increases that have exceeded the inflation rate. The summary data on tuition and fees in tables A, B, and C below are presented to inform prospective students of the wide variation in these charges among institutions. The total costs of obtaining an education can be significantly reduced by taking tuition charges into consideration when choosing a school. As a general rule, tuition is much lower at public institutions than at private institutions, and public institutions generally charge in-state students much lower tuition than students attending from out-of-state.

Tuition and required fees at public postsecondary institutions

Public 4-year institutions

Generally speaking, public 4-year institutions charge much lower tuition and required fees to students who attend these schools in the state where they legally reside (table A). For example, an undergraduate student who attended a public 4-year school in the state where he or she legally resided was charged an average of \$1,848 in academic year 1990-91, compared to \$4,797 for an out-of-state student. Average charges to graduate students were also much lower for in-state residents than for out-of-state residents.

The median tuition and fee charge of \$1,671 to an undergraduate, in-state student fell somewhat below the mean charge. The median charge indicates that half of all responding institutions reported tuition and fee charges to undergraduate, in-state students above \$1,671, and half reported charges below this amount. The mean charge of \$1,848 was driven above the median charge by a relatively small number of high-priced institutions. There was also considerable dispersion of tuition and fees charges across all public 4-year institutions. While 25 percent of all institutions charged \$2,202 or more to undergraduate, in-state students, another 25 percent charged \$1,331 or less to such students.

Public 2-year institutions

For an in-state resident, an average of \$1,072 for tuition and required fees was charged at public 2-year institutions in 1990-91, compared with an average out-of-state charge of \$2,562. The median charge to in-state residents was \$867, and 25 percent of all public 2-year institutions charged \$543 or less.

Public less-than-2-year institutions

In-state residents attending public less-than-2-year institutions were charged an average tuition and required fee of \$1,250 in 1990-91, and 25 percent of all such institutions charged \$300 or less. Unlike public 4-year and 2-year institutions, out-of-state and in-state charges did not vary much at public less-than-2-year institutions.

Tuition and required fees at private postsecondary institutions

Tuition and fee charges at private institutions rarely vary by a student's in-state vs. out-of-state status, so only in-state charges are presented in this report.

Private 4-year institutions

Private 4-year institutions charged undergraduate students an average of \$7,115 for tuition and required fees in academic year 1990-91 (table B), almost four times the average undergraduate, in-state charge of \$1,848 reported by public 4-year institutions. Graduate tuition and fees averaged \$5,861 at private 4-year schools, compared to the average of \$2,009 charged to graduate, in-state students at public 4-year schools.

Although private 4-year institutions charged undergraduate students an average of \$7,115 for tuition and required fees, these charges varied considerably among such institutions. For example, 25 percent of private 4-year institutions reported undergraduate tuition and fee charges of \$4,594 or less. Another 25 percent reported undergraduate tuition and fee charges of at least \$9,228. Graduate tuition and fee charges were also widely dispersed.

Private nonprofit 4-year institutions charged an average of \$7,182 to undergraduate students, considerably more than the average of \$5,814 charged to undergraduates at private for-profit institutions. Graduate students were charged an average of \$6,164 for tuition and required fees at private for-profit institutions, somewhat higher than the average of \$5,849 at private nonprofit institutions.

Private 2-year institutions

Private 2-year institutions charged an average of \$4,251 for tuition and required fees in 1990-91 (table C). The median charge was nearly identical, at \$4,255. Twenty-five percent of all private 2-year schools charged \$5,695 or more, while 25 percent charged \$2,113 or less.

Private for-profit institutions charged an average of \$5,359 for tuition and required fees, considerably more than the average of \$3,061 charged by private nonprofit institutions.

Glossary

Board. The charge for an academic year for meals, for a specified number of days per week. (In this report, when a combined room and board plan is offered at an institution, the cost is reported under room, and an asterisk (*) is found in the Board column.)

Full-time student.

Undergraduate: A student enrolled for 12 or more semester credits, 12 or more quarter credits, or 24 or more contact hours a week each term.

Graduate: A student enrolled for 9 or more semester credits, or 9 or more quarter credits.

Full-year student. A student who attends an institution for a full academic year. An academic year is the period of time generally extending from September to June; usually equated to two semesters or trimesters, three quarters, or the period covered by a 4-1-4 plan.

Graduate student. A student who holds a bachelor's or first-professional degree, or equivalent, and is taking courses at the postbaccalaureate level. These students may or may not be enrolled in graduate programs.

In-district student. A student who is a legal resident of the locality in which he or she attends school and thus is entitled to reduced tuition charges if offered by the institution. (In this report, institutions with a triple asterisk (***) to the right of their name charge tuition and required fees to in-district students that are at least 10 percent lower than the charge to in-state students.) This code is found in the 2-year and public less-than-2-year tables only, since 4-year schools generally do not have separate in-district charges.

In-state student. A student who is a legal resident of the state in which he or she attends school.

Meals per week. See "Board."

Out-of-state student. A student who is not a legal resident of the state in which he or she attends school.

Private. An institution controlled by a private individual(s) or by a nongovernmental agency, usually supported primarily by other than public funds, and operated by other than publicly elected or appointed officials.

Public. An institution whose programs and activities are operated by publicly elected or appointed school officials and which is supported primarily by public funds.

Room. The charge for an academic year for rooming accommodations of a typical student sharing a room with one other student.

Tuition and required fees. Tuition is the charge to students for instructional services. Required fees are all fixed sum charges to students which are not covered by tuition and which are required of such a large proportion of all students that the student who does not pay the charge is an exception. This figure does not include such items as books, lab fees, or transportation expenses. (In this report, tuition and required fees at private schools are for in-state students; however, in the vast majority of cases private schools charge the same amount to in-state and out-of-state students.)

Undergraduate student. A student enrolled in a 4- or 5-year bachelor's degree program, in an associate's degree program, or in a vocational or technical program below the baccalaureate.
