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ABSTRACT


This publication presents a series of charts, designed for quick reference, which describe the status of alternative teacher certification routes in each of the 50 states. The charts were prepared in response to an increasing number of inquiries from educators, policy makers, and the public. Information was gathered by telephone surveys of state departments of education in every state. The charts provide the following information: (1) nontraditional ways in which teachers are entering classrooms; (2) clarification of requirements for alternative certification; (3) the filling of teaching positions in the critical needs areas of science, mathematics, or foreign languages (in most cases emergency certification is granted on a temporary basis); and (4) requirements for clinical experience and additional classroom requirements for certification. In order to assist in national trend analysis, a summary of state data is included which provides information with respect to states that allow emergency certification for shortage areas, require clinical experience, or have evaluated their alternative routes for teacher certification. 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INTRODUCTION

The following charts present the status of alternative teacher certification routes in all 50 states. They were prepared by the Education Commission of the States (ECS) in response to the increased inquiries from educators, policy makers and the public.

Other surveys have been conducted on alternative certification¹. This survey updates the public on changes in the non-traditional ways teachers are entering the classroom and clarifies requirements for alternative certification. The attached charts are designed for quick reference.

Although the charts are designed for quick reference, several issues require further explanation. First, some states created alternative certification routes to fill teaching positions in "critical needs" areas only. These areas are in science, mathematics or foreign languages. In most cases, emergency certification is granted on a temporary basis, although some states include options for permanent certification in their legislation.

Second, the charts provide information about requirements for clinical experience and additional classroom requirements for certification. For example, some states require a candidate to perform supervised teaching hours, sometimes called clinical experience, before certification is granted. In these states, certification depends on successful completion of a specified number of hours teaching in a classroom while being evaluated by a traditionally certified teacher. Other states require the candidate to return to an accredited college or

university to attend various education classes. In addition, some states require candidates to complete both student teaching hours and to return to the college campus.

Third, a summary of state data is included. It provides information such as: how many states allow emergency certification for shortage areas, require clinical experience or have evaluated their alternative routes for teacher certification. This information will help the reader analyze nationwide trends.

Those interested must be cognizant of changes in state policy regarding alternative teacher certification. Many requirements change from one legislative session to another. Although specific requirements may change, shortages of teachers in certain subject areas mean alternative routes are likely to be available for quite some time.

The information presented here was gathered through telephone surveys of state departments of education in every state. ECS staff members Melodye Bush, Andrea Paolino and Kathy Christie conducted the surveys and prepared the charts.
