



Sound and Video Recording Collection - Bird Library

The media collection including sound and video recordings has been an integral part of the Library of Continuing Education (LCE) since 1961, when the Fund for Adult Education contributed both its print and nonprint materials. This substantial addition to the existing collection of LCE, later Syracuse University Resources for Educators of Adults (SUREA) and now the Adult Education Collection, is to provide library and related resources in the field of adult and continuing education for educators of adults who are conducting research as well as for practitioners.

Sustained, systematic efforts over the years have made the print materials ever more readily accessible. These efforts continue. Particularly in the past few years they have been processed into the Ernest S. Bird Library. Each media item has been catalogued by title, series, subject, author, date, speaker, or discussant (where available), using the same subject terms as materials for print. The cards are filed in the main card catalogue of the Bird Library through December 1980. Beginning in 1981 access was through the SULIRS on line catalog; in 1991, through SUMMIT, the new on line public access catalog (OPAC). Thus, the user may consult the same catalogs for both print and media material.

The following comments related to the Oral History Collection.

1. the primary purpose of the oral history project is the collection of sound and video recordings for research by scholars in the field of adult and continuing education.
2. The collection also includes recordings of programs conducted for adults. These may be used by research persons and also by practitioners who are developing programs.
3. In most cases the only data about the contents on a cassette are what is provided by sound. Sometimes there is a written comment on a cassette. Consequently the interviewer, moderator, convener, or presenter is not always identified and when identified the name may be subject to interpretation. Likewise titles, events, dates and other data may not be complete. Names, events, dates and other data continue to be checked for accuracy and completeness.

4. In instances where the data have been used as the basis for a publication bibliographical data about the publications are given (if identified).
5. In cases where the tape is not clear or may be incomplete, this information is given (if identified).

The original material or the copy are held in the Media Department. The user may borrow the media materials by the same procedures as for print materials. The Library will make a cassette-form copy of the open reel, record or cassette. The cassette-form copy may then be borrowed by the user through the Media Desk or through inter-library loan. Listening facilities are in Library carrels.

Educators of adults may also note that the Omnibus series is held at Syracuse University and is readily available for use. A description and shelf list are in "The Omnibus Series."

SUREA continues its processing to improve accessibility of present materials and it is continuing also to add to its collection. Individuals and groups that have items are encouraged to contribute them. Additions of sound and video recordings are noted in the regular announcements of the Media Department of Bird Library. The materials, with acknowledgement of donor, will be processed in the same way as the present materials.

Syracuse University as well as educators of adults are grateful to the many contributors to the collection.
