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ABSTRACT

This report contains a synopsis of all public education waivers to improve student achievement granted to Texas school districts during the period from September 1, 1991 through August 31, 1992. The purpose of the waivers is to set aside a requirement or prohibition imposed by state law that inhibits student achievement. The state's educational governance philosophy is to allow districts maximum flexibility to develop processes and programs to achieve state standards for student achievement and to hold districts accountable. Following the introduction, the first section describes Texas Partnership Schools and how the waiver process applies to them. Subsequent sections offer descriptions and lists of waivers granted to school districts regarding staff development, course requirements, final examinations, certification, the Texas Teacher Appraisal System, textbooks, and other general waivers. The most prevalent waiver involved staff development, which allows a district or campus to conduct one or more days of staff development in lieu of student instruction. Numerous waivers were also granted in the areas of final examinations and course requirements. An index to waivers by district and a list of exceptions to maximum class size limitations are included. 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

More extensive evaluation data will be gathered in the future and will be included in the annual report for 1992-93.

The State Board of Education reviewed this report in January 1993, and the report is now transmitted to you as required by state law.

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## EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

*The waiver process provides the means for the Commissioner to grant maximum flexibility to educators willing to accept the responsibility that accompanies their new freedom.*

**T**he Commissioner of Education grants waivers of state law and of State Board of Education rules for the purpose of improving student achievement. The authority for these waivers, Texas Education Code (TEC) §11.273, was first enacted by the 71st Texas Legislature in 1989. The 72nd Legislature later transferred waiver authority from the Board to the Commissioner, effective September 1, 1991.

Traditionally, state policymakers have been reluctant to allow unrestricted deregulation of public education. Fear of abuse that could result in the lowering of academic standards and consequently a decline in student performance have contributed to this reluctance. During the past three years, however, both the Legislature and the State Board have begun a process of granting more and more decision-making authority to local districts. The decision of the 72nd Legislature to expand and move the waiver authority corresponded with the naming of Lionel R. Meno as Commissioner of Education effective July 1, 1991.

Dr. Meno arrived as Commissioner espousing a basic philosophy of flexibility with accountability. From the beginning, he has called for the state to establish real-world standards for all students, to allow local school districts maximum flexibility to develop and implement the processes and programs to achieve these standards, and to hold the districts accountable. Critical to this concept is the implementation of site-based decision making, also enacted by the 72nd Legislature (TEC §21.931)—that is, the active involvement of teachers, parents, and the business community. Local educators have come to appreciate the Commissioner's conviction that "the programs and processes are negotiable—only the students and student outcomes are non-negotiable."

Today, local educators recognize the serious nature of their responsibility and do not take it lightly. They accept the obligation to accurately assess the needs of all students and to involve all segments of the community in meeting these needs. New and different programs and approaches are often required. The waiver process provides the means for the Commissioner to grant maximum flexibility to educators willing to accept the responsibility that accompanies their new freedom.

This report has been prepared in accordance with the statutory requirement (TEC §11.272(c)) and covers all waivers granted during the 1991-92 school year. A majority of these waivers were effective for the first time in the 1992-93 school year; therefore, future reports will more fully assess their impact. Reports from school districts on waivers effective in the 1991-92 school year, however, indicate positive results in virtually all instances and expectations for greater results in the future.

Under the law, a school district or campus may request a waiver with the approval of the district's board of trustees. Among the many waivers that have been granted are those that allow districts and campuses to conduct one or more days of staff development in lieu of student instruction. Another prevalent waiver allows a district to exempt a junior and/or senior student from one or more final examinations if the student's grades and attendance meet specified standards. Waivers affecting course requirements, particularly those replacing low-level courses with grade-level instruction, have been numerous. Altogether, seven types of waivers, including textbook waivers which are granted under Board rule, are enumerated and explained in this report. A separate section on Partnership Schools and waiver authority related to these schools follows this introduction.

Finally, the appendix includes a listing of the exceptions granted to the maximum class size limitation (22:1), as required by law.

# INTRODUCTION

**W**aivers as an instrument of public education policy were first established in 1988 when the State Board of Education adopted a rule authorizing the Commissioner of Education to waive any of the other rules of the Board. State law already contained provisions permitting the Commissioner to allow exceptions to certain law, e.g., maximum class size, in cases of hardship or calamity. The Board rule recognized the possibility of waivers being granted for these reasons; however, it had as its main purpose fostering educational innovation and improvement. This waiver authority, of course, did not include state statutes, and its power to set aside rules of the Board was not broadly used.

Statutory authority to waive both state laws and Board rules was established by the 71st Texas Legislature as part of public education sunset legislation. This authority was initially contained in a separate measure backed by Governor William P. Clements which also included excellence exemptions and the Governor's Public Education Excellence Program, now the Texas Successful Schools Program. Late in the 1989 session, the measure was added to the sunset bill as a floor amendment in the House of Representatives and was adopted as part of this bill. This waiver authority is codified as Section 11.273 of the Texas Education Code (TEC). (Excellence exceptions are applicable under the statute to a district or campus with an accreditation status that will be activated in the future.)

The purpose of waivers, as stated in the waiver statute, is to set aside a requirement or prohibition "imposed by law or rule that . . . inhibits student achievement." In other words, the purpose is to improve student achievement. Either a district or campus may request a waiver. By law, every waiver request requires the approval of the local board of trustees and must be developed with the involvement of the district or campus faculty, as appropriate. According to the statute, a waiver may not be granted if it relates to any of the following:

- curriculum essential elements
- restrictions on extracurricular activities
- health and safety
- competitive bidding

***The Commissioner may grant a waiver for a period not to exceed three years.***

- elementary school class size limits
- minimum graduation requirements
- removal of a disruptive student from the classroom
- suspension or expulsion of a student
- at-risk programs
- prekindergarten programs
- educational employee and educational support employee rights and benefits
- special education or bilingual education programs
- any federal law or rule

The Commissioner may grant a waiver for a period not to exceed three years. Where a waiver results in improving student achievement, the Commissioner may grant an exemption to the district or campus that has had the waiver for a three-year period. The exemption "remains in effect until the Commissioner determines that the achievement level of the campus or district has declined" (TEC §11.273(d)).

As adopted in 1989, waiver authority was placed with the State Board rather than the Commissioner. The 72nd Legislature in 1991 amended the law to move the authority to the Commissioner, effective September 1, 1991. Since that time, Commissioner Meno has been aggressive in promoting the use of waivers and in granting waivers for progressive and innovative efforts to improve student achievement in the public schools of the state.

During the 1991-92 state fiscal year, the Commissioner granted waivers under the authority of TEC §11.273 that fall into seven basic types: (1) staff development waivers, (2) course requirement waivers, (3) final examination waivers, (4) certification waivers, (5) Texas Teacher Appraisal System waivers, (6) other general waivers, and (7) textbook waivers. Textbook waivers, while also authorized by TEC §11.273, are granted by the Commissioner only under the terms and conditions established by State Board rule, as provided by the statute. This rule is found in the Texas Administrative Code (TAC) §61.30. The Commissioner reports to the Board at each of its meetings on all waivers granted in the previous period. The Commissioner's waiver authority is currently administered by the Division of Field Services.

Waivers granted by the Commissioner during 1991-92 are helping schools in many ways to improve their educational programs and operations, thereby improving student achievement. Perhaps the most significant and certainly the most prevalent waiver is the waiver related to staff development. This waiver allows a district or campus to conduct organized and planned sessions, involving district or campus faculties, that present better methods and new approaches to meeting the varied educational needs of an increasingly diverse student population. Due to the absence of any days for staff development in the state-mandated 180-day instructional calendar, these waivers are an essential component of virtually any organized effort a campus or district undertakes to improve the performance of its students.

Another prevalent waiver is directly aimed at increasing the mathematical abilities of Texas' high school students. This waiver is targeted particularly at students who have not done well in mathematics at lower grade levels and who reach high school too deficient in math skills to tackle the regular high school math curriculum successfully. The waiver allows a district to offer Algebra I to these students over a two-year period, rather than the usual one year, and to award two state graduation credits in mathematics for successful completion of both years of the course. Several other waivers related to course requirements allow similar means of changing instructional approaches and, thereby, improve student achievement. These are outlined in a section of this report dealing with course requirements.

For a few months, waivers allowing individual students to substitute off-campus, Olympic-level physical training for required physical education were granted by the Commissioner under authority of TEC §11.273. Subsequently, the Commissioner appointed a committee, including parents, to review the Board rule relating to substitutions for physical education (TAC §75.151(6)(D)) and policies needed to assure the quality and effectiveness of the physical education program. Until the committee concludes its review, no additional substitutions are being approved by the Commissioner.

Sections of this report describe the types of general waivers granted by the Commissioner during the 1991-92 state fiscal year under the authority of TEC §11.273. Any policy criteria established by the Commissioner in connection with a specific type of waiver is noted, and examples are presented indicating the effects of some of these waivers in the 1991-92 school year on the performance of students in selected districts. Each section lists the waivers of that type granted by the Commissioner in

1991-92. While all the waivers granted during 1991-92 are listed, a majority of these waivers were effective for the 1992-93 school year and often for subsequent years (not exceeding three years as provided by statute). Consequently, the effects of many of these waivers are being felt for the first time this school year. Districts must report on progress every year that waivers are in effect. Therefore, complete results will be included in subsequent annual waiver reports.

A separate section of this report shows waivers granted in 1991-92 by school district. This listing serves as an index by district for the data contained in prior sections of the report. Also, a section on Partnership Schools and waiver authority related to these schools is included following this introduction.

In addition to waivers under authority of TEC §11.273, the Commissioner grants exceptions to the law requiring a maximum class size of 22 students to one certified teacher in kindergarten through Grade 4 and, by Board rule, applicable also to prekindergarten. These exceptions are commonly called waivers but are authorized by the statute establishing the 22:1 limit (TEC §16.054). The report on class size exceptions required by statute is included as an appendix.

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# PARTNERSHIP SCHOOLS

**I**n October 1991, the Commissioner of Education issued a challenge to Texas educators. He invited them to participate in an innovative effort—the Partnership Schools Initiative (PSI)—designed to achieve educational excellence and equity for all students. Campuses were sought for PSI that had innovative leaders, committed staffs, supportive boards, and involved communities. Within a month, administrators from over 2,000 campuses from around the state had responded to the challenge. After a rigorous selection process, 83 of the many qualified schools were chosen to be part of the Initiative. In January 1992, Commissioner Meno publicly announced the 83 campuses selected to participate in PSI. During the spring and summer of 1992, PSI schools identified the needs of their students and developed their campus plans. The fall of 1992 marked the beginning of the implementation of each plan.

The PSI is a catalyst for systemic change, providing support, freedom, and empowerment to help campuses meet their unique needs. The Initiative involves all stakeholders in facilitating academic excellence and equity. The goal of the Initiative is to demonstrate that schools can overcome complex challenges, improve student achievement and close performance gaps. As the demands of the world change and increase, educators cannot continue to teach the same skills with the same techniques and expect students to be successful. PSI schools are charged with restructuring education to meet the needs of students living in an increasingly complex society. The Initiative helps these schools devise and implement innovative programs to enable students to be successful. The schools—their trustees, teachers, administrators, students, and communities—are pioneers committed to this goal. Through the PSI, the Texas Education Agency and the 20 education service centers join participating schools as partners in the commitment.

*The goal of the Initiative is to demonstrate that schools can overcome complex challenges, improve student achievement and close performance gaps.*

The following basic beliefs provide the foundation and guidance for the PSI:

- The students and the expected student results are non-negotiable; programs are totally negotiable.

***PSI schools are committed to improving student performance.***

- Full involvement of all levels of school staff in the decision-making process leads to ownership and pride in the program.
- Investing in intensive staff development will improve teacher competency which will lead to improved student outcomes.
- Creating environments that promote staff growth and development is essential.
- A partnership among the state, the school, parents, and other interested parties is one major strategy for reaching the goal of improved performance of all Texas students.

The Commissioner is prepared to grant PSI campuses maximum flexibility through the waiver process. This strategy is based on the belief that when given maximum opportunity, including relief from rules and regulations, a school will develop and implement a program that leads to improved performance of all students. The PSI allows educators and others closest to the students the flexibility and creativity to determine how to best serve the needs of the students and to help them reach their goals. PSI schools are committed to improving student performance. To do so, they:

- identify areas of need
- involve all levels of the campus community in the decision-making process
- remain willing to question and modify the existing system
- develop plans to address needs
- identify barriers that hinder student performance
- implement and continually evaluate their plans

To facilitate the waiver process for PSI schools, the Commissioner has delegated to the executive directors of the education service centers his authority to waive law and rules. This waiver process will allow PSI schools maximum freedom to create effective programs and practices that will improve student performance.

In addition, to encourage comprehensive staff development that addresses campus needs, time for such training is being provided. Through the waiver process, PSI schools may use up to 15 days for staff development in lieu of student attendance. These staff development days must be planned by the campus staff and must be based on the specific needs of students.

Participation in PSI represents a long-term commitment on the part of all involved. Campuses are expected to show substantial improvement in all areas of student performance. However, systemic change requires time and extended effort. Incremental gains in student performance are expected continually throughout the Initiative. Over a period of three to four years, successful models for school restructuring will be developed. These models can then be replicated in all parts of the state, thus spreading the successes of PSI throughout Texas.

# STAFF DEVELOPMENT WAIVERS

*Some districts reported specific gains as early as Spring 1992.*

**E**very staff development waiver must meet all of the following criteria:

- It must reflect a clear focus and the aim of improving student performance and closing the achievement gap between advantaged and disadvantaged students.
- It must demonstrate teacher and, preferably, community involvement and commitment.
- It must involve well-planned staff development and not so-called work days.

In addition, every approved waiver for staff development prohibits the use of early release days for any purpose other than staff development or parent-teacher conferences. Each waiver also prohibited the scheduling of the staff development days that are granted in lieu of student attendance on the days immediately prior to the beginning of school. In most cases, a waiver for staff development is for no more than six days and often less, depending upon the plan and request of the school district or campus. In a few instances, where a district developed a more complete educational plan and strategy with extensive involvement of the community, additional staff development days not exceeding 15 were granted. During 1991-92, over 600 waivers were granted for staff development scheduled at the district or campus level in 1991-92 or 1992-93.

Only a relatively small number of districts were able to amend their calendars and take advantage of staff development waivers during the 1991-92 school year. Of the districts that did receive staff development waivers in 1991-92, most held programs in the spring. The major effect of these programs on student learning and performance, consequently, will be seen in the 1992-93 school year and thereafter. Every district evaluation of 1991-92 staff development, however, reported a highly positive response by school faculties. Also reported were expectations for real gains in performance as a result of days devoted to improving district and campus programs and methods. Some districts reported specific gains as early as Spring 1992. For example, as a result of technology training, one district reported: "We are doubling our time in the computer lab and the use of the

computers in our basic curriculum. . . . We are seeing after-hours use of our computers by students and more interest in the use of computers for term papers and other written assignments." Another district reported that improvements were observed in students' attitudes and grades and a lower number of students were in tutorials, which the district believed "signaled a positive effect of staff development on student achievement." Overall, as another district reported, results of staff development programs in the spring of 1991-92 were positive, but "it is too soon to determine any significant effects on student achievement." However, the teachers rated the content workshops and the quality of the presentations highly and indicated that "they would be able to use the new strategies to improve the quality of their teaching."

In the following table, a numerical entry by itself indicates the number of full days granted for staff development. An entry including the letters ER indicates, generally, the number of additional early release days granted over and above the six early release days permitted by Board rule (TAC §105.31). A district that receives a waiver for staff development must use any early release days either for staff development or parent-teacher conferences.

# COURSE REQUIREMENT WAIVERS

**A** significant number of districts—226 in total—have received waivers to offer Algebra I as a two-year course and to award two state graduation credits for successful completion of the two-year course. Prior to July 1992, a number of districts received approval to discontinue offering certain courses considered low level. These courses were originally designed for students who were not at grade level in one or more areas of academic performance, e.g., mathematics or English. In July 1992, the State Board of Education, at the recommendation of the Commissioner, adopted amendments to its rules for curriculum and discontinued graduation credit for low-level courses in a phaseout which was immediately effective. The courses affected, which were previously the subject of several waivers, include Fundamentals of Mathematics, Consumer Mathematics, and Correlated Language Arts. Waivers allowing districts to eliminate low-level courses and to offer Algebra I for two years for two credits are aimed at raising the level of the basic curriculum. The waivers will help assure that every student learns core subjects at an adequate real-world level.

To this same end, several districts received waivers allowing them to eliminate the reading improvement course prescribed by Board rule for Grade 7 and 8 students who score below an accepted level on a standardized reading achievement test. In place of this separate course, districts, generally, are placing all their Grade 7 and 8 students in heterogeneous classes in reading, in addition to regular language arts classes. In these classes, high-achieving, average, and low-achieving students all benefit from the additional reading instruction. Another example of waivers to improve the curriculum are those that allow districts to offer computer literacy prior to Grades 7 and 8 where it is prescribed by rule. These waivers permit computer instruction to be offered to students earlier in their academic careers, often at Grade 6 but sometimes at lower grades in a diffused fashion through other subjects.

The following table lists waivers for course requirements granted during 1991-92. Since most of these waivers were first effective in the 1992-93 school year, their impact will be evaluated in a future report.

# FINAL EXAMINATION WAIVERS

*District evaluations have been virtually unanimous in reporting improvement in grades and attendance as a result of the final examination waiver and the district's exemption policy.*

**W**aivers granted to many school districts across the state—240, in fact—permit the districts to establish policies, within the limitations established by the terms of the waivers, that allow students to earn exemptions from one or more final examinations. The terms of the waivers limit final examination exemptions to junior and senior students. To be exempt from a final examination in a course, the student's grade must not be less than 80 in the course. Also the student must not have more than three absences during the semester under the school's absence policy. An estimated one-third of districts with final examination waivers have stricter local policies. Some limit the exemption to seniors only. Some limit the exemption to fewer than all the courses a student is taking. Others set up graduated scales relating grades and absences so that, for example, only a course grade in the nineties earns an exemption if the student has any absences.

District evaluations have been virtually unanimous in reporting improvement in grades and attendance as a result of the final examination waiver and the district's exemption policy. A number of districts also reported fewer truancies and fewer discipline problems.

The following table lists waivers for final examinations granted during 1991-92.

## FINAL EXAMINATION WAIVERS

Every final examination waiver must meet the following minimum criteria: (a) the waiver applies only to students in Grades 11 and/or 12; (b) the student must have a grade average of at least 80 in the class from which final exam he or she is exempted; and (c) the student must have not more than three absences in the semester. Districts may adopt stricter criteria, and one-third or more are believed to have done so.

# CERTIFICATION WAIVERS

*In some instances, certification rules have been waived because they impede educational improvement.*

**A** request for a certification waiver is often submitted by a district that faces a situation in which no satisfactory alternative exists. The district can find no certified and qualified teacher, and the individual for whom a waiver is requested is the most qualified person available. The waiver is usually granted for only one year. The individual (often a certified teacher already) is expected to take steps to add the needed additional certification and to finish uncompleted certification requirements. After initial receipt, these requests are reviewed by the Agency division that administers teacher and administrator certification. If an emergency or other permit cannot be granted for technical or other reasons, the waiver request is then reviewed based on the merits of each case.

In some instances, certification rules have been waived because they impede educational improvement. For example, several certification waivers have been granted to allow teachers certified in elementary education to teach core subjects in alternative education programs for at-risk high school students. These students are usually one or more grade levels behind and, although overage, often relate better to an elementary level teacher and style of instruction.

# TEXAS TEACHER APPRAISAL SYSTEM WAIVERS

**W**aivers related to the Texas Teacher Appraisal System (TTAS), like all other waivers, have as their purpose improving the educational program of the campus or district in order to improve student achievement. Waivers of TTAS granted in 1991-92 were basically of two types. Most TTAS waivers (23) were granted to permit a reduced use of TTAS for experienced, proven teachers at Level 2 or Level 3 of the career ladder. A small number (6) permit the development and use of a teacher appraisal system that may differ completely from TTAS. These systems, because they will be used for career ladder purposes, must meet the same standards for accuracy, reliability, and absence of bias as does TTAS.

Two approaches to waivers allowing reduced use of TTAS are being approved. The approach most requested, and the only one approved in 1991-92, is to place the teachers (either Level 2 or Level 3 teachers, or both, as the district requests) on a two- or three-year TTAS appraisal cycle. To qualify, teachers must have been rated either *clearly outstanding* or, if the district requests, *exceeding expectations* on their most recent TTAS summary performance scores. A local evaluation is required in the year(s) any teacher is not appraised under TTAS, but the last previous TTAS appraisal must be used for career ladder purposes. Participation by eligible teachers is voluntary, and any teacher who wishes to have a TTAS appraisal rather than, or in addition to, the local appraisal in any year is entitled to it.

The other approach allows a single observation (rather than the usual two observations required by Board rule) under TTAS procedures and standards to satisfy the requirement for an annual TTAS appraisal. This approach also can apply only to Level 2 or Level 3 teachers and cannot be combined with another TTAS waiver that applies to the same teachers.

## OTHER GENERAL WAIVERS

**W**aivers that do not readily fit into a more specific category are listed as *other general waivers*. Although these waivers vary from the other types, several kinds reoccur within this group. For example, 19 districts or elementary campuses were approved to alter their methods of reporting students' academic progress in one or more elementary grades. Rather than using A, B, C, etc. or numerical grades, these waivers allow the use of *excellent*, *satisfactory*, and *unsatisfactory* (permitted by Board rules through Grade 1) or, in some instances, a more detailed scheme of progress reporting, especially for use in discussions with parents and guardians.

Waivers allowing a change in the reporting period from six weeks to nine weeks for several (17) districts' elementary schools were also approved. Some of these schools are on year-round calendars with 45-day class schedules, followed by 15-day intercessions. Other districts, however, received approval to use the nine-week period to allow more instructional time between reporting periods, giving students greater opportunity to learn, especially at lower grade levels, between formal reporting times. Four waivers, including the high school level, were granted to allow grade reporting on a nine-week basis. These waivers, like those that included any grade level that is subject to the no pass-no play rule—high school, middle school, junior high, or elementary—required that on a six-weeks basis a grade equivalent to 70 and above or below be established for any student involved in extracurricular activities. This requirement was imposed because of the prohibition in statute on waiving extracurricular law or rules.

Several elementary campuses received waivers permitting changes in weekly class schedules to allow improved programs of physical education for their students. The waivers permit these schools to offer longer physical education periods several days each week in place of limited periods of daily physical education. Daily physical activity is provided for these young students, however, through the regular classroom and lunchtime play.

*Waivers that do not readily fit into a more specific category are listed as other general waivers.*

Scheduling of the summer bilingual program was the subject of seven waiver requests granted during the 1991-92 school year. In virtually every case, districts asked to be allowed to change the schedule of their programs from four hours per day, five days a week to schedules that coincided with other summer programs at their schools. These changes in schedule were requested to increase attendance in and, in some cases, to provide transportation for summer bilingual programs. In every case where a waiver was granted, the total instructional time was not reduced. Attendance—and, consequently, student readiness for regular session classes—was expected to improve.

A number of waivers aimed at improving student achievement through parental involvement were granted. Effective for the beginning of the 1992-93 school year, these waivers were limited to prekindergarten, kindergarten, and first grade. Generally, they allowed teachers to spend part or all of the first few days of the school year visiting in the homes of their students or holding parent conferences and training sessions for parents at the school campus.

# TEXTBOOK WAIVERS

**T**extbook waivers are granted under a rule adopted by the State Board of Education (19 TAC §61.30), as provided by the law establishing waiver authority. The purpose of textbook waivers, like all other waivers, is to improve students' academic performance. Textbook waivers must be submitted by March 1 preceding the first year of the state's textbook adoption cycle for the course or subject for which a different textbook or course materials are desired. With approval of the local board of trustees, either a campus or district may submit a textbook waiver request. Under the rule, a textbook submitted for consideration but denied state adoption is not eligible for selection through a waiver. Also, if no textbook for a course or subject is adopted by the Board, no waiver for a textbook in that course or subject is allowed under the rule. Finally, under the criteria that the Commissioner of Education must use in evaluating and granting textbook waiver requests, "a clear designation of special student groups to be served, such as special campuses, academic groupings, selected grade levels [or] specific student populations . . ." is a fundamental consideration in any request.

The following table lists textbook waivers granted in 1991-92. All of these waivers are effective for 1992-93; consequently, results will be evaluated at a subsequent date.

# EXCEPTIONS TO MAXIMUM CLASS SIZE LIMITATION

**A** statutory limitation applicable to the size of classes in certain elementary grades was adopted by the Texas Legislature in 1984 as part of the public education reform act (House Bill 72) of that year. In a phase-in approach written into the law, the limit of 22 students to one certified teacher (22:1) applied in the 1985-86 school year through the 1987-88 school year to kindergarten through Grade 2 students only. The law extended this limitation to Grades 3 and 4, beginning with the 1988-89 school year. The State Board of Education by rule made the limitation applicable to prekindergarten classes also (19 TAC 75.141(g)(7)).

Today, it is generally recognized that smaller class size in elementary grades positively affects student achievement and that educational gains in Texas public schools have resulted from the class size limitation adopted in 1984. Considering the relatively limited number of requests for exceptions, most classes in the affected grades apparently conform to the requirements of the class size statute. Because of the continuing growth of the state's student population, however, and its mobility, temporary exceptions from the application of the limitation are still needed by some districts, usually for only a few of their classes. (The statute uses the term *exception* rather than waiver.)

Until January 1992, exceptions to the 22:1 limitation were granted by the Commissioner of Education under a State Board rule. The rule allowed only two reasons for obtaining an exception: the district requesting the exception either (a) did not have the facilities for additional classrooms or (b) could not find and obtain the services of a certified, qualified teacher. Since the Board rule was repealed under the sunset process applicable to Board rules, the Commissioner has continued to follow the policy established by the former rule in granting 22:1 waivers. By law, a class size waiver may be granted for only one semester at a time. Under the former rule and now Commissioner's policy, a district may have one class at each grade level on each campus of up to and including 24 students and not need an exception.

In the fall of the 1991-92 school year, a total of 81 districts were granted exceptions from the maximum class size requirement. In the spring, a total of 94 districts were granted exceptions. The districts receiving exceptions for the 1991-92 fall and spring semesters are listed in the table that follows, showing the grade(s) for which the exception was granted and the reason for the exception. Data collection and programming improvements made in Fall 1992 to the data base for exceptions granted to the maximum class size statute will allow future reports to show more information about these exceptions, including the name of the campus where the exception is applicable and the number of classes affected at each grade level.

The following table fits the exceptions to the maximum class size limitation granted for the fall semester and spring semester of the 1991-92 school year.

# COMPLIANCE STATEMENT

## **TITLE VI, CIVIL RIGHTS ACT OF 1964; THE MODIFIED COURT ORDER, CIVIL ACTION 5281, FEDERAL DISTRICT COURT, EASTERN DISTRICT OF TEXAS, TYLER DIVISION**

Reviews of local education agencies pertaining to compliance with Title VI Civil Rights Act of 1964 and with specific requirements of the Modified Court Order, Civil Action No. 5281, Federal District Court, Eastern District of Texas, Tyler Division are conducted periodically by staff representatives of the Texas Education Agency. These reviews cover at least the following policies and practices:

- (1) acceptance policies on student transfers from other school districts;
- (2) operation of school bus routes or runs on a nonsegregated basis;
- (3) nondiscrimination in extracurricular activities and the use of school facilities;
- (4) nondiscriminatory practices in the hiring, assigning, promoting, paying, demoting, reassigning, or dismissing of faculty and staff members who work with children;
- (5) enrollment and assignment of students without discrimination on the basis of race, color, or national origin;
- (6) nondiscriminatory practices relating to the use of a student's first language; and
- (7) evidence of published procedures for hearing complaints and grievances.

In addition to conducting reviews, the Texas Education Agency staff representatives check complaints of discrimination made by a citizen or citizens residing in a school district where it is alleged discriminatory practices have occurred or are occurring.

Where a violation of Title VI of the Civil Rights Act is found, the findings are reported to the Office for Civil Rights, U.S. Department of Education.

If there is a direct violation of the Court Order in Civil Action No. 5281 that cannot be cleared through negotiation, the sanctions required by the Court Order are applied.

## **TITLE VII, CIVIL RIGHTS ACT OF 1964 AS AMENDED; EXECUTIVE ORDERS 11246 AND 11375; TITLE IX, EDUCATION AMENDMENTS; REHABILITATION ACT OF 1973 AS AMENDED; 1974 AMENDMENTS TO THE WAGE-HOUR LAW EXPANDING THE AGE DISCRIMINATION IN EMPLOYMENT ACT OF 1967; VIETNAM ERA VETERANS READJUSTMENT ASSISTANCE ACT OF 1972 AS AMENDED; AMERICAN DISABILITIES ACT OF 1990; AND THE CIVIL RIGHTS ACT OF 1991.**
