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ABSTRACT

A study was conducted at William Rainey Harper College (WRHC) in Illinois to develop a profile of students who withdrew from courses between summer 1990 and spring 1992. For the 2-year period studied, each degree credit student who officially withdrew from a course was asked to complete a survey form, indicating withdrawal status, whether a counselor had been consulted, principal reason for withdrawal, method of registration, and general comments. Between 1990 and 1992, 13.4% of the 170,000 course enrollments resulted in official withdrawals, representing a 0.4% decrease in withdrawals from the 1988-1990 cohort. An analysis of these withdrawals indicated the following: (1) one out of every five course withdrawals resulted in complete withdrawal from WRHC, although nearly three-fourths of the students who withdrew planned to return to WRHC in the future; (2) nearly 30% of those withdrawing gave reasons completely beyond WRHC's control, and only 7% indicated WRHC as the primary cause for withdrawal; (3) the major reasons cited for withdrawals included personal, family, or health problems, too far behind/poor grades, inconvenient meeting times, or job pressures; (4) there continued to be a lower percentage of withdrawals during the summer semester than during the spring and fall semesters (11% versus 14%); (5) about 40% of the withdrawing students indicated that they had never consulted a counselor in the 2 years previous to withdrawal; and (6) overall, younger students continued to have a higher withdrawal rate than students over the age of 25. 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#### ABSTRACT

OVER THE PAST TWO YEARS 13.4 PERCENT OF THE COURSE ENROLLEES OFFICIALLY WITHDREW FROM THEIR PAST COURSES. ONE-FIFTH OF THE WITHDRAWALS RESULT IN A COMPLETE WITHDRAWAL FROM HARPER.

OVER THREE-QUARTERS OF THE STUDENTS WHO COMPLETELY WITHDRAW PLAN TO RETURN TO HARPER. CLOSE TO ONE-THIRD OF THOSE WITHDRAWING GIVE REASONS COMPLETELY BEYOND HARPER'S CONTROL AND ONLY SEVEN PERCENT INDICATED HARPER AS THE PRIMARY REASON FOR WITHDRAWAL. THESE RESULTS MIRROR OUR PAST STUDIES.

THE MAJOR REASONS FOR WITHDRAWAL CONTINUES TO BE RELATED TO PERSONAL, FAMILY, OR ILLNESS PROBLEMS. REASONS FOR WITHDRAWAL DIFFER SOMEWHAT BETWEEN THE SUMMER SEMESTERS AND THE FALL/SPRING SEMESTERS. SUMMER ENROLLEES CONTINUE TO BE LESS LIKELY TO WITHDRAW BECAUSE OF FALLING BEHIND ON COURSE WORK OR GRADES. JOB PRESSURES AND INCONVENIENT COURSE TIMES ARE THE MOST COMMON REASON FOR WITHDRAWAL FOR THE SUMMER STUDENTS.

YOUNGER STUDENTS HAVE A HIGHER WITHDRAWAL RATE (2 TO 1 RATIO) THAN OLDER STUDENTS. OLDER STUDENTS ARE MORE LIKELY TO WITHDRAW FOR REASONS BEYOND HARPER'S CONTROL. JOB PRESSURE IS A FREQUENT CAUSE FOR WITHDRAWAL FOR THE OLDER STUDENTS.

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## Purpose

The purpose of this report is to summarize data contained in the survey given each student who withdrew from a course during the period from summer semester 1990 through spring semester 1992. The objective of the report is to provide general institutional background profiling students who withdraw from courses at Harper.

## Population Surveyed

Students are asked to complete a survey form at the time they officially withdraw from a course. During the last two years, surveys have been completed for approximately 80 percent of the course withdrawals. However, one out of every three students drop more than one course and usually only one withdrawal form is filled out regardless of the number of courses a student drops. Thus, the unduplicated headcount of withdrawing students who completed surveys is much higher than appears. When compared to the previous study, the number of surveys completed per course withdrawals increased by 10 percent.

## Methodology

For the period from summer semester 1990 through spring 1992, each degree credit student who has officially withdrawn from a course has been asked to complete a survey form (shown in the appendix). This form was designed by the Office of Planning and Research and is distributed by the Office of the Registrar. The data has been analyzed to show many comparisons to data within the survey and to some limited student characteristics data.

## Discussion of Results

The results found in this study are similar to our last study. During the two-year period from the summer 1990 through spring 1992, 13.4 percent of the 170,000 course enrollments resulted in official withdrawals. This is a slight decrease (.4%) in course withdrawals when compared to the previous study completed in spring 1990. As in past studies, one out of every five course withdrawals results in a complete withdrawal from Harper. However, over three-quarters of the students who completely withdraw plan to return to Harper some day.

Of those withdrawing, nearly 30 percent withdraw for reasons completely beyond Harper's control and only seven percent indicate Harper as the primary cause for withdrawing. Those who withdraw for reasons beyond Harper's control are more likely to withdraw from Harper completely. These statistics have remained fairly constant with prior studies.

The major reasons cited for withdrawals include personal, family or illness problems, course times were inconvenient, and job pressures or new job. These reasons continue to be some of the most frequently cited reasons for withdrawals when compared to the

previous study. The number one cited reason for withdrawals is personal, family, or illness problems. The percentage of those withdrawing for inconvenient course times was the second most stated reason for withdraw.

The percent of withdrawals during the summer semester continues to be less than the percent of withdrawals in the spring and fall semesters (11% vs. 14%). Student's who withdraw during the summer are more likely to withdraw completely and to register by phone. Summer withdrawing students are less likely to ever have seen a counselor.

Reasons for withdrawal also differ when comparing the summer semester to the spring and fall semester. Summer enrollees continue to be less likely to withdraw because of falling behind on grades. However, the summer enrollees withdraw due to inconvenient course times and job pressures than students in the fall and spring semesters. Inconvenient course times is consistently given as the reason for withdrawal by summer students.

The percentage of withdrawals of those who register by telephone continues to be less than the percent of withdrawals by students registering in person. A smaller percentage register during the spring semester by phone compared to other semesters. Student's age 25 or more are more likely to register by phone. The student's which enroll by phone are more likely to withdraw completely from Harper. Despite the fact that younger people tend to withdraw twice as much as older students, and the ratio of older students withdrawing by phone is larger than the younger students, no definitive statement can be made regarding the affect of withdrawal compared to the actual method of registration since the system does not capture the volume of registration conducted by phone or in person.

During the past two years, around 40 percent of the students withdrawing say they have never consulted a counselor - similar to prior studies findings. Those who withdraw completely from Harper are less likely to consult a counselor in the semester of withdrawal.

The withdrawals consist mostly of younger students. They continue to have a higher withdrawal rate when compared to students 25 years of age or older (2 to 1 ratio). Students 25 years of age or older are more likely to withdraw for reason's completely beyond Harper's control than most students under 25 years of age (43% to 23%). The reason cited most by these students is personal, family, or illness. Although that reason is given almost twice as much than given by younger students, the reason of job pressures is significantly higher among older students (18.4% to 1.4%). Older students are less likely to withdraw due to poor grades or falling behind. Most of the above reasons are comparable to our prior studies.

## Conclusions

Over the past two years 13.4 percent of the course enrollees officially withdrew from their past courses. One-fifth of the withdrawals result in a complete withdrawal from Harper. Over three-quarters of the students who completely withdraw plan to return to Harper. Close to one-third of those withdrawing give reasons completely beyond Harper's control and only seven percent indicated Harper as the primary reason for withdrawal. These results mirror our past studies.

The major reasons for withdrawal continues to be related to personal, family, or illness problems. Reasons for withdrawal differ somewhat between the summer semesters and the fall/spring semesters. Summer enrollees continue to be less likely to withdraw because of falling behind on course work or grades. Job pressures and inconvenient course times are the most common reason for withdrawal for the summer students.

Younger students have a higher withdrawal rate (2 to 1 ratio) than older students. Older students are more likely to withdraw for reasons beyond Harper's control. Job pressure is a frequent cause for withdrawal for the older students.


It would be helpful if the system could provide the actual method of registration for the student enrollment data so that comparisons can be made between what is reported as the method of registration by the withdrawal study to the actual method of registration for the entire student body. Without this information no definitive statements can be made about the affect of the method of registration to withdrawal survey information.
