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ABSTRACT

This report provides information on selected characteristics of certified public school employees between 1980-81 and 1990-91. Information on certified personnel in 1989-90 was not available. Certified employees are grouped into function areas such as teachers, principals, guidance counselors, etc., based on each person's primary work assignment. Information is provided on personnel characteristics such as average age and experience, racial and sexual composition, and college degree levels. The information gives a historical picture of staffing patterns and significant trends. Data were obtained from reports completed by teachers and school districts, with much of the data derived from Student Activity Reports beginning with the 1989-90 school year. The report is divided into the following sections: (1) teachers; (2) principals; (3) assistant principals; (4) central office administrators and subject area and support area specialists; (5) librarians; (6) guidance counselors; and (7) other certified personnel. In all, 77 tables present personnel characteristics. (SLD)

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

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# INTRODUCTION

This report provides information on selected characteristics of certified public school employees between 1980-81 and 1990-91. Information on certified personnel in 1989-90 is missing from this report because the data for computing these statistics were not available for this year.

Certified employees are grouped into functional areas such as teachers, principals, guidance counselors, etc., based on each person's primary work assignment. Information on personnel characteristics such as average age and experience levels, racial and sexual composition, and college degree levels is provided. This report provides a historical view of staffing patterns and an indication of significant trends. Besides reporting the yearly status of current employees by functional area, information is also reported on personnel who left or entered employment. Information concerning the distribution of employees by experience level is reported for each category of certified personnel.

It should be noted that information in this document about the number of personnel leaving and new staff members refers only to persons who are new or have left public school employment. In this report, certified employees who change jobs or transfer to another school system are not considered new employees or personnel who have left public school employment.

The data in this report were obtained from Student Activity Reports (SAR), Professional Personnel Activity Reports (PPAR), and the Teacher Certification File. Professional Personnel Activity Reports are filed yearly during late September and early October by some school employees. Superintendents, associate superintendents and assistant superintendents do not file PPARs or SARs. Because PPARs are only collected once during each year, they provide a picture of what the certified staff looks like then. Data from Student Activity Reports are collected several times during the school year and are converted to a format compatible with that of the PPAR. Both the PPAR and SAR provide information on what certified school employees do and the time they spend on various assignments.

In this report, certified persons are classified according to their primary area of assignment. For example, persons spending 75 percent of their time as teachers and 25 percent of their time as librarians are classified as teachers. It also should be noted that the term "years of experience" refers to the total experience credit a person has accumulated, not the number of years of experience a person has in a particular assignment area.

Beginning with the 1989-90 school year, much of the data used in this report was obtained from the Student Activity Reports. This data is somewhat different from the PPAR data used in the past to develop this report. As a result, some information related to personnel characteristics for 1989-90 and beyond may be somewhat different than that for earlier years.

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# TEACHERS

## Characteristics of Teachers

The average age of teachers rose steadily since 1980-81, increasing from 38.6 to 41.4 in 1990-91. During the same period, the average years of experience increased from 12.2 to 13.5. The racial mix of the teaching staff shows a significant trend. The percentage of blacks in the teaching staff dropped from 20.8 percent in 1980-81 to 16.2 percent in 1990-91. Black females dropped from 16.7 percent in 1980-81 to 13.3 percent in 1990-91 and black males declined from 4.1 to 2.9 percent of the teaching staff during the same period. White males remained about the same percent of the teaching staff during this period. The percentage of indians in the teaching staff has remained fairly constant at about 0.9 percent. The only category showing an increase is white females. Between 1980-81 and 1990-91, their percentage of the total teaching staff increased from 61.8 percent to 66.2 percent. In 1980-81, males made up 20.6 percent of the teaching staff and females made up 79.4 percent. By 1990-91, males made up 19.4 percent and females 80.6 percent of the teaching staff. The percentage of teachers holding a bachelors degree or less declined since 1980-81, while the percentage holding the masters degree, sixth-year certificate, or doctorate increased. In 1980-81, the highest degree held by 76.2 percent of the teaching staff was a bachelors degree or less and 23.8 percent held a masters, sixth-year, or doctorate degree. By 1990-91, the percent of teachers whose highest degree was a bachelors degree or less declined to 68.5 percent and teachers with advanced degrees had increased to 31.5 percent of the teaching staff.

## Characteristics of Teachers Leaving the Profession

The average age of teachers leaving teaching is increasing. In 1979-80, the average age of a teacher leaving was 37.0. By 1988-89, it had increased to 40.5. The average years of experience of teachers leaving also increased from 10.8 in 1979-80 to 11.7 in 1988-89. Between 1979-80 and 1988-89, the percentage of black teachers leaving increased slightly from 15.2 to 15.6 percent. The percentage of indians leaving remained relatively constant at less than 1 percent. During the same period, the percentage of white teachers leaving decreased slightly from 83.8 to 83.5 percent of the teachers leaving. From 1979-80 to 1988-89 the percent of males leaving increased slightly from 18.3 to 18.8 percent and the percent of females leaving dropped from 81.7 percent to 81.2 percent.

## Characteristics of Newly Employed Teachers

The average age of newly employed teachers increased from 31.6 in 1980-81 to 35.2 in 1990-91. During the same period, the average years of experience of newly employed teachers varied from year to year, with the experience level averaging about 4.9 years. The racial mix of newly employed teachers has changed. In 1980-81, 13.0 percent of the newly employed teachers were black and 86.0 percent were white. In 1990-91, 11.2 percent of newly employed teachers were black and 86.3 percent were white. The percent of newly hired indian teachers has remained relatively constant, ranging from 0.6 to 0.8 of one percent of the new teachers. The male-female mix of new teachers varies from year to year and does not show a clear trend. Over the ten-year period, males made up from 16.7 to 21.0 percent of the newly employed teachers, while females ranged from 79.0 to 83.3 percent.

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# PRINCIPALS

## Characteristics of Principals

The average age of principals increased from 46.4 to 47.8 between 1980-81 and 1990-91. During the same period, the average experience increased from 21.7 to 22.6 years. Between 1980-81 and 1990-91 the racial composition of principals showed an increase of 1.1 percent in the percentage of black principals and a decrease of 1.2 percent in white principals. During the ten-year period, the percentage of indian principals remained relatively constant, averaging about 1.0 percent of the total. The sexual composition of persons in the principalship changed considerably between 1980-81 and 1990-91, with females increasing from 12.1 to 27.3 percent and males dropping from 87.9 to 72.2 percent. The highest degree held by principals has changed. In 1980-81, 30.7 percent of the principals held either the sixth-year certificate or the doctorate degree. By 1990-91, 46.6 percent of the principals held either a sixth-year certificate or a doctorate degree.

## Characteristics of Principals Leaving the Principalship

Between 1979-80 and 1988-89, the average age of persons leaving the principalship rose from 50.8 to 51.5 while the average years of experience increased from 24.3 to 26.2. During the same period, the percentage of blacks leaving the principalship varied from year to year, averaging about 21.0 percent of the principals leaving. The percentage of white principals leaving varied from year to year, averaging about 79 percent of those leaving. The number of indians leaving the principalship during the ten-year period averaged less than 1.0 of the personnel leaving yearly. The percentage of male principals leaving decreased from 84.2 percent to 70.3 percent while the percentage of females leaving the principalship rose from 15.8 to 29.7 percent between 1979-80 and 1988-89.

## Characteristics of Newly Employed Principals

The average age of newly employed principals varied between 44.1 and 46.4 between 1980-81 and 1990-91. During the same period, the average experience level of new principals showed year-to-year variation, averaging about 19 years. The racial and sexual composition of newly hired principals varied considerably from year to year. The percentage of new black principals ranged from a high of 29 percent in 1980-81 to a low of 10.6 percent in 1981-82, with the average between 1980-81 and 1990-91 being about 19.0 percent. During the same period, the percentage of newly employed white principals ranged from a high of 88.3 percent in 1981-82 to a low of 69.5 percent in 1980-81, with the average being about 80.0 percent. The sexual composition of newly employed principals changed significantly. In 1980-81, 75.4 percent of the newly employed principals were male and 24.6 percent were female. By 1990-91, the percent of males hired as new principals dropped to 63.0 percent and the percent of females increased to 37.0 percent, but there was considerable year-to-year variation.

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# ASSISTANT PRINCIPALS

## Characteristics of Assistant Principals

The average age of assistant principals increased from 42.2 in 1980-81 to 45.0 in 1990-91. During the same period, the average years of experience increased from 17.3 to 18.9. The racial and sexual composition of the assistant principal staff has changed. The percent of black assistant principals declined from 30.8 percent in 1980-81 to 28.2 percent in 1990-91. White assistant principals increased from 67.6 to 71.1 percent during the same period. Indian assistant principals ranged from .5 to 1.2 percent of the assistant principal staff during the ten-year period. The shift in the male-female composition of the assistant principal staff between 1980-81 and 1990-91 has been dramatic. In 1980-81, 82.3 percent of the assistant principals were male and 17.7 percent were female. By 1990-91, the percentage of male assistant principals had declined to 53.1 percent and the percentage of females in the assistant principalship had risen to 46.9 percent. The highest degree held by assistant principals has risen. In 1980-81, 76.8 percent of the assistant principals held a masters degree, sixth year certificate or doctorate. By 1990-91, 96.6 percent of the assistant principals held an advanced degree beyond the bachelors level.

## Characteristics of Assistant Principals Leaving the Profession

The average age of persons leaving the assistant principalship varies from year to year and does not show a clear trend. The ten-year average age for persons leaving was approximately 46.9. The average experience level of persons leaving the assistant principalship varies from year to year, averaging about 19.8 years. The racial and sexual composition of persons leaving the assistant principalship shows some significant trends. The percentage of blacks leaving assistant principalship positions varies from year to year, averaging about 30 percent over the ten year period. Over the same ten year period, about 68 percent of the principals leaving were white and less than 2 percent were indians and others. There has been a significant shift in the male-female composition of persons leaving assistant principalships. In 1979-80, 81.3 percent of the people leaving the assistant principalship were male and 18.7 percent female. By 1988-89, 47.7 percent of the assistant principals leaving were male and 52.3 percent were female.

## Characteristics of Newly Employed Assistant Principals

The average age of newly employed assistant principals increased from 40.5 in 1980-81 to 45.7 in 1990-91. The experience level of newly employed assistant principals rose from 15.3 years in 1980-81 to 17.9 years in 1990-91. The percent of newly employed blacks in assistant principal positions varies from year to year. Because of the small number of indian assistant principals, insufficient data exist to show any trends. In 1980-81, 31.3 percent of the newly employed assistant principals were black and 65.6 percent white. In 1990-91, 24.6 percent of the new assistant principals were black and 75.4 percent white. The male-female mix of newly employed assistant principals has changed. In 1980-81, 78.1 percent were male and 21.9 percent female. By 1990-91, the percentage of newly employed males declined to 39.1 percent and the percentage of new female assistant principals increased to 60.9 percent.

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# CENTRAL OFFICE ADMINISTRATORS AND SUBJECT AND SUPPORT AREA SPECIALISTS

This group consists of persons who primarily work out of the central office and usually have systemwide, regional or multiple school responsibilities. Some personnel in this group are administrators, directors, or coordinators with responsibility over various subject and support areas. Others in the group are subject or support area specialists. Among the types of personnel in this group are supervisors, vocational education directors, directors of special education, subject area directors, coordinators of media services, school psychologists, social workers and athletic directors.

## Characteristics of Central Office Administrators and Subject and Support Area Specialists

Between 1980-81 and 1990-91 the average age of this group increased from 40.3 to 42.1 and the average years of experience increased from 13.4 to 13.7. During this period, the percentage of blacks in this group declined from 14.3 to 12.9, while the percent of whites increased from 85.4 to 85.9. The percent of indians in this group varies from year to year, averaging about 0.5 percent. Over the ten-year period, males made up an average of about 39 percent of the staff and females account for about 61 percent of this group. Since 1980-81, the percentage of females in the central office administrative staff increased and the percent of males declined. Personnel in this group with advanced degrees beyond the bachelors level increased from 48.4 percent in 1980-81 to 69.6 percent in 1990-91.

## Characteristics of Central Office Administrators and Subject and Support Area Specialists Leaving

The average age of persons in this group who left employment increased from 39.9 in 1979-80 to 42.1 in 1988-89. The average years of experience of persons leaving increased from 12.3 in 1979-80 to 13.0 in 1988-89. Over the same period, an average of approximately 13 percent of those leaving were black, 85 percent white, and about 1 percent indian. The male-female mix of those leaving during this period averaged about 33 percent male and 67 percent female.

## Characteristics of Newly Employed Central Office Administrators and Subject and Support Area Specialists

Between 1980-81 and 1990-91, the average age and experience level of new employees in this group did not show a clear trend. The racial composition of new employees in this group varies from year to year. Between 1980-81 and 1990-91, an average of approximately 14 percent of the new employees were black, 85 percent were white, and 1 percent were indians and others. Over the same period, an average of about 29 percent of the new hires were male and 71 percent were female.

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# LIBRARIANS

## Characteristics of Librarians

The average age of librarians increased from 42.9 in 1980-81 to 46.4 in 1990-91. Over the same period, their average experience increased from 15.0 years to 17.4 years. The racial composition of librarians shows a decline in the percentage of blacks and an increase in the percent of whites and indians. Between 1980-81 and 1990-91, the percentage of black librarians decreased from 19.1 to 15.9 percent, white librarians increased from 79.8 to 82.5 percent, and indian librarians increased from 0.7 to 1.2 percent. Over the same period, the male-female composition of librarians remained fairly constant, averaging about 4 percent male and 96 percent female. Between 1980-81 and 1990-91, the percentage of librarians holding advanced degrees increased. In 1980-81, 46.1 percent of the librarians held advanced degrees beyond the bachelors level. By 1990-91, 66.6 percent of the librarians had advanced degrees.

## Characteristics of Librarians Leaving

The average age of librarians leaving fluctuated from year to year, averaging about 46.7 between 1979-80 and 1988-89. Over the same period, the average years of experience of those leaving varied, averaging 16.6 years. The racial composition of persons leaving librarian positions shows considerable year-to-year variation and does not show a clear trend. The male-female composition of persons leaving librarian positions varied from year to year. Over the ten-year period from 1979-80 to 1988-89, males averaged about 5 percent of those leaving and females comprised about 95 percent.

## Characteristics of Newly Employed Librarians

The average age of newly employed librarians increased from 37.2 in 1980-81 to 41.8 in 1990-91. Between 1980-81 and 1990-91, the average experience level of newly employed librarians increased from 8.1 years to 9.1 years. Between 1980-81 and 1990-91, the percentage of blacks hired as librarians varied from year to year, averaging about 11 percent of the new hires in this area. Over the same period, whites averaged about 88 percent of the newly employed librarians. The number of newly employed indian librarians was too small to show any trend. The male-female composition of newly employed librarians varies considerably from year to year, but over the ten-year period an average of less than 5 percent were male and about 95 percent female.

# GUIDANCE COUNSELORS

## Characteristics of Guidance Counselors

The average age of guidance counselors increased from 40.6 in 1980-81 to 43.7 in 1990-91. Over the same period, the average experience level increased from 14.3 to 15.1 years. The racial composition of the guidance staff remained relatively constant between 1979-80 and 1990-91, with blacks comprising an average of about 23 percent of the staff, whites 76 percent, and indians and others about 1 percent. Between 1980-81 and 1990-91, males declined from 26.2 to 18.8 percent of the guidance staff and females increased from 73.8 to 81.2 percent. The percent of guidance counselors with advanced degrees beyond the bachelors level increased from 91.3 in 1980-81 to 93.6 in 1990-91.

## Characteristics of Guidance Counselors Leaving

The average age of guidance counselors who left increased from 39.4 in 1979-80 to 43.5 in 1988-89, but there were fluctuations from year to year. The experience level of those leaving increased from 12.2 in 1979-80 to 14.2 in 1988-89. Of the guidance counselors leaving between 1979-80 and 1988-89, an average of about 21 percent were black, 78 percent were white, and about 1 percent were indian and other. During the same period, the percentage of males leaving decreased from 28.2 percent in 1979-80 to 26.9 percent in 1988-89, and the percent of females leaving increased from 71.8 to 73.1 percent.

## Characteristics of Newly Employed Guidance Counselors

The average age of new guidance counselors increased from 34.3 in 1980-81 to 39.8 in 1990-91. The average experience level of newly employed guidance counselors showed some year to year variation, but increased from 6.9 years in 1980-81 to 9.0 years in 1990-91. The male-female mix of new guidance counselors varied from year to year, but shows a decline in the number of males becoming guidance counselors. Between 1980-81 and 1990-91 the percent of newly employed black guidance counselors declined, but there were year to year variations. Newly employed white guidance counselors showed a general increase, but there were yearly variations. In the same period, indians made up an average of about 1 percent of the new hires. The percent of newly employed male guidance counselors dropped from 26.1 percent in 1980-81 to 19.9 percent in 1990-91, and the percent of females increased from 73.9 to 80.1 percent.

# OTHER CERTIFIED PERSONNEL

## OTHER CERTIFIED PERSONNEL

This category of certified personnel includes persons whose primary duty did not fit into the other classifications. Persons included in this category comprise less than one percent of the certified school employees. Certified personnel in this group worked at duties such as study hall and lunch room supervision, testing, dropout prevention, athletic trainer duties and learning lab responsibilities.

### Characteristics of Other Certified Personnel

The average age of this group increased from 35.9 in 1980-81 to 42.4 in 1990-91. This group's experience level increased from 9.4 years to 13.9 years over the same period. Blacks comprised 27.4 percent of this group in 1980-81 and 21.8 percent in 1990-91. Whites made up 70.5 percent of these personnel in 1980-81 and 76.7 percent in 1990-91. The number of indians in this group was too small to show any meaningful trend. Over the ten-year period, males in this group dropped from 45.4 percent to 23.1 percent, while the percent of females increased from 54.6 to 76.9 percent. The percentage of people in this group with advanced degrees increased between 1980-81 and 1990-91. In 1980-81, 35.2 percent of the personnel in this group held an advanced degree beyond the bachelors level. By 1990-91, the percent with an advanced degree increased to 55.6 percent.

### Characteristics of Other Certified Personnel Leaving

The average age of persons in this group who left school employment between 1979-80 and 1988-89 was about 40. Over the same period, the experience level of those leaving averaged about 11 years. The racial composition of those leaving varied from year to year. Over the ten-year period from 1979-80 to 1988-89, blacks averaged about 23 percent of those leaving, whites approximately 76 percent, and indians and other racial groups less than 2 percent. During the ten-year period, the male-female composition of those leaving this group varied from year to year, with males averaging 33 percent and females 67 percent.

### Characteristics of Newly Employed Other Certified Personnel

The average age of newly employed personnel in this group rose from 32.1 in 1980-81 to 40.6 in 1990-91. The average experience level of new employees in this group rose from 3.9 years 1980-81 to 10.6 years in 1990-91. The racial and male-female composition of new employees in this group varied from year to year and did not show clear trends. Between 1980-81 and 1990-91, an average of about 27 percent of the new employees were black, 72 percent were white, and under 2 percent were indians and others. Between 1980-81 and 1990-91, an average of approximately 34 percent of the new employees in this category were male and 66 percent female.
