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ABSTRACT

Conducting research in the field of public health care policy requires the use of many different materials in the library. This guide provides a bibliography of useful tools as well as a basic strategy to follow when researching a topic. The following tools are included in the guide: indexes and abstracts; books; statistics; government documents; legal materials--United States; and legal materials--New Mexico. Under each section, there is a description of the tool and an annotated listing of specific examples in that category. This annotation includes publication information and scope of the source. There are 73 sources of public health care policy listed in all. (JLB)

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
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How To Do Library Research in Public Health Care Policy

Conducting research in the field of public health care policy requires the use of many different materials in the library. This guide provides a bibliography of useful tools as well as a basic strategy to follow when researching a topic.

Finding Journal Articles

Journals are the best source for current information on a topic. This is especially important if an area of study is new, currently being investigated, or subject to frequent change. If there is a list of references following a journal article it might provide leads to further sources.

Indexes and Abstracts

Journal articles on a specific subject can be identified through the use of a general or specialized index. Some indexes include abstracts (summaries) of articles. The library subscribes to indexes in print format and on CD-ROM. The library cannot subscribe to all of the journals in these indexes; a list of journals to which the library does subscribe accompanies most of the indexes on the index and CD-ROM tables.

Printed Indexes

Indexes or abstracts in printed form give subject and/or author access to journal articles. Some of the indexes are located on tables in the reference area; others can be found in the reference stacks by call number. The following indexes list references to journal articles in the field of public health care policy.

- *Cumulative Index to Nursing & Allied Health Literature*. Glendale: Glendale Adventist Medical Center, 1977 - .

Bimonthly. Indexes journal articles on psychiatric nursing and on psychology as it applies to nursing and allied health fields.

- *Index Medicus and Cumulated Index Medicus*. Washington: U.S. Dept. of Health and Human Services, 1960 - .

Index Medicus comes out monthly and is replaced at the end of each year by *Cumulated Index Medicus*, which consists of many volumes of author and subject indexes. Volume one is medical subject headings. Because these headings do not change frequently, and because the subject index does not always give adequate cross-references, volume one should be consulted. The *List of Journals Indexed in Index Medicus* gives journal abbreviations, classifies journals by broad subject areas, and lists journals by country of publication.

- *PAIS International in Print*. New York: Public Affairs Information Service, 1991 - .

Subject index to periodicals, pamphlets, some books, and some U.S. and foreign government publications.

- *Social Sciences Index*. Bronx: Wilson, 1979 - .

Quarterly with annual cumulations. Similar to *Readers' Guide*, except that it indexes more scholarly journals. Covers all fields of social science including political science. Indexed by subject and author. Title varies: *International Index* (1916-1973); *Social Sciences and Humanities Index* (1965-1973); split into two indexes, the *Social Sciences Index* and the *Humanities Index* (1974 -).

CD-ROM Indexes

CD-ROM databases offer an exciting new approach to the retrieval of citations to journal articles. CD-ROM stands for Compact Disk—Read Only Memory. Several years of an index are stored on a small disk that is read by a laser reader. Through a computer keyboard the user can specify a combination of subject terms in order to find references to articles which contain those terms in their titles, in their abstracts, or as assigned descriptors. CD-ROM offers the potential to search for very specific topics. The following CD-ROM systems may be useful for finding information on public health care policy topics. New products may be added; check the CD-ROM area near the reference desk.

- ABI/INFORM

Gives citations and abstracts for articles in business journals. Many of these articles relate to health care, often from a business point of view. Appropriate subjects for this database would be health care policy and health insurance, among others. Updated monthly.

- INFOTRAC ACADEMIC INDEX

Provides easy-to-use access to articles in periodicals of a popular nature (*Time*, *Newsweek*, etc.) as well as some specialized journals such as *Health and Social Work* and *Lancet*. Gives access to stories in the news through references to the *New York Times*. Updated monthly.

➤ PsycLIT

Compiled by the American Psychological Association, this is the electronic version of *Psychological Abstracts*. Contains citations with abstracts to journal articles and book chapters in psychology and the behavioral sciences. International in scope. Topics covered include all aspects of psychology, as well as the behavioral aspects of education, medicine, sociology, law, and management. Provides coverage from 1974 to the present, with quarterly updates.

The *Thesaurus of Psychological Index Terms* may be helpful in suggesting terms to use when researching the psychological aspects of public health care.

➤ CINAHL

Provides citations and abstracts for journal articles which relate to various books, dissertations and conference proceedings since 1983. Includes articles in English for nursing including such subjects as health care industry, health policy, and public policy.

Finding Books

Books are not as current as journal articles but will provide more comprehensive coverage of a subject. Access to the book collection is through the online catalog.

Library of Congress Subject Headings

To determine the appropriate heading(s) for a topic, consult the multi-volume *Library of Congress Subject Headings (LCSH)*. These large red books, located at the reference desk are very useful for suggesting alternate or additional headings to search. UF means "used for" and indicates terms that are not used. BT means "broader term," RT means "related term," SA means "see also," and NT means "narrower term." Suggested subject headings are:

- AIDS (Disease)
- Health Maintenance Organizations
- Insurance - Health
- Medicaid
- Medicare

While Library of Congress subject headings can be very useful in finding books on a topic, the researcher should also explore keyword and Boolean (logical combinations of keywords using **and**, **or**, **not**) searching options .

Government Documents

The U.S. government publishes much information that may be of use in the study of public health care policy. The way to locate a particular document or information on a subject is to use the *Monthly Catalog of United States Government Publications*, GPO on CD-ROM, or one of several indexes available for searching documents .

Government documents do not have the same type of call number as other materials in the library. They are organized by the Superintendent of Documents (SuDoc) classification system. The first letters in the call number represent the issuing agency.

GPO is a CD-ROM database that lists publications by the U.S. Government Printing Office from 1976 to the present. The user can type in title, agency, subject, or a combination of subject terms and retrieve a listing of titles and SuDoc numbers of documents. Issued bimonthly.

The CIS Index is used to identify, evaluate and obtain information contained in the United States Congresses working papers. It covers hearings, prints, documents, reports and special publications. The set is a monthly publication which is cumulated annually.
