

ABSTRACT

A study was conducted of the financial aid awarded to students in the University and Community College System of Nevada (UCCSN) in 1991-92. Study findings included the following: (1) financial aid awards to students attending UCCSN institutions amounted to \$43,549,673 in 1992-92; (2) of the \$43.5 million awarded, \$22,958,948 (52.7%) was in federal assistance, \$11,914,900 (27.4%) was in state assistance, \$1,507,631 (3.5%) was in institutional assistance, and \$7,168,194 (16.5%) was in assistance from private sources; (3) \$8,252,456 of state aid to students was in the form of student employment, including graduate assistant wages; (4) the four community colleges in the UCCSN expended a total of \$5,253,938 in student financial assistance, of which \$4,369,988 (83.2%) was in federal assistance, \$436,874 (8.3%) was in state assistance, \$78,536 (1.5%) was in institutional assistance, and \$368,540 (7%) was in private assistance; (5) in the community colleges, a total of 6,306 awards were given, of which 892 were loans, 4,401 were grants, 310 were scholarships, and 703 were in student employment; (6) the two universities in the UCCSN expended a total of \$38,295,735 in student financial assistance, of which \$18,588,960 (48.5%) was in federal assistance, \$11,478,026 (30%) was in state assistance, \$1,429,095 (3.7%) was in institutional assistance, and \$6,799,654 (17.8%) was in private assistance; and (7) in the four-year institutions, a total of 20,520 awards were given, of which 6,423 were loans, 6,010 were grants, 4,232 were scholarships, and 3,855 were in student employment. A review of loans versus grants in federal funding; data on state allocations nationally; and detailed data tables are included. (PAA)

UCCSN STUDENT FINANCIAL AID STUDY, 1991-1992

Financial aid awards to students attending University and Community College System of Nevada institutions amounted to \$43,549,673 in 1991-92. As Table One shows (page 6), of the \$43.5 million for 1991-92, \$22,958,948 or 52.7% was in federal assistance. State assistance totaled \$11,914,900 or 27.4% of the total. Institutional assistance totaled \$1,507,631 or 3.5% of total aid. Student financial assistance from private sources totaled \$7,168,194 or 16.5% of total aid.

It should be noted that a considerable portion of state student aid (\$8,252,456) is in the form of student employment (including graduate assistant wages). Many national financial aid studies do not list student employment, with the exception of the federal college work study program, as student financial assistance. Without the student employment funds, the total for state aid is \$3,662,444.

Student Financial Assistance-- UCCSN Community Colleges

The four community colleges together expended \$5,253,938 in student financial assistance in 1991-92. As Table Two shows (page 7), \$4,369,988 or 83.2% of the total was in federal assistance. State assistance accounted for \$436,874 or 8.3% of total aid. Institutional aid amounted to \$78,536 or 1.5% of the total. Financial aid from private sources accounted for \$368,540 or 7.0% of the total aid. A total of 6,306 awards were given: 892 in the form of loans; 4,401 in grants; 310 scholarships; and, 703 for student employment.

Of the community college total of \$5,253,938, 18.7% (\$981,337) was in the form of loans. Grant assistance totaled

\$3,345,327 or 63.7% of the total. Scholarships accounted for \$400,000 (7.6%) and student employment for \$527,000 (10.0%) of the total. Reports for each institution may be found in Tables Eight through Eleven (pages 16-19).

Student Financial Assistance-- UCCSN Universities

UNLV and UNR together expended \$38,295,735 in student financial assistance in 1991-92. As Table Three shows (page 8), \$18,588,960 or 48.5% of the total was in federal assistance. State assistance accounted for \$11,478,026 or 30% of total aid. Institutional aid amounted to \$1,429,095 or 3.7% of the total. Financial aid from private sources accounted for \$6,799,654 or 17.8% of the total aid. A total of 20,520 awards were given: 6,423 in the form of loans; 6,010 in grants; 4,232 scholarships; and, 3,855 for student employment.

Of the university total of \$38,295,735, 36.9% (\$14,125,877) was in the form of loans. Grant assistance totaled \$8,083,230 or 21.1% of the total. Scholarships accounted for \$6,684,687 (17.5%) and student employment for \$9,221,941 (24.0%) of the total. Reports for each institution may be found in Tables Twelve and Thirteen (pages 20 and 21).

Loans Versus Grants in Federal Funding

The trend in federal funding to increased dependence on loans rather than grants has received much attention in the higher education community and was recently discussed in Congress in the context of the Higher Education Act Reauthorization of 1992. Page 9 features charts showing the breakdown of federal appropriations for higher education student financial assistance by grant, loan, and College Work Study for 1990 and 1992. In 1990, \$5.322 billion or 53.7% in

federal funds was appropriated in the area of grants, \$3.987 billion or 40.2% for loans, and \$602 million or 6.1% for the College Work Study program. By 1992, a considerable change had occurred. In 1992, 43.4% or \$6.112 billion in federal funds was appropriated in grants, 52.2% or \$7.341 billion for loans, and 4.4% or \$615 million for the College Work Study program. In sum, the loan and grant appropriation ratio essentially reversed over the two-year period.

Pages 10 and 11 feature breakdowns in federal funding during similar years for UCCSN community colleges and universities. For UCCSN community colleges during 1989-90, 66.5% of federal funds or \$1,912,449 were in the form of grants, 26.3% or \$756,474 in loans, and 7.2% or \$206,709 for the College Work Study program. In 1991-92, the percentage of grants rose to 72.0% or \$3,143,962, percent of loans dropped to 21.7% or \$944,702, and percent of funds for College Work Study dropped to 6.3% or \$274,840.

For UNLV and UNR together during 1989-90, 31.7% of federal funds or \$4,007,052 were in the form of grants, 63.4% or \$8,008,240 in loans, and 4.9% or \$612,435 for the College Work Study program. In 1991-92, the percentage of grants dropped to 27.1% or \$5,042,050, percent of loans rose to 69.6% or \$12,925,550, and percent of federal funds for the College Work Study program dropped to 3.3% or \$611,365.

State Programs

Tables Four through Seven (pages 12-15) display information on state grant programs for the fifty states and the District of Columbia. Table Four shows estimated total grant aid awarded by state programs for both need-based and non-

need-based funding. Nevada ranks 39th with \$3,161,000. Table Five shows those figures broken down by enrolled student in each state. For state grant funding, Nevada ranks 38th per enrolled student at \$51.20.

Table Six shows estimated total grant aid awarded by state programs for need-based funding only. Nevada ranks 50th with \$377,000. Table Six shows those figures broken down per enrolled student in each state. For state grant funding in need-based programs, Nevada ranks 51st at \$6.10 per student.

Unmet Student Need

While data are not currently available on all UCCSN campuses to document unmet need, it should be noted that many students who apply for financial aid each year do not receive it. For example, at UNLV 5,138 of the 9,712 students who applied for aid in 1991-92 received some type of aid. A total of 4,574 students were denied aid. The financial aid officers on each of the campuses have agreed to collect data on this area in the future, so that future reports can document unmet need in Nevada.

Summary and Conclusions

In conclusion, the following trends exist in student financial aid in Nevada and/or the nation:

- ▶ There has been a dramatic shift in federal funding of financial aid from grants to loans.
- ▶ In Nevada, a high proportion of state-funded financial aid is given in the form of grants-in-aid which often, although not exclusively, are based on merit considerations instead of financial need.

- ▶ Nevada ranks last-- 51st-- among the states and the District of Columbia for state grant funding in need-based programs.
- ▶ The UCCSN's community colleges have a greater percentage of grants and a lower percentage of loans (63.7% of total aid in grants and 18.7% in loans) when compared to the universities (21.1% of total aid in grants and 36.9% in loans).
- ▶ The UCCSN's community colleges have relatively fewer funds available from private sources (\$368,000 or 7%), given their enrollment totals, when compared to the university total of \$6,685,000 or 17.5% of their total aid funds.

In an era of increasing tuition and fees in Nevada, coupled with the changing patterns in federal student financial assistance, if the state wishes to continue to pursue a public policy of assuring student financial accessibility to higher education it will need to seriously consider greater support for need-based state-funded student financial aid programs.




Breakdown of Federal Appropriations Nation, 1990 in Millions



Breakdown of Federal Appropriations Nation, 1992 in Millions





Breakdown of Federal Funds UCCSN Community Colleges, 1989-90





Breakdown of Federal Funds UCCSN Community Colleges, 1991-92




