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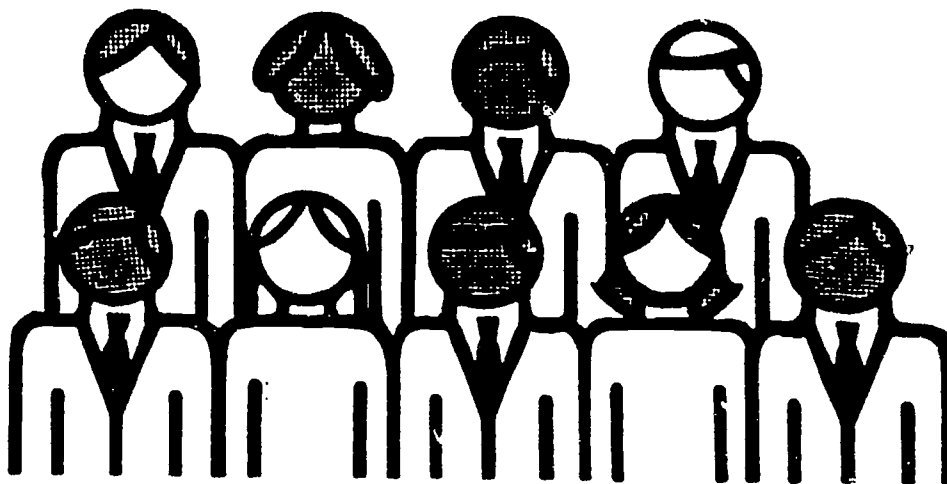
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ABSTRACT

Each year, Piedmont Virginia Community College (PVCC) examines longitudinal data on fall term minority enrollment to identify trends which may be of interest to those involved in planning student recruitment and retention activities. The findings of the 1993 study indicated that: (1) 664 minority students enrolled at PVCC during fall semester 1993, surpassing the fall 1992 figure of 632; (2) 15.2% of the total student population were minorities, the highest percentage in the college's history; (3) blacks represented 11.7% of the total student population and 76.8% of the minority student population, representing the largest number of black students to attend PVCC in any single term; (4) from fall 1989 to fall 1993, the number of minority students increased 30.7% and the number of black students increased 25%; (5) between fall 1991 and fall 1993, the percentage of white students increased by only 0.1%, compared to a 5.1% increase in minority students; (6) only 27.5% of the black students enrolled in fall 1993 were male, compared to 38.1% of white students and 40.9% of other minority students; (7) 35.1% of non-black minority students were new to PVCC in fall 1993, while just under 30% of both white and black students were new; and (8) despite an increase in full-time students from the late 1980s to 1991, the number of full-time students declined by 10.6% between 1991 and 1993. 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**MINORITY ENROLLMENT AT PVCC
FALL SEMESTER 1993**

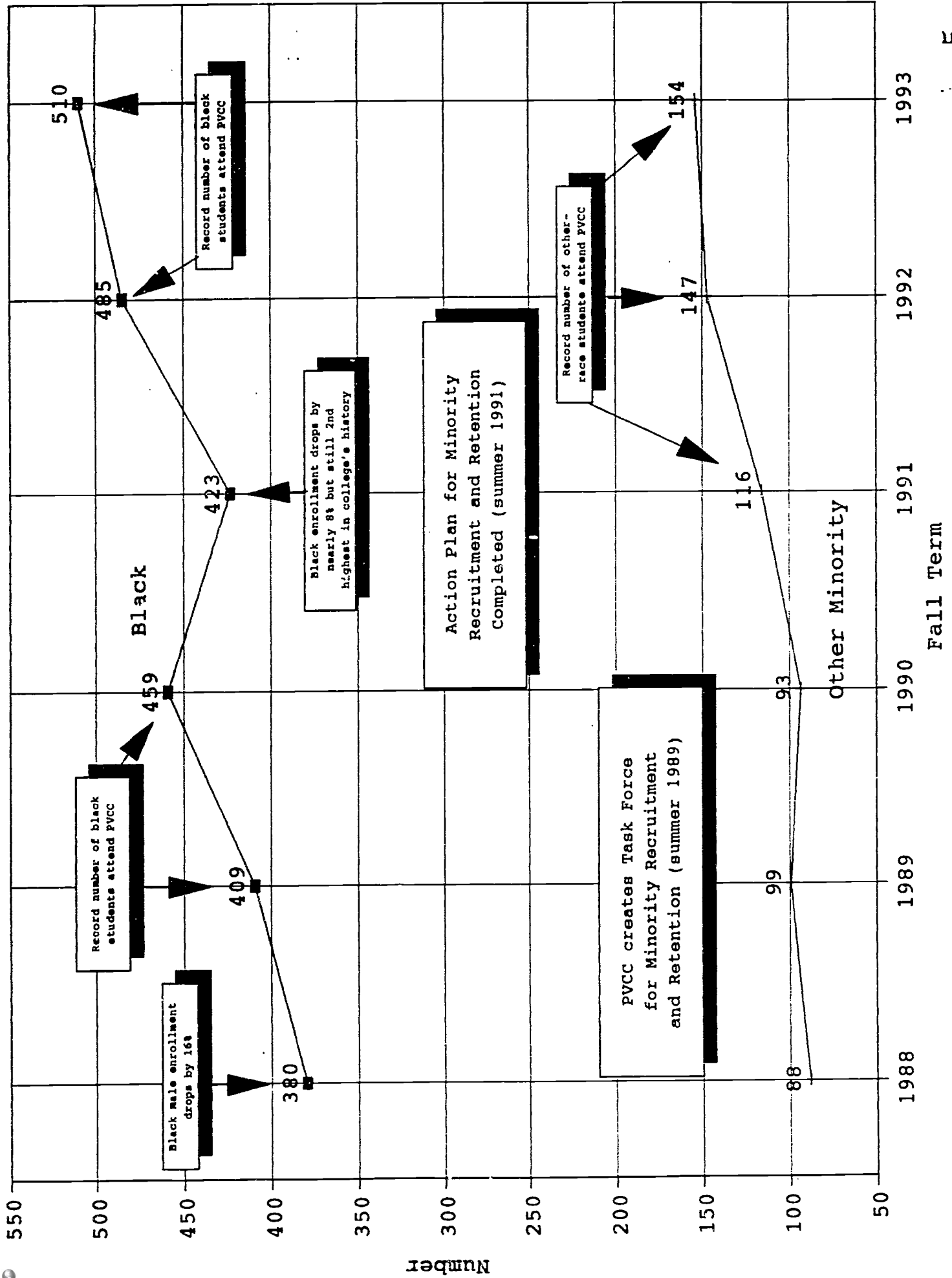
Each year the Office of Institutional Research and Planning at Piedmont Virginia Community College (PVCC) publishes a report on fall term minority enrollment. The purpose of the report is to display longitudinal minority enrollment data and examine trends which might prove of interest to those involved in planning student recruitment and retention activities. This brief highlights the thirteenth of these reports, *Minority Enrollment Report: Fall Semester 1993* (PVCC Institutional Research Report No. 1-94, February 1994).

Six-hundred sixty-four minority students enrolled at PVCC during Fall Semester 1993. This was a 5% increase over the fall 1992 figure and marked the second consecutive record-setting year. The percentage of minority students within the student body as a whole (15.2%) was also the highest ever, as was the number and percentage of both black students (510, 11.7%) and other minority students (154, 3.5%). In fact, the two-year gains in minority enrollment were largely responsible for the increase in the total number of students attending PVCC between fall 1991 and fall 1993 (the number of white students increased by only four during this two-year period). Since 1991, minority enrollment has not only increased substantially, but has resulted in more minorities enrolling as full-time, degree-seeking students.

In the summer of 1989, in an effort to attract minorities to the college, PVCC's new president, Dr. Deborah DiCroce, created the Task Force for Minority Recruitment and Retention. Two years later, the Action Plan for Minority Recruitment and Retention was completed by the Task Force and implemented by the college. A group of prominent black community leaders has been instrumental in assisting college officials implement the plan. Certainly, as is readily evident, the work of Dr. DiCroce, the Task Force, and the Black Community Leaders Group, is yielding a rich harvest in terms of minority student enrollment.

A chart, illustrating minority enrollment trends during the past five years, appears on the back side of this sheet.

MINORITY ENROLLMENT REPORT FALL SEMESTER 1993

INTRODUCTION

This is the fourteenth in a continuing series of studies concerning minority enrollment at Piedmont Virginia Community College (PVCC). Each study is designed to display longitudinal minority enrollment data and examine trends which should prove helpful to those involved in planning student recruitment and retention activities.

All data in this series of reports were obtained from the Student Enrollment Booklets compiled each term by the Virginia Community College System (VCCS) and printed electronically by computer. These booklets consist of numerous tables of data relating to many different aspects of student enrollment within the VCCS. Each table within the Student Enrollment Booklet from which data were obtained is noted within this report.

MINORITY ENROLLMENT

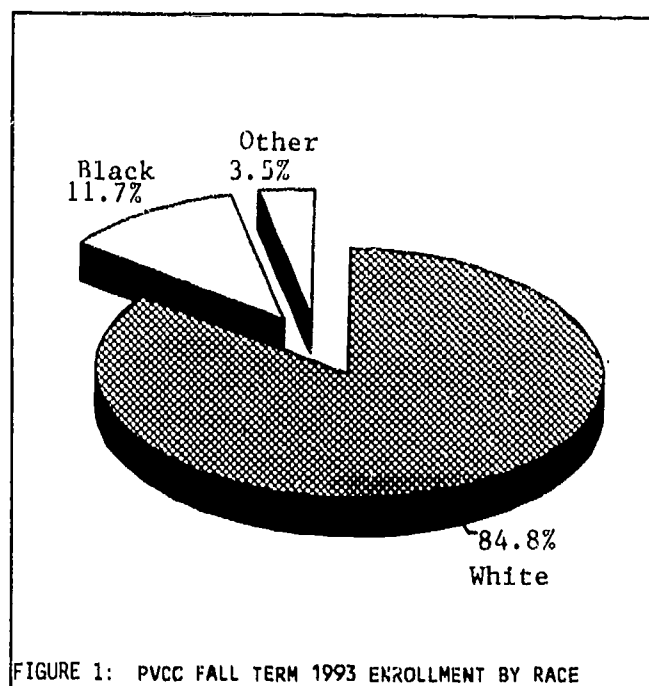


FIGURE 1: PVCC FALL TERM 1993 ENROLLMENT BY RACE

Six-hundred sixty-four minority students enrolled at PVCC during Fall Semester 1993 (see Figure 1). This was a 5.1% increase over Fall Semester 1992 and is the largest number of minority students enrolled at the college during any single academic term. The percentage of minority students within the student body as a whole (15.2%) was also the highest ever. Overall, between Fall Semester 1989 and Fall Semester 1993, minority enrollment increased by 30.7%.

Five-hundred ten, or 76.8% of all minority students were black. This was the largest number of black students to ever attend PVCC during any single term, breaking the old record (485, set in fall 1992) by 25 students. Black students accounted for 11.7% of the entire student body.

Of the remaining minority students, 82 were Oriental (Asians or Pa-

cific Islanders), 33 were Hispanic, 6 were American Indians or Alaskan natives, and 33 classified themselves as "other."¹ The total number of minority students other than black was the highest in the college's history (154), exceeding the previous record of 147, set in fall 1992, by 3.5%.

As can be seen in Table 1, a large increase in minority enrollment has occurred during all but one of the past five years. Approximately 31% more minority students, and nearly 25% more black students, were enrolled in fall 1993 than in fall 1989. Between Fall Semester 1991 and Fall Semester 1993, the number of white students increased by only four (0.1%), while the number of minority students increased by 32

¹As noted in previous reports, a student's racial classification is determined by what he or she indicates on the initial admission form. There are six boxes which the student may check: (1) White; (2) Black; (3) American Indian or Alaskan Native; (4) Asian or Pacific Islander; (5) Hispanic; and (6) Other. After the "other" box, space is provided for comment. Usually, students do not write comments. However, typically, an "other" student is a foreigner, uncertain which box to check. Occasionally, an "other" student is one with a sense of whimsy. On the admission form, students have written such comments as "humanoid" or "Indiana Irish" to justify their "other" classification. Three students were inadvertently classified "other" due to clerical error. Their status was corrected after the data for this report were generated.

(5.1%). In this respect it can safely be said that the 3% increase in total headcount at PVCC was due solely to increases in minority enrollment.

Percentage increase figures indicate the increase or decrease by percentage in students from one year to the next. Note that before fall 1988 PVCC operated under a quarter system.

Minority enrollment patterns typically differ from overall student enrollment patterns. Between fall 1984 and fall 1985, minority student enrollment increased at a faster rate than either white student enrollment or enrollment in general. The opposite was true between fall 1985 and fall 1986 and between fall 1986 and fall 1987. Between fall 1987 and fall 1988 the enrollment patterns were approximately the same, but between fall 1988 and fall 1989 minority student enrollment once again increased at a slightly higher rate than either white student enrollment or enrollment in general.

Between fall 1989 and fall 1990, both white student enrollment and total student enrollment decreased while minority enrollment increased. Between fall 1990 and fall 1991, black student enrollment decreased at a higher rate than white student and total student enrollment did, and other-race student enrollment increased at a high rate. Between fall 1991 and fall 1992, both black student and other minority student enrollment increased at a much faster rate than did white student enrollment. Between fall 1992 and fall 1993, the trend continued with both black student and other minority student enrollment increasing at a greater rate than white student enrollment.

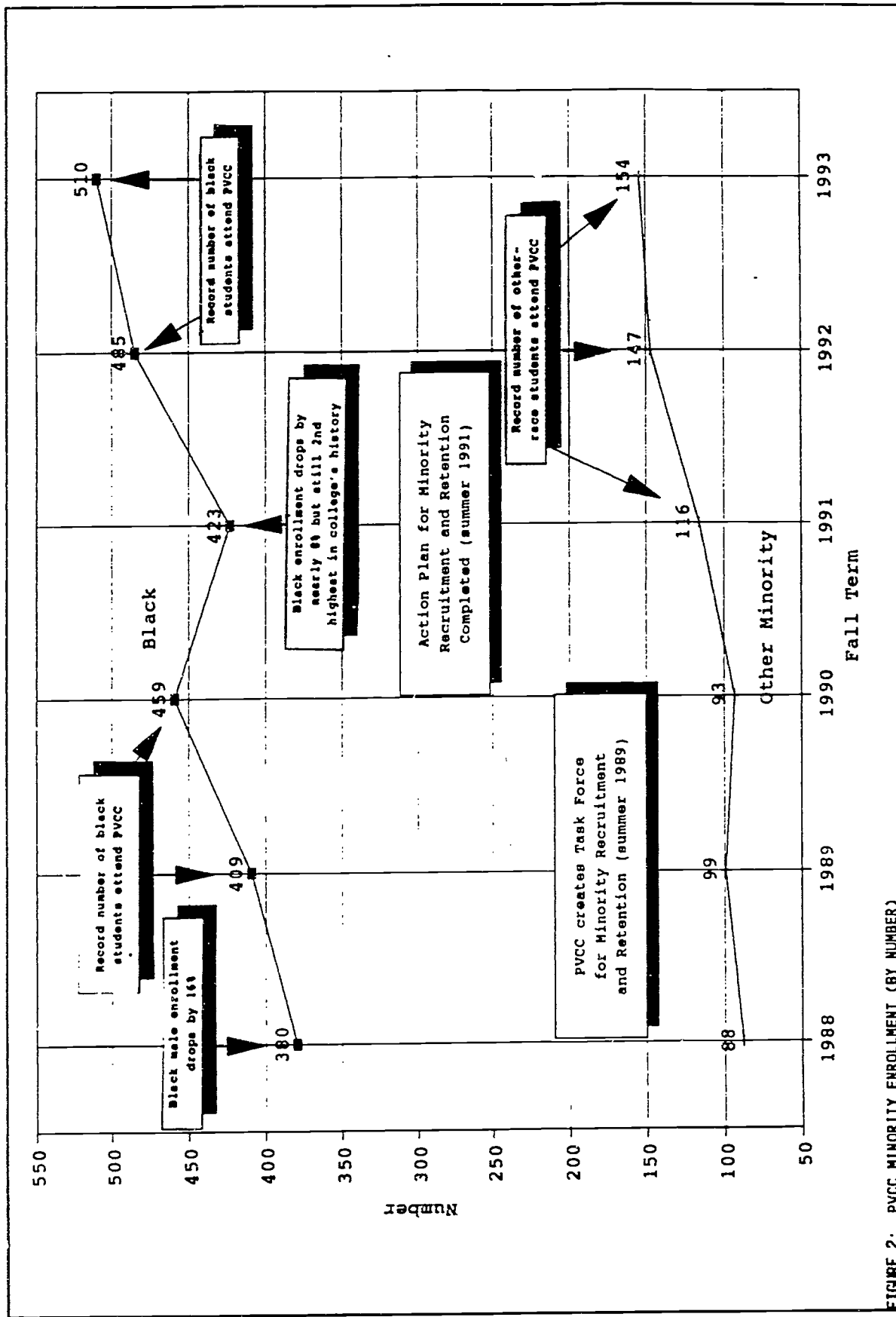


FIGURE 2: PVCC MINORITY ENROLLMENT (BY NUMBER)

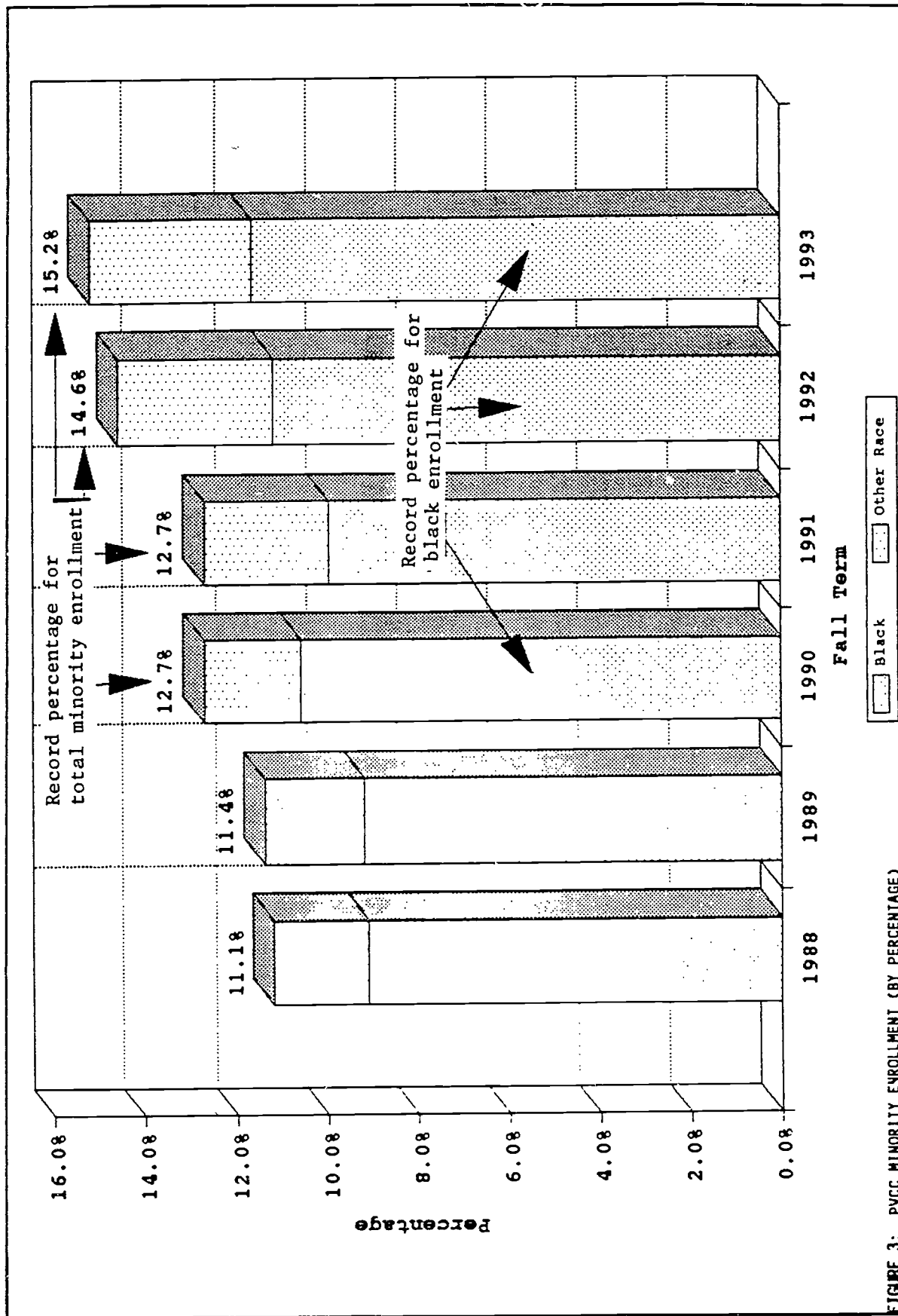


FIGURE 3: PVCC MINORITY ENROLLMENT (BY PERCENTAGE)

Minority enrollment trends are graphically illustrated in Figures 2 and 3.

STUDENT DEMOGRAPHIC CHARACTERISTICS BY RACE

In previous minority enrollment studies, demographic characteristics of minority students have been similar to those of white students.² The one exception, noted in most of the previous minority enrollment reports, concerned sex. Nearly every fall,

all minority students other than black were male.

In terms of actual numbers, black male enrollment at PVCC remained constant between fall 1992 and fall 1993. In other words, the increase in black student enroll-

ment at the college was the result of twice as many black female students as male students attending PVCC.

Minority students were about the same age as white students in fall 1993. The mean age of black students (31) matched the mean age of white students, while the mean age of minority students other than black (28) was three years lower than that of black and white students. The distribution by age categories mirrored that of previous years. As can be seen in Table 3, slightly under 21% of all students were between the ages of 18 and 21, nearly 29% between the ages of 25 and 34, and over 21% between the ages of 35 and 44. During the fall 1993 semester, minority students were more evenly matched with white students in age distribution than in recent years.

The PVCC fall semester headcount by race and residence is shown in Table 4. Approximately the same percentage of black and white students resided within the PVCC service region. The percentage of minority students other than black residing within the service region, however, was lower than that of

either white or black students. The percentage of students residing outside the service region but within the Commonwealth of Virginia was highest for whites and lowest for minorities other than black. However, a much larger percentage of minority students other than black were classified as out-of-state students than were white or black students.

The fall semester headcount by race and residence for all PVCC service region localities is shown in Table 5.

Most minority students residing within PVCC's service region lived within the City of Charlottesville or in Albemarle County. Approximately two-thirds of all black students from the service region, and nearly 90% of minority students other than black, were residents of one of these two jurisdictions. As in previous years, the largest number of blacks resided in the City of Charlottesville, and the second largest number resided in Albemarle County.

PVCC has never enrolled as high a percentage of non-whites as reside within the service region as a whole. As can be seen in Table 6, approximately 18% of the

service region population during any recent year was non-white, while typically less than 14% of the PVCC student service region population was non-white. However,

over the past two years, the gap between the two narrowed considerably, as almost 15% of all fall 1993 PVCC service region students were non-white.

STUDENT ENROLLMENT CHARACTERISTICS BY RACE

Differences in white and minority enrollment characteristics often provide indications as to what minority students find attractive about PVCC. Enrollment characteris-

tics examined in this study are attendance (new or returning), status (full-time or part-time), class (freshmen, sophomores, developmental, or unclassified), program (college transfer, occupational/technical, de-

velopmental, or unclassified), degree sought (Associate of Arts [A.A.], Associate of Science [A.S.], Associate of Applied Science [A.A.S.], diploma, certificate, developmental, or unclassified), and curriculum (Business Administration, Education, Fine Arts, and so forth).

As can be seen in Table 7, just under 30% of all white and black students were new to PVCC in Fall Semester 1993.³ Proportionally, there were slightly fewer new black students than white students, and more new minority students other than black than either white or black students.

During the late 1980's and early 1990's, a notable increase in full-time students occurred at PVCC (see Table 8). This increased culminated in fall 1991 with 896 full-time students. Of these, 128 (14.3%) were minority students. Between 1991 and 1993, however, the total number of full-time students declined by 10.6%, while during the same two years, the number of minority full-time students continued to grow, increasing 4.7%. Between fall 1992 and fall 1993, black full-time student enrollment decreased by

only one (1%) while white full-time student enrollment decreased by 52 (7%). Minority full-time enrollment other than black increased (32%) for the fifth consecutive year. Since 1989, full-time enrollment other than black has increased by 104%. Over the same five year period, black full-time enrollment has increased 29%, and full-time white student enrollment has decreased 11%.

Proportionally, nearly one-third of all minority students other than black were enrolled at PVCC as full-time students, while less than one-fifth of all white and black students were.

PVCC fall term headcount by race and class is shown in Table 9. Normally, during any fall term, a higher percentage of minority students are classified as freshmen than white students, and this was true during fall 1993. While only slightly over one-third of all white students were classified as freshmen, nearly one-half of all minority students were. On the

other hand, a smaller percentage of minority students were classified as sophomores.

As full-time student enrollment decreased at PVCC, curricular student enrollment also decreased. The percentage of curricular students fell from 53.6% in fall 1992 to 51.9% in fall 1993. This was not true for black students, however. The percentage for

Over one-third of all PVCC students were enrolled in college transfer programs in fall 1993. A slightly higher percentage of both black and other minority students were enrolled in college transfer programs than white students. The figures for fall 1993 were quite similar to those for previous fall terms.

A higher percentage of black students were enrolled in occupational/technical programs than were other minority students or white students. The number of white students enrolled in occupational/technical programs has gradually increased since fall 1991, reversing a downward trend prior to 1991. On the other hand, the number of black students enrolled in occupational/technical programs rose sharply between fall 1989 and fall 1990, then fell between fall 1990 and fall 1992, and again rose sharply between fall 1992 and fall 1993.

Enrollment patterns by race and degree sought are shown in Table 11. College transfer programs are those leading toward either the A.A. or A.S. degrees; occupational/technical programs are those leading toward the A.A.S. degree, a certificate, or a diploma. PVCC fall term headcount by race and curricular programs is shown in Table 12 and Table 13. These tables are presented to assist academic administrators and faculty in assessing minority enrollments within their divisions and programs. However, considerable caution should be exercised when examining these data. In any particular year, very few minority students may be enrolled in a particular curriculum. Because of such small numbers, the statistical reliability of the data is questionable.

CONCLUSIONS

Six-hundred sixty-four minority students enrolled at PVCC during Fall Semester 1993. This was a 5% increase over the fall 1992 figure and marked the second consecutive record-setting year. The percentage of minority students within the student body as a whole (15.2%) was also the highest ever, as was the number and percentage of both black students (510, 11.7%) and other minority students (154, 3.5%). In fact, the two-year gains in minority enrollment were largely responsible for the increase in the total number of students attending PVCC between fall 1991 and fall 1993 (the number of white students increased by only four during this two-year period).

During the past two years, minority student enrollment has increased substantially at PVCC. Yet, in terms of total minority enrollment, the college falls below the national and the state norms. In 1991, 24.6% of all students in the United States attending two-year public institutions were of minority status (U.S. Department of Education figures). Within the Commonwealth of Virginia, 18.7% of all public two-year students were minority. This is misleading, however, because in terms of black student enrollment, PVCC is ahead of the national norm. During Fall Semester 1992 and Fall Semester 1993, PVCC black student enrollment exceeded the national average of 10.2% with percentages of 11.2% and 11.7%, respectively.

This upsurge in minority enrollment, particularly among black students, can be attributed largely to the efforts of President Dr. Deborah DiCroce. During the summer of 1989, in an effort to attract minorities to the college, Dr. DiCroce created the Task Force for Minority Recruitment and Retention. Two years later, the Action Plan for Minority Recruitment and Retention was completed by the Task Force and implemented by the college. A group of prominent black community leaders has been instrumental in

assisting college officials implement the plan. Certainly, as can be seen in this report, the work of Dr. DiCroce, the Task Force, and the Black Community Leaders Group, is yielding a rich harvest in terms of minority student enrollment.
