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ABSTRACT

This document reports the result of a study carried out to evaluate the installation and use of the UNESCO CD-ROM prototype. A questionnaire in English and French was sent to about 267 institutions around the world. Replies were received from 97 bodies, giving a response rate of about 36%. Almost all respondents were information professionals in charge of staff, and the sample was composed chiefly of public bodies and large organizations. Results from the survey included the following information: the UNESCO CD-ROMs are usually installed in reference rooms and available on a self-service basis; installation was considered easy by 94.8% of the respondents; the instructions for installation found in the user manual were considered appropriate; the number of databases held by the organizations surveyed was large and included MEDLINE, ERIC, UNESCO, and PSYCLIT; the satisfaction rate for the CD-ROM was 78.4%; and the CD-ROM was considered easy to use by 85.6% of the respondents. Several graphs present data, and the questionnaire used in the study is included. (JLB)

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

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I PURPOSE AND METHOD USED

At the request of UNESCO, CLE MARKETING carried out a quantitative study for the purpose of evaluating the installation and use of the UNESCO CD-ROM prototype.

A questionnaire in English and in French was sent to about 267 bodies.

Replies were received from 97 bodies, giving a response rate of about 36 per cent.

NOTE

A response rate of 36 per cent for a postal survey is satisfactory and reflects the interest shown in the question of documentation by the bodies concerned.

However, it is to be observed that the 'did not answer' percentages are high, particularly for questions requiring more extensive experience of the prototype.

II COMPOSITION OF THE SAMPLE

Latin America is under represented in the sample. The low rate of response may be due partially to the fact that the questionnaire sent was in English.

Almost all respondents are information professionals in charge of staff, being directors or heads of information departments, documentalists or librarians.


The sample is composed chiefly of public bodies and large organizations.

The number of documentation department users is high (about 60% of the organizations surveyed receive more than 100 users per month).

Documentation stocks are large.


The budget for the purchase of documentation average between 100,000 french francs and 500,000 french francs.

DISTRIBUTION OF RESPONDENTS BY REGION



POSTS HELD BY RESPONDENTS




NUMBER OF STAFF UNDER AUTHORITY OF RESPONDENT


TYPE OF ORGANIZATION



FIGURES REPRESENT PERCENTAGE



NUMBER OF STAFF IN ORGANIZATION





NUMBER OF STAFF IN DOCUMENTATION DEPARTMENT






OCCUPATION OF USERS OF DOCUMENTATION SERVICE


HOLDINGS OF DOCUMENTATION SERVICE NUMBER OF MONOGRAPHS


HOLDINGS OF DOCUMENTATION SERVICE NUMBER OF PERIODICALS

BY WAY OF CONCLUSION

Installation

- The UNESCO CD-ROMs are usually installed in reference rooms and, in more than half the cases, are available on a self-service basis.

- On receipt of the CD-ROM, the organizations took one month on average to install it. It was usually installed by an in-house computer scientist or documentalist (or librarian) in less than an hour. Installation was considered easy by 94.8% of those questioned, and in the majority of cases no problems were encountered.

- The chapter of the User Manual on installation was referred to and the instructions given regarded as appropriate. The installation floppy disk did not pose any problems, and the instructions it contained were regarded as satisfactory.

- The most common make of equipment was Hitachi, followed by Philips. Most equipment made use of a colour screen (VGA). In 20% of cases the equipment was linked up to a local network. Three bodies purchased their equipment specifically for the UNESCO prototype.

- The number of data bases held by the organizations surveyed was large: the majority possessed from one to ten data bases in addition to the UNESCO ones. The most widely used data bases were MEDLINE, ERIC, UNESCO and PSYCLIT.

- The majority of the organizations made use of other consultation media - chiefly on-line access and paper - in addition to the CD-ROM. The CD-ROM was the preferred medium, followed by on-line access.

Use

- On the whole, the level of satisfaction was high, with 78.4 per cent of satisfied users.

- Use was made of the CD-ROM User Manual, which was generally kept beside the microcomputer. The instructions given appeared to be satisfactory.

- Use of the UNESCO CD-ROM was considered easy by 85.6% of the bodies surveyed. The screens were commended and the error messages regarded as clear. It appeared to function less well in two respects: help with retrieval and speed of retrieval.

- The most widely used retrieval mode was the assisted mode, which was considered easy. The expert mode was used mainly by professionals or persons with experience of the micro CDS/ISIS software.

- The most widely used display format was the long format.

- The most widely used databases were UNESBIB, IBEDOCS and DARE. The CD-ROM is employed chiefly for information retrieval.

- Fewer than 10 persons per month use the UNESCO CD-ROM. They are chiefly professionals and researchers.

Expectations

- The bodies concerned are avid for data bases, those most sought after being the UNESCO Thesaurus and Study Abroad.

- The use of English in the Manual and on the screen is appreciated.

- The proposed cost (\$200) is acceptable in that it represents less than 10% of annual budgets for the purchase of paper or computerized documentation.

- It is essential to provide for updating every year preferably twice a year.

- The existence of printed versions of five of the data bases on the UNESCO CD-ROM appears to be little known.

- As regards future policy, 45% of respondents intended to purchase CD-ROMs only; 43% both CD-ROMs and printed documents.
