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ABSTRACT

In an attempt to evaluate the effectiveness of its nursing program, William Rainey Harper College (WRHC) (Illinois) conducted a follow-up study of 1992 nursing graduates or alumni. In spring 1993, a survey instrument, inquiring about employment status, future educational plans, and evaluation of their experience at WRHC, was mailed to all 142 WRHC nursing students who earned 48 credit hours in 1992. Study findings, based on a 100% response rate, included following: (1) 86% of the nursing alumni had achieved an associate degree; (2) 33.1% of the alumni were still enrolled in school, compared to 23% in a 1992 study; (3) over 90% of the alumni were working in jobs that were identical or closely related to the nursing field; (4) nursing alumni rated their preparation in technical job skills and specific job knowledge highly, with the lowest rated areas of preparation including managerial and job search skills; (5) an increase in the extent to which the nursing graduates supervise the work of others was reported, with one-third of alumni supervising on a regular basis; (6) the average salary increased from \$28,675 for 1990 alumni to \$30,980 for 1992 alumni; (7) 90% of the students indicated that they were "satisfied" or "very satisfied" with WRHC, more than had indicated "very satisfied" before; and (8) the leading fields of work included medicine (22%), surgery (16%), psychiatric (10%), and intensive care unit (7%), with nearly three-fourths working in hospitals. 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A B S T R A C T

THE PURPOSE OF THIS STUDY WAS TO FOLLOW UP 1992 NURSING GRADUATES AS ONE OF THE AVENUES OF EVALUATING THE NURSING PROGRAM. THE SURVEY INSTRUMENT WAS MAILED TO THESE FORMER HARPER NURSING STUDENTS ABOUT ONE YEAR AFTER THEY GRADUATED FROM HARPER COLLEGE. A RESPONSE RATE OF 100 PERCENT WAS OBTAINED.

EMPLOYMENT IN THE NURSING FIELD IS VERY GOOD. THOSE WORKING PART TIME ARE DOING SO BY CHOICE. AS IN THE PAST, MOST NURSING ALUMNI ARE WORKING IN ORGANIZATIONS AND SHIFTS THAT ARE OF THEIR CHOICE. THE AVERAGE SALARY HAS INCREASED FROM \$28,675 TO \$30,980. MORE OF THE ALUMNI, THAN IN THE PAST, STATED THEY WERE 'VERY SATISFIED' WITH THEIR JOBS. MOST COMMENTED THEY WERE SATISFIED WITH HARPER IN THE PREPARATION OF 'JOB SKILLS' AND 'SPECIFIC JOB KNOWLEDGE'. A GOOD NUMBER OF THE ALUMNI ARE STILL CONTINUING THEIR EDUCATION AND LOOK TOWARD OBTAINING A BSN. TEN PERCENT OF THE ALUMNI ALREADY ARE ENROLLED IN A BSN PROGRAM.

MOST OF THE ALUMNI ARE WORKING IN HOSPITALS. THE FIELDS THEY WORK IN ARE VARIED. SOME OF THE FIELDS ARE MEDICINE, SURGERY, PSYCHIATRIC AND INTENSIVE CARE UNITS. WHILE TAKING CLASSES AT HARPER, THE NURSING STUDENTS AVERAGE 20 HOURS OF WORK EACH WEEK. MUCH OF THE WORK WAS IN RELATED NURSING FIELDS. FOUR OF THE NURSING ALUMNI SAID THEY WERE DENIED A POSITION DUE TO NOT BEING AN ADN GRADUATE.

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PURPOSE

The purpose of this study was to follow up on the 1992 graduates or alumni of the Nursing Program as one of the avenues of evaluating the program. The survey asked the graduates about their present employment status, their future educational plans and an evaluation of their experience at Harper. The study was requested by the Director of the Nursing Program.

POPULATION SURVEYED

All 142 nursing students who earned 48 credit hours in 1992 were surveyed one year later. After the initial mailing and appropriate follow-up, the following response rate was obtained:

METHODOLOGY

The basic instrument shown in the appendix was borrowed from the regular career alumni study that was conducted at the same time. Additional questions specific to nursing graduates were added by the Director of Nursing. The survey was mailed to these former Harper nursing students about one year after they graduated.

DISCUSSION OF RESULTS

Most of the nursing graduates achieved an Associate in Applied Science Degree. However, 10 percent of the Nursing Program students surveyed do not have a degree. This is reflected by the percentage of Nursing Program students still in school. The results of this study showed one-third still enrolled in school compared to 23 percent in our last study. In addition, the current study reflected close to 8 percent of the alumni not working compared to the last study where all were employed either full time or part time. Over 90 percent of the nursing alumni who are working are working at jobs that are identical or closely related to the nursing field. Only 5 percent are working in areas related to nursing. The nursing alumni highly rated their preparation of technical job skills and specific job knowledge from Harper. The lowest rated areas of preparation were managerial skills and job search skills.

The extent the nursing graduates supervise the work of others has increased from those reported by prior alumni. Now, one-third of them supervise on a regular basis. The average salary has increased from \$28,675 to \$30,980. Although the percentage of the alumni saying they were 'satisfied' to 'very satisfied' with their present jobs is similar to prior alumni, more said 'very satisfied' than before. Those who are employed found their jobs in ways the prior alumni did and slightly less than one-half stated they found

the job on their own. Others found jobs from their current workplace, some by friends or relatives and others by newspaper ads. Most working part time are working part time by choice. A greater percentage than reported in the past said they were temporarily working part time while in school. This relates to the above finding that more of the alumni surveyed said they are still in school.

The leading fields of work are in medicine (22%), surgery (16%), psychiatric (10%) and intensive care units (7%). Close to three-fourths work in hospitals. Others work in extended care facilities, doctor's offices, home health agencies and clinics. The length of time in their present position is much higher than in prior years. The average number of months in their position is 19 compared to 12 months in the last study. Over one-half of them have been in their position for one year or more. Only 20 percent of the 1988 alumni worked in their present position for that amount of time. Over 80 percent are working the shift of choice. Less than 2 percent are working a shift that is definitely not their choice. The shifts currently being worked are not strikingly different than those reported before - 38 percent days, 29 percent evenings, 23 percent nights and 10 percent rotating. Of those not working shifts of their choice, three-fourths preferred days. However, some reported preferring 12-hour shifts. About 90 percent are working in the organization of their choice. Four of the alumni reported they were denied a job because they were not an ADN graduate. Ten percent of the alumni said they belonged to the Illinois Nursing Association. For the first time, over one-half of the graduates said they plan to enroll in a BSN program in a year or two. Ten percent are already enrolled in a BSN program.

When asked to rate student services or aspects of student life at Harper, most rated the teaching faculty and course selection as the best. The courses they rated as most beneficial were nursing, followed by biology, psychology and physical science. Over 50 percent were able to find and check out books/material from the Learning Resources Center. One-third said AV material was available and that the Center was a good place to study. Almost three-fourths of the graduates never made a career change.

Most of the alumni worked while attending Harper averaging 20 hours of work each week while taking classes. Nearly one-third of them worked over 30 hours per week. Just under one-half of this work was related to the nursing field. This accounts for the number of months they reported working in their current position - mentioned earlier. Only 5 percent of them were involved in student activities at Harper College. Practically all of them spent less than 7 hours per week on campus informally while over one-half of the alumni studied on campus. The most prevalent spot for them to study was the Learning Resources Center. Over 90 percent found studying on campus as 'satisfactory' or better.

MAJOR CONCLUSIONS

Employment in the nursing field is very good. Those working part time are doing so by choice. As in the past, most nursing alumni are working in organizations and shifts that are of their choice. The average salary has increased from \$28,675 to \$30,980. More of the alumni than in the past stated they were 'very satisfied' with their jobs. Most commented they were satisfied with Harper in the preparation of 'job skills' and 'specific job knowledge.' A good number of the alumni are still continuing their education and look toward obtaining a BSN. Ten percent of the alumni are already enrolled in a BSN program. Most of the alumni are working in hospitals. The fields they work in are varied. Some of the fields are medicine, surgery, psychiatric and intensive care units. While taking classes at Harper, the nursing students average 20 hours of work each week. Much of the work was in related nursing fields. Four of the nursing alumni said they were denied a position due to not being a ADN graduate.
