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ABSTRACT

An analysis of student matriculation was conducted at Diablo Valley College, in California, using the cohort of 4,251 students identified as new in fall 1992. Data indicate that 22.3% of this cohort did not enroll in any courses after applying, being tested, and completing orientation and advising; 8.4% continued on in the semester, but dropped all their courses; and 69.3% completed the semester. To determine characteristics of students by academic outcome, students were further identified as fully matriculated (FM) (e.g., having completed all assessment, orientation, and advisement components), partially matriculated (PM) (e.g., having components left to complete), exempt from the components, and not matriculated (NM). Results of the analysis included the following: (1) 80% of the FM students chose transfer as an educational goal, compared to 69% of the PM, 13% of the exempt, and 42% of the NM students; (2) 82% of the NM students completed fall 1992, while 79% of the exempt, 44% of the NM, and 38% of the PM students did so; (3) 100% of the FM students enrolled in at least one subsequent semester by fall 1993; (4) FM students enrolled in and completed more units than students in other groups; and (5) while only 39% of the NM students had a grade point average of 2.0 or higher, 64% of the FM and 50% of the PM students did. Recommendations for intervention strategies and data tables are included. (KP)

SUMMARY

Students who completed the matriculation process are significantly more likely to choose transfer as an educational goal, to be less than 20 years old, to complete the semester, to persist to additional semesters, and to be successful.

Students who completed the matriculation process enroll in more units and complete more units than students in the other three groups. Significantly more of them have a 2.0 GPA or higher.

Of the students that were assessed and who never continued beyond the 1992 fall semester, 77% had significant weaknesses in math. Over 50% of the students tested and who never continued beyond the 1992 fall semester were recommended to basic skills math and another 27% were recommended to elementary algebra. Their English skills do not appear to be an indicator; basic skills English was suggested to only 21% of this group of students.

Of the students who did not participate in matriculation, over 42% had transfer as their ed goal. But 61% of the non matriculated group enrolled only in the fall of 1992. This group also contained more women, more students over 20, more African American students and more Hispanic/Latino students than should be expected*. Only 44% of this group completed the fall 1992 semester.

Students who were exempt were significantly older, had short term not transfer ed goals, completed the fall 1992 semester only, and completed fewer than 12 units. About 53% of them had a GPA of zero, which indicates they took a significant number of their courses for CR/NC. About 95% of this group were only temporarily exempt.

RECOMMENDATIONS

1. Identify the students whose assessment results indicate they have a weakness in math as an "At Risk Population".
 - Provide early intervention and counseling to get them enrolled in classes where they can be successful their first semester.
 - Have them enroll in appropriate developmental math courses their first semester with proper support.
2. Strongly encourage the students who choose not to participate in matriculation to be assessed and work with a counselor to develop an educational goal. Especially those who have long term goals.
3. Investigate interventions to reduce the number of students who do not take part in the matriculation process.
4. Investigate interventions to reduce the number of students who complete all or part of the matriculation process and do not enroll in classes.

MATRICULATION EVALUATION

From the fall of 1992, 4,251 students new to DVC who had no prior college experience were identified.

Of this cohort of students, 22.3% did not enroll in any course after filling out an application, after being tested, or after completing orientation and advising.

- * 9.5% of the students applied but did not enroll.
- * 5.2% of the students only went through the assessment process.
- * 7.6% of the students completed orientation and advising but did not enroll in any classes in the fall semester.

Of the 4,251 students in the cohort, 69% completed the semester by completing at least one course other than counseling 105 (orientation & advising).

For this study the students in the cohort have been separated into four groups:

Students are **"Fully Matriculated"** if they have completed one or more of the components assessment, orientation, and advisement and no component is required.

Students are **"Partially Matriculated"** if they have completed one or two of the components and the remaining are still required.

Students are **"Exempt"** if they have been exempt on all three components.

Students are **"Not Matriculated"** if they have not completed any of the three components. At least one must be required; the others may be exempt.


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DEMOGRAPHICS

- 80% of the students who were **fully matriculated** chose transfer as an educational goal.
- Students who were **partially matriculated** chose transfer as an ed goal 69% of the time.
- Students who were **exempt** chose transfer as an ed goal only 13% of the time, but chose job related as an ed goal 44% of the time
- Those who were **not matriculated** had indicated transfer as an ed goal 42% of the time and job related 26% of the time.
- Students who were **fully matriculated** were evenly distributed by gender.
- There were more men who **completed only part of matriculation or were fully exempt** than should be expected.
- More women were a part of the group that **did not participate in matriculation** than should be expected.
- There was a larger number of African American and Hispanic/Latino students in the group that was **not matriculated** than we should expect.
- More Asian and Filipino students were **fully matriculated** than expected.


- Students who were fully matriculated were primarily less than 20 years old.
- Students who were fully exempt were primarily over 30 years old.
- Students who did not participate in matriculation were evenly spread across the three age groups.

RETENTION

"Enrolled in Fall 92 Semester" includes only those students who were enrolled in a course other than the orientation/advising course, counseling 105.

"Completed Fall 92 Semester" includes only those students who completed a course other than the orientation/advising course, counseling 105.

- Students who were fully matriculated had a higher retention rate for the fall 1992 semester than the other three groups.

PERSISTENCE

A student is **persistent** when he/she enrolls in a course in subsequent semesters after their first semester. **Counseling 105 is included as one of the courses.** The summer of 1993 is not included in the table. However, eighteen of the students had attended the summer session of 1993 only. Nine were partially matriculated and nine were not matriculated.

A student is considered to have enrolled in a course even if they received a grade of "W". Students who only received a grade of "WX" are not considered enrolled. The following table is the number of students who enrolled in at least one semester by the fall of 1993.



- Of the 22% of the students who were **fully matriculated** and only attended DVC in the fall of 1992, 50% were recommended to take basic skills math and another 27% were recommended to take elementary algebra. Only 21% were suggested to take basic skills English.
- Of the 50% who were **recommended to take basic skills math**, 58% had transfer as their educational goal.
- Of the 27% who were **recommended to take elementary algebra**, 83% had transfer as their educational goal.
- Students who were **fully exempt** or who were **not matriculated** were significantly more likely to not persist beyond the fall 1992 semester at DVC than those who were fully or partially matriculated.

The following table shows the enrollment pattern of each of the four groups over three semesters.

The 207 students who were fully matriculated and only completed courses 105 in the fall of 1992 have been eliminated from the "Enrolled In At Least One Semester" group.

- Students who completed the matriculation process were significantly more persistent across semesters than those who did not complete the process.


SUCCESS

Three broad measures of success are the cumulative units enrolled, the cumulative units completed, and the GPA.




- Students who were fully exempt or who did not complete any of the matriculation components were significantly more likely to only enroll in 12 units or less.



- Students who were fully exempt or who did not complete any of the matriculation components were significantly more likely to only complete 12 units or less.

A third measure of success is the student's cumulative GPA. The following table shows the percent of students who have a **cumulative GPA of 2.0 or higher** as of their last semester enrolled.



- Students who are **fully matriculated** are significantly more likely to have a cumulative GPA of 2.0 or higher than any of the other three groups.
- Only 39% of the students who were **not matriculated** had a GPA of 2.0 or higher.

The following table shows the percent of students who have a **cumulative GPA of zero** as of their last semester enrolled. A GPA of zero will be the result of only taking courses for CR/NC, of not completing courses (a grade of W), or of receiving grades of F.

- Significantly fewer of the **fully matriculated** students had a GPA of zero than any of the other three groups.

APPENDIX

DEFINITION OF EXPECTED

To determine if students in a sub group of the cohort are any different than the students in the cohort; all 4,251 students in the Fall 1992 Cohort are used as a standard. If we assume that the proportion of each of the categories of students in a sub group of students should be the same as the proportion of those who are in the cohort, we can determine how many students we should expect to have in each of the categories of the sub group. A CHI probability test can then be applied between the actual number of students and the expected number of students to determine if the difference is significant.

If the percentage difference between the expected number and the actual number is 20% or more, there is considered to be a disproportionate impact.

The following tables give various distributions of the students in each of the four groups; fully matriculated, partially matriculated, fully exempt, or not matriculated.
