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ABSTRACT

San Jose City College's ADELANTE Program is a year-long program that seeks to engender a social, cultural, and political consciousness to increase pride in Latino identity, and commitment to endeavors contributing to lifelong success. The program is committed to increasing the recruitment, retention, and graduation and transfer rates of Latino students. ADELANTE began in fall 1990 as the result of a Title III Grant in developmental education. The program is modeled on the ENLACE program at Evergreen Valley College, with the addition of a career planning course. The ADELANTE Program currently serves 30 students. ADELANTE classes that were offered from fall 1990 through spring 1993 were Basic Writing, Guidance 96 (career planning), and English 1A (Transfer Composition). The overall success rate of ADELANTE students over the first six semesters of the program was 67%, compared to 53% for Latino students in non-ADELANTE comparison sections, and 57% for all other students. Over six semesters, ADELANTE students had higher success rates than the other Latino students; however, most ADELANTE sections had small numbers of students so caution should be used in generalizing from data for a single semester's comparisons. Overall, the ADELANTE program seems to be achieving its goal of greater success for Latino students. (KP)

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

Mission

ADELANTE at San Jose City College is a year-long program that seeks to engender in its students a social-cultural-political consciousness to increase pride in Latino identity and commitment to individual and group endeavors that contribute to lifelong success. The program is committed to increasing the recruitment, retention, graduation and transfer rates of Latino students.

History

Now in its third year, ADELANTE began in Fall 1990 as the result of a Title III grant in developmental education. The program is modeled on Enlace at Evergreen Valley College, with the addition of a Career Planning course that teaches students to learn more about themselves and their careers. Specific courses include Basic Writing (English 335/English 92 in one semester), Guidance 96, and College Composition (English 1A). The ADELANTE Program currently serves approximately 30 students.


The Program

ADELANTE includes the following elements:

Success Story

The ADELANTE classes that were offered from Fall 1990 through Spring 1993 were ENGL 335 (two levels below English 1A), ENGL 92 (one level below English 1A), and Guidance 96 (Career Planning) during the fall semesters, and ENGL 1A (transfer composition) during the spring semesters. The Latino students in the ADELANTE sections of these courses were compared to all other Latino students in the same courses, as well as all other non-ADELANTE students in the same courses.



Over the course of six semesters, from Fall 1990 through Spring 1993, 265 Latino ADELANTE students had:

- a 67% overall success rate. 1078 other Latino students in the same courses had a 53% success rate.
- a range of from 2 to an impressive 35 percentage points higher than other Latinos in ten of the twelve comparisons.
- a 67% overall success rate. 4238 non-ADELANTE students in the same courses had a 57% success rate.


Conclusion

The ADELANTE program continues to show great success. This is very impressive given that there have been commonly graded finals in English 92 and English 1A writing classes since Spring 1992 to help stabilize grading variations. The results are encouraging and support the kinds of interventions that are being used in the program on behalf of Latino students.


Comment: The overall success rate of Latino ADELANTE students over the first six semesters of the program was 67% compared to 53% for Latino students in non-ADELANTE comparison sections and 57% for all other students. In ten of twelve comparisons, Latino students in ADELANTE groups had higher success rates than Latino students in non-ADELANTE comparison groups, and in nine of twelve comparisons they had higher success rates than all other students.


Answer: Over 6 semesters, the total success rate for Latino ADELANTE students was 67% compared to other English 335, English 92, English 1A, and Guidance 96 Latino students at 53%. For all six semesters, the Latino ADELANTE students had higher success rates than the other Latino students. Most individual ADELANTE sections had small numbers of Latino students; therefore, caution should be used in generalizing from data for a single semester's comparisons. Overall, the ADELANTE program seems to be achieving its goal of greater success for Latino students.

Note: ADELANTE records of student ethnicity differ somewhat from the official District Ethnic Grade Distribution Report from which data for this research report was taken. Students indicate their ethnic background on a scanner filled out as part of the admission and registration process and this information goes into the Grade Distribution Report. Latino students who marked "Decline to State," "Unknown," or any designation other than "Hispanic" on the scanner, were not included as "Latino" in this ADELANTE report.


Comment: Latinos in the Spring 1993 ADELANTE English 1A section had a very high success rate of 73%, 27 percentage points higher than the success rate for all other Latinos in English 1A at 46% and 16 percentage points higher than the success rate of all other English 1A students at 57%.

Note:

Direct comparisons between ADELANTE English 335 and English 92 classes with other English 335 and English 92 classes are complicated by the fact that the ADELANTE program has a unique English 335/92 course, combining students at both levels in one classroom in a one-semester approach at mastery of these two writing levels. In order to assist in evaluation of the ADELANTE program, however, it is helpful to look at success rates of students who gain competency in these two levels of English both within and outside of the program. The District's Grade Distribution Report was used to calculate student success in the ADELANTE sections of English 335 and 92 (a combined class) as well as success rates for other Latino students in other sections of those courses. In every comparison, ADELANTE students show higher rates of success.

The overall success rate for female ADELANTE students was 16 percentage points greater than the male success rate. Overall enrollment breakdown for ADELANTE was 41% male, 59% female.

Other Latinos had a 51% success rate for females and a 53% success rate for males. The enrollment was 45% male and 55% female.

The All Other Students female success rate was 59%, compared to 53% for males. The enrollment breakdown was 47% male and 53% female.

COMMENT:

The rate of success for female ADELANTE students was higher than that of male ADELANTE students in every course in every semester except for English 92 in Fall 92, where male success was 8 percentage points higher, and English 1A in Spring 93 (male and female were tied at 73%). There was a 16 percentage point difference in the overall total over five semesters. This was the opposite of the trend for Other Latinos in the same courses; Other Latino males had higher success rates than Other Latino females 56% of the time, although the differences were not as great as those between male and female ADELANTE students. Female success rates were higher for All Other Students (excluding ADELANTE) in 7 out of 9 comparisons, but the overall difference between male and female was only 6 percentage points. Overall male success was nearly the same in every category (57%, 53% and 53%), but female success ranged widely from 51% for Other Latinos and 59% for All Other Students, to a high 73% for ADELANTE female students. A greater focus on the male ADELANTE student might be of value.
