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ABSTRACT

Since May 1991, College of the Canyons (CoC) in California, has conducted annual surveys of the registered nursing graduates. As of May 1994, 160 surveys have been distributed and 100 completed surveys have been received. An analysis of responses over the 4-year period and comparisons between years indicate the following: (1) 87.9% of the respondents indicated that they would select a nursing major again if starting over; (2) 89.9% indicated CoC was their first choice when they enrolled; (3) 50.5% reported that they chose CoC for its location, while 26.3% chose it for the quality of the program; (4) 29.3% attended CoC for 3 years, 26.3% for 2 years, and 16.25 for 4 years; (5) 56.1% reported grade point averages (GPA's) of 3.0 to 3.4, 36.7% reported GPA's of 3.5 to 4.0, and 7.1% reported GPA's of 2.0 to 2.9; (6) 97.9% were employed in the field, 80.9% of these were employed full-time, and the largest percentage of alumni employed full-time received a salary of \$30,000 to \$39,999; (7) 15 alumni reported that they had enrolled at another educational institution after graduation, with most stating that they were more than adequately prepared; (8) the number of male graduates has increased from 0 in 1990 to 28 (14.3% of graduates) in 1993; (9) the percentage of graduates employed at the time of the survey has decreased from 100% in 1990 to 78.6% in 1993; and (10) 36% rated their preparation for their job as excellent in 1993, up from 10% in 1992, but down from 50% in 1990. ## REGISTERED NURSING ALUMNI SURVEYS

Since May 1991, the Nursing Department has annually sent a Registered Nursing Alumni Survey to each alumnus who completed the Registered Nursing program the previous December. In the four years, 160 surveys have been distributed and 100 were completed and returned for an overall response rate of 62.5%. The response rate for each year follows:

The first section of this report provides an overview of the responses of all 100 alumni respondents over the four year period. Each of the respondents reported six months after graduating from the Registered Nursing program at College of the Canyons. The second section of the report will provide annual comparisons.

## Section 1: Overall Responses

### I. EDUCATIONAL EXPERIENCE AT COLLEGE OF THE CANYONS

- Over four-fifths of the respondents (87.9%) said that if they were starting college over again, they would select a Nursing major.
- Nearly ninety percent (89.9%) indicated that College of the Canyons was their first choice when they first enrolled.
- When asked the primary reason they chose to attend College of the Canyons, 50.5% said it was because of "location", while 26.3% said it was due to the "quality of the Nursing Program."
- Three out of five (62.2%) of the Nursing alumni lived within the district while a student. Over 10 out-of-district students came from Lancaster and Palmdale (11.2%) and from adjacent areas of the San Fernando Valley (Sylmar, Granada Hills and San Fernando -- 13.3%). The most well-traveled Nursing student reported living in Moorpark.
- Fifty-five percent (54.8%) of the respondents said they were primarily enrolled part-time at the college prior to their acceptance into the Nursing Program.
- When asked how long they attended the college, the respondents reported the following:
  - 0.0% -- One term
  - 13.1% -- One Year
  - 26.3% -- Two Years
  - 29.3% -- Three Years
  - 16.2% -- Four Years
  - 15.2% -- More than four years
- When asked about how many hours per week they usually spent studying or preparing for classes, alumni gave the following responses:
  - 4.1% -- 1 to 3 hours
  - 37.8% -- 4 to 10 hours
  - 33.7% -- 11 to 15 hours
  - 13.3% -- 16 to 20 hours
  - 11.2% -- More than 20 hours
- Nearly all reported doing well academically. The respondents reported the following final grade point averages:
  - 36.7% -- 4.0 to 3.5
  - 56.1% -- 3.4 to 3.0
  - 7.1% -- 2.9 to 2.5
  - 0.0% -- 2.4 to 2.0
  - 0.0% -- Below 2.0

- When crosstabulations were run to determine the relationship of study time to final GPA, a statistically significant difference was found. A larger percentage of alumni who reported usually studying 16 or more hours per week reported final GPA's of 3.5 or higher than those who studied fewer hours per week.



- About half (45.5%) of the Nursing alumni thought the college provided a better quality of education than other colleges. Only 2.0% thought it was "worse" than other colleges.
- Table 1, on the following page, shows that a high percentage of alumni were satisfied with both the availability of Nursing courses and the quality of Nursing instruction.
- When crosstabulations were run to determine the relationship of hours spent studying to alumni ratings of the quality of nursing instruction, a statistically significant difference was found. A higher percentage of alumni who usually studied 16 or more hours per week indicated that they were "very satisfied" with the quality of nursing instruction than those who studied fewer hours per week.

• When asked to indicate why they were dissatisfied with the Nursing Program, fifteen alumni provided the following comments. Most were concerned with the faculty.

- Help/support provided by nursing faculty to nursing students was seldom available. Varied from person to person (1993 graduate).
- Instructors were difficult to reach in off-hours (1993 graduate).
- One instructor was abrupt and not encouraging - in fact she seemed to pick at some students, always finding fault. Did not answer questions (1993 graduate).
- Some nursing staff were not helpful to student requests. Either they were too busy or did not want to be liable to teach procedure when a teacher wasn't available. As a result, there were missed opportunities (1993 graduate).
- I feel as though there are some teachers who should retire. They can't remember the lectures and are always being corrected (1991 Graduate).
- Some staff/faculty always give negative feedback. Not seeing positive attributes of students. Very critical and not supportive (1991 Graduate).
- Certain instructors are unprofessional and belittling to some students (1991 Graduate).
- Picked on students with apparent handicaps. Unfair treatment of student on equal basis (1991 Graduate).
- Distant, dictatorship, too controlling, cold (1990 Graduate).
- For as long as these instructors have worked together, they were disorganized, which put stress on the students (1990 Graduate).
- More compassionate faculty (1990 Graduate).

One 1993 graduate would have liked a pre-test, to give her an idea of what to truly expect. Two 1992 alumni noted that they did not feel as though they had been given adequate preparation for the boards. One 1991 graduate indicated that there wasn't a tutor available during the last semester of Advanced Medical-Surgical.

• Seventy-two alumni generously offered one or more suggestions on how the R.N. Program might be improved. The comments have been grouped by topic area, with the date of the student's graduation noted in parenthesis.

#### INTRAVENOUS PROCEDURES

- Should have had IV's earlier than 4th semester! Also, pharmacology just seemed too abstract at the time - didn't get a comfortable understanding of meds (1993).
- Learning IV skills earlier to gain more experience (1993).
- Start IV training sooner than 4th semester (1993).
- Preparing for Boards more adequately. Start IV teaching earlier (1992).
- Spend more time on IV therapy and organizing your time. There should be more clinical time and/or beginning with meds/IV's and at least 2-3 patients earlier than in the 4th semester. 4th semester should include more than 3 weeks of teamleading to prepare you for working in the "real world" (1992).
- Provide more time to practice more difficult nursing skills (i.e. IV's, IVC, etc); less time on basic skills such as bedmaking, bathing patients etc. (1992).
- Earlier IV training and more patient contact. Longer hours at the hospital and less simulated lab time (1991).
- Instead of spending so many hours filling out green sheets to satisfy an instructor, I feel I

- Preparing for Boards more adequately. Start IV teaching earlier (1992).
- Spend more time on IV therapy and organizing your time. There should be more clinical time and/or beginning with meds/IV's and at least 2-3 patients earlier than in the 4th semester. 4th semester should include more than 3 weeks of teamleading to prepare you for working in the "real world" (1992).
- Provide more time to practice more difficult nursing skills (i.e. IV's, IVC, etc); less time on basic skills such as bedmaking, bathing patients etc. (1992).
- Earlier IV training and more patient contact. Longer hours at the hospital and less simulated lab time (1991).
- Instead of spending so many hours filling out green sheets to satisfy an instructor, I feel I learned more from daily/weekly patient care sheets. Also include a briefing about giving IV push meds. I found this was the most frightening aspect of becoming an RN as it was such a foreign skill I was suddenly faced with. A brief overview of this skill would have been helpful (1991).
- IV module should have been presented earlier in the program (1991).
- Total patient care earlier in the program such as IV therapy; 2 full days of clinical time (1991).
- More training with IV's and nutrition (1990).
- More emphasis on IV starts and nursing process (1990).
- More IV therapy time - lecture and clinic (1990).

### CLINICAL EXPERIENCE

- Clinic time needs to be increased in summer work program (1993).
- I feel we need more clinical experience start and care for IV's sooner in program (1993).
- Include ER clinical (1993).
- Increase exposure to clinical procedures by group observation of fellow students (in addition to what was done) (1993).
- More clinical hours (1992).
- Would like more hands-on training (1992).
- Should have been able to participate in more procedures, ex. heart cath., mammogram, etc. There are many questions on the Board in these areas. We were advised to stay with our patients (1992).
- Yes, need more hands-on clinical experience on rotations - difficulty comes with inability to perform techniques without instructor present (1992).
- More hospital experience (1992).
- Responsibility during clinical, i.e. patient load more leadership; organization skills during clinical to help prioritize (1991).
- Clinical: more patients in 2nd half of program. Rehab Time: too much, more MIS. Instruction: more lecture from instructor experience/knowledge than straight from the text. It's easy to read yourself (1991).
- Need experience in drawing blood. Overall need more clinical experience, less lecture (1992).
- Practical training instead of just theory (1991).
- More clinical practice with multiple patients (to learn time management and floor procedures (1990).
- More variety of clinical experience, other sites with better opportunity for learning (1990).
- Hospitals with greater variety and more #'s every patients for better experience in the clinical area (1990).
- We could have used a different clinical setting such as a county hospital for med-surg

experience (1990).

- Training at a County hospital for Med-Surgical with a wider variety of patients would have provided a broader clinical experience (1990).
- Sometimes, as in the working world of nursing, theoretical training isn't as valuable as clinical experience; the patient load should be gradually upped to give the Student Nurse the experience they'll need to carry a patient load once employed (1990).
- Clinical experience (1990).

### FACULTY

- Instructors need to occasionally work as floor nurses to effectively teach (1993).
- Virginia Soriano needs to work on several areas to deserve to be w/ the great instructors there (1993).
- More organized. Less talking among students during lectures (1993).
- Get a new, younger faculty (1992).
- One instructor presented her lecture out of a book without any preparation. I felt I could have learned as much reading it at home (1992).
- The psych. professor could have been less involved in my personal life - much less critical (1991).
- Better communication between instructors regarding educational information (1991).
- Communication between faculty and all students (1991).
- More compassionate faculty; more hands-on, bedside instruction (1990).

### CURRICULUM

- Nutrition=need entire class on! Preceptorship-type last semester (1993).
- Yes, more focused on nursing process rather than physiology (1993).
- 1st semester - more guidance in the clinical setting. 3rd semester - begin "Focus of Care" in clinical (don't wait until 4th semester) (1993).
- > exposure of students to patients/cases (1993).
- Yes - L.V.N. bridge class revised and more specific to individual need (1993).
- Pharmacology - more spread out - it was a little overwhelming - possibly expand Med. Surg. & present pharm. with relevant systems? More cardiac/EKG coverage - I'd already had EKG experience, both others found it harder to grasp so quickly (1993).
- More exposure to different areas, such as orthopedics, oncology, more chances to try procedures such as I.V. starts (1993).
- The course was slightly disorganized, once I learned "the ropes" I was fine! (1993).
- Syllabus (1992).
- More weeks as team leader. Judy shouldn't read out of the book (1992).
- More focus on actual nursing and less time on bed-making and baths (1992).
- LVN's should be handled separately from 2 year RN's. LVN's were sort of set aside when it came to 1:1 instruction from the teachers (1992).
- I felt the computer test in psych. was a waste of time for me because it gave me no feedback (1991).
- Less basic nursing and more mid or advanced nursing skills (1991).
- More of an emphasis on diagnostic tests and what they do and do not reveal and what to do to prepare patient for different tests (1991).
- Needs to be more organized (1991).
- More time needs to be spent on EKG interpretations. LVN's DO NOT learn this in their

programs. This is a very important aspect of RN duties not only for ICU but all nurses (1991).

- Time spent with student preparing to go into hospital. And what was expected for each level of study (1991).
- Better preparation in bridge class for integration with 2 year students. More Board-type questions on exams so it would test on integration of materials rather than memory (1991).
- Could have used more Board and job preparation (1991).
- More nutrition & TPA; heavy on the boards (1990).
- Better choice of books (1990).
- Practice with charting SAP (1990).
- Require 2-3 patients on not-green sheet weeks (1990).
- The scheduling of class time with training time in the hospitals (1990).

#### SUPPLIES AND EQUIPMENT

- Some of the audio-visual film strips do not play and some are outdated. Could use more hospital equipment and instruments in the Nursing Lab (1991).

#### OTHER

- The initial day our schedule was changed. The new hours caused a lot of work problems to reschedule. 1 student had to drop. Also, a suggestion - a brief interview in the selection process. I felt a couple of students who were psychologically unstable may have not been accepted even though they "test" well (1993).
- Reviewing tests (1993).
- Very good program (1990).

## II. EMPLOYMENT HISTORY

- Nearly all the Nursing alumni reported they were currently employed and that they were employed in the field of Nursing (97.9%). Eighty percent (80.9%) reported they were employed full-time.

- Almost sixty percent of the Nursing alumni (59.1%) said that they already held their current job before leaving College of the Canyons. The rest of the respondents provided the following breakdown about the time taken to secure employment:

- 59.1% -- Had a job which continued after I completed my program
- 8.6% -- Obtained a job just prior to leaving College of the Canyons
- 7.5% -- Less than 1 month
- 18.3% -- 1 to 3 months
- 6.5% -- 4 to 6 months


- Over eighty percent (81.7%) said their employment title was Staff Nurse. Another 4.3% said they were Charge Nurses. The remaining 10.0% held titles such as LVN, Office Nurse, Industrial Nurse and Correctional Nurse.

- Nursing alumni work around-the-clock, with most working the night shift (42.4%), followed by 35.9% who work the day shift and 21.7% who work the evening shift.

- Table 2, on the following page, shows that the largest percentage of Nursing alumni employed full-time receive an annual salary of \$30,000 to \$39,999.


- When asked the area(s) of medicine in which they work, the respondents reported the following. Multiple responses account for a total greater than 100.0%.

- 37.0% -- Medical-Surgical
- 14.0% -- Emergency
- 12.0% -- D.O.U.
- 10.0% -- Obstetrics
- 9.0% -- Pediatrics
- 7.0% -- Psychiatric
- 5.0% -- Skilled Nursing Facility
- 3.0% -- Critical Care

- Over one quarter of the Nursing alumni (28.7%) felt that College of the Canyons did an "excellent" job in preparing them for their current job. Another 51.1% said the college provided them with "good" preparation. None of the alumni reported that they felt "inadequately" prepared.
- Table 3, on the following page, shows that nearly all the Nursing alumni feel as though they use their clinical skills either "very much" or "quite a bit" in their current position.
- Table 4, following Table 3, shows that nearly 90 percent of the alumni are either "satisfied" or "very satisfied" with the challenge of their current position.


Percentage of Nursing Alumni Who Indicated They Use the Following Skills/Processes Either "Very Much" or "Quite a Bit" in Their Current Position

### III. CONTINUING EDUCATION

- Fifteen of the 96 respondents, or 15.6%, reported that they had enrolled at another educational institution in the six months since completing their Nursing program at College of the Canyons.

- Of the 15 alumni continuing their education, 46.7% were doing so to satisfy job/career requirements, 33.3% to increase their earning power, and 13.3% for general self-improvement.

- Of the 15, the following percentage indicated the College of the Canyons had prepared them \_\_\_\_\_ for continuing their education:

- 13.3% -- Exceptionally well
- 46.7% -- More than adequately
- 40.0% -- Adequately
- 0.0% -- Less than adequately
- 0.0% -- Very poorly

- When asked to report the GPA they had achieved at the new institution, five of the 15 respondents were able to respond:

- 20.0% -- 4.0 to 3.5
- 80.0% -- 3.4 to 3.0
- 0.0% -- 2.9 to 2.5
- 0.0% -- 2.4 to 2.0
- 0.0% -- Below 2.0

- When asked what institutions they were attending and their intended major, the fifteen respondents reported the following:

- Of the 15 enrolled in another educational institution, they planned the following as their highest degree:

6.7% -- Associate Degree  
33.3% -- Bachelor's Degree  
46.7% -- Master's Degree  
6.7% -- Doctor's Degree (Ph.D. or Ed.D.)

#### IV. DEMOGRAPHIC CHARACTERISTICS

- The majority of the respondents were White, middle-age females.
  - 90.0% were female
  - 88.9% were Caucasian/White
  - 63.6% were 30 to 49 years of age
- Ten of the respondents were male (10.0%).
- Eleven of the respondents, or 11.0%, were non-white, with 4 African-Americans (4.0%), 3 Latinos (3.0%), 2 Asian Americans (3.0%) and 1 other non-white (1.0%).
- Thirty-three of the respondents, or 33.4%, were between the age of 22 and 29. Three alumni were age 50 or above. None of the alumni were below the age of 22.
