ABSTRACT

Intended to make the job of finding the right book for the right child easy, this book lists the "Children's Choices" selections (recent books recommended and voted on by children themselves) for 1992, 1993, and 1994. Each of the over 300 entries (about 100 for each calendar year) is annotated and includes publication information. Entries are grouped according to the following reading levels: all ages, beginning independent reading, younger readers (approximately 5 to 8 years old), middle grades (ages 8 to 10), and older readers (ages 10 to 13). Indexes of authors, illustrators, and titles are attached. (NKA)

The Children's Book Council (CBC) is a nonprofit organization encouraging the reading and enjoyment of children's books. CBC sponsors National Children's Book Week each November and also prepares and sells display and informational materials to promote year-round reading. The Council cooperates on a variety of projects with the International Reading Association and with other national professional associations.

The International Reading Association is a nonprofit, professional organization of classroom teachers, reading specialists, administrators, educators of reading teachers, reading researchers, parents, librarians, psychologists, and others interested in improving reading instruction. It encourages study of the reading process, research, and better teacher education. It promotes the development of reading proficiency to the limit of each person's ability, an awareness of the need and importance of reading, and the formation of the reading habit.

The production of the three "Children's Choices" lists included in this book has involved many people in many different locations. Introduction

Each year since 1975 the International Reading Association and the Children's Book Council have joined efforts to produce a list of about 100 titles that kids have chosen as their favorite books. Teachers, librarians, and parents look forward to receiving the new "Children's Choices" list each fall. The first list was published in 1975 in the Association's journal *The Reading Teacher*. A reprint of the list is also widely circulated each year.

The idea behind the list is simple. If children are to learn about the joy of reading and become proficient, lifelong readers, they need to know that books are fun. What better way to find books a child will like than to consult each year's version of Children's Choices, a list of titles selected by children themselves as "good reading"? The list can be used by anyone who is interested in children's reading material: teachers looking for titles to use in their classrooms, librarians and parents helping children choose special books for recreational reading, or friends and family hoping to find the perfect book to give as a gift. Children's Choices is organized by suggested reading levels to help in determining whether a particular book will be accessible to a particular child.

Although the idea behind the project is simple, the process by which each book is selected for inclusion in the list is elaborate. Each year approximately 500 new children's books (excluding textbooks) are sent to each of five test sites across the United States. At each of these sites, about 2,000 children participate in reading and evaluating the books. The children are asked "Do you like this book?" and get to vote "Yes," "No," or "Maybe." The votes from all five sites are tabulated, and the most popular books (usually just over 100 titles) are selected to appear as the year's Children's Choices. The coordinators of the project at the test sites determine whether the books are appropriate for All Ages, Beginning Independent Reading, Younger Readers (children ap-

proximately 5 to 8 years of age), Middle Grades (ages 8 to 10), or Older Readers (ages 10 to 13). The coordinators and their teams also prepare annotations for each title.

More Kids' Favorite Books lists the Children's Choices selections from 1992, 1993, and 1994—over 300 books in all. Each entry includes bibliographic information about the book and an annotation. (Please note that the publishers' names and the ISBNs refer to the original publication evaluated at the test sites. In some cases, paperback editions may now be available; in a few cases, the original edition may be difficult to find or unavailable. Librarians and bookstore employees should be able to provide current information on the availability of particular books. The intention in supplying the original bibliographic information is simply to provide a starting point.) To increase the collection's usefulness as a resource tool, we have included indexes of titles, authors, and illustrators.

More Kids' Favorite Books will make the job of finding the right book for the right child easy and fun. And because these books were chosen by children themselves, reading a Children's Choices book will likely show children that reading can be easy and fun, too!

Illustrated transparent overlays add to the beauty of this innovative approach to nonfiction. Originally published in France in 1990 by Editions Gallimard.

Even super athletes have bad days, and lessons can be learned from these stories of determination, embarrassment, victory, and defeat. Children are heavily influenced by professional football players, and inspiration is in heavy supply here.

Hey, Hay! A Wagonful of Funny Homonym Riddles

"These riddles are fun!" exclaimed a third grader when this homonym riddle book was read aloud. The answers are all homonyms—sometimes two, three, and even four words that sound the same.

An intriguing book that opens up new ways of looking at art. It may be enjoyed alone, but it is too good not to share with someone.

two special pages, the drawing of an ocean liner and a steam train fold open to 3 feet.

Lady Penelope is having a party to show off her new treasure, the Dudley Diamond. The lights go out and the diamond is stolen! Who took it? A great whodunit mystery with pop-up pictures.

Jack and the Beanstalk

This rich retelling of the popular tale, featuring Kellogg's magical, often humorous illustrations, has universal appeal. As one class commented, "We think Mr. Kellogg is a great artist."

"Who's there?" or "What's there?" Thrills, chills, and laughter await readers of all ages as they guess what creature lurks behind the door.

A gold mine of ideas for helping students plan, design, and make their own books. "It was so neat, I'm making my own book," wrote one 3rd grader. "I must have this book!" was the comment of another student.

Walt Disney was not afraid to work hard and make his dreams become a reality. This book contains many interesting quotes by Disney and is a very descriptive biography.



Patrick Edward's mother is sweet, tender, and very protective, but she also lives in a cave and has magic powers. Gammell's illustrations create a surreal mood for the boy's adventures.

Puns of fun is what you'll feel when reading Mrs. Bretsky's Bakery. Readers of all ages will rise to the occasion and agree that this book takes the cake!

Nature's Deadly Creatures: A Pop-Up Exploration

Frances Jones. Illustrated by Tony Smith and Andrew Robinson. Dial. ISBN 0-8037-1342-8. CC '93.

"Fascinating" describes this pop-up book about venomous animals such as the scorpion, blue-ringed octopus, Gila monster, cobra snake, black widow spider, and zebrafish. Cleverly designed to look lifelike, each entry also opens in a side panel with much written and graphic detail.

Not the Piano, Mrs. Medley!

This is a delightful book about a crazy swap between people and barnyard animals. Kellogg's zany illustrations combined with Ehrlich's tongue-in-cheek dialogue will charge the imaginations of young and old alike.

Planes of the Aces: A Three-Dimensional Collection of the Most Famous Aircraft in the World

Joan Bowden. Illustrated by Stef Suchomski. Doubleday/Bantam Doubleday Dell. ISBN 0-385-30910-4. CC '94.

In this book for airplane enthusiasts, historical and statistical facts accompany seven three-dimensional pop-up planes, ranging from the Red Baron's World War I Fokker to the Tornado GR.1, which flew in the Persian Gulf War.

Somebody Catch My Homework

Original and humorous poems about school experiences include the agony of homework and tests, the horrors of cafeteria food, the classroom bully, and the joy of reading your very first book.

Somebody Loves You, Mr. Hatch

A sad and lonely man becomes enlightened when a special gift is sent to him. This story shows the importance of friendship in everyone's life.

A Southern Time Christmas

Students enjoy this hilarious regional take-off on the traditional Christmas poem "The Night Before Christmas." Jed, Santa's elf, gives special insight into customs that are uniquely Southern. A good read-aloud.

The Stinky Cheese Man and Other Fairly Stupid Tales

In this wonderful reference book with a new approach to looking at art, Robin Richmond tries to describe the picture

and help us understand what the artist is trying to express. We learn art history as well as art appreciation.

Tailypo!

Retold by Jan Wahl. Illustrated by Wil Clay. Holt. ISBN 0-8050-0687-7. CC '92.

A wonderful African-American folk-tale told by an old man to the author: Why never to chase with a hatchet a creature that has a long, long tail and is crawling through your wall!

Talking with Artists

Fourteen distinguished children's book illustrators talk about their early art experiences and answer questions frequently asked by students. Also of interest are photographs of the artists and samples of their artwork both as children and adults.

Tyrannosaurus

William Lindsay. Illustrated with photographs. Dorling Kindersley. ISBN 1-56458-124-1. CC '94.

This thorough reference book with dramatic photographs of realistic models from the American Museum of Natural History details the discovery and excavation, reconstruction, and location of the world's most ferocious dinosaur.

Voices of the Wild

Jonathan London. Illustrated by Wayne McLoughlin. Crown. ISBN 0-517-59217-7. CC '94.

This beautifully illustrated book details messages of nature as seen through the eyes of animals. Readers will be inspired by the animals' simple observations of the need for balance in nature.

Walt Disney's 101 Dalmatians: Illustrated Classic









This book not only explores the story of Christopher Columbus but also delves into the research process. It takes a historical look at information to try to determine fact.




