ABSTRACT

Over the 29-year period from 1966 to 1994, the number of faculty strikes recorded by the National Center for the Study of Collective Bargaining in Higher Education and the Professions totaled 163. They transpired in 96 two-year and 67 four-year institutions. The vast majority involved faculty members employed at public sector colleges and universities. The highest number of faculty strikes occurred in the 1970s; for the first 5 years of the 1990s, faculty strike activity has been the lowest recorded. The strikes took place in only 15 states, with Michigan, Illinois, New York, Pennsylvania, and New Jersey being the top 5 states for faculty work stoppages. Fifteen colleges and universities experienced more than two faculty strikes. Local unions affiliated with the American Federation of Teachers participated in almost one-half of all the strikes, with the American Association of University Professors involved in one-quarter and local unions affiliated with the National Education Association involved in almost 20 percent. A table lists the strikes in chronological order, giving the name of the college or university and its state, the collective bargaining agent involved, status as a two-year or four-year college, and strike duration. FACULTY STRIKES IN HIGHER EDUCATION: 1966-1994

The National Center has recorded 163 faculty strikes from 1966-1994, a 29-year span. The National Center first started to monitor faculty strikes in 1973 and has published the following information on strikes every year: the institutions and bargaining agents involved, the location and type of college or university (two or four year), the number of faculty affected, and the duration of the strike.

In the early 1980s, Dr. Joel Douglas, edited two newsletters (Vol. 10, No. 4, October 1982 and Vol. 11, No. 5, December 1983) which analyzed aggregate faculty strike information from 1966. Much of the original research on strike activity was done by Esther Liebert, then Baruch College Director of Personnel and now our Dean of Faculty and Staff Relations. We hope that this newsletter will successfully update the work which Joel and Esther started over a decade ago. Since it is extremely difficult to follow all the labor-management activities in higher education throughout the country, we may have neglected to record certain strikes, or we may have incorrectly recorded information. We urge our readers to inform us of any errors or omissions. Since the National Center is now the only source in the U. S. for this type of data, it is imperative that we publish the most correct material possible.

TABLE ONE lists all the strikes which the Center has recorded from 1966-1994. These 163 strikes transpired in 96 two-year and 67 four-year institutions. The vast majority of these strikes involved faculty members employed at public sector colleges and universities (125) which makes sense since faculty collective bargaining is overwhelmingly a phenomenon of public sector institutions (see the National Center's publication Directory 1994). We can document only 39 strikes in private colleges and universities over the past 29 years.

The decade of the 1970s witnessed the highest number of faculty strikes (78) and the highest average

number of strikes per year (7.8). Strike activity declined considerably during the next two decades. There were 54 strikes during the 1980s, with an average number of strikes per year of 5.4. For the first five years of the 1990s, the Center has recorded the lowest faculty strike activity since we began keeping this information, with only 13 strikes, for an average number of strikes per year of 2.6. In contrast, during the last four years of the 1960s (1966-1969), there were 18 strikes, for an average number of strikes per year of 4.5.

Five of the six years with the highest number of strikes occurred in the 1970s: 1977 (13), 1979 (12), 1978 (12), 1974 (10), and 1975 (12). The remaining year with the highest number of strikes was 1986, with 12 strikes. Three of the five years with the lowest number of strikes occurred during the 1990s: 1992 (0), 1991 (2), and 1993 (2). There were only two strikes in 1970 and 1 strike in 1989.

These 163 strikes took place in only fifteen states, with the states of Michigan (42), Illinois (31), New York (20), Pennsylvania (18), and New Jersey (13) ranking in the top five states for faculty work stoppages. These five states were the home-states for 124 faculty work stoppages, or 76 percent of the total number.

Fifteen colleges and universities experienced more than two faculty strikes. Three institutions, the City Colleges of Chicago (IL), Prairie State College (IL), and Wayne State University (MI) saw faculty members stop work seven times! Four strikes occurred at Henry Ford Community College (MI), Thornton Community College

ENDNOTES

1. All strike statistics have been taken from past issues of National Center newsletters and annual directories.
2. By agent, we mean the faculty bargaining representative at the time of the strike.
3. From 1966-1993, the National Center used calendar days to indicate the duration of faculty strikes. From 1984 to present, the Center counts only work days lost in calculating the duration of strikes.
4. The asterisk (*) before the name of a college or university indicates a private sector institution.
5. There was no bargaining agent at the time of the strike. We believe that many of the faculty members were affiliated with the AFT. The current agent is AAUP/Ind.
6. The agent at the time of the strike is unknown.
7. The National Center originally reported the duration of the strike as 15-16 days.
8. The National Center originally reported the duration of the strike as 20-25 days.

(IL), and the private sector University of Bridgeport (CT). Three strikes transpired at Charles Mott College (MI), Schoolcraft College (MI), Community College of Philadelphia (PA), the private sector Brooklyn Center of Long Island University (NY), the private sector C.W. Post Center of Long Island University (NY), Delaware County Community College (PA), and the private sector Hofstra University (NY). These colleges and universities account for 69 strikes, 42 percent of the total.

Local unions affiliated with the American Federation of Teachers (AFT) participated in almost one-half of all the strikes: 81 strikes, 49.6 percent of all strikes. Local unions affiliated with the American Association of University Professors (AAUP) set up picket lines in 41 strikes, 25 percent of the total number of strikes. Local unions affiliated with the National Education Association

(NEA) struck 32 times, 19.6 percent of the total number of strikes. Independent local unions, and unions whose affiliation we cannot account for struck 9 times, or 5.5 percent of the total number of strikes.

STRIKES BY NATIONAL UNIONS, 1966-1994




TABLE THREE
STATES WITH THE MOST STRIKES, 1966-1994




TABLE FOUR
