ABSTRACT

This Native American education resource guide lists tribal, state, federal, and community-based agencies and organizations active in the North Central region including Illinois, Indiana, Iowa, Michigan, Minnesota, Ohio, and Wisconsin. Addresses are included for: (1) national associations, organizations, clearinghouses, and centers; (2) Bureau of Indian Affairs education line and field offices; (3) Department of Education technical assistance centers and resource centers; (4) Department of Health and Human Services Head Start Bureaus and Bureau of the Census; (5) applicable periodicals and publications; (6) state government agencies, Indian centers, private agencies, and organizations in each state of the region; (7) colleges, universities, and related organizations; (8) federal Indian reservations by state; (9) non-federally-recognized tribes by state; (10) museums and libraries by state; and (11) Bureau of Indian Affairs, tribal, and community secondary and elementary schools by state. Besides education, the resources included also may be useful for concerns such as economic development, law, social welfare, contracting, and planning. (RAH)

Preface

The Native American Initiative (NEI) is a collaborative effort among the nation's regional educational laboratories (RELs), which are funded by the Office of Educational Research and Improvement, U.S. Department of Education. This initiative began in 1992 under the leadership of McREL (Mid-continent Regional Educational Laboratory). The foundation for the NEI consists of two nationally significant reports: (1) Indian Nations at Risk and (2) White House Conference on Indian Education: Final Report. The overall purpose of NEI is to follow through with the recommendations contained in these reports that pertain to education. More specifically, NEI strives to collaborate with Indian educators and organizations; gather and disseminate information on resources and promising programs for Native Americans; promote professional development of teachers and administrators on multicultural issues generally and Native education in particular; and institutionalize the involvement of Native Americans in the work of the RELs. This regional directory is a significant part of this overall effort.

The *Organizations and Resources for Educators of Native Americans in the North Central Region* is an outgrowth of the *Native Education Directory*. As is the case with all attempts to develop a comprehensive directory, this document is by no means complete. We believe, however, that the resources identified herein represent a significant, useful cross section of government (tribal, federal, and state) and community-based resource agencies and organizations.

Information contained in this directory was developed with the assistance of the Midwest Regional Center for Drug-Free Schools and Communities through personal networks of community-based and public institution contacts. Identifying key individuals in each state to corroborate information, as well as add new material, was crucial to making this directory as current as possible.

Users of this directory will find that many resources listed, particularly tribal governments, may be contacted for information on topics beyond education. Economic development, law, social welfare, contracting, and planning are but a small sample of additional offices found within tribal government structures. Likewise, Indian community-based organizations often have contracts or programs to address a variety of issues.

Public schools with ten or more Indian students are eligible for Title V, U.S. Department of Education, Office of Indian Education funding. These projects range from simple tutorial programs to teaching and student support programs. For lists of Title V public school projects in your state, you may contact the Office of Indian Education, Jon Wade, Acting Director, (202) 401-1887.

The other major source of Indian education funding is found within the U.S. Department of Interior, Bureau of Indian Affairs, Office of Indian Education Programs. The key contact is Dr. John Tippeconnic, Director, (202) 208-6123.

A call to any of these resources will likely result in identifying additional local resources to assist you. We hope this directory will help you establish appropriate contacts for further study or information regarding Indian education.
