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ABSTRACT

Information is provided in this directory about 256 schools working with the school-based-management process, "Onward to Excellence" (OTE), to improve student performance. This directory provides information about recently trained OTE schools and about those longer term OTE Schools not profiled in last year's directory. Each entry includes a school contact person, the OTE status of use, school level, number of students, area (for example, small city, large city, suburban, or rural), student population (composition, free/reduced lunch, mobility), school-improvement goals and their progress status, and practice clusters. Most schools (68 percent) have goals that focus on improving student academic achievement, and 32 percent report that progress has not yet been formally assessed. The schools are indexed by effective-schools research-practice clusters, practice clusters selected by schools, and goal and content areas selected by schools. (MLF)

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Introduction

Background

The *1994 School Improvement Network Directory* is part of a series designed to facilitate information exchange and support among schools and districts involved in long-term school improvement efforts. The *Directory* provides information about 256 schools working with the school-based management process, *Onward to Excellence* (OTE), to improve student performance.

This edition is the seventh in a series of *School Improvement Network Directories* published annually since 1988. During 1988-91, our approach to preparing each year's *Directory* involved sending questionnaires to *all* schools that had ever received training in the OTE process, requesting demographic and school improvement information from them. Each edition of the *Directory* included information about the schools that completed and returned questionnaires that year.

To avoid the inevitable redundancy produced by that method, in 1992 we changed our approach. Instead of contacting all OTE-trained schools annually, we sent questionnaires only to those schools that had not been profiled the year before. Thus, since 1992, each year's *Directory* supplements the information provided in the previous year's edition, without duplicating that information. Together, the two newest *Directory* editions provide a complete picture of all schools that both received OTE training and returned completed questionnaires. Continuing with this strategy, the *1994 Directory* provides information about recently trained OTE schools and about those longer-term OTE schools not profiled last year.

Organization

The questionnaires we send to OTE-trained schools request a variety of information that appears in a separate entry for each responding school. Each school entry is included in one of four sections, according to level, and alphabetically as noted in the Table of Contents.

Each entry includes a school contact person with full address and telephone number, followed by information about the status of use of *Onward to Excellence* in the school (when use of OTE was begun and whether or not the school is currently using the process). The next section

provides background information on the school, including level, number of students, and the nature of the area in which the school is located. Area is identified by population: large city (over 50,000), small city (25,000-50,000), town or suburban (2,500-25,000), rural (2,500 or fewer) and Department of Defense Dependent Schools (overseas schools associated with military bases).

Each entry then lists information on the student body composition by percentage in various categories and the school's mobility rate (the percentage of the student population in the school that moves in or out of the district each year). Finally, each entry identifies the school improvement goal(s), when the school began working on the goal(s), current status of progress toward the goal(s), and the practice clusters used in the school's prescription to meet the goal(s).

Examination of the schools included in this *Directory* provides the following information: All but 56 of the schools continue to use the *Onward to Excellence* process. Of the 256 schools, 140 (55%) are elementary schools, 31 (12%) are middle/junior high schools, 42 (16%) are high schools, and 43 (17%) serve multiple levels of students. Unless otherwise noted, elementary schools are those serving grade K or 1 to grade 5 or 6; middle/junior high schools serve grade 6 or 7 to grade 8 or 9; high schools serve grade 8 or 9 to grade 12; and multi-level schools serve other configurations, such as grades K-8, 7-12, K-12, etc.

This *Directory* includes information only on the *current* goal area(s) for each school. Most schools focus on a single schoolwide improvement goal, with four schools reporting two active goals and six schools each reporting three active goals. A total of 210 goals are reported by the 256 schools: 143 goals (68%) focus on improving student academic achievement, 24 goals (11%) focus on improving student attitude, and 40 goals (25%) focus on improving student behavior.

Reporting progress on those 210 goals, 23 schools (11%) met the long-term standard; 34 (16%) met the short-term target; 67 (32%) made some progress toward the target; 5 (2%) made little or no progress toward the goal; and 68 (32%) report that progress has not yet been formally assessed. Thirteen schools (6%) did not cite any of these options regarding progress.

The charts on the following page enumerate, by level and location, (1) the schools featured in the *Directory* and (2) *Directory* schools combined with those featured in last year's *Directory*.

To assist users of this *Directory*, three indices are provided:

- **Index I: Effective Schooling Research Practice Clusters:** The list of practice clusters from *Effective Schooling Practices: A Research Synthesis/1990 Update*. The numbers of relevant practice clusters are listed in each entry.
- **Index II: Practice Clusters Selected by Schools:** Schools which cite each practice cluster, listed by the identifying numbers they are assigned in this *Directory*.
- **Index III: Goal and Content Areas Selected by Schools:** An index of schools organized by goal content area ("reading," "math," "self-esteem," etc.) and by level.

Like other publications in this series, the *1994 Directory* can be expected to increase educators' awareness of and access to the large and growing network of schools using *Onward to Excellence*. Schools will be queried again next year and another update prepared to include additional information about the use of OTE in schools.

Elementary Schools

A total of 140 elementary schools returned questionnaires and are listed in this section. Unless otherwise noted, schools include those with students in grade K or 1 through grade 5 or 6. Not all schools provided all requested information. Of responding schools, 51 have more than 500 students, 71 have fewer than 500 students, and 5 have fewer than 100 students. In terms of location, 41 are in large cities (over 50,000 population), 16 are in small cities (25,000-50,000), 41 are in towns or suburban areas (2,500-25,000) and 36 are in rural areas (2,500 or fewer).

In selecting improvement goals, 86 schools cite goals related to student academic achievement, 19 cite student behavior goals, and 9 cite student attitude goals. Of those identifying goals, 17 met long-term standards in their OTE cycle, 24 met short-term targets, 32 made some progress toward the target, 3 made little or no progress, and 34 have not yet formally assessed their progress.

A total of 31 middle/junior high schools returned questionnaires and are listed in this section. Unless otherwise noted, schools include those with students in grade 6 or 7 through grade 8 or 9. Not all schools provided all requested information. All but 3 responding schools have fewer than 1,000 students: 2 have fewer than 100 students, 13 have 100-499 students and 9 have 500-1,000 students. A total of 42 high schools returned questionnaires and are listed in this section. Unless otherwise noted, schools include those with students in grade 8 or 9 through grade 12. Not all schools provided all requested information. All but 4 of the schools have more than 100 students: 18 have 100-499 students, 9 have 500-1,000 students, and 8 have more than 1,000 students. In terms of location, 4 are in large cities (over 50,000 population), 5 are in small cities (25,000-50,000), 15 are in towns or suburban areas (2,500-25,000) and 16 are in rural areas (2,500 or fewer).

In selecting improvement goals, 20 schools cite goals related to student academic achievement, 15 cite student behavior goals, and 3 cite student attitude goals. Multi-Level Schools

A total of 43 multi-level schools returned questionnaires and are listed in this section. Included are 15 schools with students in grades K to 8; 17 schools with grades 7 to 12; and 9 schools with grades K to 12. Not all schools provided all requested information. All but one of the responding schools have more than 100 students: 27 have 100-499 students, 6 have 500-1,000 students, and 3 have over 1,000 students. In terms of location, 1 is in a large city (over 50,000 population), 1 is in a small city (25,000-50,000), 4 are in towns or suburban areas (2,500-25,000) and 35 are in rural areas (2,500 or fewer).

In selecting improvement goals, 24 schools cite goals related to student academic achievement, 4 cite student behavior goals, and 6 cite student attitude goals. Of those identifying goals, 2 met long-term standards in their OTE cycle, 4 met short-term targets, 12 made some progress toward the target, 1 made little or no progress, and 12 have not yet formally assessed their progress.
