ABSTRACT

This list of free and reduced rate periodicals is compiled by the office of Information Collection Exchange (ICE) to provide Peace Corps volunteers access to information on periodicals which can be of use during their term of service. Detailed instructions are provided on ordering periodicals which are distributed by ICE to Peace Corps in-country resource centers (IRCs). The main body of the publication is a list of available periodicals, including the following information: title; address; subscription rate/shipping method; telecommunications information (telephone, fax, and telex numbers); contact person(s); and brief description of the periodical. Special indications are made for periodicals which are either offered at a special reduced rate for Peace Corps volunteers or distributed by ICE to Peace Corps offices in countries with related projects. This list of free and reduced rate periodicals is compiled by the office of Information Collection and Exchange (ICE) to provide Peace Corps Volunteers access to information on periodicals which can be of use to you during your term of service. Each year, ICE updates the data in this publication with information provided by the organizations listed. *All earlier versions of this pamphlet are now obsolete and may contain misleading information. Please discard them.*

If you are interested in receiving any of the publications on the list, please communicate directly with the organizations listed. Enclose a check or money order when necessary in U.S. dollars unless otherwise specified. Subscription rates are subject to change. Many of the periodicals listed represent generous offers from the publishers. Please respect their generosity by informing them of your expected date of termination of service, changes of address, etc. at the time of your order.

Note that an asterisk (*) next to a subscription price indicates that a reduced rate is being offered. The rates listed apply specifically to Peace Corps Volunteers. In some cases, ordering procedures may be different for host country nationals or others requesting subscriptions. Some publications listed are not available at a reduced rate, but are included because they can provide valuable technical information.

Subscriptions take time to process and publications sent by surface mail can take six weeks or longer to reach their destination. Expect a delay between the time you order and the time your first issue arrives.

ICE provides some periodicals directly to Peace Corps offices in-country. These are listed separately on page seven of this publication. Copies are sent to each In-Country Resource Center based on the current Peace Corps projects of the country. In some cases, multiple copies are provided. At least one copy is sent to each country with a project related to the subject of the magazine. Before ordering directly any of the periodicals listed, check in your Peace Corps resource center. The current issue could already be available there for your use.
