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ABSTRACT

Each year, Onondaga Community College (OCC) undertakes a follow-up survey of graduates to gather data on their experiences at OCC and identify demographic profiles in education and work-related trends. For the class of 1994, surveys were received from 568 of the 1,098 graduates receiving degrees or certificates, while findings were compared to results for the four previous classes. Study findings included the following: (1) 57.3% of the 1994 respondents were female, while 84.2% were White; (2) 75.2% of 1994 graduates were employed, with 48.7% employed full-time; (3) 54% felt that finishing their degree/certificate was important to getting their current job; (4) 58.9% indicated that their current occupation was highly related to their program of study and only 17.2% stated that it was not; (5) the number of graduates who worked while studying decreased from 40% in 1990 to 28.8% in 1994; (6) the mean annual salary increased from \$20,249 in 1993 to \$22,297 for 1994; (7) 43.48% of the 1994 respondents were attending a college, university, or training program; (8) 57.4% were continuing their education in a field of study highly related to their OCC degree program; and (9) 47% of the 1994 graduates continuing their education were attending a public four-year institution in New York, with 36.8% attending a private four-year institution. 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## INTRODUCTION

Each year the Office of Institutional Research and Planning undertakes a follow-up survey of our graduates in order to identify how experiences at OCC have contributed to their success. The focus of this year's report is different from previous follow-up reports in that it compares the Class of 1994 with the graduates of the four previous classes from 1993, 1992, 1991 and 1990. These comparisons seek to identify demographic profiles in education and work-related trends.

The findings for the Class of 1994 are based on a sample of 568 respondents from the total of 1,098 graduates receiving degrees or certificates. The initial mailing consisted of a cover letter, a survey, and a self-addressed, postage-paid return envelope. Approximately six weeks after the first mailing a second replacement survey was mailed to all non-respondents. One month later, telephone calls were made to the remaining non-respondents.

The survey is organized into two major sections. The first section provides employment status summaries with five-year comparisons. Included is a listing of employers and occupations, along with charts showing employment status and locations. In addition, for the Class of 1994, a listing of employers, job titles and mean salaries is provided for each curriculum. The second section provides transfer information with five-year summaries. Included is a listing of transfer institutions along with tables showing student status and type of transfer institutions. Additionally, for the Class of 1994, a listing of colleges and major fields of study are provided for each curriculum.


### *Demographic Profile: Five-Year Comparison*

Of the 1,098 students who graduated with the Class of 1994, 574 (52%) received degrees in Career Programs while 533 (48%) received degrees in Transfer Programs. A total of 431 (75.9%) returned a completed usable survey, while 137 (24.1%) responses were obtained from telephone calls. As shown in Table I, 45.5% of our 1994 graduates received an AAS Degree, 22.8% an AA Degree, and 25.8% an AS Degree. The Certificate degree represents the smallest percentage, but shows an increase from 3.4% in 1990 to 5.9% of the degrees conferred in 1994.

As shown in Table II, well over half (57.3%) of the graduating class of 1994 is female. This percentage is similar to the overall student enrollment at OCC.

Table III shows the patterns of diversity for graduates at OCC. For the Class of 1994, 84.2% are White, another 4.2% is African American, 6% are Hispanic, 1.5% are Native American, 1.3% are Asian/Pacific Islander and 1.3% are Non-Resident 'Alien'. Since 1990 the percentage of graduates not reporting their ethnicity has dropped to 6.9%.

***Educational Objectives/Continuing Plans***

In order to better understand how our graduates feel about their experiences at OCC, the questionnaire asked them to identify which educational goals were important to them and the overall effectiveness of OCC in helping them to achieve their goals.

Among other survey items, the graduates were asked to identify what best describes their most important reason for earning a college degree. As shown in Table IV, for the Class of 1994, 52.0% of the responding graduates selected "Increase chances for a Job"; 29.2% indicated "To Prepare me to Transfer"; and 18.8% selected "To reach other Goals such as selffulfillment". Eighty-five percent of the graduates who indicated this last category ("Other Goals") also indicated that their goal was met by their college education.

For those graduates not currently enrolled in transfer institutions, the survey inquired about their continuing education plans. As shown in Table V, 61.4% of 1994 graduates indicated that they plan to attend elsewhere in the near future. This is similar to previous years.


EMPLOYMENT INFORMATION<sup>1</sup>

This section provides five-year employment summaries from previous graduate surveys along with detailed results for the class of 1994. Three fourths (75.2%) of the 1994 graduates responded as being employed, similar to last year's figure of 73.3%. As shown in Table VI, almost half (48.7%) reported being employed full-time. One of the most significant differences for this year's graduating class is the increase in the percentage of the graduates employed part-time. The percentage employed part-time has increased to 26.5% from a low of 18.7% in 1990. The students who responded *Not Employed/Seeking*, *Not Employed/Not Seeking*, or *Other*, were mostly students who are continuing their education.

Over half (54.0%) of those employed felt that *finishing their degree/certificate* was important to getting their current job. Also, 52.1% of the respondents felt that their *specific program of study* was important to getting their current job. As shown in Table VII, this result is similar to previous years.



As show in Table VIII, there is an increase in graduates employed full-time, with a 58.9% indicating that their current occupation is highly related to their program of study at OCC up from 50.8% the previous year. Only 17.2% stated that their current job is not related to their program of study at OCC.

The number of graduates who work and study has been decreasing over the years, from 40.0% in 1990 to 29.8% for the Class of 1994. As shown in Table IX, only 29.8% of the respondents indicated that they work and study compared to 34.5% the previous year.

As an educational institution, Onondaga Community College continues to make important contributions in educating the labor force of the County. Over the years the percentage of graduates who report working in Onondaga County has increased. Table X shows that the percentage of graduates working full-time in Onondaga County is up from 71.5% in 1993 to 79.6% in 1994. In addition, the mean salary has increased over last year's class from a mean of \$20,249 in 1993 to \$22,297 for 1994, and the median rose from \$19,000 in 1993 to \$21,000 in 1994. Each graduating class of OCC collectively earns more than \$10 million in salaries from Onondaga County employers.



## TRANSFER INFORMATION<sup>2</sup>

This section provides five-year summaries concerning transfer information along with detailed results for the Class of 1994. Forty three percent (43.48%) of the graduates reported that they were attending a college, university, or training program, as shown in Table XI. Of those attending college, 80.6% are full-time students, a slight decrease from the previous year, with 19.4% attending part-time. Fifty seven percent (57.4%) are continuing their education in a field of study highly related to their OCC degree program, while another 31.7% indicated their field is only slightly related to their OCC degree.

The percentage of students attending New York State Public Institutions has increased from 44.5% in 1993 to 47.0% in 1994, as shown in Table XII. The percentage attending 4-year private colleges has decreased from 40.0% in 1993 to 36.8% in 1994. Six percent (6.1%) of the graduates indicated that they are attending 2-year public colleges, while 9.7% transfer out of New York State.




Table XIII presents the various reasons students chose their particular transfer institution. The five-year comparisons show similarities across the years. Most respondents indicated that a *Good Academic Reputation* and the *Availability of Programs* are very important. Less important are the *Access* (location) and *Ease of Transfer*. Least important are *Recruitment by Institution* and the *Social Environment*, though the importance of recruiting has been increasing.
