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ABSTRACT

Statistics related to education in Maryland are presented in this booklet of tables. The first chart presents some selected statistics about the educational community in the whole state. In 1993-94, the education budget was approximately \$4.66 billion, and the estimated cost per pupil was \$6,250. Public school enrollment in 1993 was 771,377 and private school enrollment was 151,481. Other tables present information about student characteristics, including the racial composition of the student body. Dropout and graduation rates are summarized, and information is given on such outcomes as standardized test results. The public school students of Maryland are served by 45,168 teachers. Information is presented about teacher educational background and characteristics. Other tables present information about educational finance in Maryland. The booklet provides information about specific educational areas, including special education and vocational education. Some data are summarized about services related to education, such as public libraries and food service programs. One table ranks Maryland among the states on a number of indicators. A list of additional resources is presented. In all, there are 2 figures, 34 tables, and a list of resources and services at the Maryland Department of Education. (SLD)

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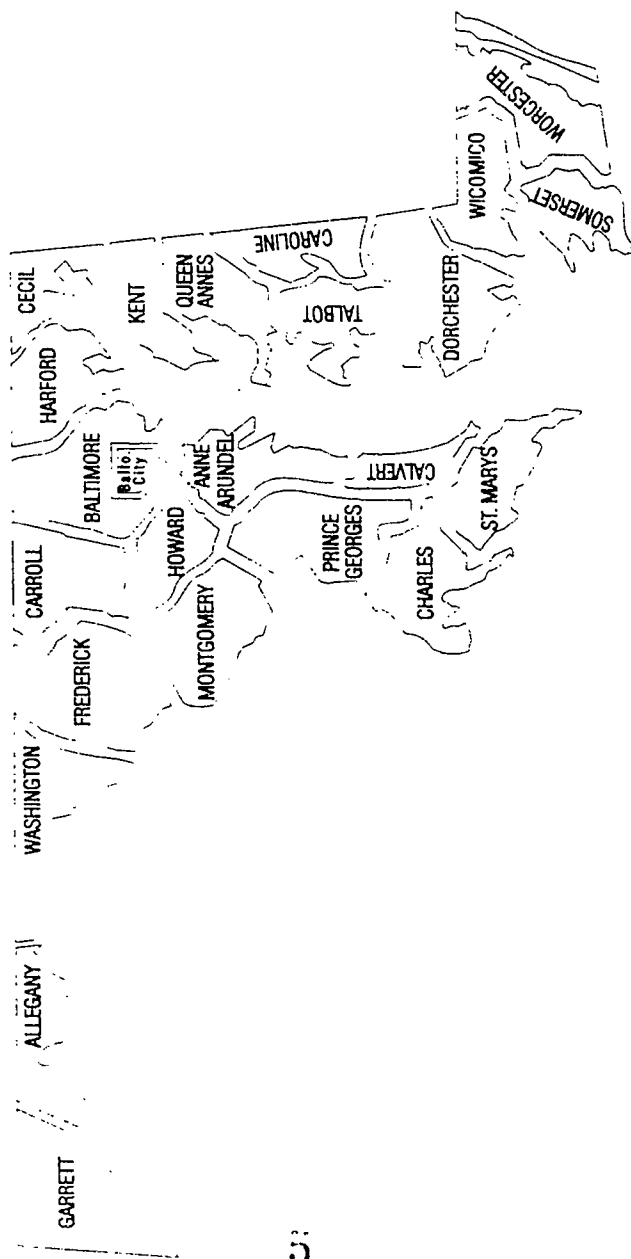

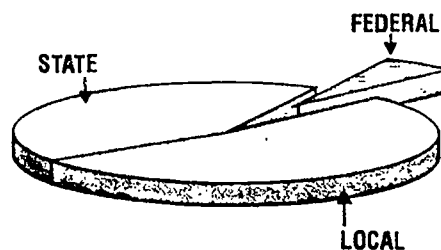

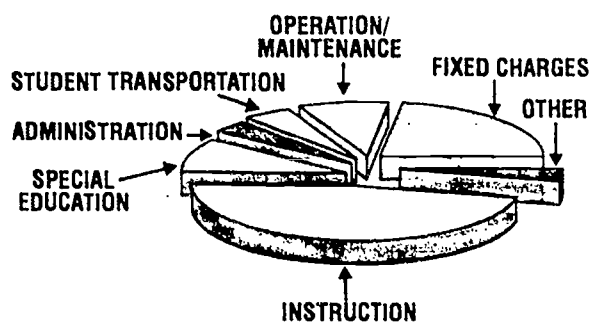

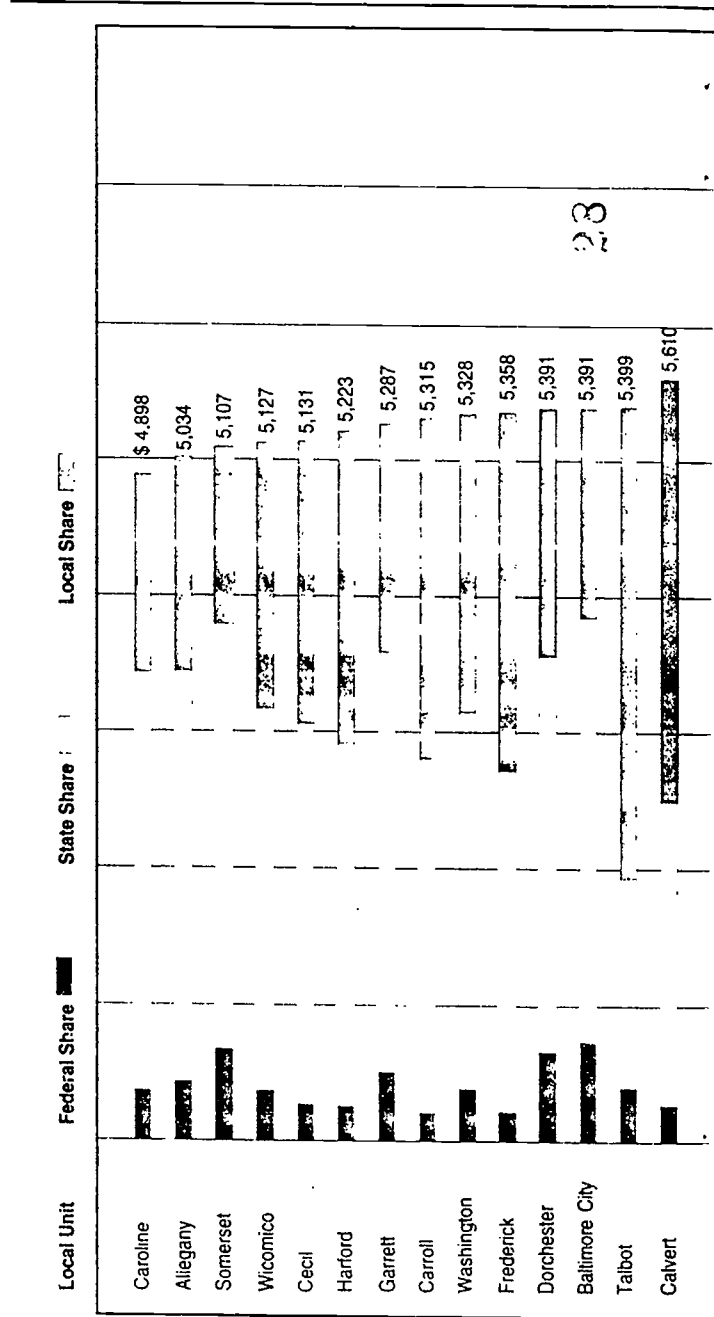

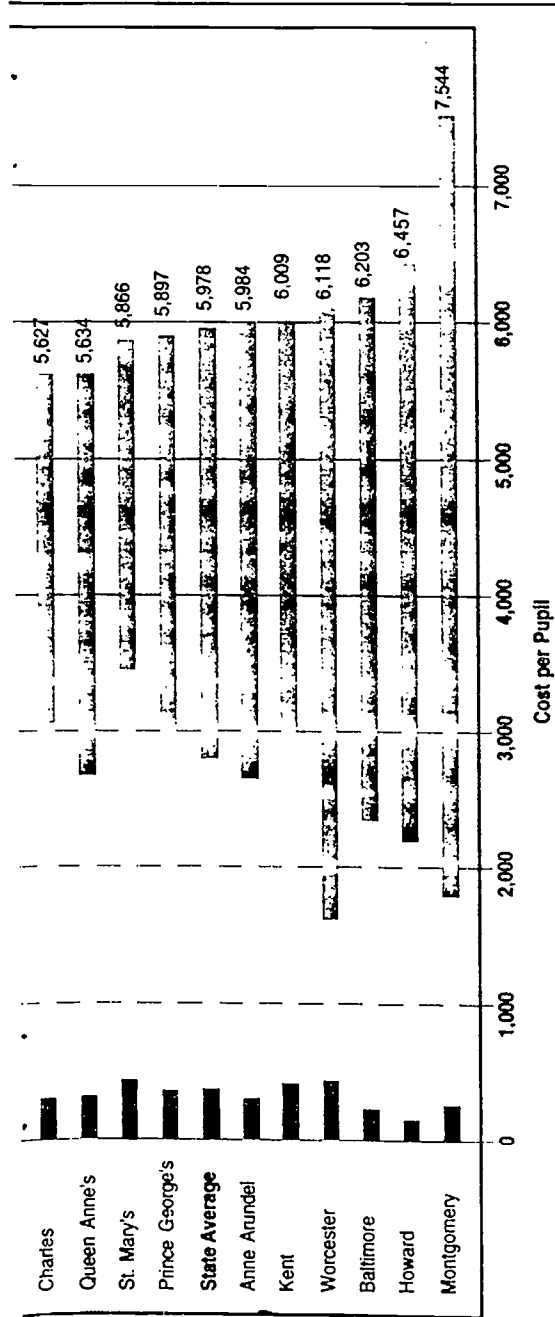

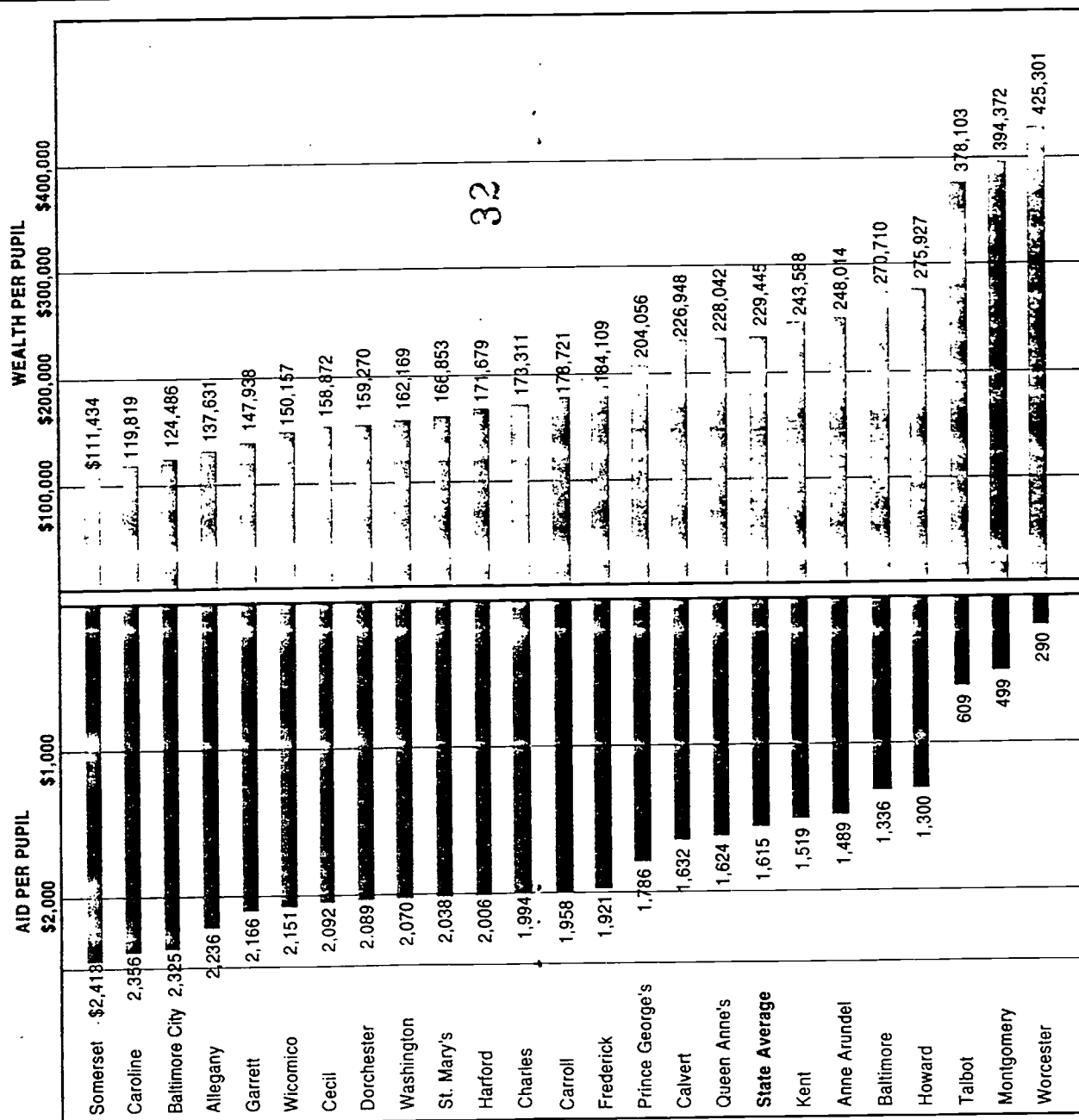

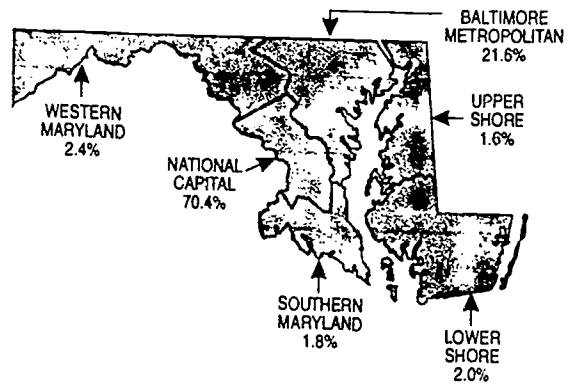

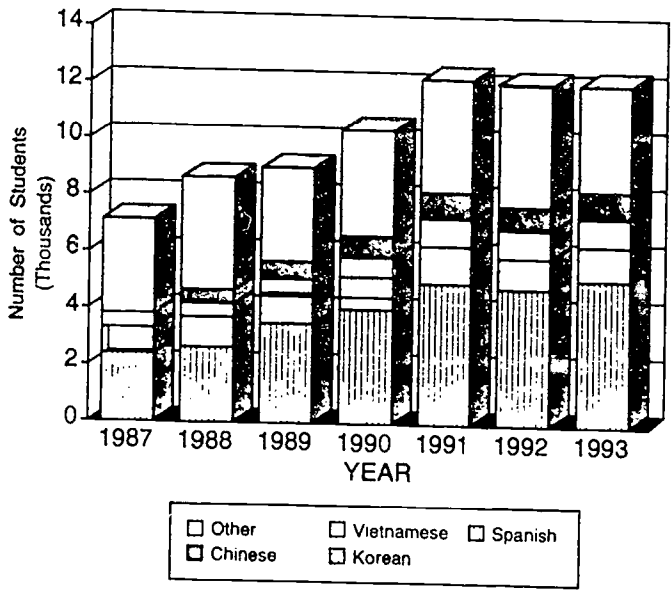

Did You Know . . .

- Sixty-eight percent or 3,127,684 Maryland residents are public library registered borrowers.
- Public librarians and associates in Maryland answered 5,426,755 reference questions in FY 93.
- Maryland citizens have access to over 32 million books through the state library network.
- Maryland citizens borrowed over 48 million books through their libraries in FY 92.
- 8,061 Maryland school bus drivers transported 522,053 public school students 97,985,313 miles without a single student fatality during the 1992-93 school year. Maryland's safety record is among the best in the country with only one fatality in 30 years involving children riding a bus.
- Maryland's school bus safety and maintenance program is one of the most comprehensive in the country.
- Public school bus drivers spent a total of 6,097,132 hours transporting 522,053 students to and from Maryland schools in the 1992-93 year.
- A school bus driver in Maryland will average more than 12,156 miles per year transporting students to and from school.
- A Maryland school bus will average 204,606 miles during its 12 year life.
- Each school day last year an average of 308,364 Maryland students ate a school lunch and an average of 48,525 students ate a school breakfast, thus improving their nutritional well being as well as their readiness to learn.
- During the 1992-93 school year 4,870 Maryland school food and nutrition service personnel received instruction in healthful food production methods.
- Last year 45,000 parents of children in Maryland family day care homes and child day care centers were given nutrition education materials.

Did You Know . . .

- Eight hundred and twenty-seven Maryland teachers received instruction on nutrition education strategies to use in teaching nutrition in the 1992-93 school year.
- More than 215,000 Maryland residents have been awarded high school diplomas through GED testing since 1941.
- Fifty-six percent of Maryland's 1992 GED examinees were under 25 years of age. Of this population, 82% passed the tests and earned a high school diploma.
- In the most recent norming study, only 66% of graduating high school seniors nationally were able to meet Maryland's minimum score requirements on the GED tests. Maryland is one of 16 states which require higher minimum passing scores on the GED tests than that required by the other 34 states.
- One out of every 20 GED recipients pursues a college education.
- Annually, GED diplomas account for about one out of every seven U.S. high school diplomas. In Maryland, the figures are one in every eight.
- More than 8,800 Maryland residents have been awarded diplomas through the Maryland Adult External Diploma program since 1978.
- The Correctional Education teachers and librarians, reduced to 80% employment in October 1991, were restored to 100% employment effective July 1993.
- The first capital project of the Correctional Education Program, the Occupational Skills Training Center, opened in 1993 with operations contracted to the Community College of Baltimore City.
- Over 2,000 individuals with disabilities found or maintained employment due to services provided by the Division of Rehabilitation Services in FY 93.
- The Maryland Rehabilitation Center provided vocational and medical evaluations, training, rehabilitations technology, therapy, job placement and other services to 2,355 individuals with disabilities in FY 93.
- The average weekly earnings of individuals at the time they apply for services from the Division of Rehabilitation Services is \$53. At the time of case closure, the average weekly earnings are \$219.
