The first two sections list general and religious sources of braille books and magazines, the third section lists sources for jumbo braille and print-braille, the fourth section lists major braille presses and transcription services, and the last section provides resources for further information. This circular was compiled from catalogs and other literature submitted by agencies and organizations in response to a survey conducted by the Reference Section.
