ABSTRACT

Composed primarily of tables and graphs, this report provides data on trends in student enrollment from 1986 to 1996 in the University and Community College System of Nevada (UCCSN). Following a brief overview, tables are provided on headcount enrollments; full-time equivalent (FTE) enrollments; student full- and part-time status by campus; student gender and ethnicity by year; student age by campus; and changes from fall 1995 to fall 1996 in FTE and headcount enrollment. Highlighted findings include the following: (1) in fall 1996, the UCCSN enrolled 74,655 state-supported students--an increase of 9.4% from fall 1995 and 58.3% from fall 1986; (2) system community colleges served 42,693 state-supported students in fall 1996, while universities served 31,962; (3) in fall 1996, the number of FTE students was 40,016 systemwide, an increase of 8.3% from fall 1995 and 75.7% from fall 1986; (4) 69% of UCCSN students in fall 1996 attended part-time, including 45% of the university and 86% of the community college students; (5) 56% of all students in fall 1996 were female, the same proportion as in 1995; and (6) 70.3% of all UCCSN students in fall 1996 were white, 21% were minority students, 2.8% were nonresident alien, and 5.9% were of unknown status. FALL 1996 ENROLLMENT

HIGHLIGHTS

- ◆ The UCCSN is currently serving 74,655 state-supported students. This is an increase of 6,425 students or 9.4% from the fall of 1995 and an increase of 58.3% from the fall of 1986.
 - The UCCSN community colleges currently serve 42,693 state-supported students, an increase of 6,279 students, or 17.2% more than the number enrolled in fall 1995 and an increase of 72.0% from the fall of 1986.
 - The universities currently serve 31,962 state-supported students, an increase of 146 students or 0.5% more than the number enrolled in fall 1995 and an increase of 43.1% over the fall of 1986.
 - All campuses serve substantial numbers of additional students enrolled in non-state supported courses including continuing education, community service, and contract education courses.
- ◆ The UCCSN currently enrolls 40,016 full-time equivalent (FTE) students. This represents an increase of 3,079 FTE students, or 8.3% from fall 1995 and an increase of 75.7% from the fall of 1986.
 - The community colleges currently enroll 16,972 FTE students, an increase of 2,362 students, or 16.2% from the fall 1995 semester and an increase of 116.2% from the fall of 1986.
 - The universities currently enroll 23,044 FTE students, an increase of 717 FTE students, or 3.2% from the fall 1995 semester and an increase of 54.3% from the fall of 1986.

- ◆ 69% of UCCSN students are part-time students.
 - 45% of university students are part-time students, 3% fewer than in 1995.
 - 86% of community college students are part-time students, 1% fewer than in 1995.
- ◆ 56% of all students in fall 1996 are female, the same proportion as in 1995.
- ◆ 70.3% of all UCCSN students in fall 1996 are white, 21.0% are minority students, 2.8% are nonresident alien, and 5.9% of students did not designate a racial/ethnic category.
- ◆ Student age data are collected every other year. The following UCCSN age data were reported for fall 1995:
 - Systemwide, 27.1% of students are between 18 and 21 years of age.
 - 33.5% of students are 22 to 29 years of age.
 - 19.5% of students are 30 to 39 years of age.
 - 11.8% of students are between 40 to 49 years of age, 6.5% are over 50 years of age, and 1.5% are under 18 years of age.



Fall 1986 - 1996**






Percent Change in FTE Enrollment Fall 1986 - 1996



Fall 1996






