ABSTRACT

This report provides a summary of enrollment projections for the University of Hawaii (UH) system, which includes three university and seven community college campuses. The projections are statistical extrapolations of current trends in enrollment by campus, based on unduplicated headcounts of full-time and part-time students enrolled in regular session day or extended-daycredit courses. Included are students in programs leading to a bachelor's degree or higher, students in programs leading to associate degrees or certificates, and unclassified students. Historical data are included in the tables and charts to facilitate comparison and analysis. They were compiled from the Student Enrollment Reports, the Academic Crossover Studies and the Course Registration Reports. Findings show that the enrollment of regular students for the University of Hawaii measured 45,251 in Fall 1997, a 3.9% decline from Fall 1996 and the third consecutive year of decrease. For Fall 1998, UH system enrollment is forecast to decline slightly, to just over 45,000. This projection is somewhat lower than that made last year and takes into account the recent enrollment decline across the UH system. Recommendations are made in response to findings that the UH system will experience little or no overall growth in enrollments. (JLJ)

**ENROLLMENT PROJECTIONS
THE UNIVERSITY OF HAWAII
FALL 1998 TO FALL 2004**

This report provides a summary of enrollment projections for the University of Hawai'i system: the University of Hawai'i at Mānoa, the University of Hawai'i at Hilo, the University of Hawai'i-West O'ahu, and the University of Hawai'i Community Colleges (Hawai'i, Honolulu, Kapi'olani, Kaua'i, Leeward, Maui, and Windward). Detailed data on the individual campuses may be found in the separate enrollment projections reports by unit, published annually by the Institutional Research Office as a part of the Management and Planning Support (MAPS) series.

The projections are statistical extrapolations of current trends in enrollment by campus. In general, they reflect neither planned changes in campus policies or procedures nor external socio-economic trends. In addition, these projections do not set enrollment targets or goals. They should be considered only as a first step in the planning and budgeting process, and as a signal to administrators and other interested individuals of what might occur given recent enrollment trends.

The enrollment projections are based upon unduplicated headcounts of full-time and part-time students enrolled in regular session day or extended-day credit courses. Included are students in programs leading to a bachelor's degree or higher, students in programs leading to associate degrees or certificates, and unclassified students. Excluded from the enrollment count are students taking courses in continuing education, senior citizen or community service center programs, or enrolled in apprenticeship or journeyworker programs. Special students (auditors, concurrent students and early admits) are also excluded.

Historical data are included in the tables and charts to facilitate comparison and analysis. They were compiled from the Student Enrollment Reports, the Academic Crossover Studies and the Course Registration Reports.

METHODOLOGY AND ASSUMPTIONS

The projections for undergraduates (freshmen through seniors) are broken down by registration status: first-time, transfer and continuing / returning students. Within each registration status category, enrollments are projected by educational level (freshmen through seniors) for UH-Mānoa, UH-Hilo, and UH-West O'ahu. For the UH Community Colleges, enrollments for each registration status category are projected by program area. Unclassified and graduate student enrollments are projected separately. The projections make use of continuation rates as well as various other ratios. The specific methods used may vary among units and from year to year. Detailed descriptions of the methods used and assumptions made in projecting enrollments by campus are found in the separate enrollment projections report published by unit (UH Mānoa, UH Hilo, UH-West O'ahu and the UH Community Colleges).

Projected enrollments for each campus and for the UH system total are summarized in Table 1 (see also Figure 1). Annual percentage changes in enrollment are shown in Table 2. Table 3 provides an enrollment index, useful for comparing across campuses, using Fall 1997 as the base year (Fall 1997=100). Enrollment indexes are illustrated for the UH system in Figure 2 and for each campus in Figures 4 to 14. Tables 4 and 5 project student semester hours (SSH) offered and full-time equivalent (FTE) course enrollments, respectively. Projected headcount enrollments by attendance status (full-time / part-time) are given in Table 6.

HIGHLIGHTS

Enrollment of regular students for the University of Hawai'i measured 45,251 in Fall 1997, a 3.9% decline from Fall 1996 and the third consecutive year of decrease (see Table 1 and Figure 1). ***For Fall 1998, UH system enrollment is forecast to decline slightly, to just over 45,000.*** These projections are somewhat lower than those made last year and take into account the recent enrollment declines across the UH system.

Historical headcount enrollment for the UH system from 1907 through 1997, along with projected enrollment through 2004, is illustrated in Figure 3. Enrollment grew slowly but steadily from the founding of the UH Mānoa campus in 1907 through 1960, when total UH system enrollment measured 7,771. Through the 1960s and into the early 1970s, enrollment boomed, increasing by more than twenty-fold from 1960 to 1975. From 1975 to 1989, enrollment held steady at around 43,000 students. From 1989 to 1994 enrollment grew by over 18%, reaching an historical peak of 51,380 in Fall 1994. Since then, total UH system headcount enrollment has declined 11.9% and in Fall 1997 stood at its lowest level this decade.

Enrollment at the **University of Hawai'i at Mānoa** measured 17,353 in Fall 1997, a 4.8% decrease from Fall 1996 and the fourth consecutive decline in fall enrollment. Enrollment is projected to decrease slightly in Fall 1998 to about 17,285 students.

Enrollment at the **University of Hawai'i at Hilo** measured 2,587 in Fall 1997, a 5.0% decline from Fall 1996 and the fourth consecutive decline in fall enrollment. Enrollment is expected to decrease slightly in Fall 1998 to about 2,576 students.

Enrollment at the **University of Hawai'i-West O'ahu** measured 648 in Fall 1997, a count identical to that registered in Fall 1996. Enrollment is projected to remain at or near this level again in Fall 1998.

Enrollment for the **University of Hawai'i Community Colleges** totaled 24,663 in Fall 1997, a 3.2% decline for the UHCC system from Fall 1996. Enrollment in Fall 1998 is expected to decline slightly, to near the 24,500 level. (See the enrollment projections report for the UH Community Colleges for more information about individual campuses.)

SUMMARY

In summary, enrollment in the University of Hawai'i system seems to be in a protracted phase of little or no overall growth. Enrollment in 1997 was only 4.0% higher than in 1975. The brief surge in enrollment experienced from 1980 to 1982 was followed by a return below the 43,000 level by 1986 (see Figure 3). Similarly, the brief increase in enrollment measured from 1990 to 1994 seems to be on its way back down. The reasons for these surges are not clear and merit further study.

The Hawai'i Department of Education has published forecasts of high school enrollment that indicate increased numbers of high schools seniors over the next decade. This conclusion is supported by estimates in the number of high school graduates for the State of Hawai'i forecast by the Western Interstate Commission for Higher Education (WICHE). If these increases materialize, the University of Hawai'i campuses could begin to experience a renewed upward trend in first-time student enrollment during the first decade of the next century. In subsequent years, increases in first-time students should boost enrollment levels across the UH system.

In any case, there should be no return in the foreseeable future to the kind of high growth in enrollment experienced in the 1960s and early 1970s. Higher education in the State of Hawai'i may be in a "mature" phase, where the relatively easy growth that came with the post-war population increase and economic prosperity has been achieved. Further growth or even maintaining current enrollment levels will depend upon careful management of the end product, tailoring the campuses and their course offerings to meet the needs of their local communities. A more competitive environment for higher education will require the University to respond to the marketing initiatives of other higher education institutions in the State, including those that take advantage of new technology. The prolonged economic stagnation in the State economy also requires the University to control costs, so that citizens who need higher education services can afford them. Finally, efforts to stimulate demand for services through strategic promotion and recruitment should be implemented.

Actual & Projected Headcount Enrollment




UH System Historical Headcount Enrollment




Enrollment index - UH Hilo




Enrollment Index - UH Community Colleges




Enrollment index - Honolulu CC




Enrollment index - Kaua'i




Enrollment index - Maui CC



Enrollment Index - Windward CC


