ABSTRACT

Highlights of this data on student financial aid in the University of Wisconsin (UW) system for 1997-98 include the following: 84 percent of student financial aid comes from federal sources; 56 percent of undergraduate students receive aid (up 2 percent from the previous year); 35 percent of graduate students receive aid (up 2 percent); 60 percent of resident undergraduates have debt at graduation (up 2 percent); and average loan debt of a Wisconsin resident receiving a bachelor's degree is \$14,201, up \$869 from the previous year. The 10 tables provide data showing trends from the early to mid 1980s on: (1) financial aid provided to UW students, 1982-83 to 1997-98; (2) financial aid by source of funding; (3) distribution of loans; (4) UW system distribution of grants; (5) Wisconsin Higher Education Grant awards to UW system students; (6) UW system distribution of federal work-study; (7) UW system financial aid recipients by dependency and level; (8) UW system financial aid recipients by ethnicity, 1997-98 only; (9) cumulative student loan debt for UW resident undergraduates; and (10) cumulative student loan debt for undergraduates by institution. Appendices provide additional tables showing financial aid dollars by institution and financial aid recipients by institution and residency. (DB)

OVERVIEW OF STUDENT FINANCIAL AID TRENDS

Overall, 79,745 UW System students, 53 percent of total enrollment, received \$440.8 million in financial aid in 1997-98 (Table 1). The number of financial aid recipients increased by 4,079 and 35.9 million dollars over 1996-97. More than one-half of the undergraduate students (56%) received some financial aid (including non-need based aid) in 1997-98.

SOURCES OF AID FOR UW SYSTEM STUDENTS

Over five of every six financial aid dollars (84%) to UW students were provided or underwritten through a federal program (Table 2). Aid from state sources represented less than one-tenth (8%) of all aid, a percentage that has remained stable for the past three years. Institutional aid accounted for five percent of the aid received by UW students. Institutional aid is made up primarily of scholarships funded through sources such as private donations to UW institutions.

LOANS

Loan aid continues to make up the largest component of financial aid to UW students. Loan dollars make up 70% of total financial aid dollars and 80% of financial aid recipients received some kind of loan. Forty-two percent of enrolled UW System students received a loan in 1997-98 (Table 3).

GRANTS


Grant aid made up 27% of financial aid dollars and 57% of financial aid recipients received a grant of some kind in 1997-98. The proportion of grant dollars to total aid has remained steady over the past three years as has the percentage of financial aid recipients who receive grants (Table 4). However, the proportion of grant dollars to total aid is well below that of the late 1980s and early 1990s.

In 1997-98, federal grants comprised the majority of grants (46%) received by UW System students followed by state grants at 27% (Figure 1). Grants in the "other" category are provided by other states to non-resident students.

The largest need based state grant program available to Wisconsin residents attending a UW institution is the Wisconsin Higher Education Grant (WHEG). Slightly less than one out of every five resident undergraduate students (18%) received a WHEG award in 1997-98, a proportion that has been relatively constant over the past decade (Table 5). Other state grant programs are described in Appendix A.

FEDERAL WORK STUDY

In 1997-98, \$11.7 million dollars were provided through the Federal Work Study (FWS) program, a work program that includes both federal and state contributions. In 1997-98, 9,444 students participated in this program which accounted for 3% of all financial aid dollars (Table 6).

CHARACTERISTICS OF FINANCIAL AID RECIPIENTS

Thirty percent of all aid recipients, 24% of undergraduate students and 88% of graduate students, were independent students and therefore received no parental contribution towards educational costs (Table 7). A higher percentage of non-resident undergraduate students are dependent (77%) compared to resident undergraduate students (69%).

Seventy-four percent of all enrolled UW System multicultural students received some form of financial aid in 1997-98 (Table 8). Eighty-six percent of these students had demonstrated financial need as defined by the Federal Needs Analysis Methodology.

STUDENT INDEBTEDNESS

UW resident undergraduate students who received loans (both need and non need-based) during their academic careers, had an average debt of \$14,201 at graduation in 1997-98. This represents a 6.5% increase from 1996-97. The proportion of resident undergraduate debt coming from non-need based loan programs continues to increase and has increased from 8% to 30% since 1990-91 (Table 9). Sixty percent of resident undergraduate students who graduated in 1997-98 had loan debt at graduation compared to 50% of graduates five years ago.

TECHNICAL NOTES

This Informational Memorandum presents annual data on the amount of financial assistance provided to UW System students. Figures are based on student financial aid data provided to UW System Administration by the UW institutions via the Financial Aid Central Data Request. The total number of aid recipient figures represent the total number of students (undergraduate, graduate, residents, non-residents) receiving any type of financial aid (with exceptions noted below). Students often received more than one type of aid so the cumulative total for students aided through grant, work, and loan programs will not equal the grand total. Other important caveats include:

- Details in the text and tables may not add due to rounding.
- The data reported in this Informational Memorandum do not include graduate assistantships/fellowships and tuition remission grants.
- Work study includes only dollars provided through the Federal Work Study program and ROTC. It does not capture other on and off-campus employment.
- Loan data do not include private non-federally-guaranteed borrowing activity.
- Residency for fee-purposes is determined by the Registrar at each institution. Non-residents are defined as all students with residency other than "resident" including Minnesota and Michigan reciprocity agreement students. Students with missing residency information have been included with Wisconsin residents.
- Graduate enrollment includes enrollment in professional programs.
- Financial need is defined by Federal Needs Analysis methodology.
