ABSTRACT

The 21st Annual Tuition and Fees Report details each institution's tuition and fee charges for the school year 1999-2000. Data in the report were gathered from the Tuition and Student Fee Questionnaire. For the 1999-2000 school year, a total of 124 accredited U.S. medical schools reported tuition and fee data. Resident and non-resident tuition and fees are listed for both public and private schools. For the majority of the private medical schools, resident and non-resident tuition rates are the same. Table 1 compares tuition and fee ranges, medians, and averages for all U.S. medical schools within the prior year. Table 2 provides an alphabetical listing of public medical schools and their charges for tuition and fees. Table 3 provides an alphabetical listing of private medical schools and their charges for tuition and fees. (HB)

Tuition and Student Fees, First-Year Medical School Students, 1999-2000

The 21st *Annual Student Tuition and Fees Report* details each institution's tuition and fee charges for 1999-2000. The data in this report were obtained from the Tuition and Student Fees Questionnaire. For the 1999-2000 year, 124 accredited U.S. medical schools reported tuition and fee data. One medical school, Uniformed Services University of the Health Sciences, does not charge tuition or student fees.

Resident and non-resident tuition and fees are listed for both public and private schools. For the majority of the private medical schools, resident and non-resident tuition rates are the same.

Table 1 compares current tuition and fee ranges, medians, and averages for all U.S. medical schools with the prior year. For public medical schools, average tuition and fees increased by 4.7 percent for residents and by 4.3 percent for non-residents from 1998-99 to 1999-2000. Average tuition and fees for private schools increased by 4.0 percent for residents and by 4.3 percent for non-residents during the same period.

Table 2 provides an alphabetical listing of public medical schools and their charges for tuition and fees. Table 2A ranks public schools by the tuition and fees charged to state residents; Table 2B ranks public schools by the tuition and fees charged to non-residents.

Table 3 provides an alphabetical listing of private medical schools and their charges for tuition and fees. Table 3A ranks private schools by the tuition and fees charged to state residents; Table 3B ranks private schools by the tuition and fees charged to non-residents.
