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ABSTRACT


This report contains student data obtained from the 1999-2000 Transfer Program Graduate Follow-Up Survey at Parkland College (Illinois). The alumni were surveyed during the summer following graduation. Results include: (1) about 89% of the students studied attended Parkland with an intent to transfer to a four-year university or college; (2) approximately 82% indicated that they would enroll in a field the following semester; (3) satisfaction rates for all seven major program areas were high: graduates were somewhat or very satisfied with course content (95%); equipment, facilities, materials (94%); preparation for further education (94%); group and individual projects (80%); and information on current employment (60%); (4) eighty-four percent of the respondents reported that they have utilized college transfer planning service and, among these users, 78.6% were somewhat or very satisfied with the service; (5) approximately 49% reported that they had sought college-tutoring service--among them, 82% were somewhat or very satisfied with the academic service; (6) more graduates reported that they transferred to the University of Illinois Urbana-Champaign (17%) and to Illinois State University (15%) than to the other 18 in-state and 15 out-of-state reported institutions; and (7) about 68% agreed or strongly agreed that their experience at Parkland improved their abilities to write and speak, while 50% indicated improvement in reading. 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EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

I. Out of 378 graduates contacted in the 1999-2000 **Transfer Program Graduate Follow-Up Survey**, 261 returned surveys (response rate of 69.0%).

II. PROFILE OF OUR BACCALAUREATE/TRANSFER GRADUATES:

- * There were more female (56.1%) than male (43.9%) graduates.
- * Approximately 8 out of 10 graduates of the baccalaureate/transfer programs are White:

White, non-Hispanic.	82.8%
Black, non-Hispanic.	7.9%
International students.	4.2%
Asian/Pacific Islander.	4.0%
Hispanic	0.8%
American Indian/Alaskan Native	0.3%
- 48.9% of the graduates were in AA degree programs, 38.4% in AS programs, 7.1% in AGS programs, 4.0% in AES programs, and 1.6% in AFA programs.
- * Graduates ranged in age from 19 to 57 and **most (75.4%) were under 25 years old.**

III. OUTCOMES

- * 88.5% attended Parkland with an intent **to transfer** to a 4 year university/college.
- * 81.5% indicated that they **will enroll** in a field the **following semester.**
- * **Satisfaction rates for all 7 major program areas were high:** between 60.3% and 95.3% feel very or somewhat satisfied in:

- * More graduates reported they transferred to the **University of Illinois Urbana-Champaign** (17.2%) and to **Illinois State University** (14.8%) than to the other 18 in-state and 15 out-of-state reported institutions.
- * **68.4% agreed or strongly agreed that their experience at Parkland improved their abilities to write and speak,** while 67.4% indicated improvement in solving problems, 63.0% in doing math, and 49.6% in reading.

Introduction

The Parkland College Transfer Program Graduate Follow-Up Survey was administered to the Class of 1999-2000 by Career Planning and Employment Services (CPES) and the Office of Institutional Research and Evaluation (OIRE).

Methodology

CPES and a faculty advisory committee developed the survey instrument from the Student Occupational Follow-Up Survey questionnaire. In this study, graduates were asked questions that were pertinent only to the baccalaureate/transfer programs.

OIRE was responsible for mailing and CPES for following up of surveys. The combined efforts generated a high response rate of 69.0%. Three hundred seventy eight (378) graduates of baccalaureate/transfer programs were initially contacted approximately six weeks after graduation. Non respondents were mailed a second survey three weeks later. The remaining non respondents were contacted by telephone calls starting three weeks following the second mailing.

OIRE was responsible for data entry, analysis and reporting.

Results and Conclusions

Data are presented in the following tables on students' objective in attending college; planned objective for the next semester; satisfaction ratings on major and outside major program of study, student services, academic and college services; perceptions of Parkland's contribution to graduate improvement; and the name of the institution to which they plan to transfer.

Data by Gender, Ethnicity and Age Group are compiled in Tables 2-9.

A new question was added to the 1999-2000 survey. Tables 21-22 reflect perceptions of Parkland's contribution to graduates' improvement in reading, writing, speaking, doing math, and solving problems.
