ABSTRACT

The information provided in this publication was reported by state education agencies to the National Center for Education Statistics for the Common Core of Data. It relates to student membership and staff in public schools and school districts in the United States and outlying areas during the 1999-2000 school year, graduate and dropout counts for the 1998-1999 school year, and to revenues and expenditures for fiscal year (FY) 1998. The 100 largest public school districts, representing less than 1% (0.6%) of all school districts in the United States, were responsible for the education of 23.0% of all public school students. These 100 largest districts employed 21.2% of U.S. public school teachers and accounted for 16.5% of all public schools and 19.1% of public high school completers. The 100 largest school districts had larger school sizes than the average school district and higher mean pupil/teacher ratios. Three states, Florida, Texas, and California, accounted for almost 40% of the 100 largest school districts. The proportion of minority students in the 100 largest school districts was 68.0%, compared to 39.6% in all school districts, and 53.6% of students in the 100 largest school districts were eligible for free and reduced-price lunch, compared to 38.9% of all students in the reporting states. In FY 1998, current expenditures per pupil in the 100 largest school districts ranged from a low of \$3,210 in the Puerto Rico Department of Education to a high of \$10,293 in the Boston School District, Massachusetts. While the number of students, teachers, and schools has increased between 1989-1990 and 1999-2000, the proportion of the national totals that the 100 largest school districts comprised of all these dimensions was essentially unchanged. 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Highlights

The information provided in this publication was reported by state education agency officials to the National Center for Education Statistics (NCES) for the Common Core of Data (CCD). It relates to student membership and staff in public schools and school districts in the United States and outlying areas during the 1999–2000 school year, graduate and dropout counts for the 1998–99 school year, and to revenues and expenditures for fiscal year (FY) 1998.

- The 100 largest public school districts, representing less than 1 percent (0.6 percent) of all school districts in the nation, were responsible for the education of 23.0 percent of all public school students (table A).
- The 100 largest districts employed 21.2 percent of the nation's public school teachers, accounted for 16.5 percent of all public schools and 19.1 percent of public high school completers (table A).
- The 100 largest school districts had larger school sizes than the average school district (704 students compared to 507). In addition to larger school sizes, the 100 largest school districts also had a higher mean pupil/teacher ratio, 17.5 to 1 compared to 16.1 to 1 for the average school district (table A).
- Three states, Florida, Texas, and California, accounted for almost 40 percent of the 100 largest school districts (appendix D).
- The proportion of minority students in the 100 largest school districts was 68.0 percent, compared to 39.6 percent in all school districts (table C).
- Among schools that reported free and reduced-price lunch eligibility, 53.6 percent of the students in the 100 largest school districts were eligible for free and reduced-price lunch, compared to 38.9 percent of all students in reporting states (table C).
- In FY 1998 (the 1997–98 school year), current expenditures per pupil in the 100 largest school districts ranged from a low of \$3,210 in the Puerto Rico Department of Education to a high of \$10,293 in the Boston School District, Massachusetts (table 10).
- While the number of students, teachers, and schools has increased between 1989–90 and 1999–2000, the proportion of the national totals that the 100 largest school districts comprised of all these dimensions was essentially unchanged (table D).

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Discussion

Introduction

This publication provides basic descriptive information about the 100 largest school districts (ranked by student membership) in the United States, Bureau of Indian Affairs, Department of Defense schools, and outlying areas (American Samoa, Guam, the Northern Marianas, Puerto Rico, and the Virgin Islands). For the sake of simplicity, when discussing characteristics, the term "nation" (or "United States") is used to refer to all 50 states, the District of Columbia, Bureau of Indian Affairs, Department of Defense schools, and outlying areas. This is different from most NCES reports, which only include the 50 states and the District of Columbia in U.S. totals.

Almost one in every four public school students in this nation is served by one of these 100 districts (table A). They are distinguished from smaller districts by characteristics in addition to sheer size, such as average and median school size, pupil/teacher ratios, number of high school graduates, number of pupils receiving special education services, and minority enrollment as a proportion of total enrollment.

Information about the characteristics cited above is found in 16 "basic tables". For the purpose of establishing a meaningful context for the information on the 100 largest districts, four text tables provide national and 100 largest school district data and precede the basic tables. Following the basic tables, appendix A lists the 500 largest school districts with some identifying information and basic statistical data. Appendix B is an alphabetical list of the 500 districts and their rank by size. Appendix C provides data for the 1989–90 school year. Appendix D provides a count of the number of largest districts represented by state. In all basic tables and appendices, with the exception of appendices B and D, districts are presented by decreasing order of size.

Overview of the 100 Largest Districts

In the 1999–2000 school year, there were 16,850 public school districts, 94,090 schools, and 47.7 million students in public education in the United States. There were just under 3.0 million full-time-equivalent teachers in the 1999–2000 school year and more than 2.5 million high school completers in the 1998–99 school year. The 100 largest school districts make up less than 1 percent of all public school districts but serve 23 percent of the total number of public elementary and secondary school students (table A). The 100 largest school districts represent 17 percent of

schools and employ 21 percent of all teachers. The 500 largest districts make up 3 percent of all school districts, 32 percent of schools, and serve 20.4 million students, or 43 percent of the total public elementary and secondary school student population in the United States (table A).


All of the 100 largest school districts have at least 45,000 students, and 26 of these school districts have over 100,000 students. The largest school district is the New York City Public Schools, with 1,075,710 students enrolled in 1,207 schools. As a comparison, New York City Public Schools has more students than the 6th- through 10th-largest school districts added together. The second largest school district is Los Angeles Unified, with 710,007 students in 655 schools (table 1). The enrollment in New York City and Los Angeles Unified school districts each have more students than twenty-seven individual states, the District of Columbia, the five outlying areas, and the Bureau of Indian Affairs and Department of Defense schools¹.

Ninety-eight of the 100 largest districts reported staff by type for the 1999–2000 school year. At the national level, 52 percent of staff were teachers¹ compared to 53 percent among the 100 largest districts. Twenty of the 98 districts that reported staff by type had 1 percent or more of their staff assigned to district administration (table 12).

Where Are the 100 Largest School Districts?

The District of Columbia, Hawaii, and Puerto Rico each have only one school district for the entire jurisdiction, and each is represented among the 100 largest school districts (table 1). There are 33 states and jurisdictions that have at least one of the 100 largest school districts. Two states, Florida

and Texas, each have 14 districts among the 100 largest, California has 11. Several other states have more than one district represented in the 100 largest: Georgia has 6; Maryland has 5; Louisiana, North Carolina, Tennessee, Utah, and Virginia each have 4; Ohio has 3; and Arizona, Colorado, Minnesota, Nevada, and New York each have 2. The following states each have one school district among the 100 largest: Alabama, Alaska, Illinois, Kansas, Kentucky, Massachusetts, Michigan, Missouri, New Mexico, Oregon, Pennsylvania, South Carolina, Washington, and Wisconsin (appendix D).

As expected, these 100 largest districts tend to be in cities and counties with large populations, with administrative offices typically located in large cities and their environs. Many of the districts are in states where the school districts have the same boundaries as counties. Over 70 percent of these districts are located in coastal and gulf coast states.

How Do These Districts Compare With the Average School District?

General Characteristics

By definition, the 100 largest school districts are large, and when compared to the membership distribution of all school districts, they are considerably larger than most. In the 1999–2000 school year, 71 percent of all regular school districts² had fewer than 2,500 students while all of the 100 largest school districts had at least 45,000 students (tables B and 1). Although 14 percent of

regular school districts had 5,000 or more students, 68 percent of students (or 2 out of 3) were served by these districts (table B).

The average school district in the United States has 5.6 schools compared to the 100 largest school districts, which average 155.6 schools per district (derived from table A). Two of the largest school districts, New York City Public Schools and the Puerto Rico Department of Education, each have over 1,200 schools (table 1). The 100 largest school districts, on average, serve considerably more students (109,625 compared to 2,831) and employ more teachers (6,274 compared to 176) per district than the average school district in the nation (derived from table A).

School Characteristics

The 100 largest school districts have more students per school than the average school district, 704 compared to 507 (table A). In fact, 11 of the 100 largest school districts have an average regular school³ size of over 1,000 students (table 4). In addition to larger school sizes, the 100 largest school districts also have a higher mean pupil/teacher ratio, 17.5 to 1 compared to 16.1 to 1 for the average school district (table A). Across the 100 largest districts, Jefferson County, Kentucky, has the largest median⁴ pupil/teacher ratio at 23.2 to 1 and St. Paul, Minnesota, has the smallest at 11.9 to 1 (table 7).

The number of high school completers (diploma recipients and other high school completers) as a percentage of all students is lower in the 100 largest school districts than in the average school district: 4.5 percent of students are graduates in the 100 largest school districts compared to 5.4 percent for the average school district (table A).

Ninety of the 100 largest school districts reported data for Title I eligible schools and programs for the 1999–2000 school year. The percentage of Title I eligible schools in the 90 districts varied widely, from 3.3 percent in De Kalb County School District, Georgia, to 100 percent in the Philadelphia City School District, Pennsylvania (table 13).

Among the 52 of the 100 largest school districts that either reported charter school data or were located in states that did not have charter schools in the 1999–2000 school year, the largest number of charter schools were in Puerto Rico (119), Los Angeles Unified (33), and the District of Columbia (27) (table 14).

Student Body

The 100 largest school districts are not homogeneous, and certain student characteristics, such as race/ethnicity, poverty level, and disability status, vary across the districts.

The 100 largest districts, with 23 percent of the nation's public school students, serve 40 percent of the 18.5 million minority public school students.⁵ In the 100 largest school districts, 68 percent of students are minority students compared to 40 percent of students nationally (table C). In fact, one-third (33) of the 96 districts where minority membership was available have over 75 percent

minority students. Eight of the 10 largest school districts have over 75 percent minority student membership (table 8).

Even with the relatively high minority membership in the 100 largest school districts, 40 of the 96 districts report 50 percent or more of their students as White, non-Hispanic (table 9). Of these 40 districts, 9 report minority representation of less than 25 percent of their student body (table 8). In 18 of the 100 largest districts, half or more of the membership is Black, non-Hispanic. Twelve districts report that the majority of students are Hispanic; 3 of these are among the 5 largest districts. In Hawaii, which is one district, and the San Francisco Unified, California, the majority of the students are Asian/Pacific Islanders (table 9).

For the 1998–99 school year, 46 of the 100 largest school districts were in states that could report dropouts using the NCES definition of dropouts. The 9th- through 12th- grade dropout rate in those 50 districts ranged from 1 to 24 percent. Twenty-five of the districts had a 9th- through 12th- grade dropout rate between 3 and 10 percent (table 16).

The 100 largest school districts have a disproportionate percentage of students eligible for the free and reduced-price lunch program relative to all public school districts. Among schools that reported free and reduced-price lunch eligibility, 54 percent of students in the 100 largest school districts are eligible, compared to 39 percent of students in all districts (table C). Among the 92 of the 100 largest school districts that reported data on free lunch, 46 districts report over 50 percent of their students eligible for the free and reduced-price lunch program (table 9).

Twelve percent of students in the 100 largest school districts have individualized education programs (IEPs) for students with disabilities. In the largest school district, New York City Public Schools, 14 percent, or 146,949 students, are reported to have IEPs (table 3). Less than 3 percent of schools in the 100 largest school districts are special education schools (table 2).

Revenues and expenditures for fiscal year 1998⁶

In the 1997–98 school year (FY 1998), \$329 billion were collected for public elementary and secondary education in the 50 states, the District of Columbia, and outlying areas; 22 percent (\$74 billion) of this revenue went to the 100 largest school districts. Of the \$74 billion in revenue to the 100 largest school districts, a little less than one-third (\$22 billion) was received by the 5 largest school districts (New York City Public Schools, Los Angeles Unified, Puerto Rico Department of Education, City of Chicago School District, and Dade County School District) (table 10). The revenues from the federal government received by 99 of the 100 largest school districts comprised between 2 and 17 percent of all revenues to the district, the exception being the Puerto Rico Department of Education (27 percent) (table 11).

The 100 largest school districts spent \$64 billion (22 percent) of the \$288 billion in current expenditures spent on the 50 states, the District of Columbia, and outlying areas in 1997–98. The two largest school districts, New York City Public Schools and Los Angeles Unified, spent one out of every five dollars expended by the 100 largest school districts. All but 2 of the 100 largest school districts devoted 50 percent or more of their current expenditures to instruction (Jefferson County, Colorado, spent 49.9 percent, while the District of Columbia spent 43.4 percent). Of the 100 largest school districts, New York City Public Schools spent the greatest proportion, 72 percent, on instruction.

The current expenditures per pupil were \$6,189 for all districts in the 50 states and the District of Columbia, slightly higher than the \$5,949 in the 100 largest school districts. Of the 100 largest school districts, 14 districts spent more than \$7,000 per pupil (with Boston School District, Massachusetts, spending the most at \$10,293 per pupil) (table 10). (See the Methodology section for definitions of specific revenues and expenditures).

Changes in the 100 largest school districts between 1989 and 1999

While there has been a lot of movement within the 100 largest school districts over time, between the 1989–90 and 1999–2000 school years, the 100 largest districts remained very similar. Only 10 of the 100 largest districts in the 1999–2000 school year were not in the 100 largest in the 1989–90 school year. Clark County School District, Nevada, was the only district to move into the 100 largest districts between these years (it moved from a rank of 15 in 1989–90 to 6 in 1999–2000) (table 1 and appendix C). Clark County includes the Las Vegas metropolitan area, which was the

fastest growing metropolitan area in the country between 1990 and 1998.⁷

The number of students in the 100 largest school districts increased by 16 percent between 1989–90 and 1999–2000, the number of teachers increased by 23 percent, and the number of schools increased by 10 percent. However, while the numbers of students, teachers, and schools in the 100 largest school districts have increased between these years, the proportion of the national total these numbers comprised was essentially unchanged. For example, the number of students in the 100 largest school districts went from 22.8 percent of all districts in 1989–90 to 23.0 percent in 1999–2000 (table D).

Basic Tables

Table 1 presents basic data: numbers of students receiving educational services; full-time equivalent (FTE) teachers; 1998–99 completers; and schools for each of the 100 largest districts. Also shown is information to fully identify each school district by its city, state, and county, since the name of the district is not always sufficient for this purpose. On this and all of the other tables, the districts are shown in decreasing order of size (students in membership as of October 1999). Since the districts are arrayed by number of students, it is easy to note the differences in the numbers of teachers, graduates, and schools as they relate to districts of similar size. For example, the Philadelphia School District, Pennsylvania, though smaller in size than the Houston Independent School District, Texas, has more graduates.

For all school districts other than Massachusetts, Tennessee, and Virginia school districts, the teacher count was derived from the school universe survey. (For a more detailed description of the surveys see the methodology section).

Table 2 presents the number of schools in the 100 largest districts, by type of school. All but six of the districts have specialized schools devoted to special, vocational, or alternative education. It can be seen from this table that districts vary widely in their use of specialized versus general schools in educating students with special needs. This table also includes schools that do not have students. Schools may not have students for a variety of reasons, the most common is that the school serves a student population that is “counted” at another school, ex. a vocational education school.

Table 3 presents the numbers of students assigned to the schools in the 100 largest school districts. It should be noted that students attending a specialized school are often counted at their nonspecialized (regular) home school rather than at the specialized school they attend. The number and percentage of students having Individualized Education Programs (IEPs) in accordance with the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act-Part B, is also shown in table 3.

NOTE: In tables 4 through 9, only schools with student membership (or regular schools with students, as specified in table 4) are used in the data sets from which these tables are derived.

Table 4 provides information on school characteristics in the 100 largest school districts by displaying students (students in membership) at different percentile levels, as well as mean school size for each district (computed using regular schools having membership). For example, in New York City Public Schools, the table shows that the smallest 25 percent of the schools have student membership of 521 or fewer, while the largest 25 percent have student membership of 1,140 or more. Dividing all the students in regular schools in the district by the number of such schools yields a mean, or average, size of 932.0 students. If all the regular schools in New York City were listed by size, the school at the mid-point on the list (the median) would have 784 pupils in membership.

The average school size ranges from a low of 402.7 pupils (Puerto Rico Department of Education) to a high of 1,277.9 (Cypress-Fairbanks Independent School District, Texas) for these districts. The largest school in these districts, and also the largest school in the United States, is the 5,380–student G. Holmes Braddock Senior High School in Dade County School District, Florida.

In **table 5**, data are given on the number of students assigned to graded (three categories) and ungraded levels. In accounting for their students, 61 of the 100 largest districts assign all of their students to numbered grades and 39 use the “ungraded” status for some students in some settings,

such as special education, vocational education, and other specialized and alternative programs. In this table, students assigned to all types of schools are counted in the grade for which they are reported.

Table 6 answers the question of how many "elementary" and "high" schools there are in the 100 largest school districts. Since nearly every conceivable grade span is found among the schools in the 100 largest districts, the following four categories are used: *primary* (low grade of prekindergarten to 3; high grade up to 8), *middle* (low grade 4 to 7; high grade 4 to 9), *high* (low grade 7 to 12; high grade 12), and *other* (all other configurations, including PK, K, or 1 to 12). Although 92 of these school districts have some schools in the "other" category, only in the Puerto Rico school system is the number relatively high (227, or 15 percent). However, there are several districts in Florida in which the proportion of schools that are other than primary, middle or high exceeds that in Puerto Rico, although their absolute numbers do not. These include: Volusia County (24 percent); Polk County (22 percent), and Pinellas, Seminole, and Escambia Counties (20 percent).

Table 7 presents median pupil/teacher ratios for the schools found in the categories established in table 6. Since teacher counts by school were not available for Massachusetts, Tennessee, and Virginia, no pupil-teacher ratio could be calculated for the districts in these states. Among the 100 largest districts, the median pupil/teacher ratio for all schools in a district was 16.7:1. The districts varied from 11.9:1 in St. Paul School District, Minnesota, to 23.2:1 in Jefferson County School District, Kentucky.

Table 8 gives the number of schools in each district in five ranges of percent-minority student membership, as well as the overall minority student percentage for each district. In this report, minority is defined as all race/ethnicities other than white, non-Hispanic. Eight out of the 10 largest school districts have more than 75 percent minority student membership.

Whereas table 8 deals with the number of schools in each district having a minority presence of any kind, **table 9** presents the percentage of students in each district by specific racial/ethnic categories. This table illustrates that some school districts are made up of many minority groups while others have high concentrations of one minority group. For example, the New York City Public Schools have 38 percent Hispanic students and 35 percent black students while the Philadelphia City School District has a much higher percentage of black students (65 percent) than any other minority group.

Also shown in table 9 is the number of students eligible for free or reduced-price lunch. Responses in this data category were available for 92 districts out of the 100 largest. Among these districts, the percentages of students eligible for free or reduced-price lunch under the National School Lunch Program varied greatly. Of the 92 districts that did report free and reduced-price lunch eligibility, 46 districts reported that over 50 percent of their students were eligible for free or reduced-price lunch.

Table 10 deals with the school district revenues and expenditures and is based on fiscal year 1998 (which is school year 1997-1998) local government financial data collected by the Governments Division of the U.S. Census Bureau. It presents the amount of revenue received by source (local, state, and federal); current expenditures and those current expenditures for instruction; and current expenditures per pupil in membership for fiscal year 1998. Data for Puerto Rico were obtained from the National Public Education Financial Survey. Among the 100 largest school districts, Boston School District, Massachusetts, had the highest expenditure per pupil (\$10,293), and Puerto Rico Department of Education the lowest (\$3,210). Overall, there were 13 school districts with per

pupil expenditures greater than \$7,000 and 5 school districts with per pupil expenditures less than \$4,000.

Whereas table 10 deals with the dollar amounts of revenues and expenditures, **table 11** presents the percentage of revenues by sources as well as the percentage of current expenditures spent on instruction. The 100 largest school districts spent 63 percent of their current expenditures on instruction.

Table 12 presents the different types of staff in each district. Teachers represented the largest proportion of staff. Of the 98 districts reporting staff by type, 67 districts reported that 50 percent or more of their staff were teachers, 5 districts had over 60 percent teachers. For those districts that did not report one of the staff categories, the percentage distribution across all types of staff could not be calculated.

Table 13 reports the number and percentage of students in Title I eligible schools and school-wide programs. The 1999–2000 school year was the second year the CCD collected this information. Not all states were able to report this information. The percentage of Title I eligible schools in districts that provided the information varied widely, from 3 to 100 percent. Of 90 districts that reported at least one Title I school, 33 reported that 100 percent of Title I schools were also Title I school-wide eligible.

Table 14 also reports new data items beginning in the 1998–99 school year; that is magnet and charter schools. Only 42 of the 100 largest districts were able to report that magnet schools could exist in their districts, while 52 districts reported they had charter schools or were located in states that do not have charter schools. Many charter schools function as their own school districts which is why many of the districts in this report may be in states that have charter school legislation but do not report having any charter schools.

A few of the new items starting in 1998–99 asked for the numbers of students receiving services for Limited English Proficient (LEP) and migrant students. **Table 15** reports these totals for those districts that provided this information. Sixty of the 100 largest districts reported the number of students receiving migrant services in the previous school year. Palm Beach County School District, Florida, reported the most migrant students served at 7,698 students. Hillsborough County School District, Florida reported the most migrant students served in summer migrant services, 1,544. Eighty-three of the 100 largest districts were able to report students served in Limited English-Proficient (LEP) programs. Santa Ana Unified School District, California, reported the highest percentage of LEP students, 67.4 percent.

Table 16 reports the percentage of 1997–98 school year dropouts for those school districts in states that were able to report dropouts using the NCES dropout definition (see Glossary for definition). Forty-six of the 100 districts have data on this table.

How to read this table: Using Dade County as an example, the table shows that 25 percent of the schools have a pupil membership of 564 or less, and 25 percent have a membership of 1,289 or more. If all the regular schools in Dade County were listed by size, the school at the mid-point on the list (the median) would have 877 pupils in membership. Dividing all students in regular schools by the number of such schools yields a mean, or average, size of 1,074.6 students. The standard deviation is a measure of how schools in the district are distributed between the minimum and maximum compared to the mean. Smaller standard deviations indicate that schools in the district are closer to the mean value while larger standard deviations indicate that school size is spread more widely across the range of possible values.

Methodology

The primary source of the nonfiscal data for this report is the 1999–2000 Common Core of Data (CCD). Information was reported to NCES by state education agencies in the spring of 2000. There are three nonfiscal CCD surveys collecting basic descriptive data on public education in the nation: the school (Public School Universe Survey), local education agency (Local Education Agency Universe Survey), and state (State Nonfiscal Survey) forms. Fiscal data are gathered at the state level by NCES in the National Public Education Finance Survey (NPEFS) and at the local level in the Annual Survey of Local Government Finances (F-33 series of the Census of Local Governments) conducted by the Governments Division of the Bureau of the Census. The most recent year for which data are available from the Annual Survey of Local Government Finances is 1998. A CCD coordinator in each state education agency provides all responses. Since the information is supplied by state education agencies, any data item missing for one school district is generally missing for other districts in the same state.

Districts represented in this report are of various physical sizes and geographic locations. Three of the 100 largest districts, District of Columbia, Hawaii, and Puerto Rico, are also analogous to states. Some districts comprise a substantial portion of a state's total student membership, while others make up only a small fraction of the state's total student membership.

Response Rates

Notwithstanding the item nonresponse situations cited below, most of these data represent school-district level figures. District-level data were provided by all 50 states, the District of Columbia, Bureau of Indian Affairs, the Department of Defense schools, and five outlying areas: American Samoa, Guam, Commonwealth of the Northern Marianas, Puerto Rico, and the Virgin Islands. The Bureau of Indian Affairs and Department of Defense schools and the outlying areas are included in the national totals in this report.

Item Nonresponse

There were some items for which data were not available at the desired levels. The following nonresponse situations in the CCD school and agency universe surveys relate to information presented in this report: no teacher counts for Massachusetts, Tennessee, and Virginia; no data on free and reduced-price lunch eligibility for Arizona, Illinois, Tennessee, and Washington (school universe); no dropout data for California, Florida, Hawaii, Michigan, New York, North Carolina, Oregon, South Carolina, and Texas.

National fiscal data were taken from the 1997–98 NPEFS. Fiscal data for Puerto Rico were taken from the 1997–98 NPEFS as well.

Definitions

Alternative Education School—A public elementary/secondary school that: 1) addresses needs of students that typically cannot be met in a regular school, 2) provides nontraditional education, 3) serves as an adjunct to a regular school, or 4) falls outside of the categories of regular, special education, or vocational education.

Bureau of Indian Affairs schools and districts—A school or district that is directly funded by the Bureau of Indian Affairs, Department of the Interior.

Charter school—A new CCD data item in the 1998–99 school year. In this first year of collection, this data item was voluntary so not all states reported this data. A charter school is a school which

provides free public elementary and/or secondary education to eligible students under a specific charter granted by the state legislature or other appropriate authority, and designated by such authority to be a charter school.

Current expenditures—Funds spent for operating local public schools and local education agencies, including such operating expenses as salaries for school personnel, student transportation, school books and materials, and energy costs, but excluding capital outlay and interest on school debt.

Dropout—The CCD defines dropouts as those students who were enrolled in school at some time during the previous school year; were not enrolled at the beginning of the current school year; have not graduated from high school or completed a state- or district-approved educational program; and do not meet any of the following exclusionary conditions: transfer to another public school district, private school, or state- or district-approved education program; temporary absence due to suspension or school-approved education program; or death.

Federal revenues—Federal revenues include direct grants-in-aid to school or agencies, funds distributed through a state or intermediate agency, and revenues in lieu of taxes to compensate a school district for nontaxable federal institutions within a district's boundary.

Free and reduced-price lunch eligible—Number of students who are eligible for the Free and Reduced-Price Lunch Program under the National School Lunch Act. Any school that reported 100 percent eligible students is adjusted on the CCD files to student population minus 3 for reasons of student confidentiality. Caution should be used when interpreting these data. Four states did not report free and reduced-price lunch eligibility, and others may have included reduced price lunch students or reported participation instead of eligibility data.

Guidance counselors—Professional staff assigned specific duties and school time for counseling students and parents, addressing learning problems, evaluating student abilities, and assisting students on career and personal development.

High School Completers—Students who completed the course of public elementary and secondary education offered by the school district and who received a high school diploma, or who met other requirements of completion as defined by state law or policy during the period September 1998 through August 1999.

Individual Education Program (IEP)—As used here, refers to written instructional plan for students with disabilities designated as special education students under the Individuals With Disabilities Education Act (IDEA-Part B) which includes: 1) statement of present levels of educational performance of a child; 2) statement of annual goals, including short-term instructional objectives; 3) statement of specific educational services to be provided and the extent to which the child will be able to participate in regular educational programs; 4) projected date for initiation and anticipated duration of services; and 5) appropriate objectives, criteria and evaluation procedures and schedules for determining, on at least an annual basis, whether instructional objectives are being achieved.

Instructional expenditures—Current expenditures for activities directly associated with the interaction between teachers and students. These include teacher salaries and benefits, supplies (such as textbooks), and purchased instructional services.

Instructional support staff—Includes instructional coordinators and supervisors and instructional aides.

LEA (district) administrators—Local education agency superintendents, deputy and assistant superintendents, and other persons with district-wide responsibilities such as business manager; and administrative assistants.

Limited-English-Proficient (LEP) Students—A new CCD data item in the 1998–99 school year. In this first year of collection, this data item was voluntary so not all states reported this data. LEP students are defined as individuals who 1) were not born in the United States or whose native language is a language other than English; or 2) come from environments where a language other than English is dominant; or 3) are American Indians and Alaskan Natives and who come from environments where a language other than English has had a significant impact on their level of English language proficiency; and who, by reason thereof, have sufficient difficulty speaking, reading, writing, or understanding the English language, to deny such individuals the opportunity to learn successfully in classrooms where the language of instruction is English or to participate fully in our society.

Library/media staff—Professional staff members who are assigned specific duties and school time for professional library and media service activities. Includes library/media specialists and support staff.

Local revenues—Include revenues from such sources as local property and nonproperty taxes, investments, and revenues from student activities, textbook sales, transportation and tuition fees, and food service revenues.

Magnet school—A new CCD data item in the 1998–99 school year. In this first year of collection, this data item was voluntary so not all states reported this data. Regardless of the source of funding, a magnet school or program is a special school or program designed to attract students of different racial/ethnic backgrounds for the purpose of reducing, preventing, or eliminating racial isolation and/or to provide an academic or social focus on a particular theme.

Migrant students—A new CCD data item in the 1998–99 school year. In this first year of collection, this data item was voluntary so not all states reported this data. A migrant student as defined under 34 CFR 200.40: 1) (a) Is younger than 22 (and has not graduated from high school or does not hold a high school equivalency certificate), but (b), if the child is too young to attend school-sponsored educational programs, is old enough to benefit from an organized instructional program; and 2) A migrant agricultural worker or a migrant fisher or has a parent, spouse, or guardian who is a migrant agricultural worker or a migrant fisher; and 3) performs, or has a parent, spouse, or guardian who performs, qualifying agricultural or fishing employment as a principal means of livelihood ; and 4) has moved within the preceding 36 months to obtain or to accompany or join a parent, spouse, or guardian to obtain, temporary or seasonal employment in agricultural or fishing work; and 5) has moved from one school district to another; or in a state that is comprised of a single school district, has moved from one administrative area to another within such district; or resides in a school district of more than 15,000 square miles, and migrates a distance of 20 miles or more to a temporary residence to engage in a fishing activity. (Provision 5 currently applies only to Alaska.)

Minority Membership—Includes at least one student of a minority race/ethnicity. These race/ethnicities include: American Indian/Alaska Native, Asian/Pacific Islander, Hispanic, and Blank, non-Hispanic.

Outlying Areas—Territories of the United States. They include: American Samoa, Guam, the Northern Marianas, Puerto Rico, and the Virgin Islands.

Other staff—Includes support staff for local education agencies, schools, student support services and other areas such as data processing, health, transportation, etc.

Per pupil expenditure—Current expenditure for public elementary and secondary education in a state divided by the student membership. The numbers reported here, based on membership, can be expected to be smaller than per pupil expenditures based on average daily attendance because the membership counts are generally larger than average daily attendance.

Public school—An institution that provides educational services and has the following characteristics:

- has one or more grade groups (prekindergarten through grade 12) or is ungraded;
- has one or more teachers to give instruction;
- is located in one or more buildings or sites;
- has an assigned administrator;
- receives public funds as primary support;
- is operated by an education agency.

Pupil/teacher ratio—The ratio of pupils to teachers in a school district, based on the total number of pupils (student membership) and the total full-time-equivalent (FTE) number of teachers reported in the schools associated with the school district. The pupil/teacher ratio is not a class size but rather a district level measure of pupils and teachers.

Pupils in membership—Count of all students whose names have been entered on the roll, minus those whose names have been withdrawn, on or before the closest school day to October 1. Membership counts at the district level may include students for whom the district is providing educational services through some other agency or institution.

Regular school—A public elementary/secondary school that does not focus primarily on vocational, special, or alternative education. It is possible for a regular school, as it is for a vocational, special, or alternative education school, to have no students in membership.

Regular school district—Agency responsible for providing free public education for school-age children residing within its jurisdiction. This category excludes local supervisory unions that provide management services for a group of associated school districts; regional education service agencies that typically provide school districts with research, testing, and data processing services; state and federally operated school districts; and other agencies that do not fall into these groupings.

Revenues—Additions to assets which do not incur an obligation that must be met at some future date, do not represent exchanges of fixed assets, and are available for expenditure by the local education agencies in the state. Revenues include funds from local, intermediate, state, and federal sources.

School administrators—Staff members whose activities are concerned with directing and managing the operation of a particular school.

Schools having membership—Schools at which students are counted for administrative purposes, even though the students may attend one or more other schools for all or part of their school day.

Special Education School—A public elementary/secondary school that: 1) focuses primarily on special education, including instruction for any of the following: hard of hearing, deaf, speech-

impaired, health-impaired, orthopedically impaired, mentally retarded, seriously emotionally disturbed, multi-handicapped, visually handicapped, deaf and blind; and 2) adapts curriculum, materials or instruction for students served.

State revenues—State revenues include both direct funds from state governments and funds in lieu of taxation. Revenues in lieu of taxes are paid to compensate a school district for nontaxable state institutions or facilities within the district's boundary.

Teachers—The total number of classroom teachers for ungraded and all PK-12 graded classes in a school or district, state in full-time-equivalencies (FTE).

Title I school—A new CCD data item in the 1998–99 school year. In this first year of collection, this data item was voluntary so not all states reported this data. A Title I school is a school designated under appropriate state and federal regulations as being high poverty and eligible for participation in programs authorized by Title I of Public Law 103-382.

Title I school-wide—A new CCD data item in the 1998–99 school year. In this first year of collection, this data item was voluntary so not all states reported this data. A program in which all the students in a school are designated under appropriate state and federal regulations as being high poverty and eligible for participation in programs authorized by Title I of Public Law 103-382.

Vocational Education School—A public elementary/secondary school that focuses primarily on vocational education, and provides education and training in one or more semi-skilled or technical operations.



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
