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## ABSTRACT

In response to a request of the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board, public universities and community, technical, and state colleges in Texas were asked to provide examples of efficiencies implemented on their campuses between Fiscal Year (FY) 2001 and FY 2003. For purposes of this request, an efficiency was defined as an activity that results in a documentable savings of time, money, or some other resources that is then readily available for some other campus program or activity. An electronic survey was completed by all Texas public institutions of higher education (97). The 97 institutions reported a total of 357 efficiencies, 329 for FY 2001 through FY 2003, and 28 initiated before the study period. Of the reported efficiencies, 81 were in the area of education, 11 in research, 255 in administration, and 10 in the area of clinical care. Some project concepts were reported by multiple institutions. Among the most common were projects related to energy efficiency. Another often reported change was reorganization of both academic departments and schools or administrative units. Texas public higher education institutions are demonstrating through their actions that they are being good stewards of state funds by identifying ways to streamline their operations without harming their missions and by reallocating financial and staff savings to higher priority programs and activities. 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## **Background**

During the Coordinating Board's October 2002 meeting, Board members asked about the extent to which measures have been taken by public higher education institutions to increase efficiencies on their campuses and to shift limited resources to higher-priority programs and activities. In mid-December, presidents and chancellors of Texas public universities, community, technical, and state colleges, and health-related institutions were asked to provide examples of efficiencies implemented on their campuses between Fiscal Year 2001 and Fiscal Year 2003.

For the purpose of this request, an efficiency was defined as "an activity that results in a documentable savings of time, money, or some other resource that is then made available to another program or activity on campus." Efficiencies may include retrenching efforts that result in the shifting of personnel, space, operating funds, or other resources from one program or activity to another.

Examples were categorized by the institutions as (1) an efficiency in education, (2) an efficiency in research, (3) an efficiency in administration, or (4) an efficiency in clinical care. For those institutions that reported efficiencies in clinical care, examples were limited to those activities for which state appropriations had been made.

## **Methodology**

A survey questionnaire was electronically distributed in mid-December 2002 to the presidents and chancellors of all public institutions of higher education in Texas (see Appendix A for a copy of the survey questionnaire). All institutions returned completed questionnaires, providing a response rate of 100 percent (see Table 1).

The following presents an overview of the data received and analyzed to date. A searchable, web-based version of the institutional responses is posted on the Coordinating Board's web site. The website location is <http://www.thecb.state.tx.us/efficiencies/>. Notice of the availability of the institutional responses and this report, is also available on the Coordinating Board's web site.

## **Results**

Responses from the 97 reporting institutions were analyzed and are described in Table 1. Thirty-four (100 percent) of the universities, fifty (100 percent) of the community colleges, both (100 percent) of the Lamar State Colleges, and Lamar Institute of Technology are included in the analysis to date. The Texas State Technical College System response covering all of its components (four colleges and three other campuses) and all nine health-related institutions are also included in this analysis.

The 97 higher education institutions reported a total of 357 efficiencies, 329 covering the period Fiscal Year 2001 through Fiscal Year 2003 under study and 28 initiated prior to the study period. The 97 institutions may have implemented additional efficiencies, but they were asked only to report a minimum of three and a maximum of five efficiencies. Of the 357 reported efficiencies, 81 were in the area of education, 11 were in the area of research, 255 were in the area of administration, and ten were in the area of clinical care (see Table 2).

The most frequently reported area of efficiency across all sectors of higher education was administrative efficiencies. Two-year institutions reported twice as many administrative as educational efficiencies, while universities reported four times as many administrative efficiencies as educational efficiencies.

Institutional responses indicate that most of the efficiencies have been in place since Fiscal Year 2002 (see Table 3), and that the estimated financial and staff savings from these activities is \$269.5 million and 619 full-time equivalent staff (see Table 4). In addition to these quantifiable benefits, some of the other benefits resulting from these

efficiencies include: increased access and ease of access to student-centered information for students and faculty (e.g., course materials, grades, and registration); increased access for educators and researchers to the most current information and data through enhanced, expanded, and shared electronic library collections; and improvements in campus facilities from energy and refinancing savings, and building reuse.

Several project concepts were reported by multiple institutions across the sectors of higher education.

- Common projects reported included energy efficiency (e.g., lighting projects involved reduced wattage bulbs and lights set on timers or illuminated from motion detectors), and economies of scale in contracting for electricity either through a system program or a group of campuses that organized a larger customer group.
- Another often reported concept was reorganization of both academic departments and schools or administrative units, which included reductions in staff through attrition and restructuring job responsibilities among remaining personnel. Some positions were purposely held vacant or eliminated to

achieve savings that could be redirected toward higher priority programs and activities.

- Negotiations for services and different procurement procedures were also cited by several institutions, as were the use of “procards” for the purchase of small items of little expense for which the transaction cost would exceed the cost of the purchased item.
- For some institutions, the trade-off between the use of adjunct faculty and permanent faculty allowed for more contact or semester credit hours, greater diversity of course offerings, and the ability to offer some courses at remote locations.
- Distance learning and enhanced curricula through technology were also cited, as were savings through standardized computers and related software.
- Many institutions provided reports of academic and administrative collaborations among several institutions, either within the same system or located within the same community.
- Partnerships helped create a more efficient research program in radiological technology at Tyler Junior College. Utilizing the economies of scale of the Texas A&M System, Texas A&M University – Commerce increased the productivity of its research faculty.
- Several institutions reported sharing academic and personal counselors, while other institutions reported sharing library facilities with the municipalities in which they are located.

The titles of these and dozens more creative, rewarding, and at times, unique project concepts are listed in Appendix B by institution and in Appendix C by area of efficiency. Additional detail about the examples and the institutional contacts is posted on the Coordinating Board web site.

## **Conclusion**

Texas public higher education institutions have demonstrated through their responses that they are being good stewards of state funds by routinely identifying ways to streamline their operations without harming their missions and by reallocating financial and staff savings to higher priority programs and activities.

The examples presented in this report indicate a high incidence of administrative efficiencies primarily through enhancements in technology and delivery systems. Significant efforts to gain efficiencies through energy management and restructuring administrative processes are also evident.

In the area of education, institutions reported that consolidation or elimination of degree and certificate programs and restructuring of academic departments resulted in greater efficiencies at the campus level.

The report on Efficiencies at Texas Public Institutions of Higher Education provides insight into efficiencies implemented throughout the state. This report could be used as a resource for higher education officials to review best practices and exemplary programs to achieve similar savings and learn about resource allocation strategies that could be implemented, with any necessary modification for their respective campus environments.

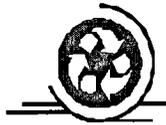
