


Success for Oregon



Success for All Schools in Oregon Gain on Oregon Statewide Assessment-Reading


Oregon elementary schools using the Success for All reading program once again made outstanding gains on the Oregon Statewide Assessment reading scale. **Averaging grades 3 and 5, students in Success for All schools gained 8.5 percentage points in students meeting standards from 2001 to 2004.** Oregon schools as a whole slightly declined over that period.

Schools making particularly outstanding gains include:

- Lake Labish Elementary in Salem-Keizer: 28.5%
- Oakland Elementary in Oakland: 27.0%
- Vernon Elementary in Portland: 25.5%
- Henry Hill Elementary in the Central District: 18.0%
- Brooks Elementary in Gervais: 16.0%
- Kennedy Elementary in Salem-Keizer: 14.0%
- Charles Tigard in Tigard-Tualatin: 10.0%

The 2004 results reflect previous Oregon findings as well as outcomes in states throughout the U.S., affirming that students in Success for All schools gain more than other students on state accountability measures.
