The exchange programs help students in the Western states to enroll in selected out-of-state professional, graduate, and undergraduate programs. Outbound students and their families save money through reduced tuition arrangements. See inside back cover for information about our other exchange programs.

OVERVIEW

Your state may be able to assist you in achieving your professional goals through WICHE, the Western Interstate Commission for Higher Education.

WICHE's **Professional Student Exchange Program** enables students in **12 Western states** to enroll in selected out-of-state professional programs, usually because those fields of study are not available at public institutions in their home states. Those fields and the participating institutions are listed on pp. 4-14.

If selected for support, WICHE exchange students pay reduced levels of tuition – usually resident tuition in public institutions or reduced tuition at private schools. The home state pays a support fee to the admitting schools to help cover the cost of the students' education. WICHE students receive some preference in admission.

Each state determines the fields and number of students they will support. Fields supported by your state are listed on the chart on page 18 of this brochure. State support and program participation affecting students are subject to change by legislative or administrative action. For current information and application materials

PSEP CHANGES IN ARCHITECTURE, LIBRARY STUDIES, NURSING AND PUBLIC HEALTH

In May 2007, WICHE's commissioners approved several changes to the Professional Student Exchange Program. These changes will be effective as of the 2008-09 academic year. As few students were participating in the fields of architecture and graduate library studies, these will be inactivated; cooperating schools that have distinctive programs will be invited to apply to join the Western Regional Graduate Program (WRGP). The fields of **public health** and graduate nursing will also be inactivated; participating schools in these fields will be strongly encouraged to join WRGP. While programs in the WRGP network are generally required to have distinctive features, commissioners voted to waive this requirement for health care-related graduate programs (which must be accredited to join).

PSEP FIELDS & ADMITTING SCHOOLS

The following programs and institutions are eligible to receive support through WICHE's **Professional Student Exchange Program** (information is correct as of August 2007; updated information is available on our Website, **www.wiche.edu/sep**). These institutions charge a reduced level of tuition to PSEP students (augmented by the WICHE support fee paid by the student's sending state). Tuition, which varies by program and institution, may be determined by contacting either the state certifying officer (see p. 18) or the institutions (check their Web sites – addresses listed below – for contact information).

Each participating state supports students in only some – not all – programs; supporting states are listed under each field. Some states have additional arrangements for professional education with schools in the West or outof-region. If your state's name is listed below as having such an arrangement, contact your certifiying officer for the names of participating schools and the procedures for applying for your state's support.

DENTISTRY

Maximum WICHE support in dentistry is limited to four academic years, or three years for accelerated programs.

HOW TO APPLY

Twelve of the 15 WICHE states expect to support students through the Professional Student Exchange Program. (California, Oregon, and South Dakota do not support PSEP students.)

States support their students in different fields of study: For instance, Colorado supports students only in the field of optometry, while Wyoming supports students in nine different fields, from dentistry to veterinary medicine. Fields of study in which each state supports students are listed on p. 17.

If the field of study you wish to pursue is supported by your state, **contact your state** certifying officer for an application (contact information is on pp. 18-20). You must be certified by your state of residence to become an exchange student and be seeking enrollment at the first professional degree level. Certification affirms only that you are a resident according to the definition established by your state and are eligible for the exchange if sufficient funds are available in your state. Obtain your certification early because some schools will not consider applications from nonresident students unless they're certified.

In most states, the deadline for receiving completed applications for certification is **October 15** of the year preceding admission. However, a few states have earlier deadlines or accept late applications. Contact your state certifying officer to find out exactly what your state's deadline is.

In addition to applying for certification, you must apply for admission to the schools of your **choice** that participate in WICHE's Professional Student Exchange Program (listed by field on pp. 4-14). You are subject to the application deadlines and academic requirements established by each school. When applying for admission, identify yourself as a certified WICHE student (or indicate that you have applied for certification). Be sure to inform your certifying officer of the schools to which you are seeking admission.

You must also keep your state certifying officer apprised of the offers you receive and of your final decision about which school you'll attend. In addition, be sure to keep your certifying officer up to date regarding your address and phone number while enrolled through the program. This is necessary because agreements between the state, the school, and WICHE must be completed to ensure that you are admitted and funded as an exchange student. You'll also need to formally decline offers for admission at other schools so that those places can be offered to other students.

If you encounter difficulty during admission regarding your status as a WICHE exchange student, contact your state certifying officer or ask a school official to call WICHE's Student Exchange Program in Boulder, CO, at (303) 541-0214.

STUDENT CHECKLIST

- Complete the certification process before
 October 15 of the year preceding admission.
 State deadlines and requirements vary; check with your certifying officer.
- □ Apply to the participating schools of your choice. Inform your certifying officer of all schools to which you are seeking admission.
- Immediately inform your certifying officer as you receive offers and when you accept an offer of admission at a participating school.
- □ Formally decline offers of admission at schools you will not be attending.
- □ Check directly with your enrolling institution regarding the specific tuition charges that will be required from you.
- □ Enroll and remain enrolled as a full-time student and maintain your home state residency.
- Keep your state certifying officer posted as to your current address. Certifying officers inform all students of annual renewal requirements for state certification.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

Q: How do I determine if I can apply for this program?

A: To determine your eligibility, contact the certifying office of the state of your residence (see pp. 18-20 for contact information). Each state determines residency based on legislative requirements.

Q: Is there a deadline for application?

A: Yes. In most cases, the deadline is **October 15** of the year preceding admission; but some states have earlier or later deadlines. Check with your certifying office directly.

Q: If I miss the deadline, can I apply anyway?

A: Most states do not accept either late applications or applications from students who are already enrolled in a professional program. However, each state has its own regulations, so check with that office directly.

Q: Can I apply online for this program?

- A: No. Because most states require original signatures on application forms and a notary verification of signatures, you cannot apply for PSEP online at the time of this printing.
- Q: Do I have to live in the state or attend preprofessional school in the state where I am a resident to apply for this program?
- **A**: No.

Q: How do I get an application packet?

A: Contact your home state certifying office for an application packet.

- Q: If my state does not have the program I want, do they have to provide PSEP assistance?
- A: No. Each state determines which fields it wishes to support, usually using a combination of workforce studies and available funding. See the chart on p. 17 for a list of the fields for which your state provides support. No state supports all fields.

Q: Can I apply to any school for admission?

 A: Yes – but you will only be considered for tuition assistance if you attend one of the PSEP cooperating institutions, and if your state has sufficient funds to support you. You can apply to non-PSEP schools as well as those participating in the program; you just can't receive PSEP support if you choose a non-PSEP school.

Q: Can I apply for assistance to more than one program (i.e., allopathic and osteopathic medicine) at the same time?

A: Yes – but you must notify your certifying office that you will be doing so. Your name is forwarded to cooperating schools, and it must be on both lists.

Q: If I am certified by my state and accepted to a cooperating institution, do I automatically receive assistance?

A: No. Each state determines how many new students it can assist each year. You should notify your certifying office immediately when you receive acceptances and again when you determine which school you will attend.

Q: How does a state determine which of the accepted students receives assistance?

A: Most states choose the "most qualified among the accepted students" and offer them assistance first. WICHE asks cooperating schools to rank all accepted students from a given state; that information is compiled by WICHE, and the results are given to the student's home state.

Q: Can I get the results of this ranking?

A: No. That information is strictly confidential for the benefit of all concerned.

Q: Am I required to repay the state for my support?

A: Each state determines requirements for return obligation or payback. Contact your state certifying office for specific information.

Q: When will I know if I am going to receive assistance?

A: You can expect to receive notification by late spring to early summer. Support is determined when all cooperating schools have had the opportunity to place offers of admission and any necessary ranking requests have been completed. These dates vary, depending upon the program and the timing of your state's budget appropriations.

Q: Do I have to reapply each year for this assistance?

A: Yes. If you are not accepted into a cooperating program or are not supported due to limited funding, you must reapply each year by the **October 15 deadline**. In most cases, once you receive support, you will continue to do so until you complete the degree program. However, there are limitations, and many states contact students annually to renew support. Make sure you keep your certifying office advised of any address or phone changes.

Q: If I receive support through this program and run into problems when I enroll, whom do I contact?

A: Have your enrolling institution contact the main WICHE office in Boulder, CO, at (303) 541-0214.

In addition to the Professional Student Exchange Program, other WICHE programs of interstate cooperation are available to residents of some states. Western Undergraduate Exchange (WUE)

WUE opens opportunity to residents of participating Western states to enroll in designated public undergraduate programs in the other participating states at resident tuition plus 50 percent, an amount considerably less than regular nonresident tuition. Participating states are Alaska, Arizona, California, Colorado, Hawaii, Idaho, Montana, Nevada, New Mexico, North Dakota, Oregon, South Dakota, Utah, Washington, and Wyoming. Western Regional Graduate Program (WRGP) Residents of 14 Western states are eligible to enroll in more than 175 distinguished graduate programs (both master's and doctoral levels) at 40 institutions at reduced rates. Eligibility is limited to qualified residents of Alaska, Arizona, Colorado, Hawaii, Idaho, Montana, Nevada, New Mexico, North Dakota, Oregon, South Dakota, Utah, Washington, and Wyoming. WICHE Internet Course Exchange (WICHE ICE)

The Western Interstate Commission for Higher Education's Internet Course Exchange (WICHE ICE) is an alliance of member institutions and university systems that operate with a common set of policies, procedures, and support systems for sharing distance-delivered courses among twoyear and four-year institutions in the 15 WICHE member states.

WICHE ICE gives students broader and easier access to high-quality online courses and degree and certificate programs offered by universities other than their own. It benefits participating institutions by making online courses more manageable for administrators and faculty and allows them to share courses with excess capacity more easily.

In addition, when home-campus courses are overenrolled, it serves as a relief valve that gives students access to courses and programs offered by other institutions, allowing students to take their required courses on schedule and remain on track to obtain their degree.
