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Wyoming Community College System Annual Enrollment Report

Introduction

The Wyoming Community College Commission (WCCC) has compiled community college enrollment data for over ten years. Originally, enrollment data were reported by the Commission only once a year, but during the 2003-2004 academic year, the WCCC began reporting data every semester. Currently, the Wyoming Community College Commission publishes four enrollment reports every year for the summer, fall and spring terms, as well as, the entire academic year. This report includes twelve distinct tables that highlight community college enrollment in terms of time, location, and demographics.

The following report provides annualized enrollment information for the Wyoming community college system for the 2006-2007 academic year. During this year, credit headcount (see Table 1a) at Wyoming's community colleges has increased by 0.2%. However, for the first time, headcount enrollment has topped 23,000 (see Table 1a). This current report also indicates that a once prevalent difference between the enrollment of men and women is dwindling. During the 2004-2005 academic year, women accounted for 61.2% of credit enrollments and men accounted for 38.8%. This year, women made up 57.5% and men accounted for the remaining 42.5% of credit enrollments (see Table 3).

Perhaps the most notable information gleaned from enrollment reports are the trends concerning part-time enrollment and student age categories. During the 2006-2007 academic year, 66.4% of credit headcount included part-time enrollments (see Table 1a). Furthermore, 68.1% of credit enrollment included students ages 17-29 and 16.0% included students ages 40-49 (see Table 2). Enrollment data for the last ten years indicate that most student enrollment at Wyoming community colleges is part-time and a majority of enrollments include individuals ages 17-29 and 40-49. On another scale of measure, it is interesting to note that current annual headcount accounted for 5.2% of Wyoming's population, and during the last five years, credit enrollment as a percent of total population has remained steady at approximately 5% (see Table 4).

In Table 8 of this report, some FTE Levels of Instruction are unspecified. These unspecified FTE are from the Summer 2006 Enrollment Report data. Since the summer report, the WCCC and the community colleges updated instructional levels for funding purposes. Currently, all community college courses are defined among the three levels of instruction and none are considered unspecified.
