





Begin your studies at U.S. community colleges—the gateway to higher education.


WHY STUDY IN THE UNITED STATES?

ach year more than 572,500 international students enroll in more than 3,300 colleges and universities in the United States. Currently, about 84,000 of these students attend community colleges. Why do so many international students choose to pursue higher education in the United States?

First, U.S. colleges and universities welcome and value international students. Classmates and professors eager to learn more about other countries, cultures, and languages encourage interaction among students with diverse backgrounds. Most campuses have multicultural and multinational student organizations to support international students.

Second, a degree from a U.S. institution is recognized throughout the world as a significant accomplishment. International students with degrees from the United States become highly marketable back home.

Finally, higher education in the United States, particularly in community colleges, is usually highly affordable for international students.

TYPES OF U.S. COLLEGES AND UNIVERSITIES

Community Colleges

Community colleges (also known as technical or junior colleges) are colleges that award associate degrees (or certificates) upon completion of a 2-year program of study. An associate degree enables you to

- Transfer to a 4-year college or university to obtain a bachelor's degree upon completing 2 additional years of study
- Begin a career immediately in any one of hundreds of fields not requiring a 4-year degree

Four-Year Colleges and Universities Four-year colleges and universities award bachelor's degrees of arts or science upon completion of 4-year programs of study. They also award graduate and professional degrees upon additional years of study. Nearly all 4-year colleges and universities accept credits earned at a community colleges for transfer into bachelor's programs. Because rules differ, it is important to find out what they are for the college or university you are interested in transferring to before applying to a community college.

Accredited Colleges And Universities

The quality of education in the United States is ensured by accreditation. Although accrediting organizations are private, nongovernment agencies that establish standards of institutional quality, many are examined and recognized by the U.S. government's Department of Education. All community colleges and 4-year colleges and universities are accredited by the same regional agencies. Degrees granted by accredited colleges and universities are recognized by ministries of education around the world. Before applying to a college, you should find out whether it is accredited (all AACC member community colleges participating in the Asia International Education Fairs are accredited).

THE BENEFITS OF ATTENDING COMMUNITY COLLEGE

ommunity colleges provide international students with a well balanced and rich study abroad experience. Two-year colleges promote academic excellence while maintaining close links to the surrounding community. This dual characteristic offers international students a unique opportunity to experience life in the United States. Unlike other higher education institutions, community colleges strive to meet the broad-based needs of the community. Small class sizes and a focus on students' individual abilities and skills help students make the transition into highly competitive academic environments. Community colleges create opportunities to succeed and achieve. Some of the many

benefits of attending community college are described as follows:

Low Cost

Community college tuition and fees are significantly lower than those at 4-year colleges and universities. If you intend to pursue a bachelor's degree, you may be able to lower the cost of your degree by earning the first 2 years of course credits at a community college.

Excellent Transfer Opportunities

Most community colleges have agreements with 4-year colleges and universities (called articulation or 2+2 transfer agreements) to allow credits you earn at a community college to count toward a bachelor's degree. Many state universities favor qualified students who transfer from a community college in that state.


Flexible TOEFL Score Requirements

Community colleges have flexible TOEFL (Test of English as a Foreign Language) requirements. TOEFL measures the ability of non-native speakers of English to use and understand English as it is spoken, written, and heard in college and university settings. Most community colleges will accept students with TOEFL scores as low as 400 written (90 on the computer version). Also, some colleges will accept an IELTS (International English Language Testing System) score in place of the TOEFL score.

Focus on Teaching and Small Class Sizes

Although community college instructors do publish and conduct research, their main focus is on teaching. Also because the average class size is between 15 and 20 students, instructors are able to devote most of their time to students. Community colleges seek out and hire many instructors who have

extensive practical experience in the subjects they teach. For international students who need to adjust to the pace of U.S. academic life and practice English-languages skills, the small classes and personal attention from instructors provided at community colleges are especially beneficial.

Specialized English Language Instruction

Community colleges offer international students Intensive English Programs (IEPs), either on campus or through private, independent English-language institutes.

Appreciation and Support for All Students

Because community colleges are committed to ensuring that all of their students succeed, they attract students of many different ages, ethnicities, nationalities, beliefs, and abilities. They offer a variety of support and cross-cultural programs and services for their students, including tutoring, advising, career planning, developmental courses, and counseling—many of which are designed specifically for international students. All U.S. higher education institutions are required by the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) to provide access-related accommodations and services to people with

disabilities, including international students who are studying in the United States. Services include sign language interpreters, note takers in classes, Braille materials, and extended time for test-taking, but usually not personal aids such as care attendants, hearing aids, or wheelchairs.

Practical Training Opportunities

Students are entitled to one year of Optional Practical Training (OPT) upon completion of an associate degree and before entering into a baccalaureate program. And because a second OPT is possible upon completion of a bachelor's degree, students who earn an associate degree can potentially benefit from two years of OPT.

Hundreds of Programs To Choose From

Community colleges—much like 4year colleges—offer programs in all major fields of study. This is especially important for students planning to transfer to 4-year colleges and universities. Programs popular among international students include business, engineering, computer science, computer graphics, Internet technology, multimedia, hotel management, restaurant management, psychology, accounting, early childhood education, and environmental conservation.

Teaching and Use of the Latest Technologies

Because of their strong ties with business and industry, most community college classrooms are equipped with the latest technology and equipment. Community colleges also lead the nation in educating students in cutting-edge fields such as biomedical engineering, biotechnology, robotics, laser optics, Internet and computer technologies, and geographic information systems.
